

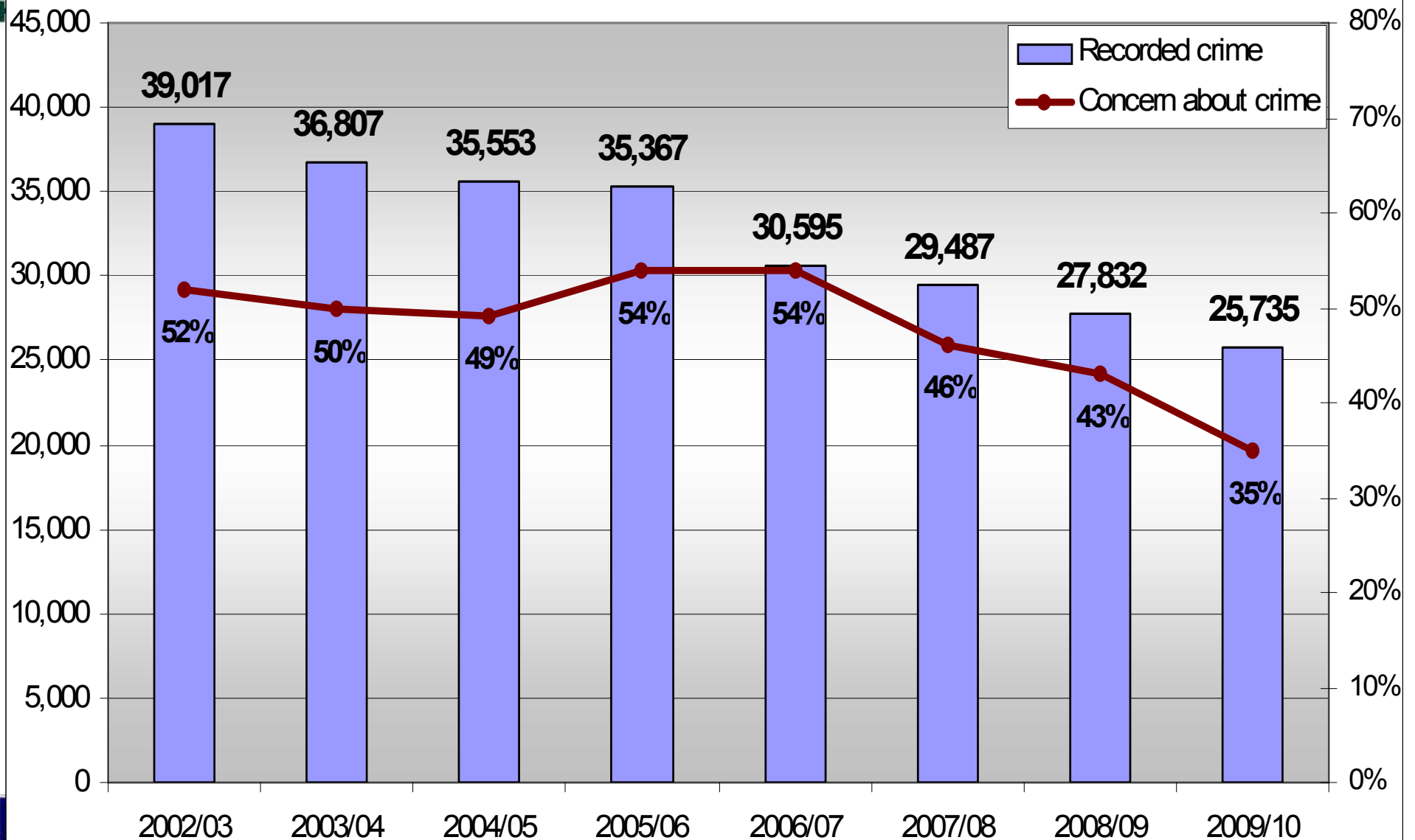

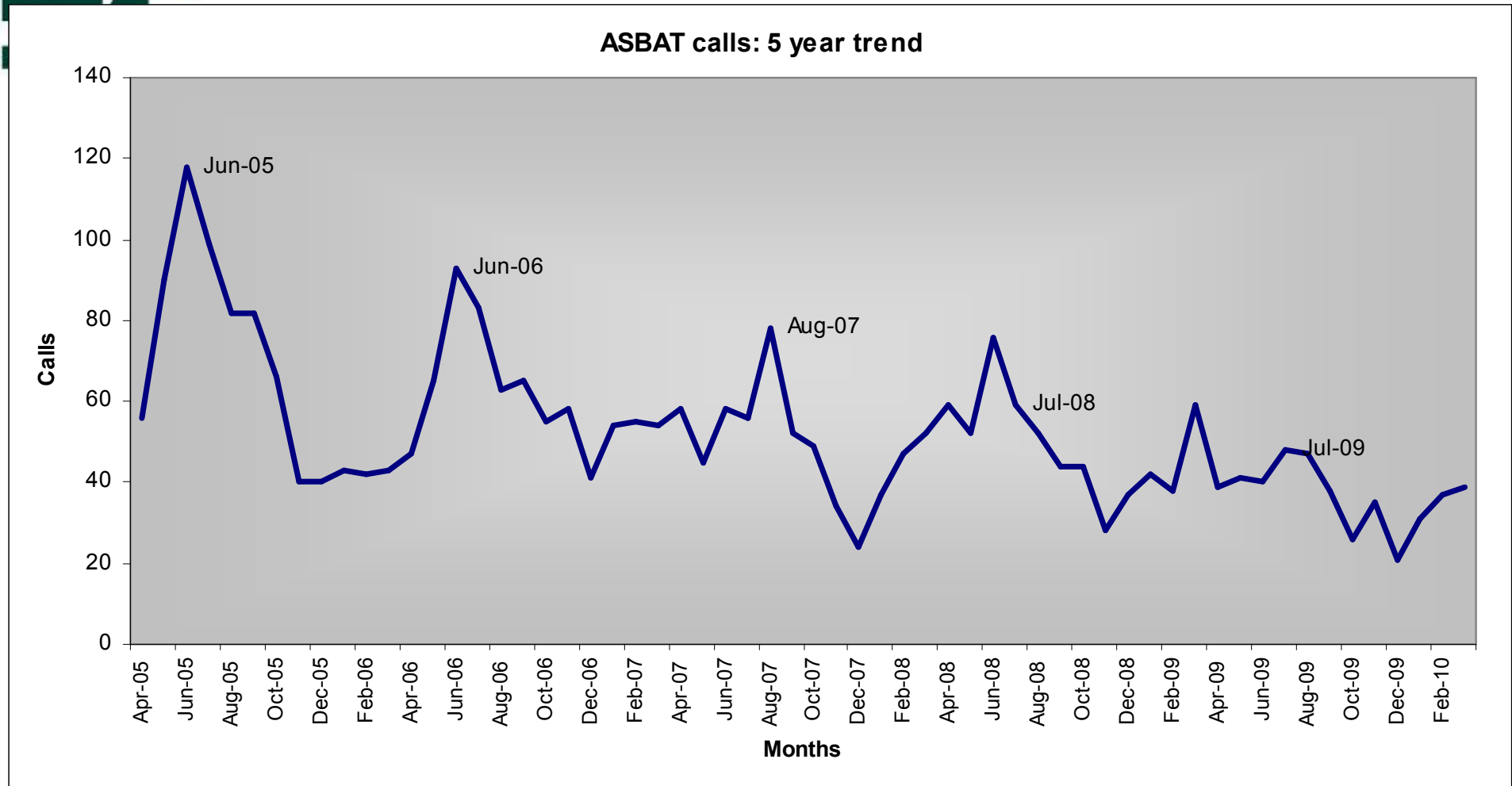

## Performance

- Crime down 34% since 2002/03
- Concern about crime down from 54% to 35%
- This saves Haringey tens of millions of pounds a year

### **However...**

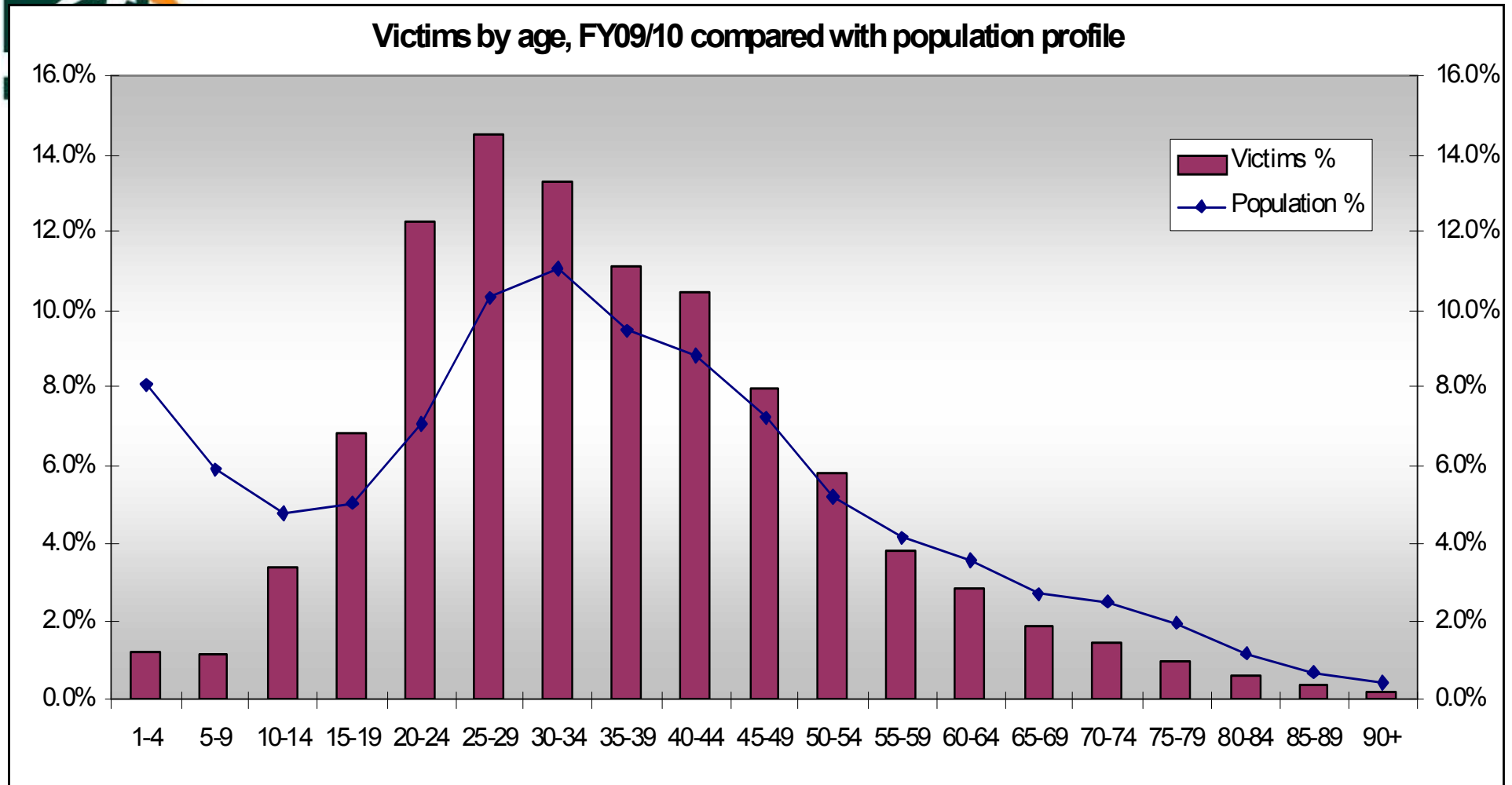
- Increase in crime likely

## Increases since last year

- Most serious violence up 15% (to 476)
- Sexual offences up 26% (to 347)
- Rape up 58% (to 98)
- Theft and handling exc vehicles up 10% (to 5,368)
- Theft from the person up 11% (to 1,060)
- Pedal cycle theft up 49% (to 440)
- Rowdy/nuisance neighbour calls up 7% (to 976)

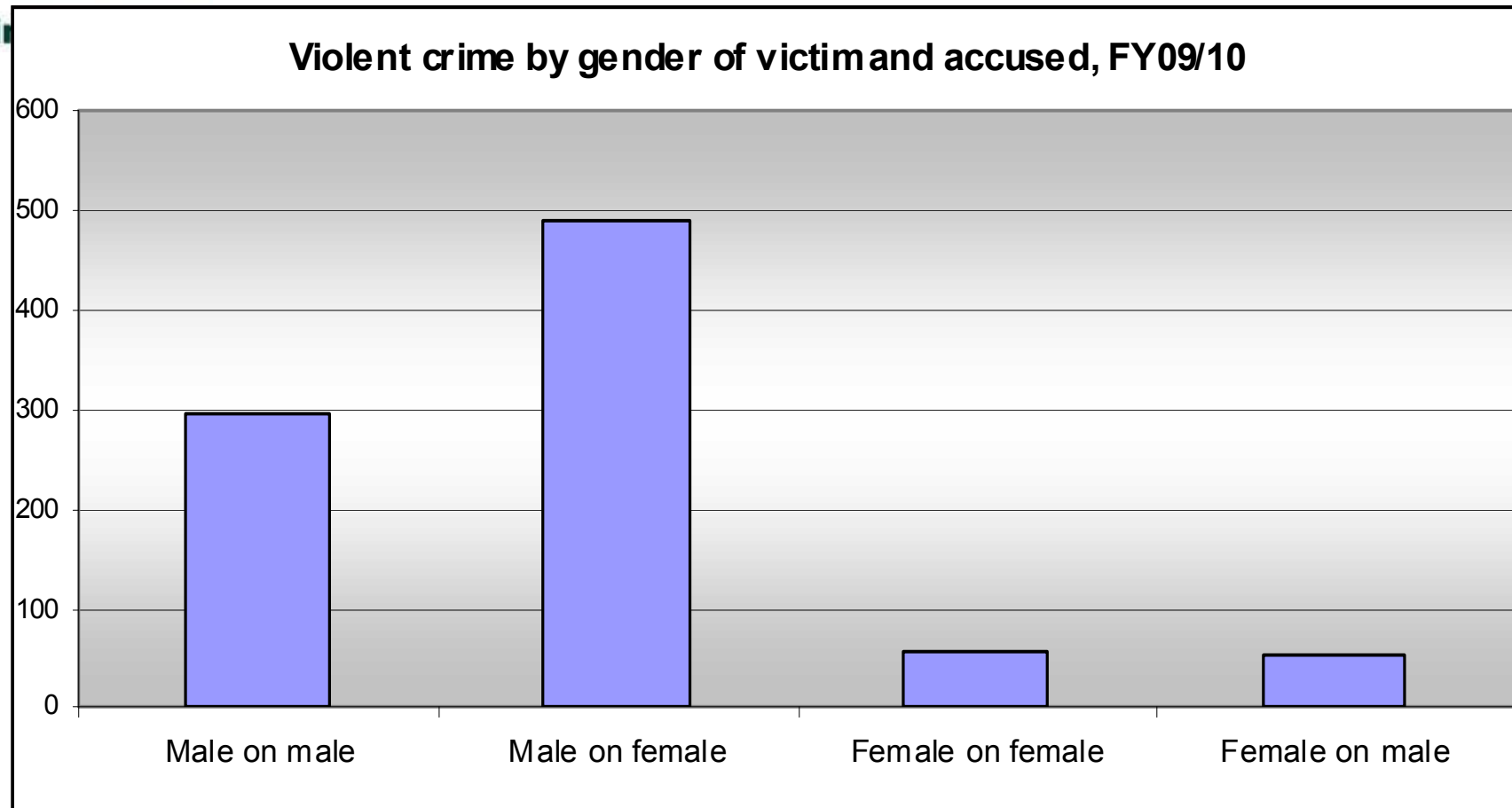

Over half of violence is by men against women



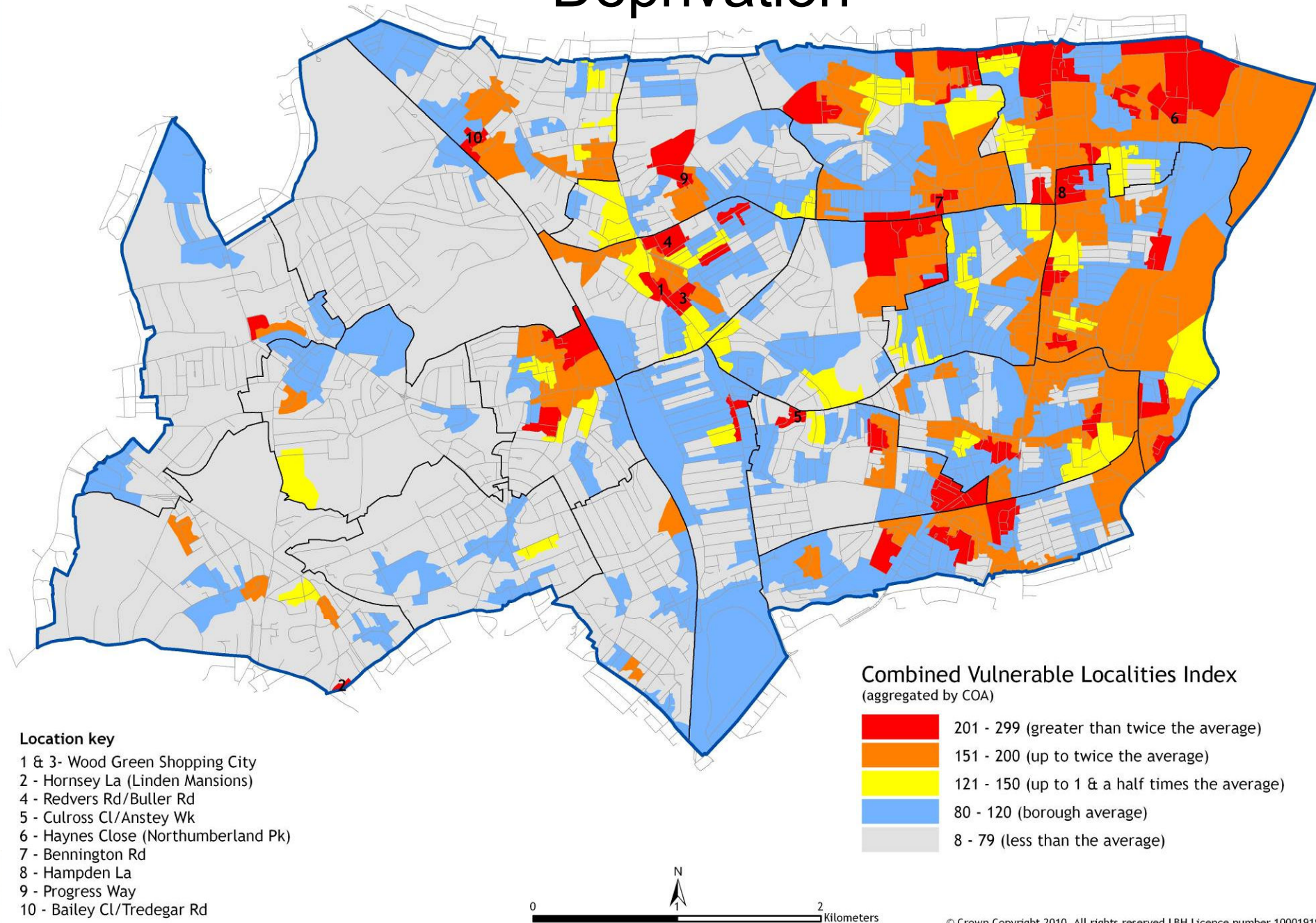

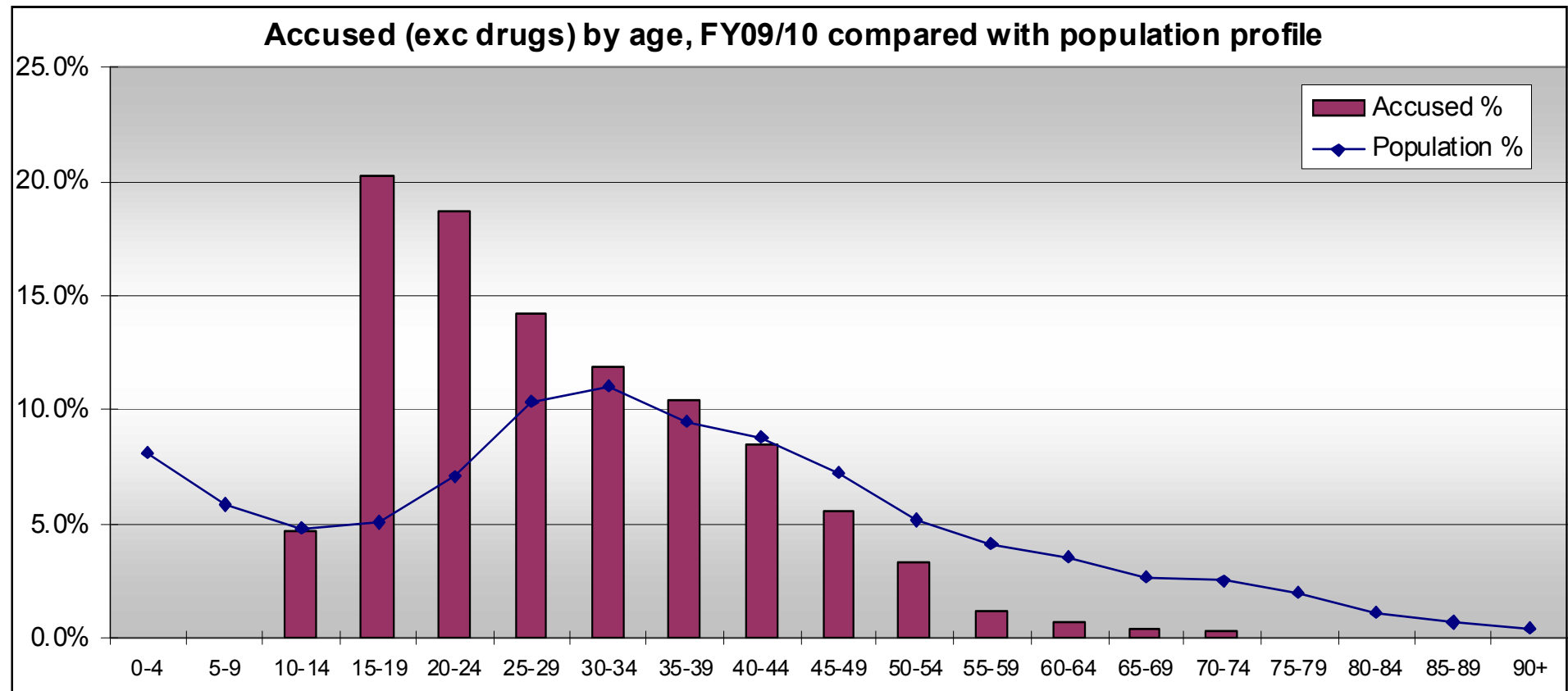
## Victims – risk factors

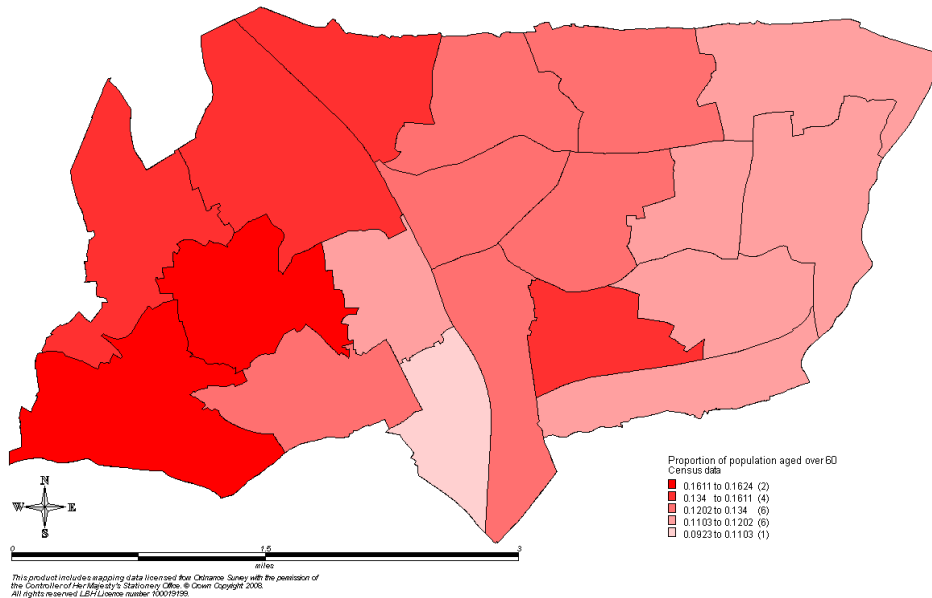

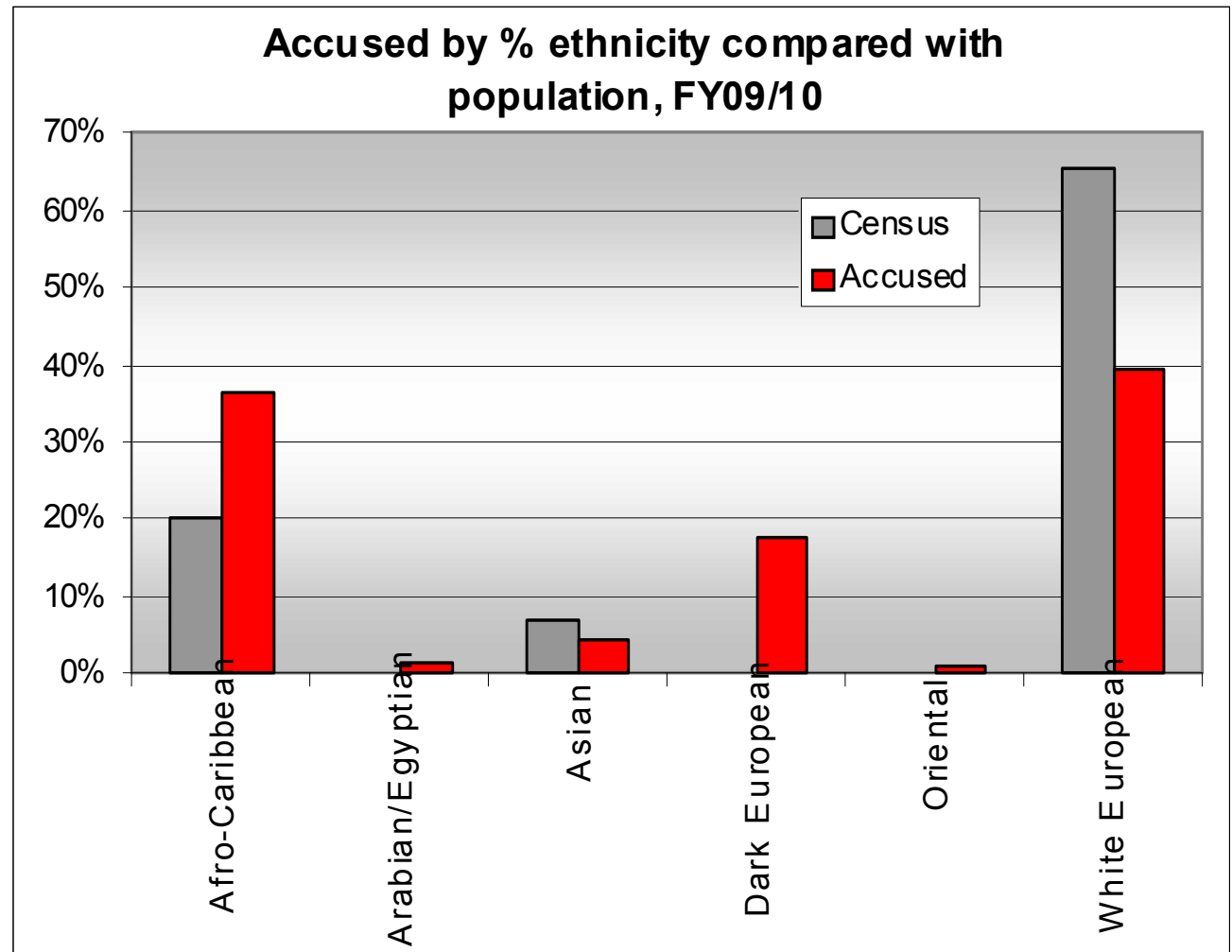

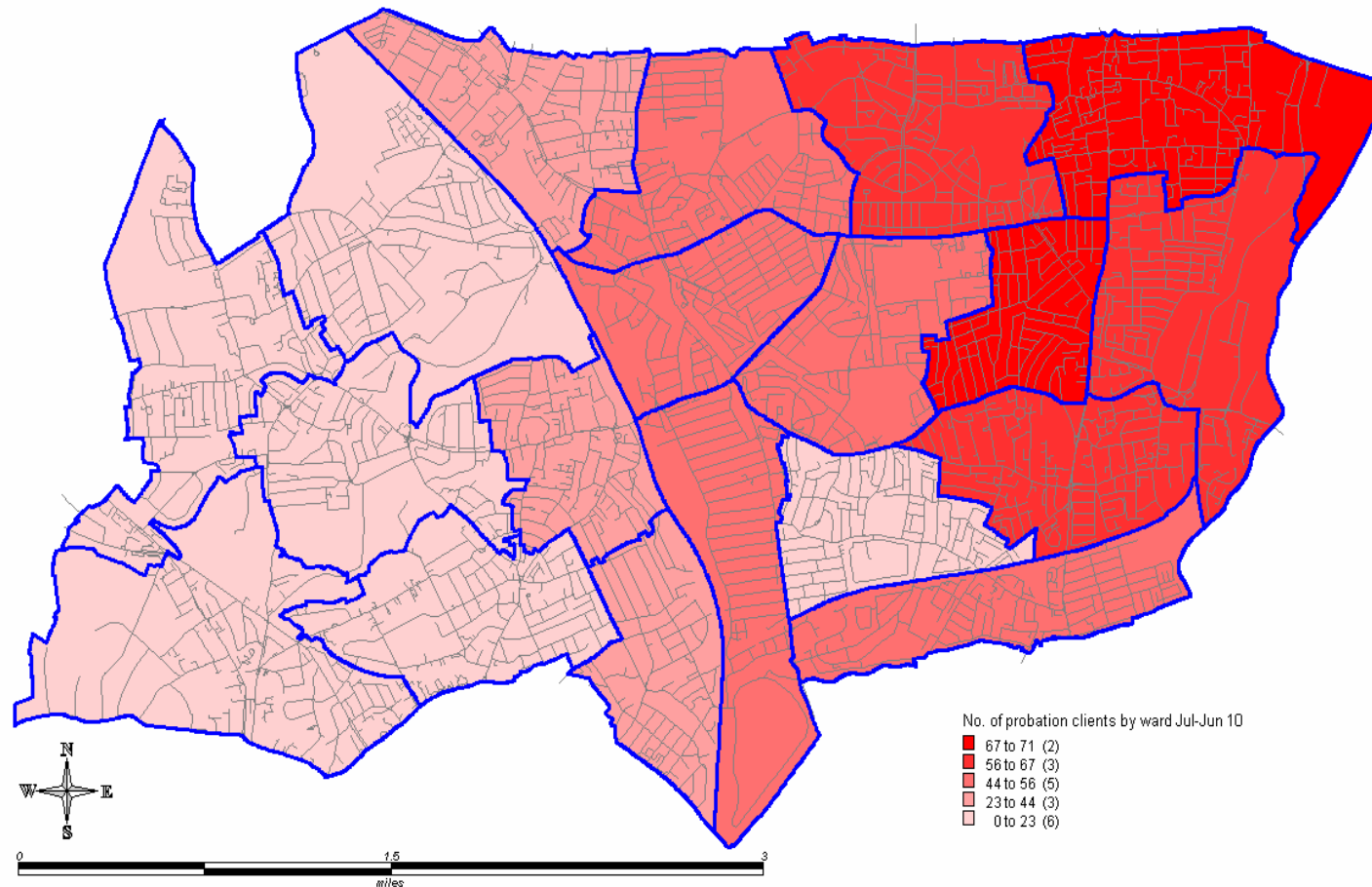
# Ethnic profile of residents

## Offenders – risk factors

- Gender – 80% male
- Age – peak age 18-24
- Ethnicity – need better Census data
- Unemployment – 57%
- Repeat offending – 23% of accused

# Drug treatment population profile

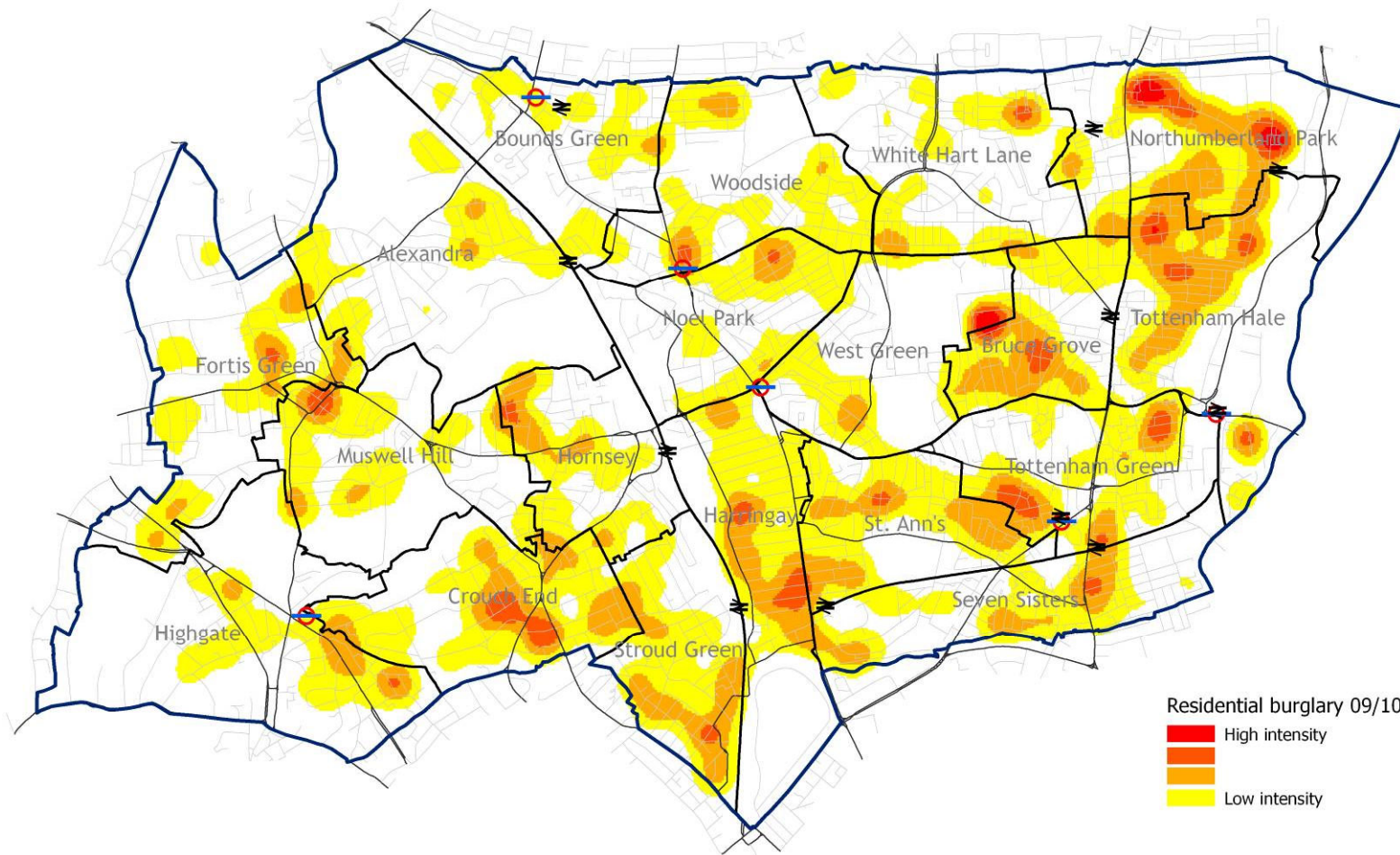
- In 2009-10 a quarter were women
- Around half reported crack or heroin as a primary or secondary problem, (47% and 50% respectively)
- Majority (70%) reported using more than one drug, including alcohol.
- Largest ethnic groups were white British (35%), other white (17%) and Black Caribbean (16%)
- No prominent age group. There were 71 children and young people under 18 in drug treatment
- 22% had mental health issues
- 32% had a housing problem.
- 85% had not worked in the month before they commenced treatment.

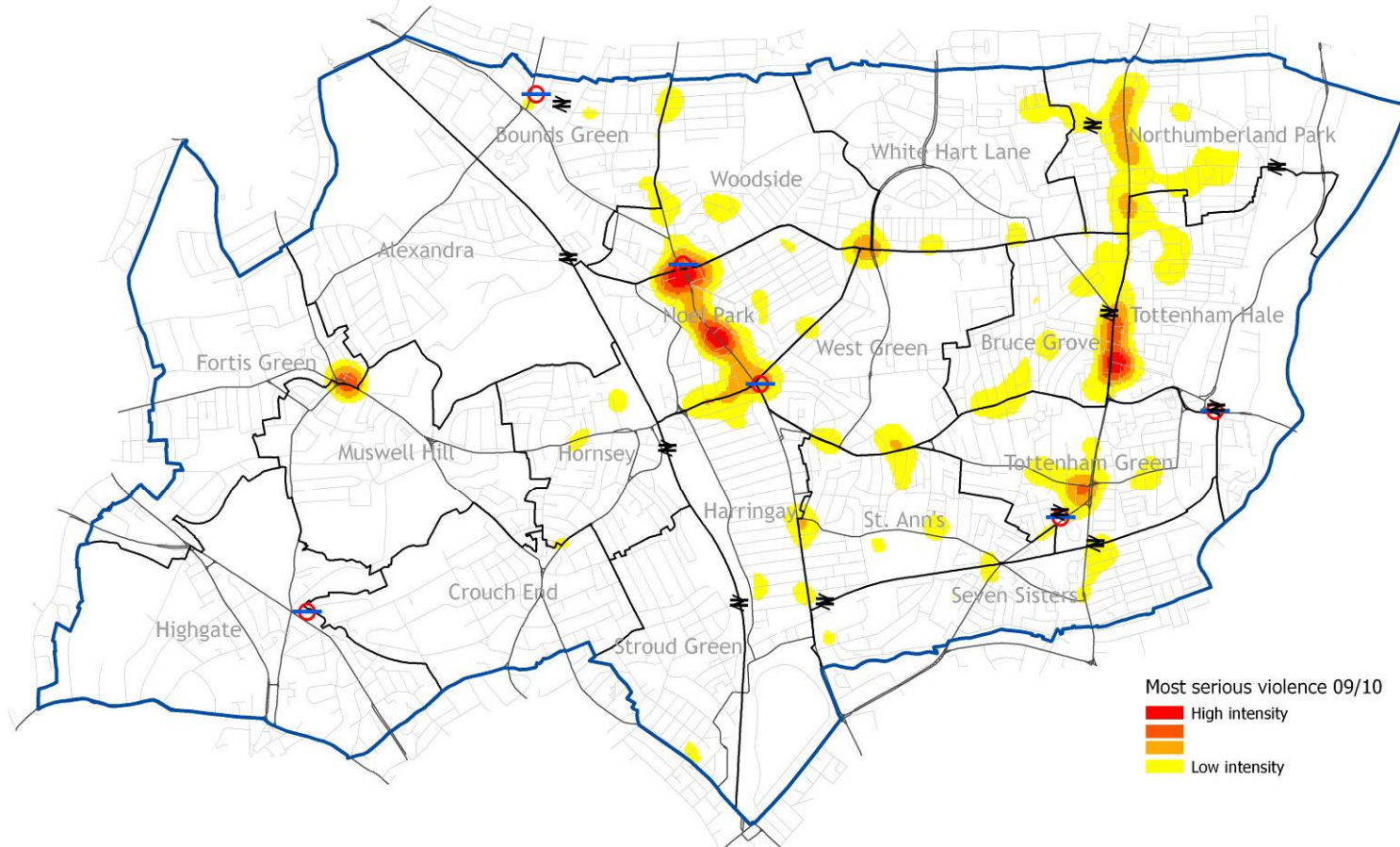

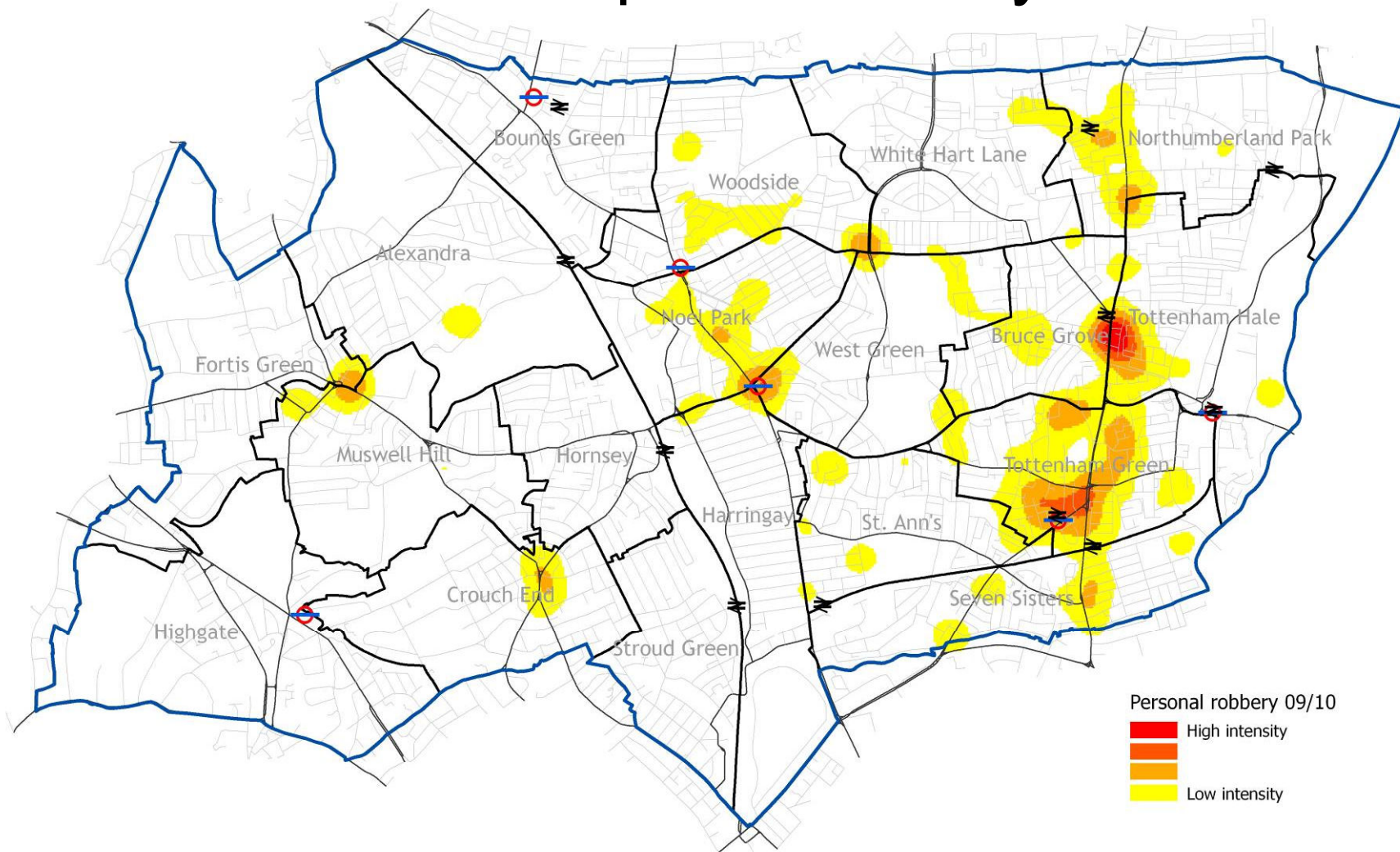


# Hot spots - violence

# Hot spots - robbery



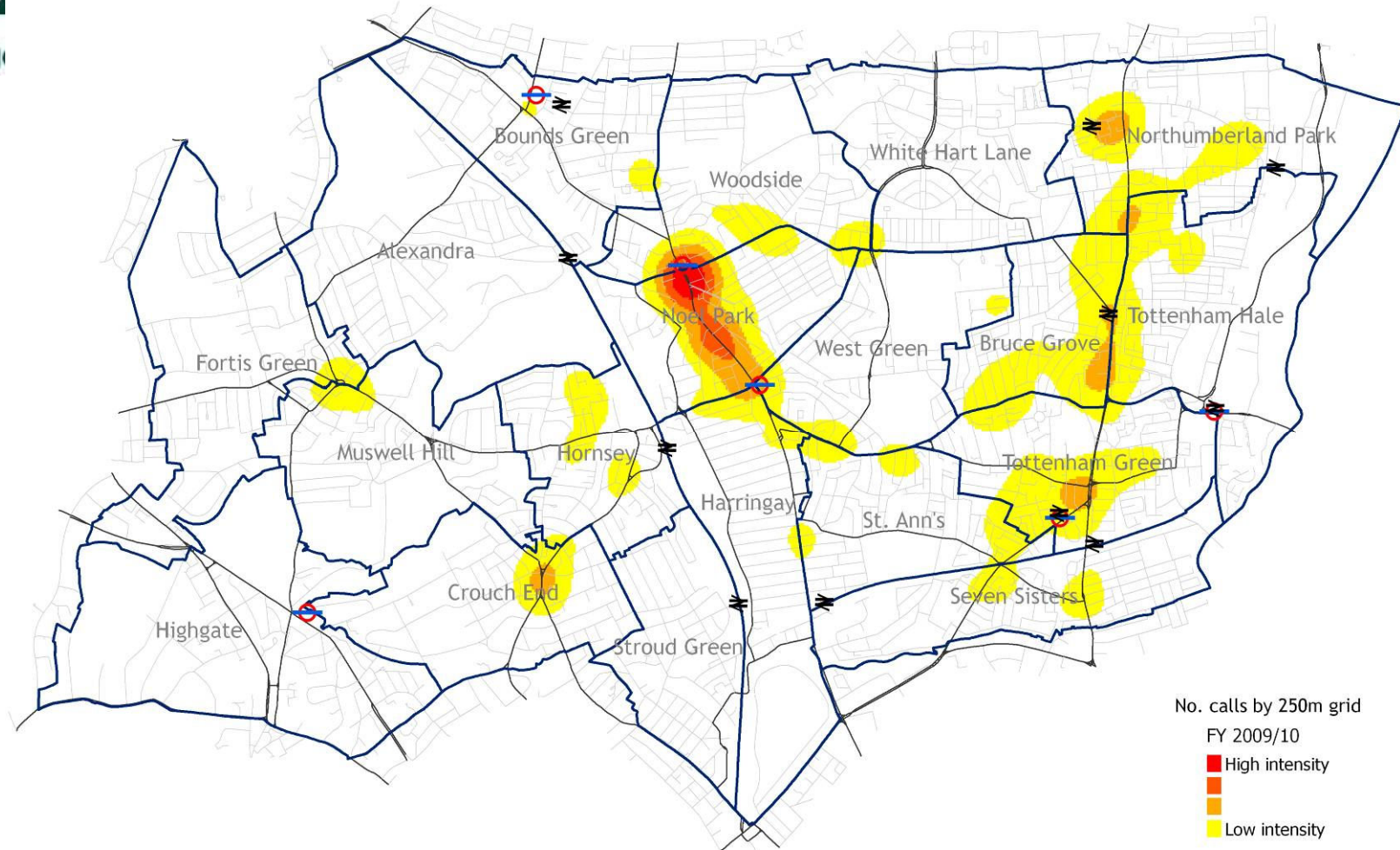
- Robbery hotspot moved

- Peak times for disorder are from 16:00 – 22:00

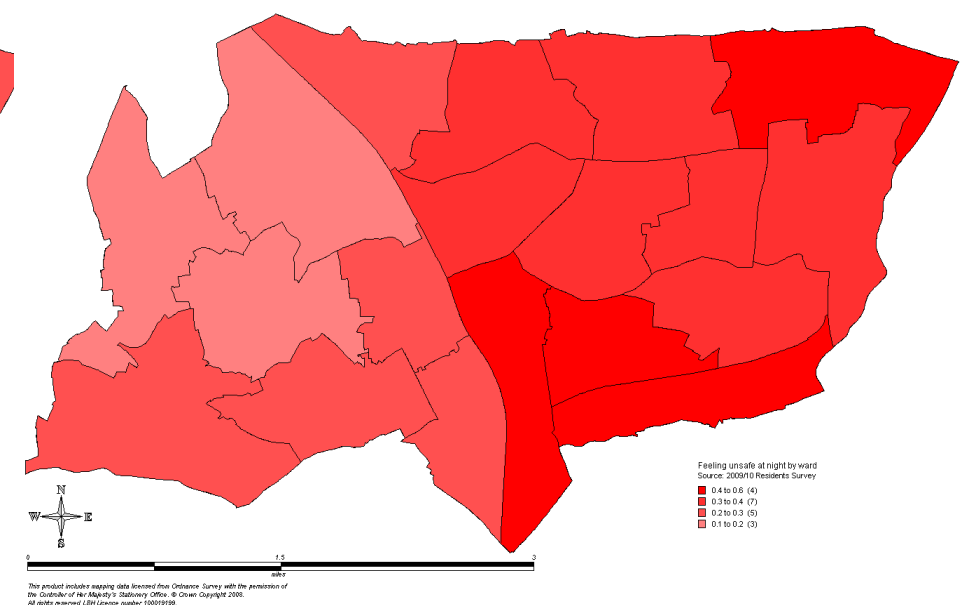
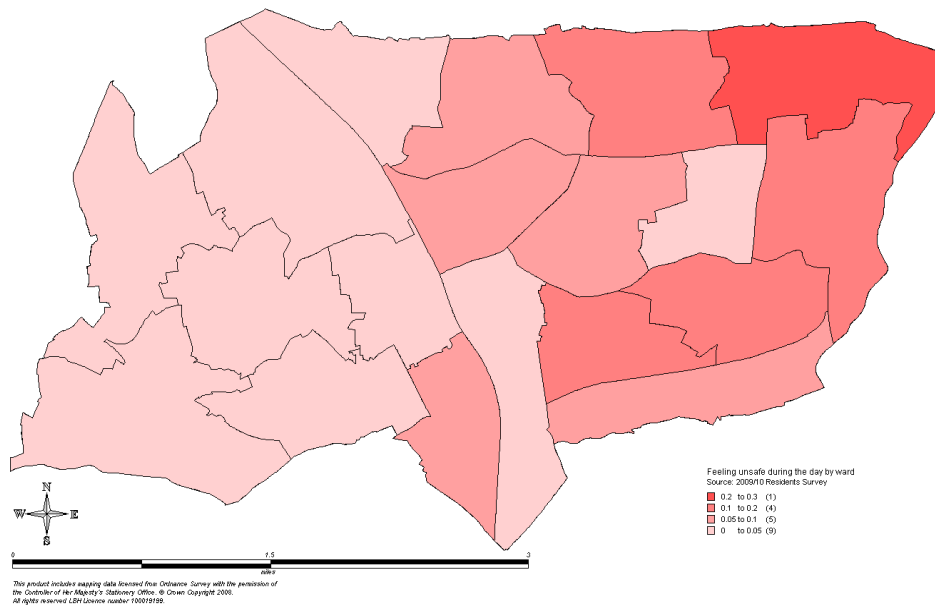

# Fear of crime

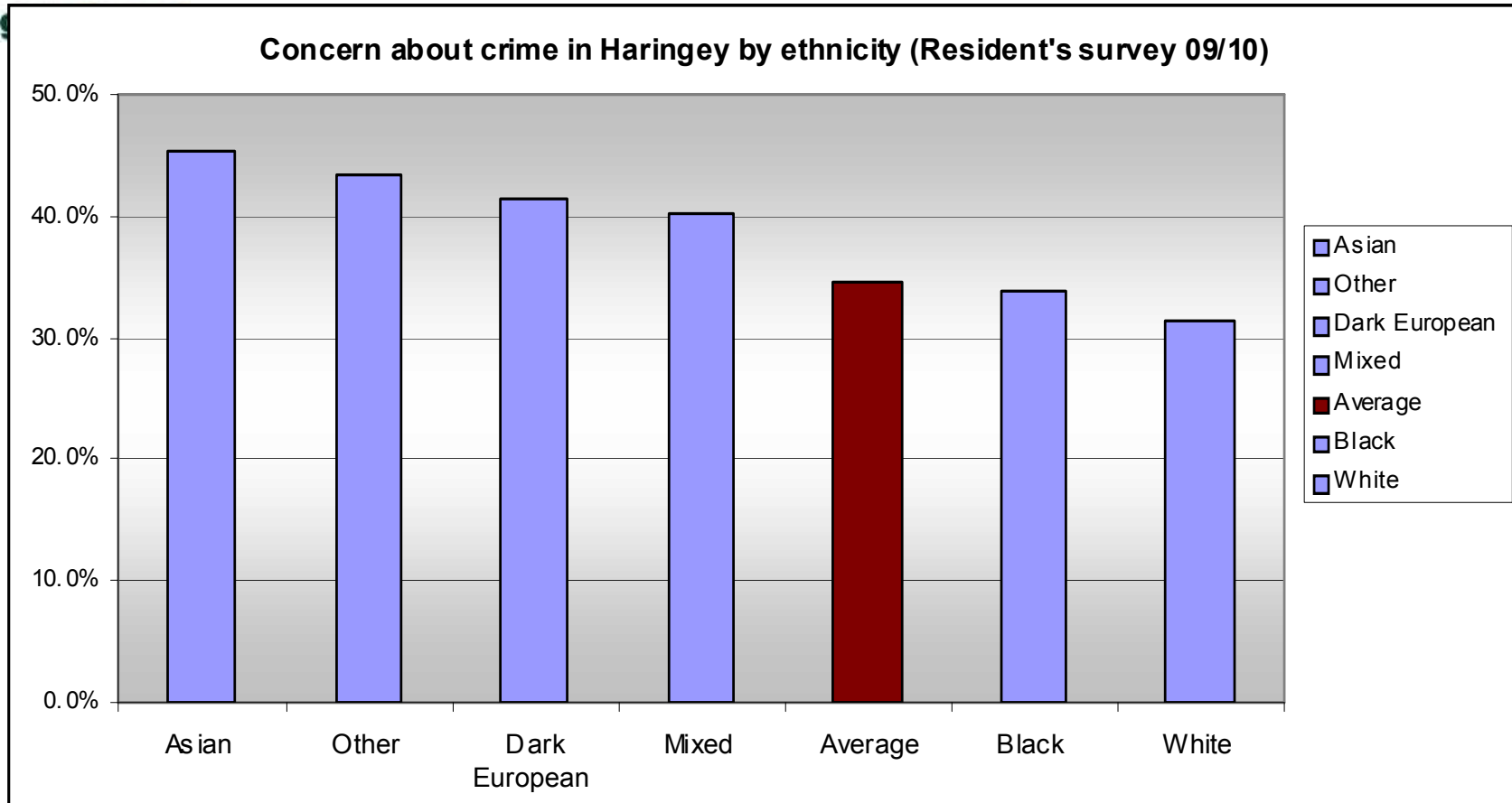


- The maps show how safe residents feel in the borough during the day (left) and at night (right). Northumberland Park is the peak ward overall.
