	Dale Barrett, Licensing Officer, presented the report on an application for a premises licence variation at The Dutch House, 148-150 High Road, Tottenham N15 6UJ. The Committee was advised that some mediation had been agreed; further to the representation made by the Police, a condition requiring a minimum of 2 SIA registered door staff from 10pm until closing on Friday and Saturday nights had been agreed. The applicant had withdrawn their request for variation of the hours for Regulated Entertainment completely, and for variation of opening hours and Supply of Alcohol, Sunday to Thursday. For Friday and Saturday, the variation applied for was for Supply of Alcohol until 2am, and opening hours until 2.30am. In light of this, the representation made by Environmental Health had been withdrawn. The proposed operating schedule was set out in the report, and the only additional condition now proposed was that in respect of door supervision on Fridays and Saturdays. A letter of representation had also been received from a local resident in respect of noise nuisance

emanating from the premises.

Collette Phillips, Admiral Taverns, addressed the Committee on behalf of the applicant. It was reported that the variation was sought in order to give the business a chance to survive in the current economic climate. Ms Phillips confirmed that the variation sought was only for Fridays and Saturdays, with supply of alcohol to 2am and opening hours to 2.30am. There was no proposed variation in respect of Regulated Entertainment. With regards to the representation from the Police, CCTV was already installed at the premises, and a condition had been agreed regarding door supervision from 10pm until close on Fridays and Saturdays. The amendment to the application meant that the Environmental Health representation had also been withdrawn.

Ms Phillips reported that the intention was not to attract new customers to the premises but to increase revenue from existing customers, by enabling them to stay for longer in response to an existing demand. The site was described as well-run by a trusted tenant, there was no record of disorder, and the variation sought was not in order to change the nature of the premises in any way. In light of the amendment of the application to affect weekends only, it was not felt that additional licensing requirements were necessary. The nearest licensed premises was already open until 2am, and therefore this application would have no impact on other local premises. Ms Phillips reported that this was a proportionate and sensible application, and that if there were any failing in respect of the licensing objectives, this variation could be reversed. The Committee was asked to grant the application.

In response to a question from the Committee, Ms Phillips reported that the nature of Regulated Entertainment at the premises was karaoke. The Committee asked about door supervision currently, and it was reported that there were no door supervisors currently employed.

In summing up, Ms Barrett asked the Committee to take into account the representations made by the local resident in their letter, as they had not attended the hearing to present their views in person.

The Committee withdrew to deliberate.

RESOLVED

The Committee carefully considered the application, all representations, the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Section 182 guidance. The Committee decided to grant the application on the following terms:

The Committee noted that the applicant agreed to the conditions as set out by the Metropolitan Police, except for the need for door supervision every night from 10pm; the Committee felt that it was only necessary and proportionate for a minimum of two SIA-approve door staff to be required or to be employed on Friday and Saturday from 10pm until the venue closes.

It was noted that the representations by the noise team no longer apply, because the applicant agreed to withdraw their request for an extension of hours for Regulated Entertainment and for an extension of opening hours, Sunday to Thursday.

The Committee noted the objection by a local resident regarding excessive noise emanating from the premises, and felt that the applicant should be careful to ensure that the doors to the premises are kept closed where possible, and not wedged open.

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5. REPORT

Background

- **5.1** An application for a new Premises Licence, by Colin Robert Kelsey in respect of The Edge under the Licensing Act 2003. The premises has operated as a snooker hall previously but in 2012 a new licence was granted to permit regulated entertainment at the premises and the premises has been used a a function hall with a restaurant now incorporated within the building.

5.3 Crime and Disorder

All glasses will be banned while dancing is taking place. Only plastic and toughened glasses will be used. We have 20 CCTV cameras they have been installed on recommendation of the police. Minimum of 2 door supervisors' male and female licensed by the security industry authority will be used when a dance is taking place. Proof of age will be strictly enforced. CCTV footage will be available to the Police and the Licensing Authority on request. Recording will be kept for a minimum of a 31 day period.

5.4 Public Safety

We have wheelchair access with disabled toilet. 4 fire exits. No glasses to be taken outside by customers. Means of escape shall be maintained unobstructed immediately available and clearly identifiable, exit doors will be checked daily so they function satisfactory. Random searches shall be undertaken of customers after 10pm. Metal detectors will be randomly used by the door supervisors. The premises will be adequately ventilated in all areas to which staff and customers have access. Evacuation policy shall be in place satisfactory to everybody. Emergency drill and light tests will be carried out on a regular basis.

5.5 Public Nuisance

The noise from the premises will be at a level not to cause noise pollution. There will be not bright lights to cause residents concern. No gathering or drinking will be permitted outside on the pavement. There is a smoking area at the back of the premises. Notices shall be prominently displayed at each exit from the premises. We shall ask patrons to be considerate to neighbours when leaving. All external lighting will be turned after premises are closed to the public.

5.6 Child Protection

No children will be allowed admission under 18 years old without an adult accompanying them.

The Enforcement Response Service has taken into consideration that this is a new application and have made representation on the following main matters:

- All live and recorded music must be controlled by a noise limiter that will be set in conjunction with the Local Authority Noise Team
- That the operating hours be reduced until 2am weekdays and 3am Friday and Saturday nights.
- That a minimum of 2 SIA door supervisors be on duty from opening time.
- Searching and wanding of all patrons on entering the premises.
- Door supervisors to fully supervise the egress of customers to ensure minimum disturbance to residents.



I am writing to register an objection to the application concerning The Edge, 117 BRUCE GROVE, N17 6UR

My flat is diagonally opposite to 117 Bruce Grove. My concerns about the application are that it will increase noise to unbearable levels. We already suffer from very high noise levels, even for London standards. We had to improve double-glazing in our property, as the levels of noise make our live very difficult. Furthermore, there are already several similar premises in the area (for example, the Regency at 113 Bruce Grove).

The application shows that the venue will be used as a club and the opening hours (6am, 7 days a week) would undoubtedly have an impact on our lives due to noise of people smoking outside the premises, parking until 6am, etc. This is certainly not what our neighbourhood needs.

In recent months, there have been firearms incidents in the Edge and I have noticed a strong police presence in more than one occasion: extending the Edge licence is the last thing our troubled neighbourhood needs.

I am extremely worried that granting of the proposed licence would lead to increased stress to local residents and a deterioration of our living standards. Similar licensing arrangements have been denied in the past by your team, and I hope you will follow the same precedent in this occasion.

I am writing to express my concerns with regard to a licensing application concerning The Edge 117 BRUCE GROVE, N17 6UR:

These premises are diagonally opposite my flat.

My concerns are:

- 1. Noise emanating from the club (we were kept awake when The Edge Snooker Club transformed itself into a music/dance venue some years ago; the noise nuisance service was called many times and a member of this service testified to the problem at a planning meeting I attended at the Civic Centre. I have already contacted the noise nuisance service about the 'new' The Edge twice in the last 6 months.
- 2. Noise caused by people congregating outside the club on leaving, entering and taking breaks to smoke on the pavement.
- 3. Noise caused by people accessing their cars in the car park and leaving the car park throughout the night up until 6.00a.m.
- 4. As the car park described in the is frequently full, visitors to the Regency Banqueting Suite (110-116 Bruce Grove) already park in the street, which is already congested with cars belonging to patrons of the Juba Café (108 Bruce Grove). I have had to call the Police because I have been unable to enter my own property due to cars parked in front of the entrance.
- 5. Noise caused by people parking and accessing their cars in the street outside my flat.

In conclusion, I am extremely worried that granting the proposed licence would lead to increased stress to local residents, especially those of us who live so close to the premises. Champa Close is directly opposite the premises, as is 8 Bruce Grove, where a Housing Association development is nearing completion. As I know from having visited residents in Champa Close, many people are already affected by problems emanating from The Edge but feel vulnerable culturally and linguistically, and are reluctant to complain.

Letter of Objection: The Edge, 117 Bruce Grove, N17 6UR

I would like to object to the multi-faceted licensing application for the above premises. I have received a number of representations from worried constituents in Bruce Grove who live within the vicinity of the premises about the late night operation of the premises which I understand has also been operating on an unlicensed basis. In short, prior to this new application, the applicant premises has been operating as a bar, club and associated premises, as per regular advertisements outside the premises for late night music functions, including with the sale of alcohol. There have been ongoing reports of anti-social behaviour and noise, much of which has been brought to the attention of the police and council enforcement officers.

The prevention of crime and disorder

Late night functions, including with music and the sale of alcohol, involving large numbers of people coming in and out of the entrance on Bruce Grove. Much of this activity has taken place without a proper licence and in contravention of the Licensing Act 2003.

There have been a number of reports of aggressive and/or violent behaviour, often late at night, outside the premises.

The prevention of public nuisance

Again, late night functions, including with music and the sale of alcohol, involving large numbers of people coming in and out of the entrance on Bruce Grove. Much of this activity has taken place without a proper licence and in contravention of the Licensing Act 2003.

As above, there have been a number of reports of aggressive and/or violent behaviour, often late at night, outside the premises. The noise and anti-social behaviour is of great concern to residents living nearby on Bruce Grove, Forest Gardens, Champa Close and Moorefield Road, as well as other nearby streets.

Overall, my biggest concern is that of the unreasonably wide-ranging hours of operation sought within the application. As per the timings listed on the attached sheet, I have underlined those aspects that I consider represent hours that are particularly excessive. I would contend that a maximum time of 12am Sunday to Thursday and 1am on Friday and Saturday be considered, were an application to be granted. This is in line with other nearby premises and represents a growing consensus amongst residents and councillors in Tottenham that premises open later than 1am are invariably more likely to cause public nuisance and be a magnet for crime and anti-social behaviour, as was seen so viciously at Rudolph's recently.

As a local ward councillor I do not see any later opening nearby premises as setting any meaningful precedent, what with the sheer volume of reports of anti-social behaviour from many of these premises when they have been given very late licenses. It is my clear intention and policy as a local ward councillor to also monitor any existing applications so as to ensure that, where the rules have not been followed, residents are provided with the right to have the application in question reviewed at a public meeting of the Licensing Committee and shorter hours demanded.

I am in favour of businesses providing services, including night time entertainment. I am not in favour of excessive licensing hours that outweigh any beneficial contribution to the local night time economy.

I would also like to confirm my intention to attend the Licensing Committee hearing for this application and speak against it.
