#### 1.0 Purpose

- 1.1 To report on the feedback received during the perception survey consultation on the proposed introduction of Event Day Controls (CPZ) to roads within The Hale Controlled Parking Zone located in the Tottenham Hale Ward (highlighted in orange on Appendix I).
- 1.2 To seek approval to proceed with the recommendations as set out in section 10 of this report.

#### 2.0 Background

- 2.1 Tottenham stadium capacity is expanding to approximately 60,000 and we have been contacted by residents and Ward Councillors asking us to consult again on introducing match/event day controls. They are concerned that the increased numbers travelling to the stadium will add to parking congestion in local streets, unless operating hours are extended on event and match days.
- 2.2 In November 2017, officers met with the Cabinet Member for Environment and Ward Councillors and it was decided that we should prioritise where the stadium is expected to have an impact on parking.
- 2.3 It was agreed that a perception survey be undertaken in The Hale Controlled Parking Zone with both residents and business to establish if they would support introducing match/event day controls.
- 2.4 The last time we consulted on introducing event/match day controls in this area was in October 2015 and at that time; there was limited demand for additional controls as the majority of residents were satisfied with the existing all day controls.
- 2.5 The council commenced the perception consultation on Friday 9 February 2018 with information letters accompanied by a freepost feedback card, hand delivered to all properties within the proposed area. And an online version was also made available. See Appendix II for the consultation letter.
- 2.6 All responses were to be received by the cut-off date of Friday 2 March 2018.
- 3.0 Consultation Feedback (Consultation area)
- 3.1 There were 41 responses received both on-line and by freepost card. When asked, 'If you think there is a need for extending parking controls to operate on event days?' Of the 41 responses received, 26 supported the changes, 11 objected and 4 had a different view.

- 3.2 It shows that 63% of those that responded support the introduction of all day controls with 27% objecting and 10% having another view.
- 3.3 A full analysis of the consultation responses received is contained in Appendix III.
- 3.4 The consultation method offered residents the option of responding online, or using hard copy freepost feedback cards. Online forms carry a risk of substantial duplication and this has to be checked carefully before data is analysed.
- 3.5 A telephone number was provided at the bottom of consultation letters to enable people to contact our Customer Service Team who will direct calls to the Parking Design Team to answer any questions.
- 4.0 Chief Finance Officer Comments
- 4.1 Provision for the implementation of the proposed measures to the CPZ has been made within the Parking Plan capital budget for 2018-19.
- 4.2 Associated costs which includes community engagement, inventory of existing site conditions, design and implementation (including installation of street signage, notifications etc) are approximately £30,000.
- 4.3 Annual running costs will be maintained by existing staff/budgets.
- 4.4 Parking controls will be enforced by existing /in house civil enforcement officers (CEO's).
- 5.0 Environmental Implications
- 5.1 Before reaching a decision to make the necessary Traffic Management Order to implement or amend a CPZ scheme, the Council must follow the statutory consultation procedures pursuant to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("RTRA") (as amended) and the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 (as amended). All representations received must be properly considered in

- the light of administrative law principles, Human Rights and equalities law and the relevant statutory powers.
- 5.2 The Council's powers to make Traffic Management Orders arise mainly under sections 6, 9, 45, 46, 122 and 124 and schedules 1 paragraph 8 and 9 of the RTRA.
- 5.3 The power of a local authority to make an order regulating or controlling vehicular and other traffic is contained within the ambit of section 6(1) of the RTRA. The power to make an experimental traffic order is contained in section 9 of the RTRA. Experimental traffic orders generally have a lifespan of 18 months. During the initial 6 month period the council will register representations received and consider and implement where possible these requests during the second 6 month period, these amendments have a further 6 month period before being considered to be made permanent.
- When determining what paying parking places are to be designated on the highway, section 45(3) requires the Council to consider both the interests of traffic and those of the owners and occupiers of adjoining properties. In particular, the Council must have regard to: (a) the need for maintaining the free movement of traffic, (b) the need for maintaining reasonable access to premises, and (c) the extent to which off-street parking is available in the neighbourhood or if the provision of such parking is likely to be encouraged by designating paying parking places on the highway.
- 5.5 By virtue of section 122, the Council must exercise its powers under the RTRA so as to secure the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of vehicular and other traffic including pedestrians, and the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on and off the highway. These powers must be exercised so far as practicable having regard to the following matters:-
  - (a) The desirability of securing and maintaining reasonable access to premises.
  - (b) The effect on the amenities of any locality affected including the regulation and restriction of heavy commercial traffic so as to preserve or improve amenity.
  - (c) The national air quality strategy.
  - (d) Facilitating the passage of public service vehicles and securing the safety and convenience of their passengers.
  - (e) Any other matters appearing to the Council to be relevant

6.0 Comments of the Assistant Director of Corporate Governance

6.1 The legal position and statutory requirements for consultation are set out in Section 5 of the report. Public consultation has been undertaken and due consideration given to representations by the public. As long as the statutory consultation is undertaken and due consideration similarly given to representations made, there is no reason why the Council should not be entitled to proceed with its proposals.

#### 7.0 Equal Opportunities

- 7.1 Consultation documents were distributed to all households/ businesses within the area of the proposed scheme.
- 7.2 Any interested party can submit a representation regardless of where they live or work during the statutory notification period.
- 7.3 A translation service for the consultation document was available upon request; however, no such requests were received.

#### 8.0 Summary

- 8.1 With the expansion of the Tottenham Football Stadium, which does not have a public parking facility, and the likely introduction of a CPZ in the southern part of LB Enfield adjacent to the boundary with Haringey, it is highly likely that further pressure will be placed on available parking in the Tottenham area. Additionally as this area is in short walking distance, there is a risk that visitors to the stadium will park during the event times and reduce the parking opportunities for local residents and businesses. In doing so this will increase the level of complaints and further request to bring in these changes.
- 8.2 From the responses received from individual roads, it is also acknowledged that some roads within the consultation area were against parking controls. However, with the introduction of any parking scheme there is always the possibility of parking being displaced to other areas/roads outside new controls.
- 8.3 Furthermore, if parking controls are not introduced in individual roads who objected to the CPZ, the council cannot commit to being able to consult these roads again in the near future. This is because of pressures elsewhere in the borough and resources being utilised there.
- 8.4 In 2008 the first event parking zone was introduced surrounding Tottenham Football ground and these controls have reportedly been successful in preventing commuter parking while making it easier for local residents to park during the controlled times.
- 8.5 Given the wide local support to introduce controls, evidenced by not only the results of the consultation but also concerns of local residents,

and the support of Ward Councillors it is recommended that the controls be implemented and monitored for a period of six months.

- 9.0 Regarding operational factors of the CPZs
- 9.1 The match/event day controls will operate in the same way as adjacent zone where the operational day and hours are set out in 10.3 of this report.

#### 10.0 Recommendations

Following consideration of the consultation results and further to discussions with Ward Councillors, it is recommended that the Cabinet Member for Environment and Head of Service:

- 10.1 Notes the feedback of the public consultation set out in this report.
- 10.2 Approves match/event day parking controls be introduced on an experimental basis to all roads in red shaded area on the plan shown on Appendix I and for this new CPZ to be known as Bruce Castle CPZ.
- 10.3 Approves the operational days/times as follows:
  - Monday Friday 8.30am 6.30pm (non-event days)
  - 8am 8.30pm Monday Friday; and
     8am 8pm Saturday and Sunday; and
     Noon 8pm on public holidays (event days)
- 10.4 Approves the controls be introduced under Experimental Traffic Management Order(s).
- 10.5 Approves that residents/traders in the area be informed of this decision. This will be done via written works notification letters distributed throughout the area.

# Public Consultation Report Parking Schemes

Tottenham Hale: "The Hale" (full-time) Controlled Parking Zone

## Subject: Need for Extended Operating Hours on Event Days

Existing operating days and hours for Tottenham Hale CPZ are Monday – Friday 8.30am to 6.30pm and the same times apply on match and event days.

In the last two years, Tottenham stadium capacity has expanded to 60,000 and some residents asked us to consult again on extending CPZ operating times on match / event days. They are concerned that increased numbers travelling to the stadium will add to parking congestion unless operating hours are extended.

Residents were asked if they saw a need for operating hours to be extended on event days e.g.: 8am - 8.30pm weekdays, 8am - 8pm weekends, and 12noon - 8pm on public holidays

The consultation provided freepost feedback cards with document delivery and respondents could, if preferred submit their comments using the online feedback 'card'. Residents were asked to indicate if they supported, or objected to, an extension in match / event day operating hours.

The consultation closing date was Friday 9 February.
