Proposed closure of Alexandra Road Crisis Unit

Haringey Council is undertaking a programme of consultation about the future of some of the adult services it directly provides. The consultation takes place between 31st January and 30th April 2011.

The Council is facing unprecedented Government cuts to its budget and this will, along with other parts of the council have very serious consequences for adult social care services. Proposed changes include the closure of Council-run residential care homes, day and drop-in centres and mental health services, which we run with NHS Haringey and Barnet, Enfield and Haringey Mental Health Trust, as appropriate.

NHS Haringey and the Council recognises the value and importance of these services but has no alternative than to consider their proposed closure as both organisations are no longer able to directly provide and/or pay for some health and adult social care services in future.
