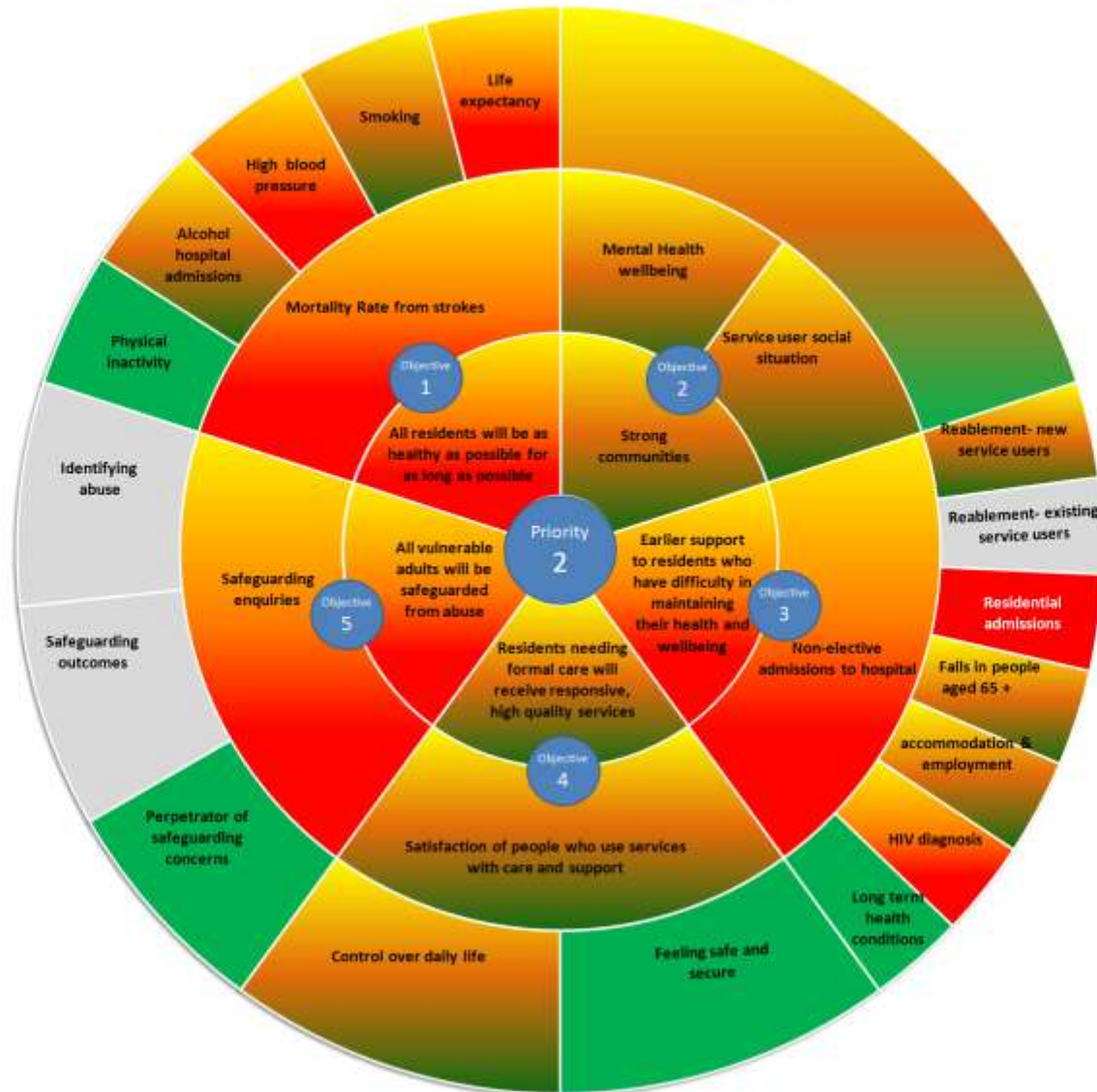

Enable all adults to live healthy, long and fulfilling lives Board: Objective 1

All residents will be as healthy as possible for as long as possible

Objective 1:

All residents will be as healthy as possible for as long as possible.



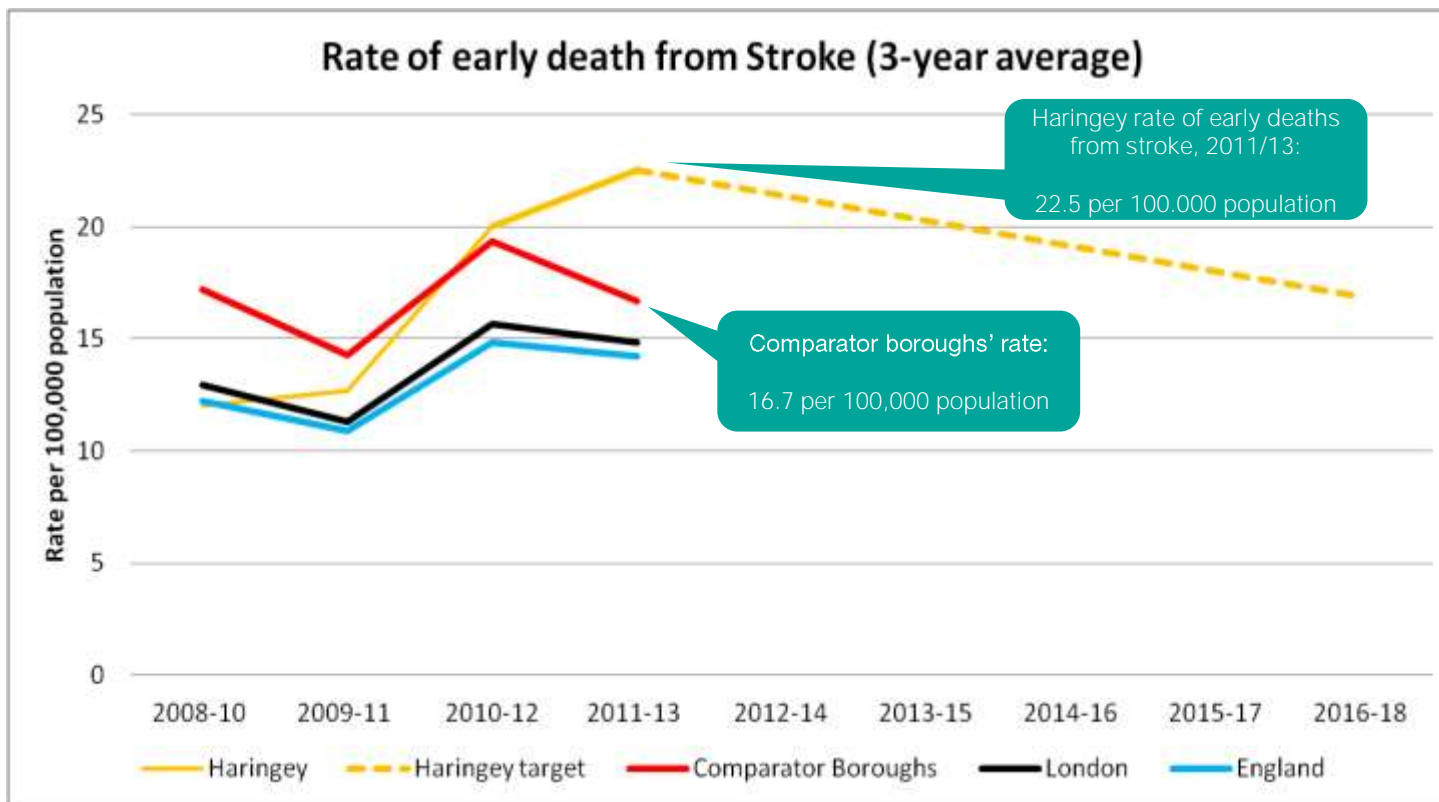
Principal Indicator:

Under 75 Mortality Rate from stroke in persons (3 Year Average).



Target:

To oversee a 25% reduction in the current (2011-13) mortality rate (22.5 per 100,000) to 16.9 deaths per 100,000 (2016-2018).



What does the data say ?

Haringey has a higher rate of early deaths from strokes than its comparator boroughs, London and England average. These rates are increasing. An ambitious target of 25% reduction in early deaths from stroke is supported by a focus on prevention of risk factors, such as reducing smoking, alcohol consumption, high blood pressure and increased physical activity.

All residents will be as healthy as possible for as long as possible.



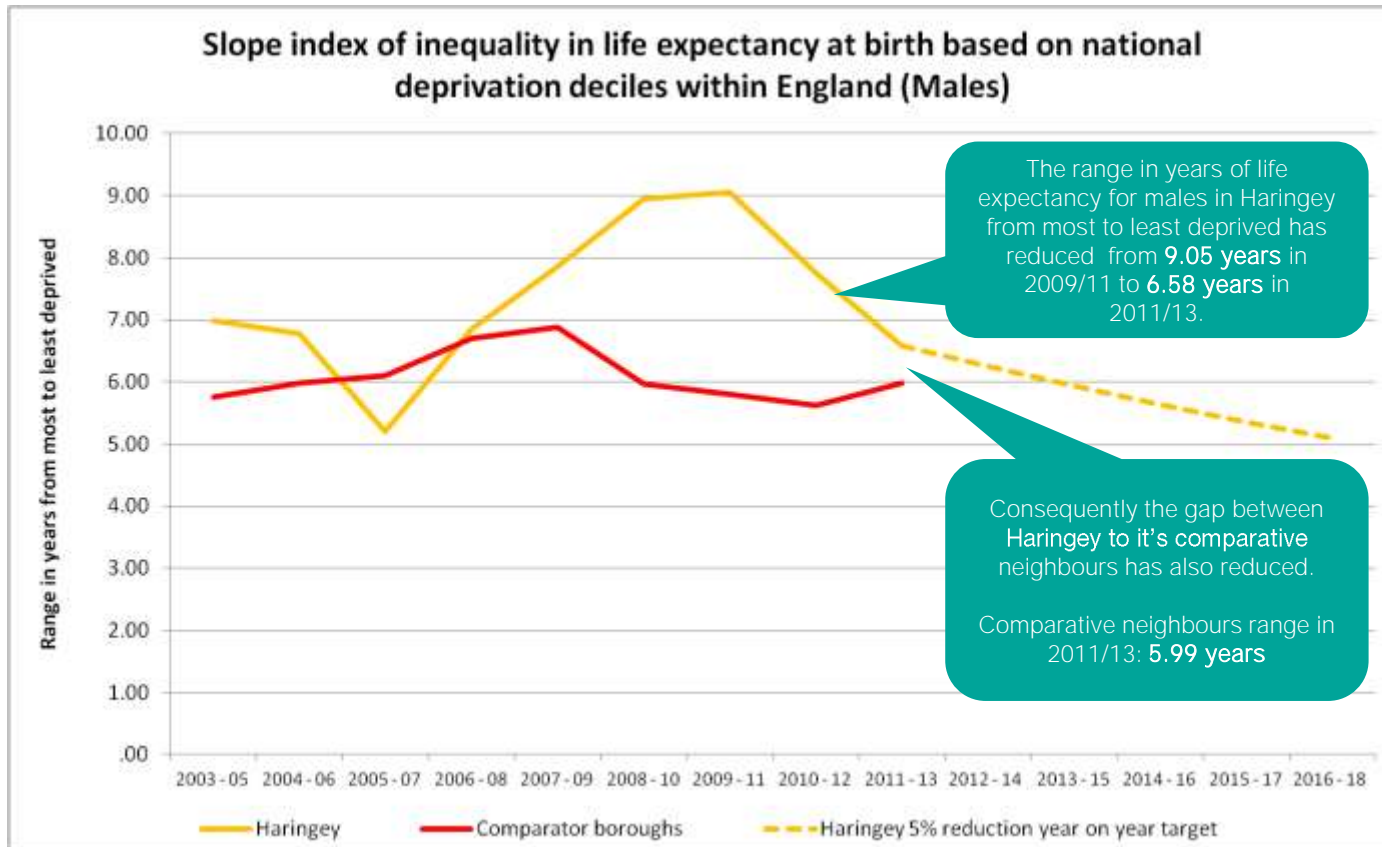
Outcome indicator:

Reduce the inequality gap in life expectancy for males and females.



Target:

To oversee a 5% year on year reduction in the slope index of inequality of life expectancy years across the social gradient within Haringey (from most to least deprived) by 2018.



What does the data say ?

Haringey has a higher inequality gap in life expectancy for males across the borough however this gap has reduced significantly over recent years, and it is projected to continue decreasing by 5% year on year until 2018.

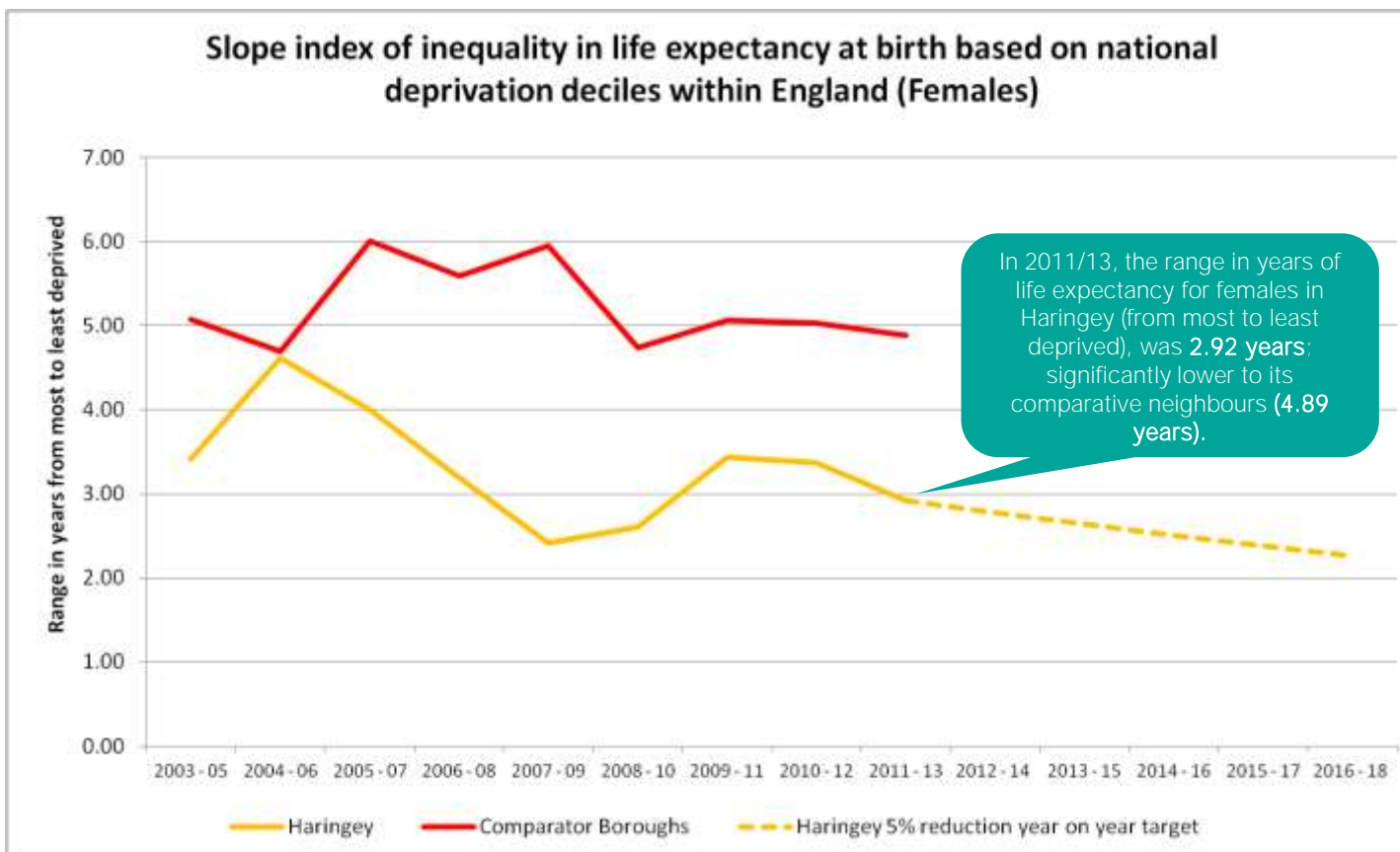
Outcome indicator:

Reduce the inequality gap in life expectancy for males and females.



Target:

To oversee a 5% year on year reduction in the slope index of inequality of life expectancy years across the social gradient within Haringey (from most to least deprived) by 2018.



What does the data say ?

Haringey has a lower inequality gap in life expectancy across the borough for females and the trend is decreasing. The aim is to further reduce this gap by 5% each year until 2018.

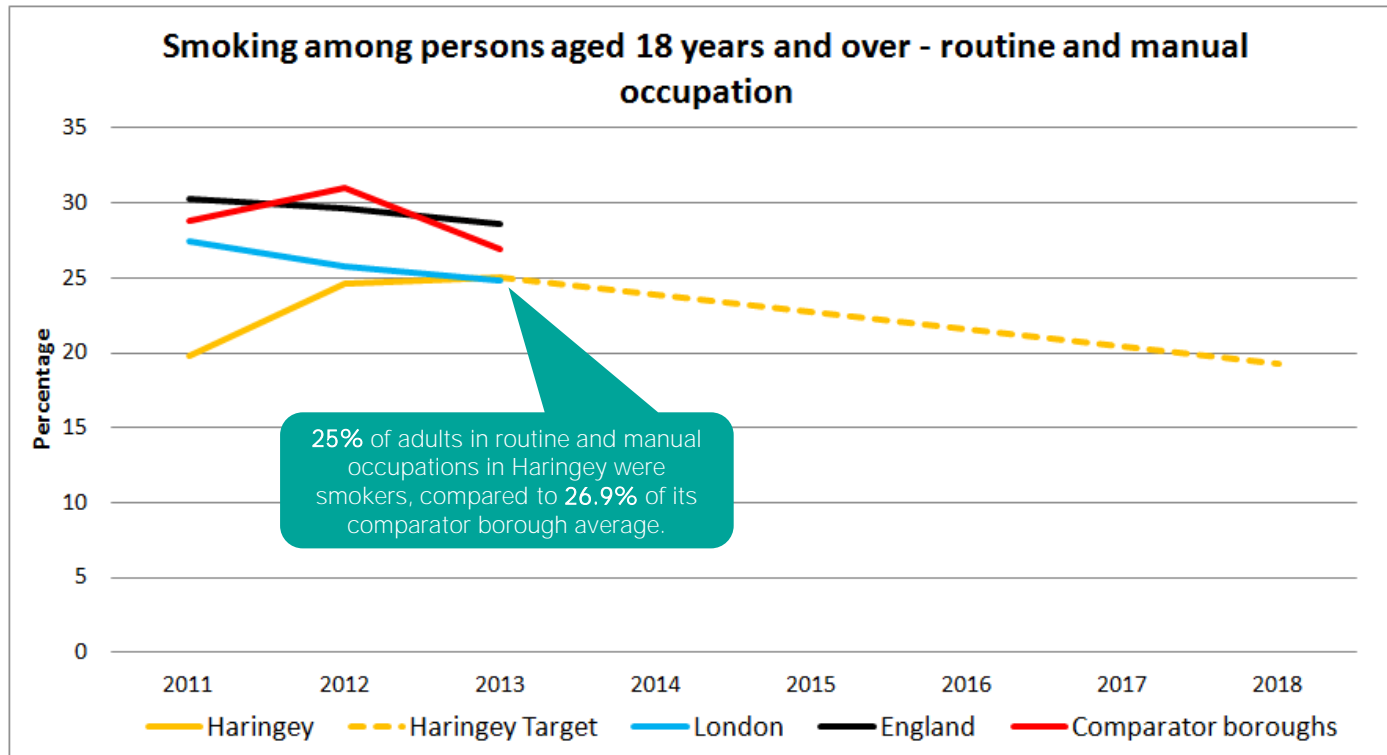
Outcome indicator:

Reduce smoking prevalence in adults.



Target:

To reduce smoking prevalence in adults to 19.26% by 2018.



What does the data say ?

The number of smokers aged 18 and over in routine and manual occupations currently stands at 25%. It is below the comparator borough average and is similar to the London average. The aim is to reduce smoking prevalence further in those occupational groups, which will also have a positive impact in reducing inequalities in life expectancy.

All residents will be as healthy as possible for as long as possible.



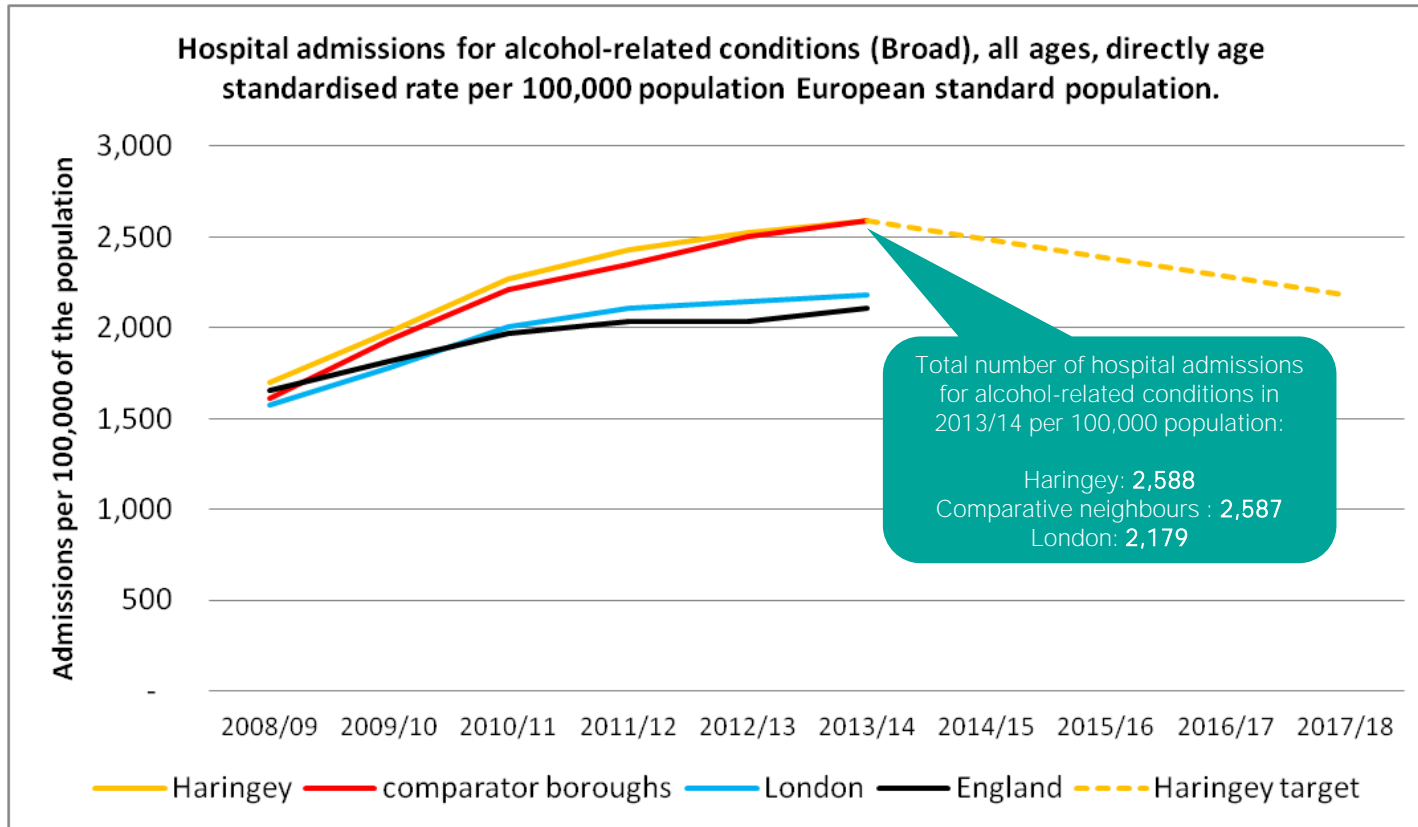
Outcome indicator:

Hospital admissions for alcohol-related conditions (Broad), all ages, directly age standardised rate per 100,000 population European standard population.



Target:

Reduce hospital admissions for alcohol related conditions (Broad) in Haringey to current (2013/14) London rate (2,179 admissions per 100,000 - age standardised rate) by 2017/2018.



What does the data say ?

Alcohol related hospital admissions rates per 100,000 population are higher in Haringey than the London and England average. Haringey aims to reduce these admissions to bring it in line with the London average by 2018.

Outcome indicator:

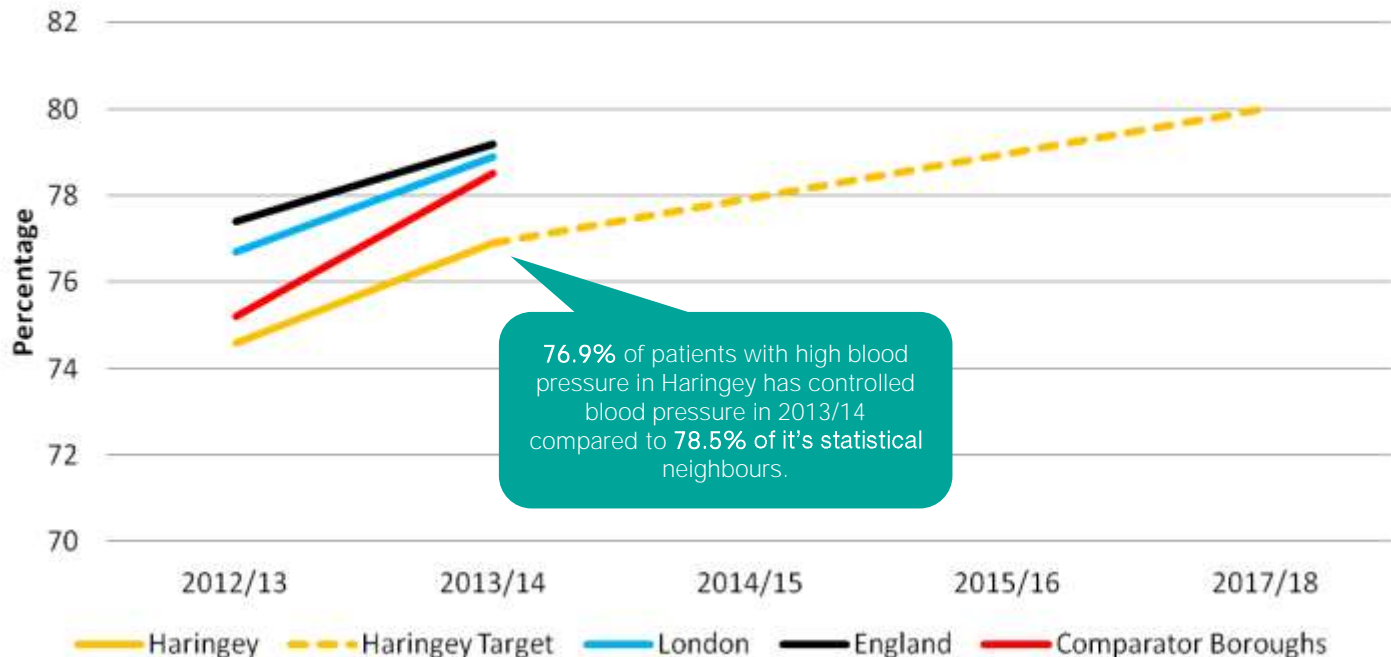
Increase in the proportion of people with high blood pressure, whose blood pressure is controlled.



Target:

Increase the percentage of people whose blood pressure is controlled (those with high blood pressure) to 80% by 2017/2018 (currently 76.9% - 2013/2014).

Percentage of patients with hypertension in whom the last blood pressure reading is 150/90 mmHG or less



What does the data say ?

This indicator focuses on those people with identified high blood pressure, who have their blood pressure under control. The aim is to increase proportion of people with controlled high blood pressure to 80% by 2018.

Objective 1:

All residents will be as healthy as possible for as long as possible.



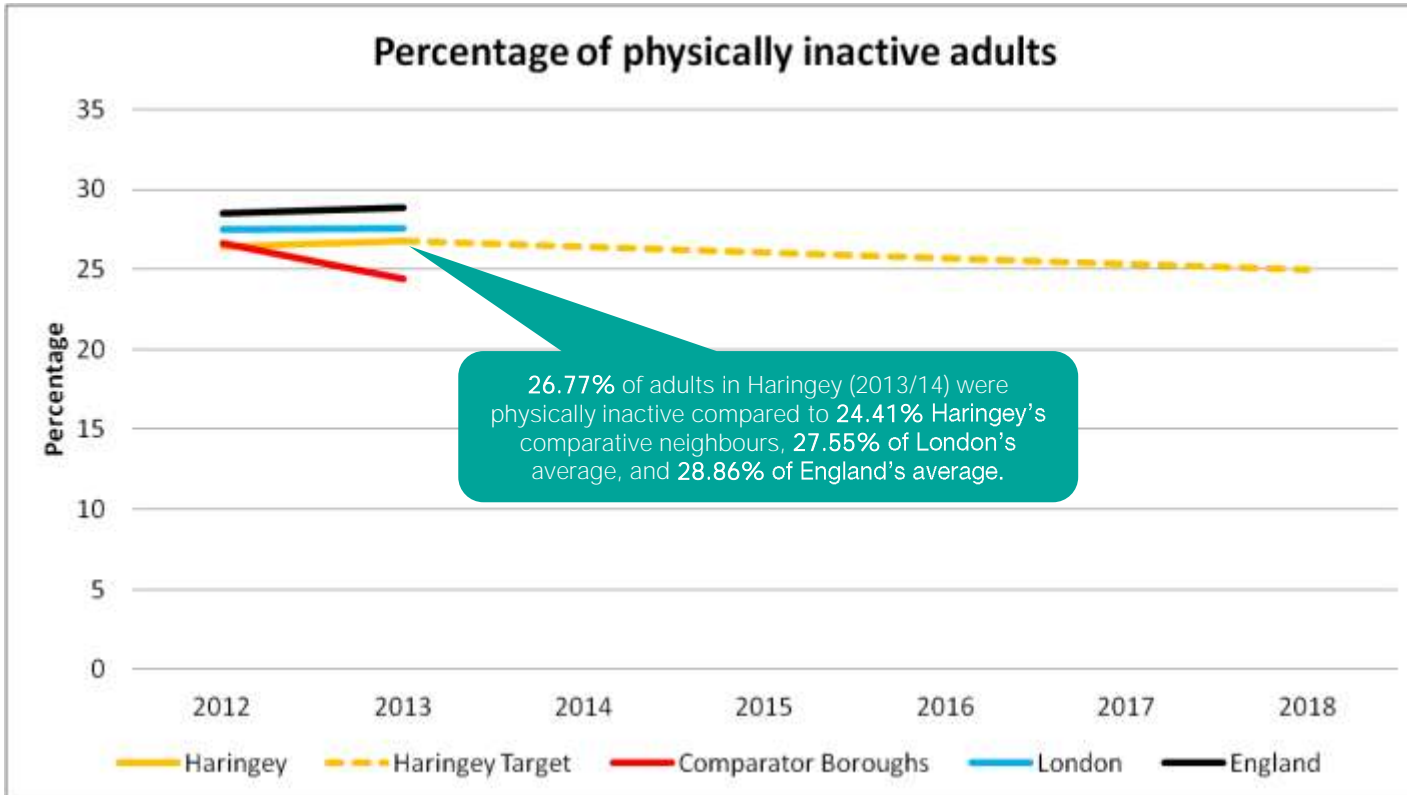
Outcome indicator:

Decrease proportion of adults recorded as physically inactive.



Target:

Reduce the proportion of physically inactive adults in Haringey to 25% by 2018 (current = 26.77%) – *Health and Wellbeing target.*



What does the data say ?

Proportion of physically inactive adults in Haringey is lower than the England and London average, and the aim is to reduce this proportion further to 25% by 2018. This will have a positive impact in helping all residents live long, healthy fulfilling lives; reducing strokes and the life expectancy gap across the borough.

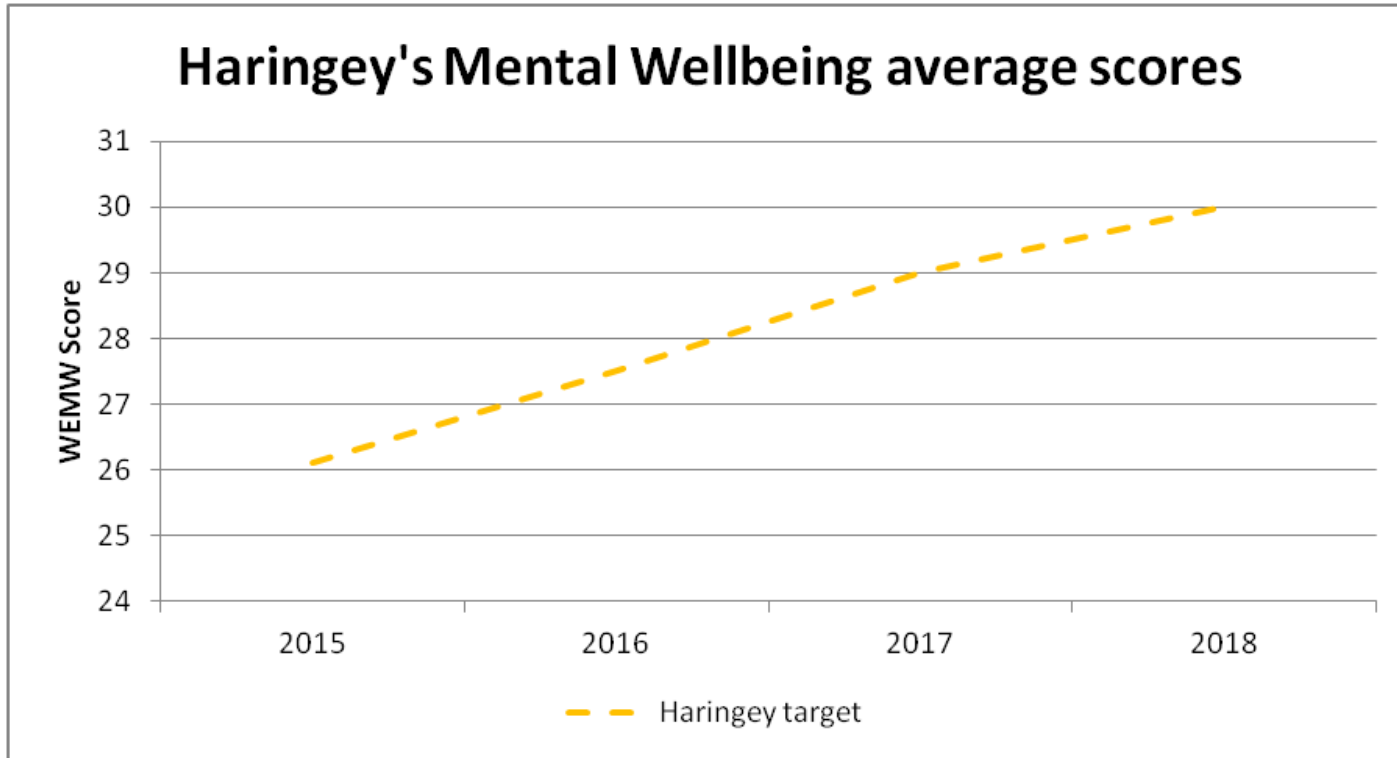
Principal Indicator:

Average score of Haringey adults on the Short Warwick-Edinburgh Mental Wellbeing Scale.



Target:

Increase in the average Warwick-Edinburgh wellbeing score to 30 by 2018.



What does the data say ?

Average Mental Wellbeing score for adults in Haringey measured by a survey across the borough was 26.1. This is a moderate score (highest possible is 36). The aim is to increase our average score to 30 (high) by 2018.

Outcome indicator:

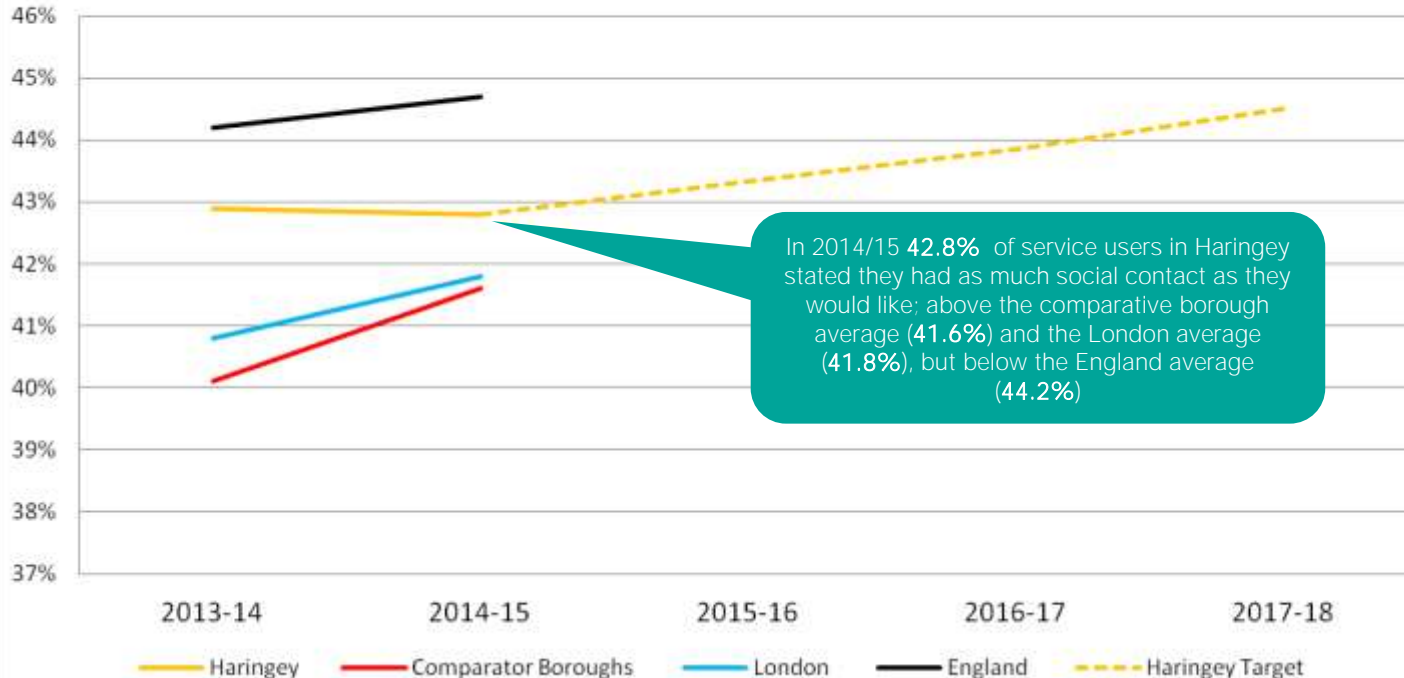
Adult Social Care Survey – Social Isolation.



Target:

Increase the percentage of people who use services with their care and support, who state that they have as much social contact as they would like.

Percentage of people who use services with their care and support, who state that they have as much social contact as they would like



What does the data say ?

Taken from the annual Adult Social Care Survey, the percentage of people who state that they have as much social contact as they would like has risen since 2013/14. A target of 44.5% has been set to bring Haringey in line with the top London quartile.

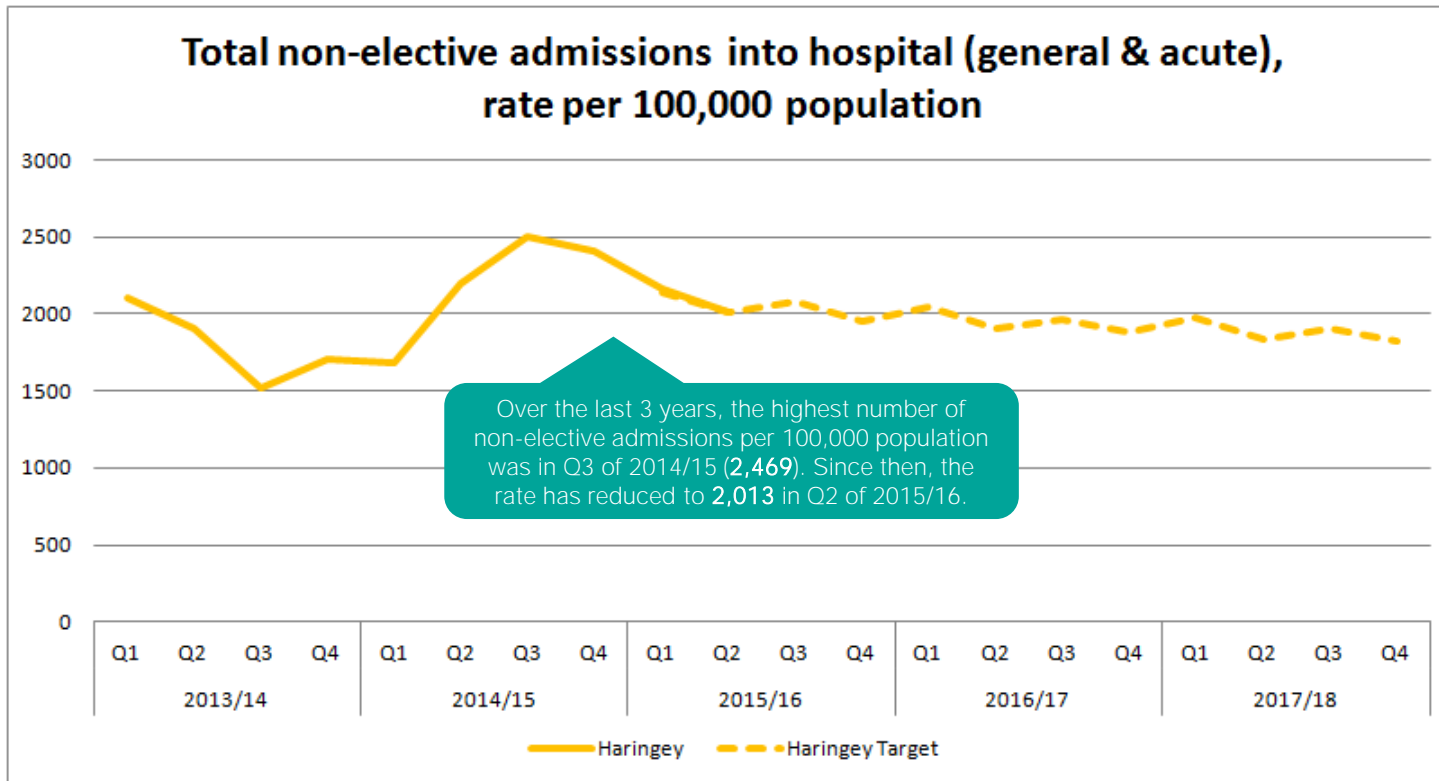
Principal Indicator:

Reduce total Non-elective admissions to hospital by 3.5%.



Target:

To reduce 3.4% per year to 2018.



What does the data say ?

Non-elective admissions in Haringey are decreasing, and a further ambitious target has been set to reduce the number of non elective admissions by 3.4% each year until 2018. This indicator shows the whole system integrated approach to prevention and early intervention within the community and primary care.

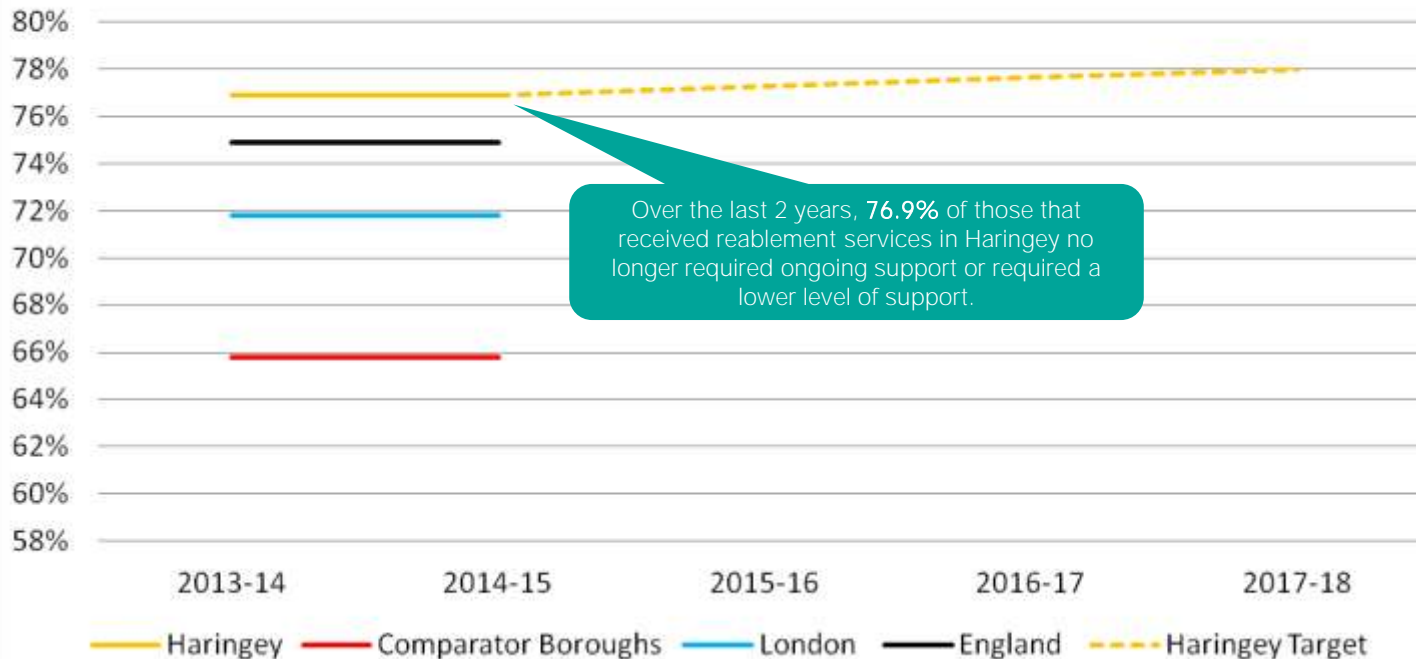


Outcome Indicator:
Outcome of short term services (Reablement) For new people.



Target:
To increase the Percentage of those that received Reablement services during the year, where the outcome was either no ongoing support or support of a lower level to 78% by 2018.

Outcome of short term services (Reablement) for new people



What does the data say ?

Since the aim of short-term services is to reable people and promote their independence, this measure will provide evidence of good outcomes in delaying dependency on long terms services.

Outcome Indicator:

Increasing Reablement for existing service users



Target:

To increase the take up of Reablement to existing service users by 10% year on year

What does the data say ?

This indicator is currently under development, and will measure the number of existing service users, who will be offered Reablement services, in order to reduce the reliance on a need for long term services.

Outcome Indicator:

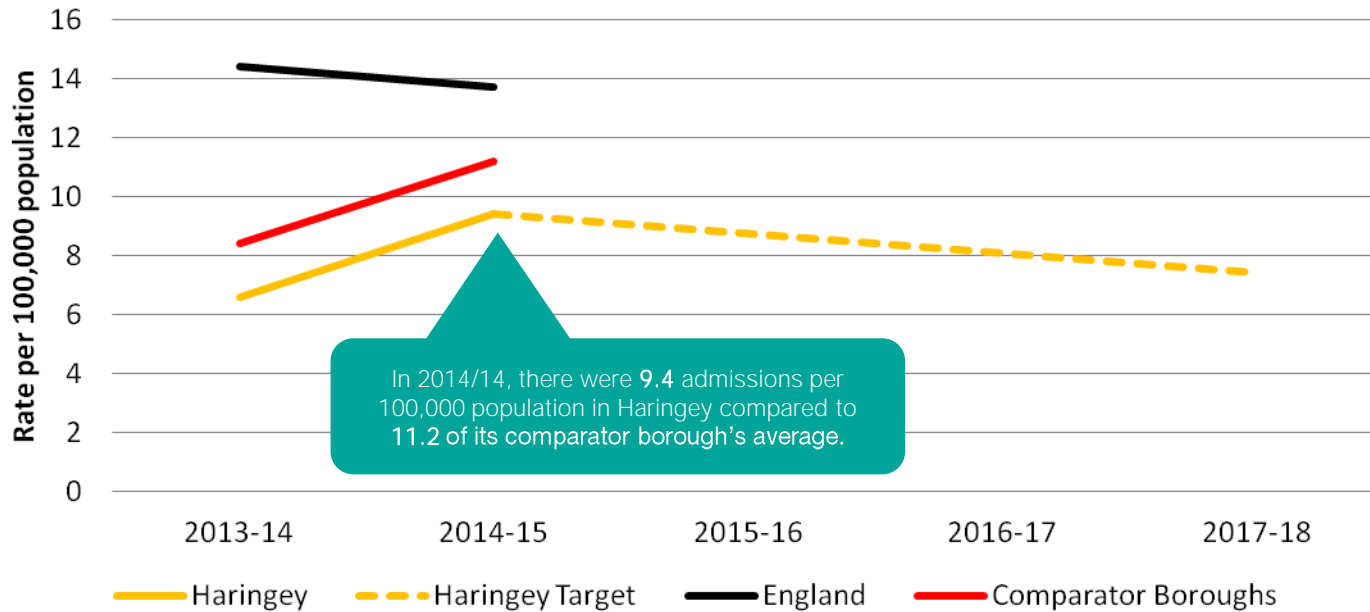
Reduction in permanent residential admissions for the 18-64 population



Target:

To reduce the rate of residential admissions to levels inline with the London top quartile of 7.4 per 100,000 population by 2018

Permanent residential admissions per 100,000 population : 18-64 age group



What does the data say ?

Haringey are currently performing above the comparator borough and London average. Prior to the introduction of the Care Act 2014, those people admitted into permanent residential and nursing care, who did not bear a cost to the Council were not included in the admissions figures. These admissions will be included as from 1st April 2014.

Objective 3:

Support will be provided at an earlier stage to residents who have difficulty in maintaining their health and wellbeing.



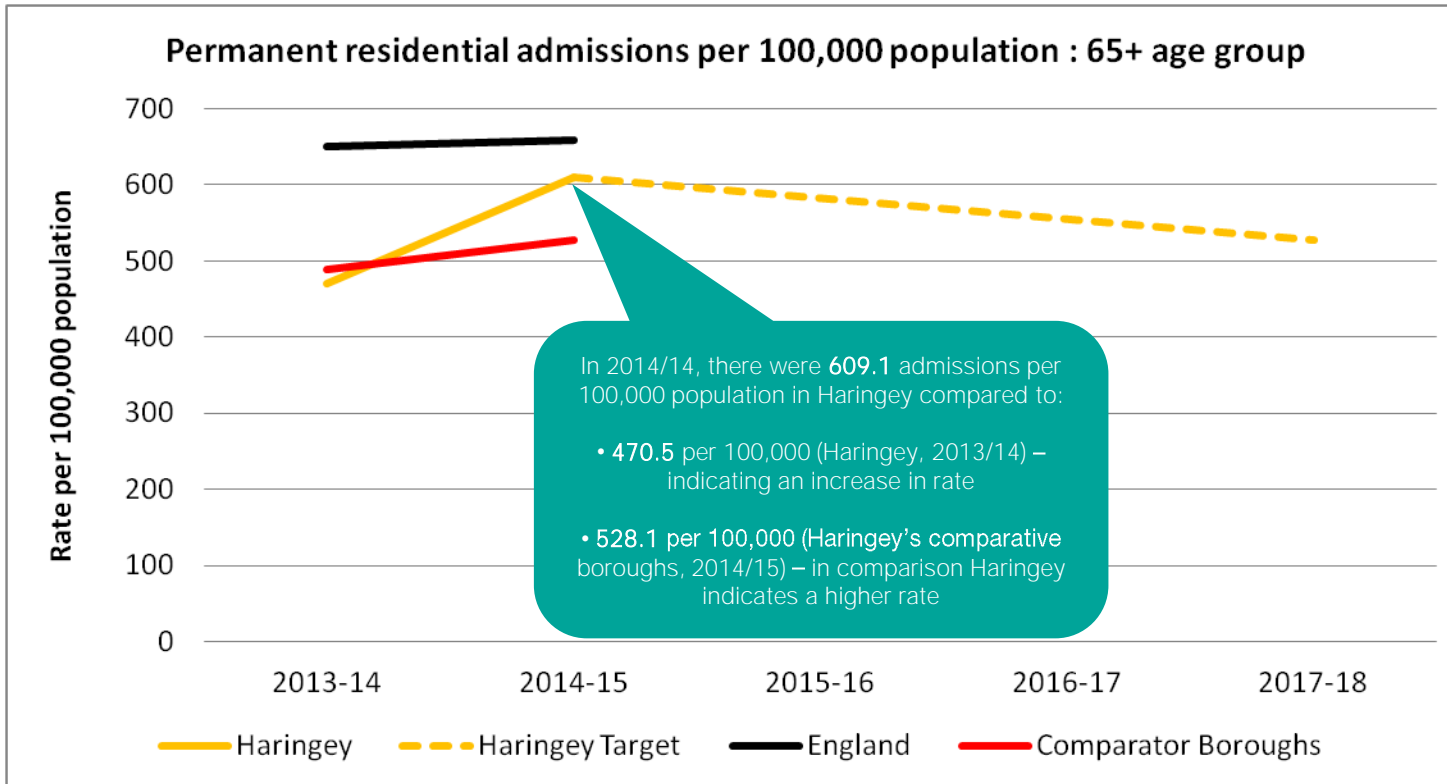
Outcome Indicator:

Reduction in permanent residential admissions for the 65+ population.



Target:

To reduce the rate of residential admissions to levels inline with the London average of 528 per 100,000 population by 2018.



What does the data say ?

Demand for residential care is ever increasing for people aged 65 and over. Prior to the introduction of the Care Act 2014, those people admitted into permanent residential and nursing care, who did not bear a cost to the Council were not included in the admissions figures. These admissions will be included as from 1st April 2014.

Support will be provided at an earlier stage to residents who have difficulty in maintaining their health and wellbeing.



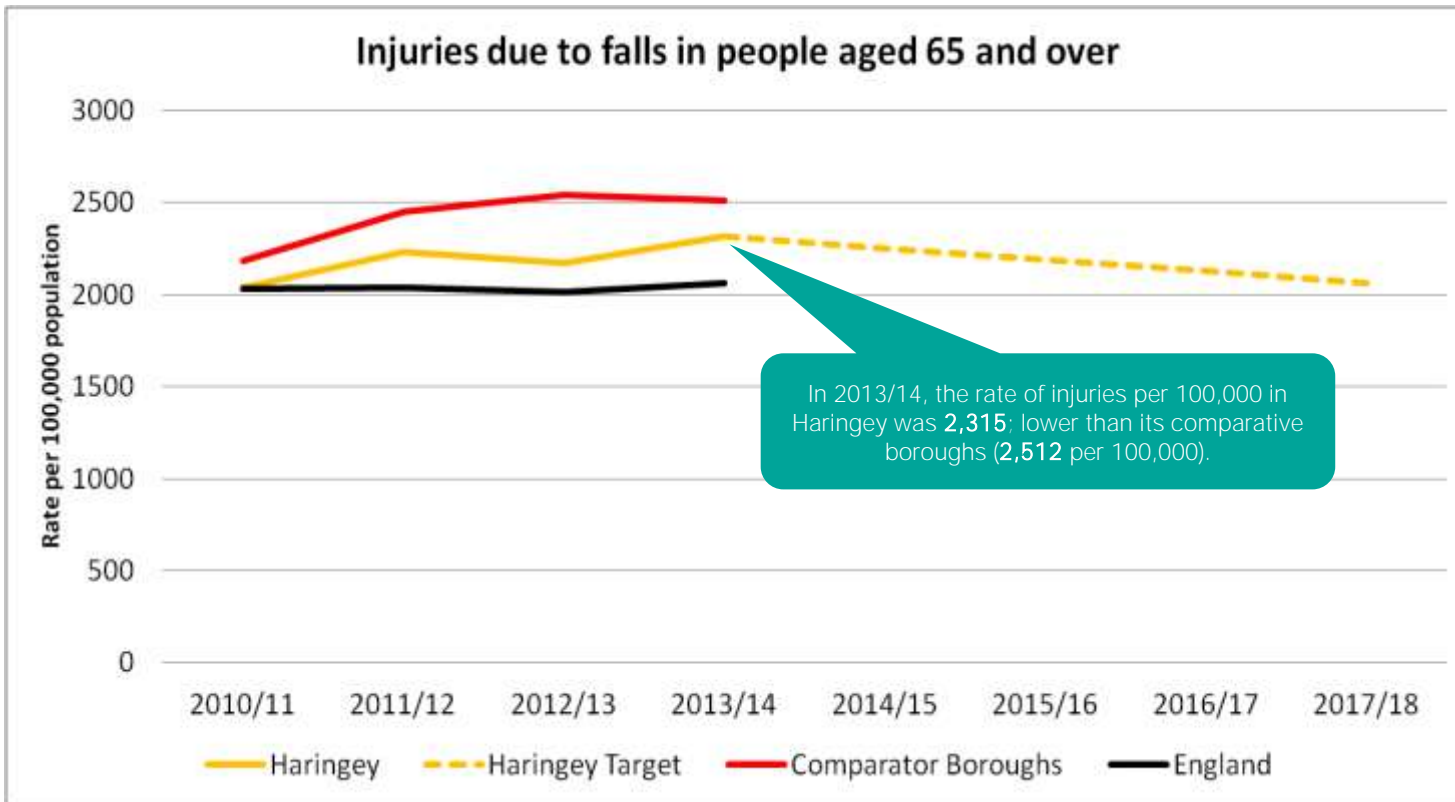
Outcome Indicator:

Reduction in the rate of hospital admissions for falls in people aged 65+.



Target:

Reduce injuries due to falls in people aged 65 and over to 2064.26 per 100,000 population by 2018 (in line with the current England performance).



What does the data say ?

The number of injuries due to falls is currently higher than the England average, however Haringey is performing higher than its comparator boroughs. The aim is to bring Haringey in line with the England average performance by 2018. Decrease in falls is a good indicator of prevention measures within the community settings.

Outcome Indicator:

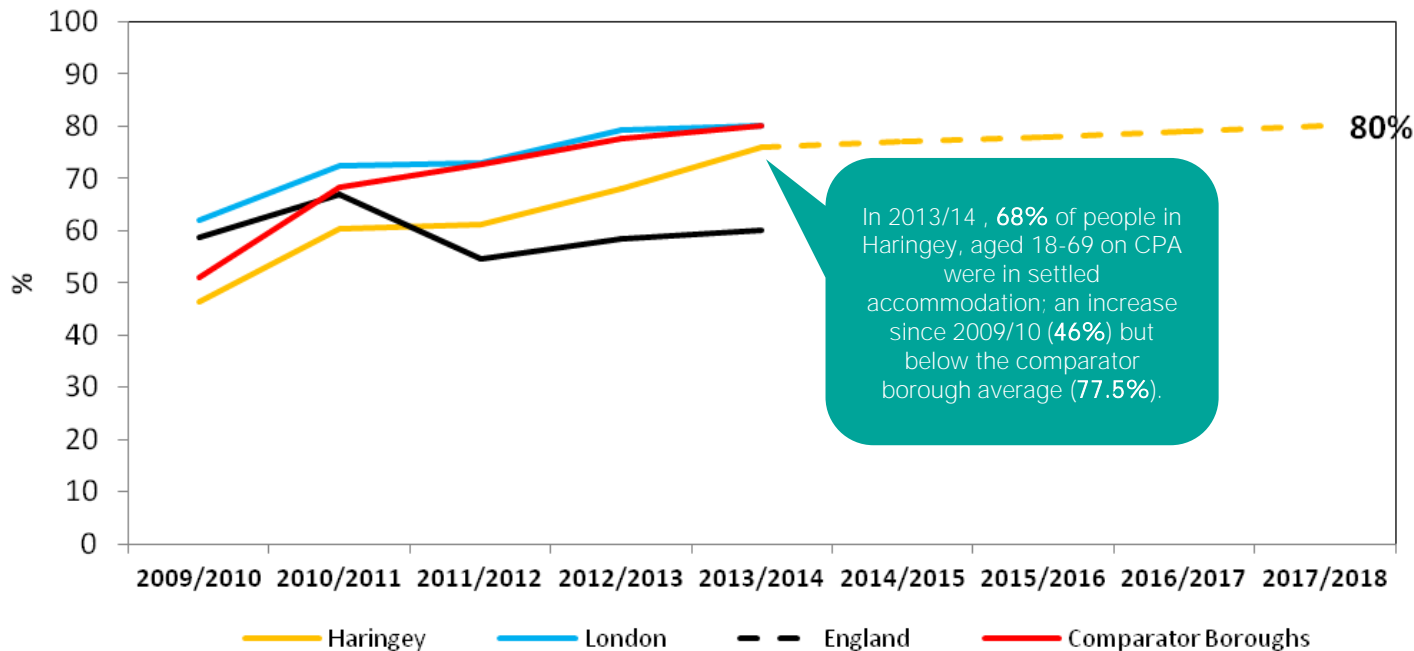
Mental Health people in accommodation and employment.



Target:

Increase the percentage of adults with severe mental illness, receiving the Care Programme Approach in settled accommodation to 80% by 2018.

Percentage of people aged 18-69 on CPA in settled accommodation



What does the data say ?

Haringey are currently performing below the comparator borough average and London average for this indicator. The aim is to increase the percentage of people on a Care Programme Approach living in settled accommodation to 80% by 2018, in order to bring it in line with its' comparator boroughs.

Objective 3:

Support will be provided at an earlier stage to residents who have difficulty in maintaining their health and wellbeing.



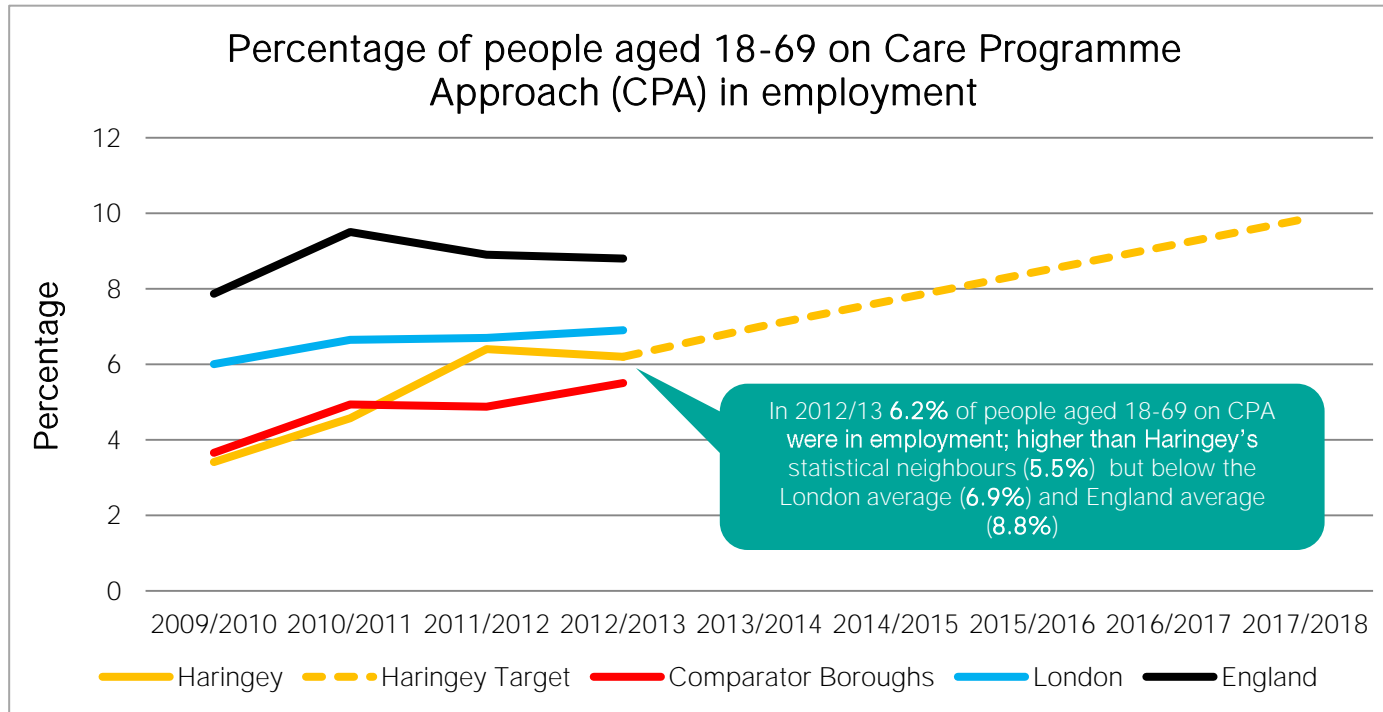
Outcome Indicator:

Increase the percentage of people with mental health in settled accommodation and employment.



Target:

Increase the percentage of adults with severe mental illness, receiving the Care Programme Approach in employment to the current top quartile percentage of 9.85 by 2018.



What does the data say ?

Haringey are currently performing below the London average for this indicator. The aim is to increase the percentage of people on a Care Programme Approach in employment to 9.85% by 2018. This indicator is supported by Individual Placement Support initiative.

Outcome Indicator:

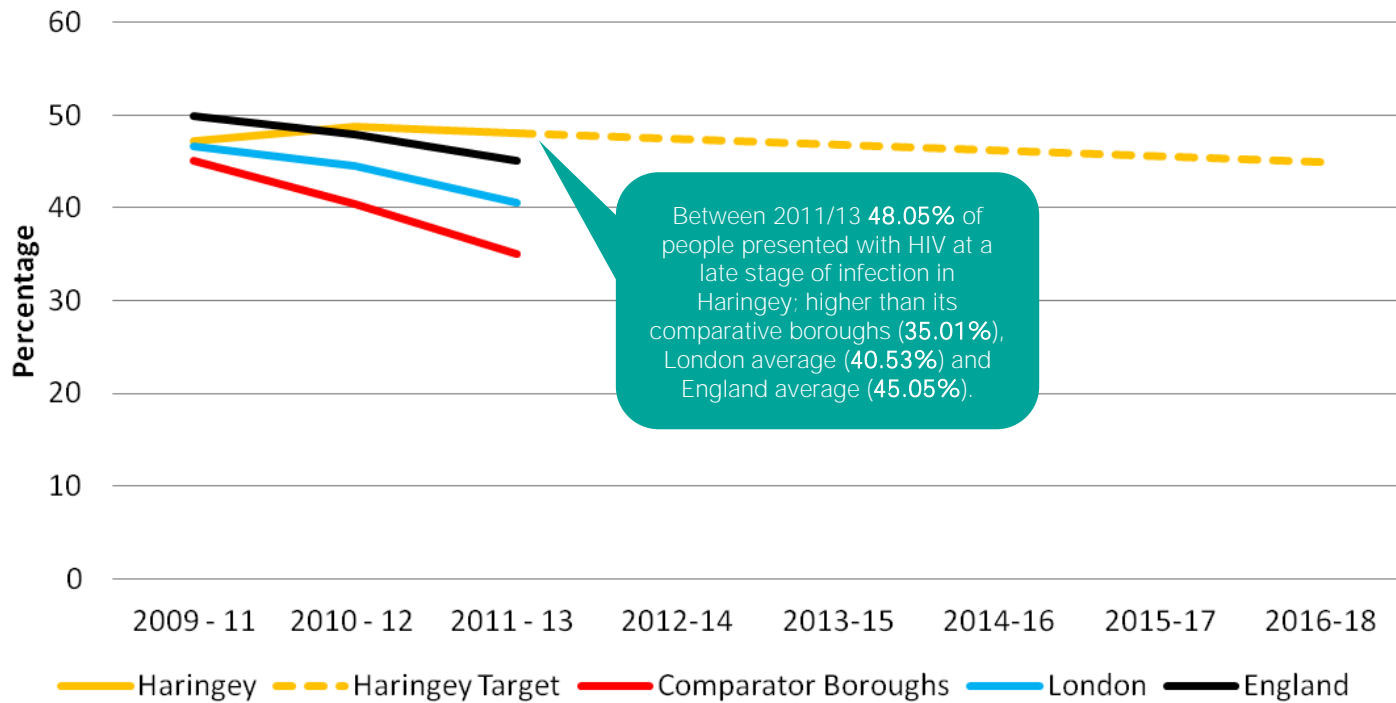
Reduction in late HIV diagnosis.



Target:

Reduce the proportion of people presenting with HIV at late stage of infection to 45% by 2018.

Percentage of people presenting with HIV at late stage of infection



What does the data say ?

Haringey is currently performing below the comparator borough and London average. A target to reduce the proportion of people presenting with HIV at late stage of infection to 45% by 2018, has been set for this indicator supported by a number of initiatives promoting early detection and diagnosis.

Outcome Indicator:

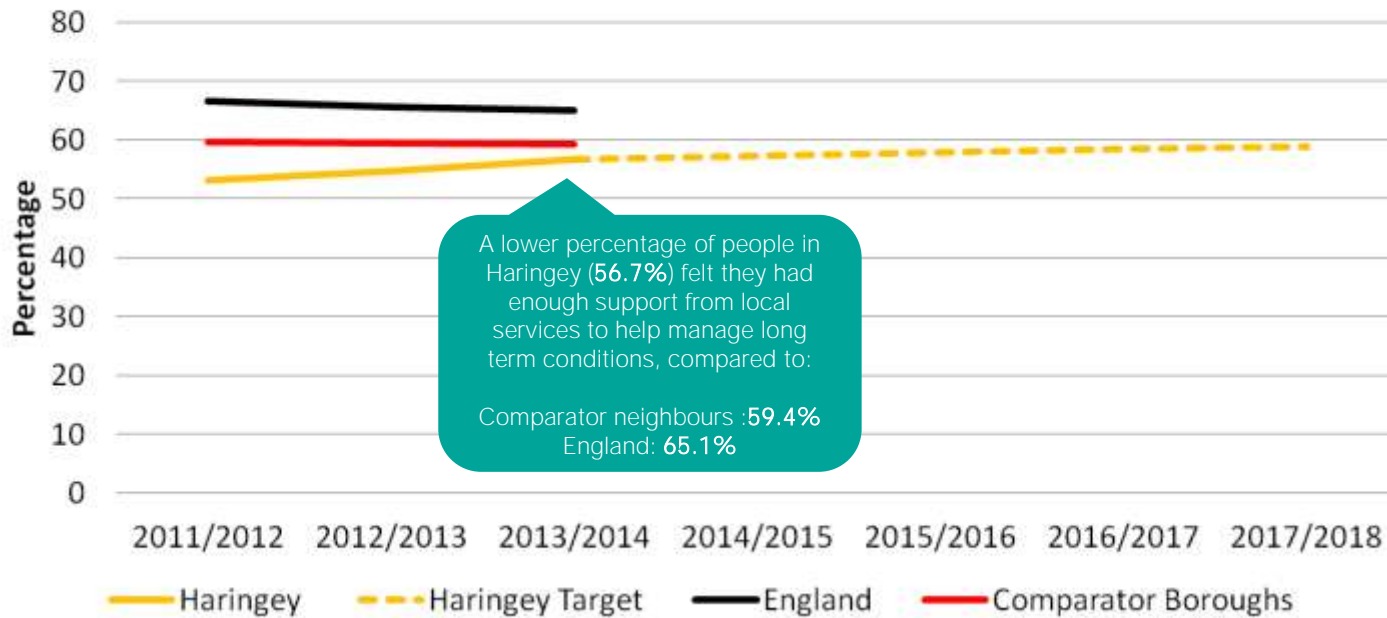
Increase the percentage of people who have support to manage long term health conditions.



Target:

Increase the percentage of people in the last 6 months who have enough support from local services/organisations to help manage long term health condition to 59% by 2018 (in line with the Better Care Fund).

Percentage of people in the last 6 months, who have enough support from local services/ organisations to help manage long-term conditions



A lower percentage of people in Haringey (56.7%) felt they had enough support from local services to help manage long term conditions, compared to:

Comparator neighbours :59.4%
England: 65.1%

What does the data say ?

Taken from the GP patient survey, the percentage of people stating they have enough support from local services/organisations to help manage long term health condition is slightly below the comparator borough and England average.

Residents assessed as needing formal care and / or health support will receive responsive, high quality services.



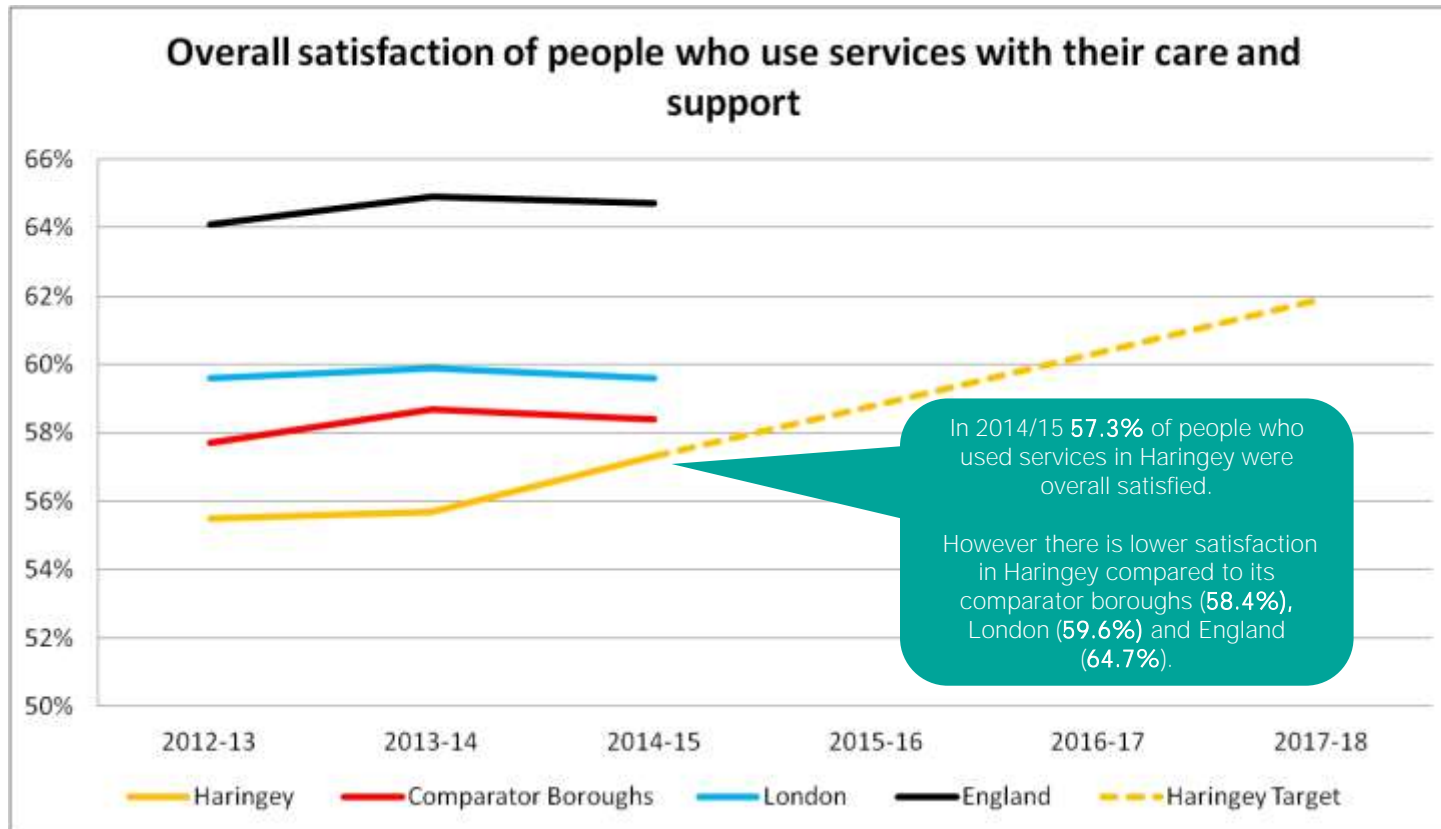
Principal Indicator:

Overall satisfaction of people who use services with care and support.



Target:

To achieve a 61.9% satisfaction rate by 2018.



What does the data say ?

Taken from the annual Adult Social Care Survey, overall satisfaction of people who use services with their care and support has increased year on year since 2012/13. A target of 61.9% has been set to bring Haringey in line with the top London quartile.

Objective 4:

Residents assessed as needing formal care and / or health support will receive responsive, high quality services.



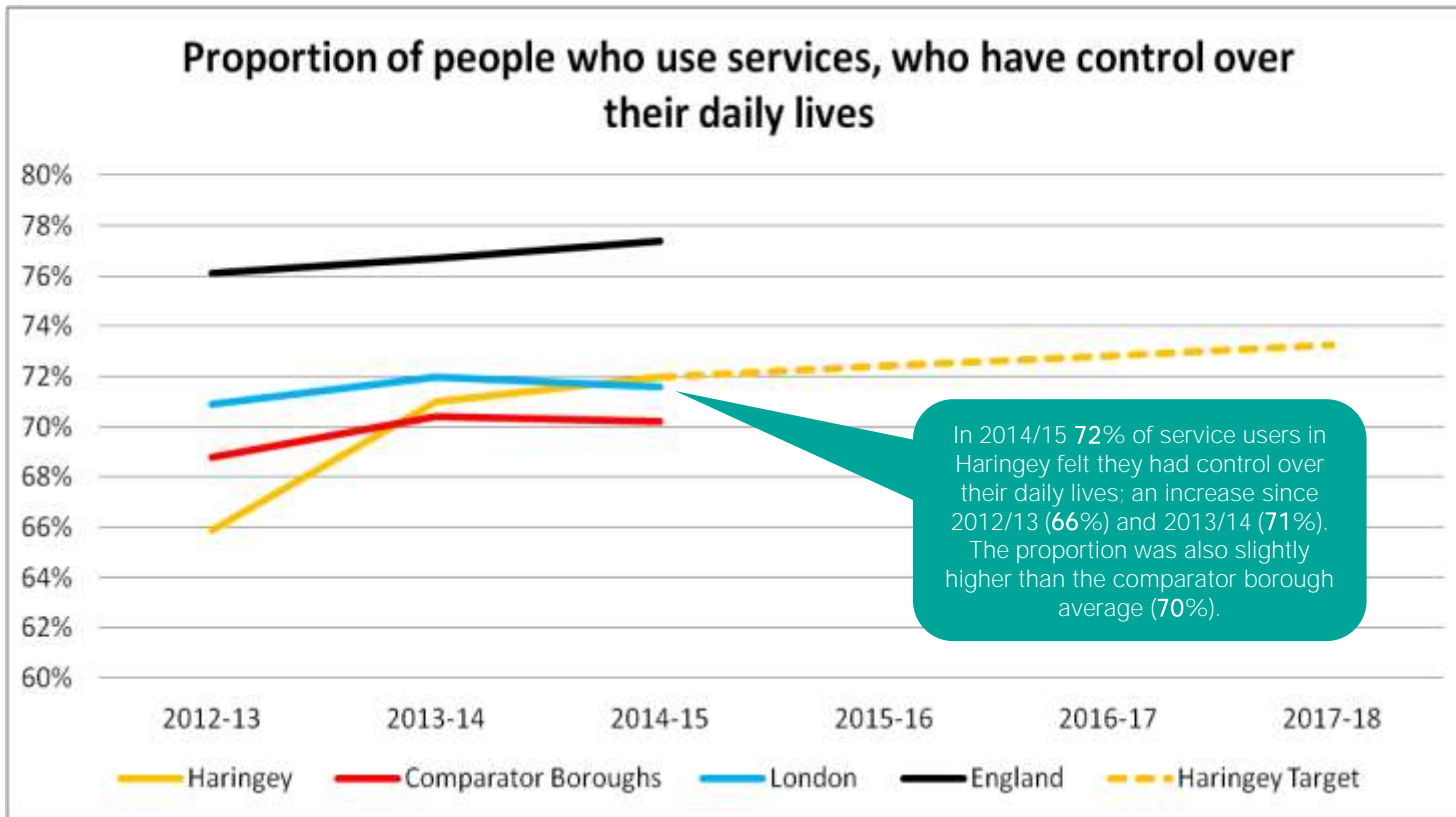
Outcome Indicator:

Proportion of People who use services, who have control over their daily life.



Target:

To achieve a 73.25% percentage outturn by 2018.



What does the data say ?

Taken from the annual Adult Social Care Survey, the number of people who receive services, and state that they have control over their daily life, has increased year on year since 2012/13. A target of 73.25% has been set to bring Haringey in line with the top London quartile.

Objective 4:

Residents assessed as needing formal care and / or health support will receive responsive, high quality services.



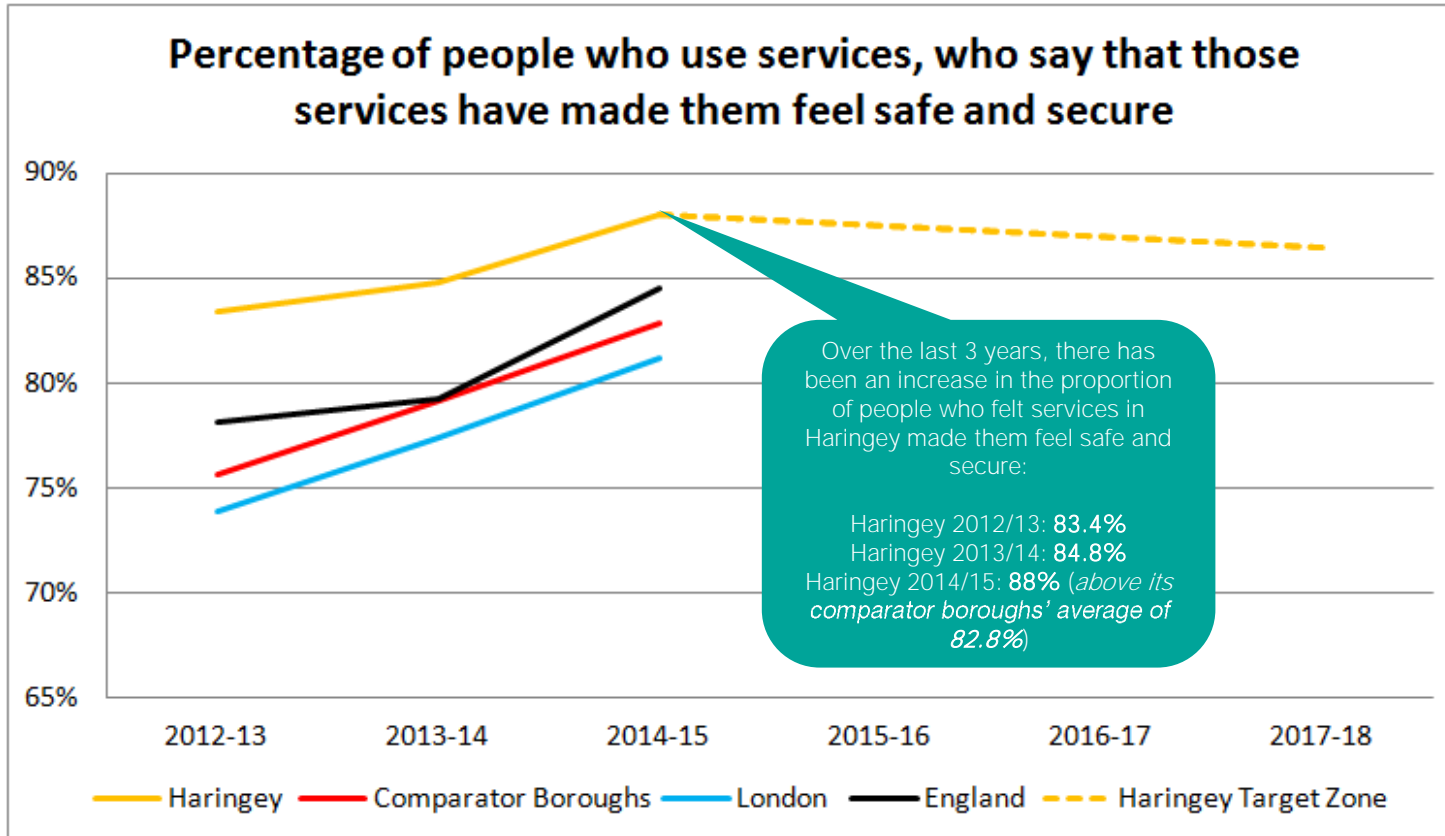
Outcome Indicator:

Proportion of people who use services, who say that those services have made them feel safe and secure.



Target:

To maintain a satisfaction rate of 86.45% by 2018.



What does the data say ?

Taken from the annual Adult Social Care Survey, the number of people who receive services, who say that those services have made them feel safe and secure, has increased year on year since 2012/13. Already in the top London quartile, Haringey have set a target to maintain a high level of satisfaction of at least 86.45% by 2018.

Vulnerable adults will be safeguarded from abuse.



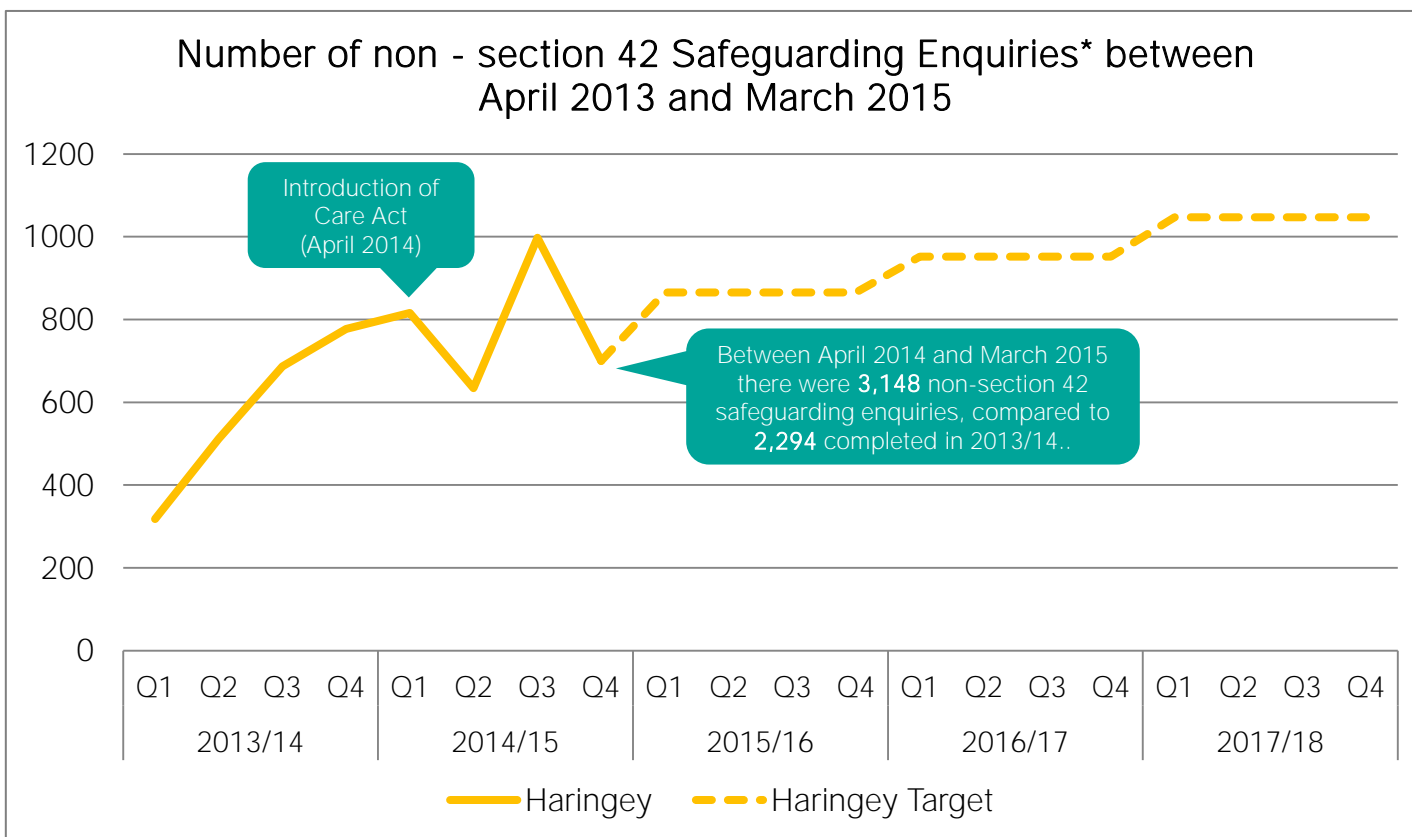
Principal Indicator:

Non Section 42 Safeguarding Enquiries to increase.



Target:

Increase the number of non section 42 safeguarding enquiries by 10% each year until 2018.



What does the data say ?

The introduction of the Care Act has witnessed a change to the Adult Safeguarding process. *The Section 42 criteria was introduced in 2014, and relates to cases which are investigated by the Council where the relevant thresholds apply. For reporting purposes, cases which did not require safeguarding intervention Prior to April 2014, will fall under the 'non section 42' criteria. These cases have increased steadily year on year, through improved safeguarding awareness campaigns.

Outcome Indicator:

Meet the outcomes defined by the person subject to a safeguarding intervention.



Target:

New indicator with no previous benchmarking. Suggest this is built into the workflow, and increase by 20% year on year.

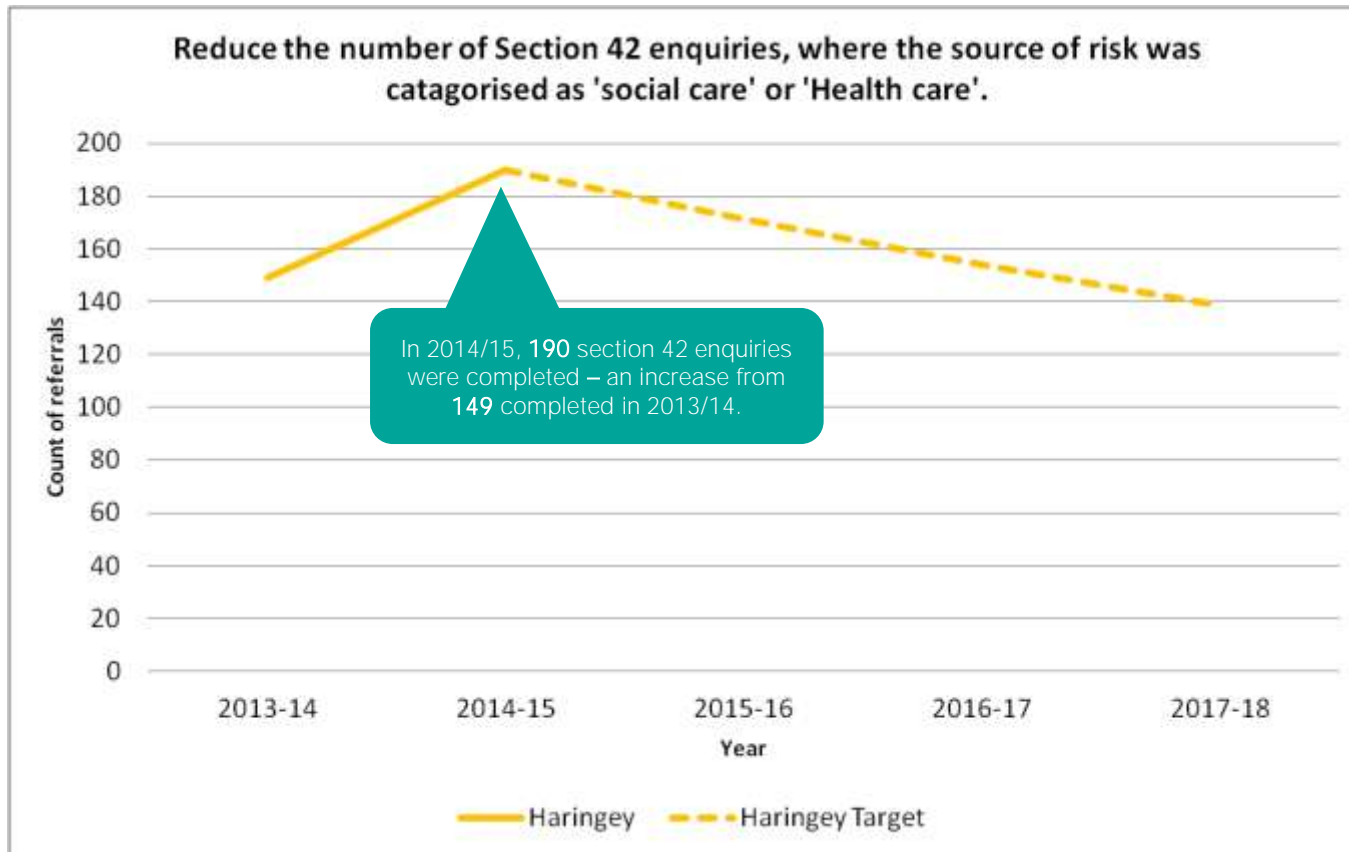
Outcome Indicator:

Reduce the number of section 42 enquiries, where the source of risk was categorised as 'Social Care' or 'Health Care'.



Target:

Reduce the number of Safeguarding Concerns by 10% year on year where the source of risk was identifies as being either Health or Social Care.



What does the data say ?

The 'source of risk' refers to the perpetrator of the alleged abuse. Haringey aim to reduce the number of Section 42 enquiries made against social care or Health related staff, or commissioned based services.
