<u>Update on Hornsey Depot</u> <u>Provided by Haringey Planning Department on 25 February 2014</u>

Following an earlier deferral the Planning Sub-Committee resolved to approve the application to redevelop the Hornsey Reuse and Recycling Centre subject to direction of the Mayor, conditions and s106 legal agreement. On the 12th of February the Mayor of London stated that he will allow Haringey to determine the case itself and does not wish to direct refusal or to take over the application.

Signing of the s106 agreement is outstanding and the decision will not be issued until it is signed. Following issue of the permission, a number of conditions will need to be discharged before demolition, before construction and before occupation of the development.
