Objective 1:

To strengthen partnerships and together work with our communities to improve their environment, enable people to feel safe and proud of where they live and work, particularly through reducing anti social behavioural and environmental crime.



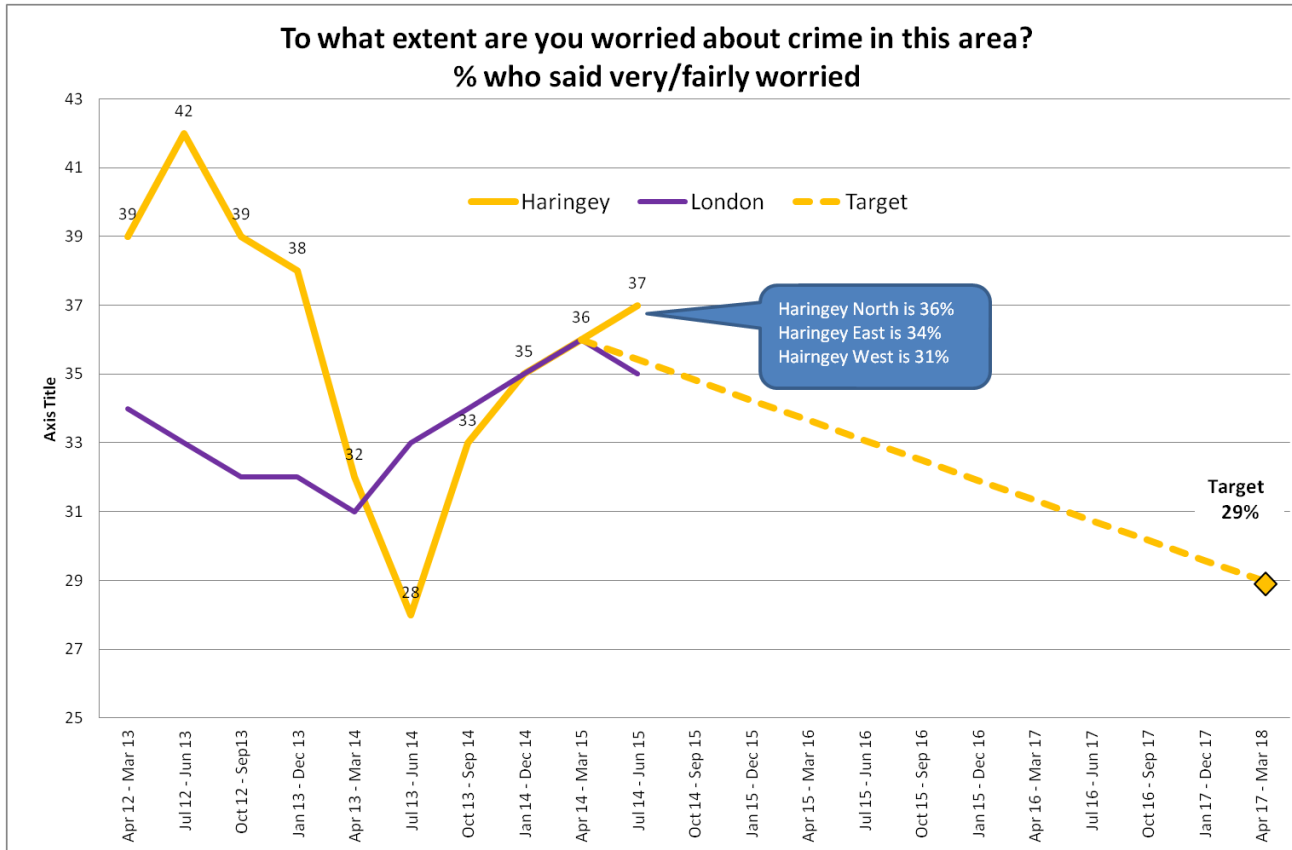
Outcome Indicator:

Public attitude survey: to what extent are you worried about crime in the area?



Target:

Haringey, East, North and West to all be down to 29% by 2018



What does the data say?

The Haringey figure is based on a rolling 12 months and the Haringey North / East and West figures are a rolling 24 month.

In the last year fear of crime in Haringey has increased faster than the London average



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Objective 2:

To make our streets, parks and estates clean, well maintained and safe



Outcome Indicator:

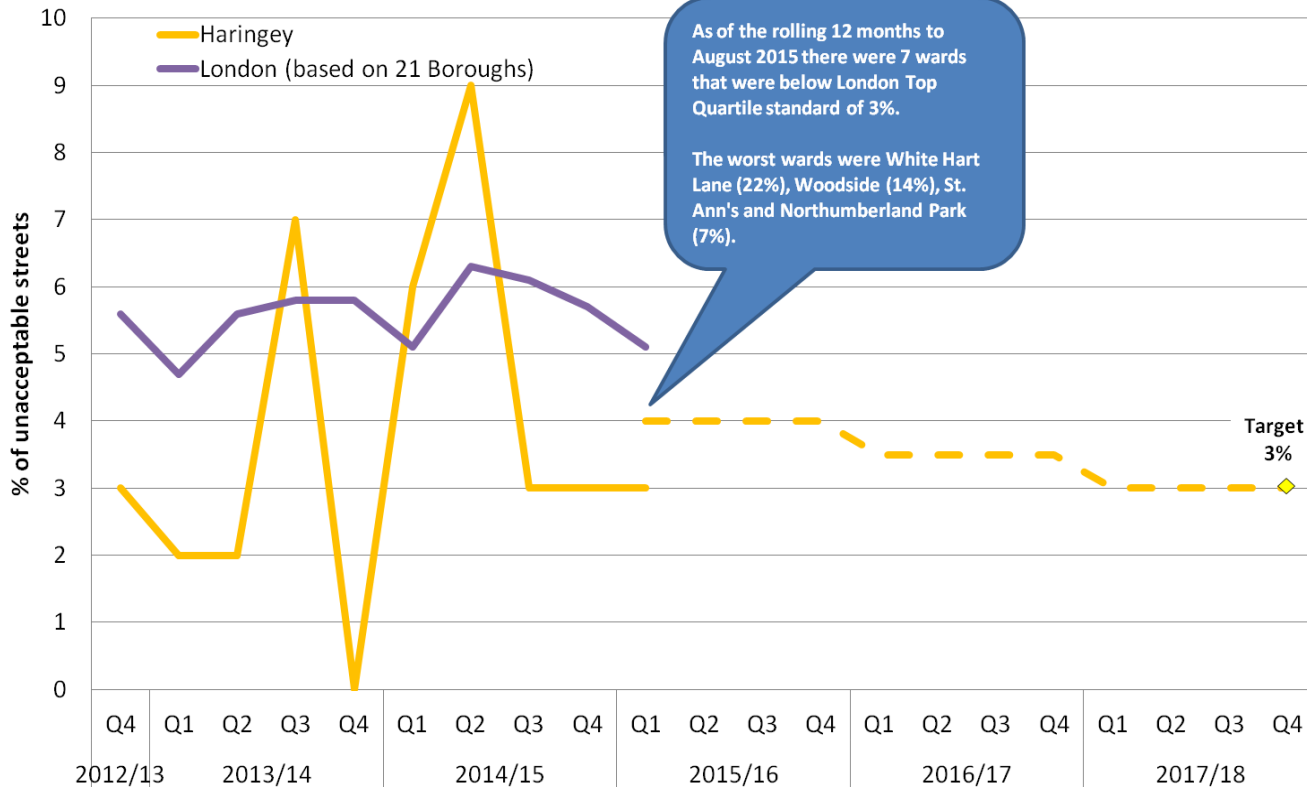
Improved street and environmental cleanliness, levels of litter (low is better performance)



Target:

Levels of litter will reduce to 3% by 2018 with all areas in Haringey to be London Top Quartile standard

Percentage of streets assessed as unacceptable levels of environmental cleanliness and litter (NI195a)



What does the data say?

Haringey's current performance is the 5th best out of the 21 London Boroughs who input data to the London Authority Performance Solution.



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Objective 2:

To make our streets, parks and estates clean, well maintained and safe



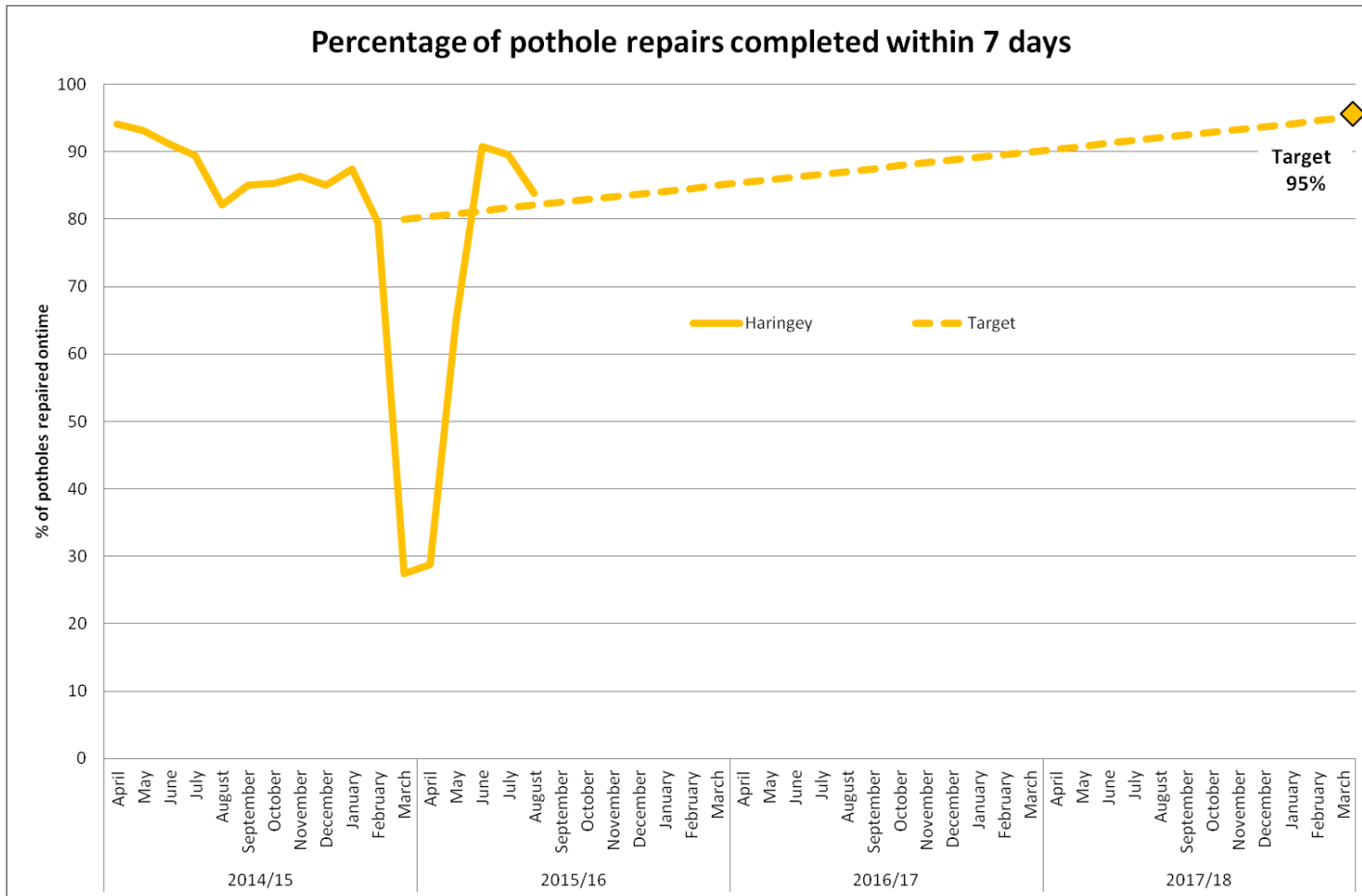
Outcome Indicator:

Percentage of pothole repairs completed within 7 days.



Target:

95% by 2018



What does the data say?

Ringway Jacobs prepared a recovery plan to deal with the drop in performance in March and April.

Since June performance has been back above target.

Outcome Indicator:

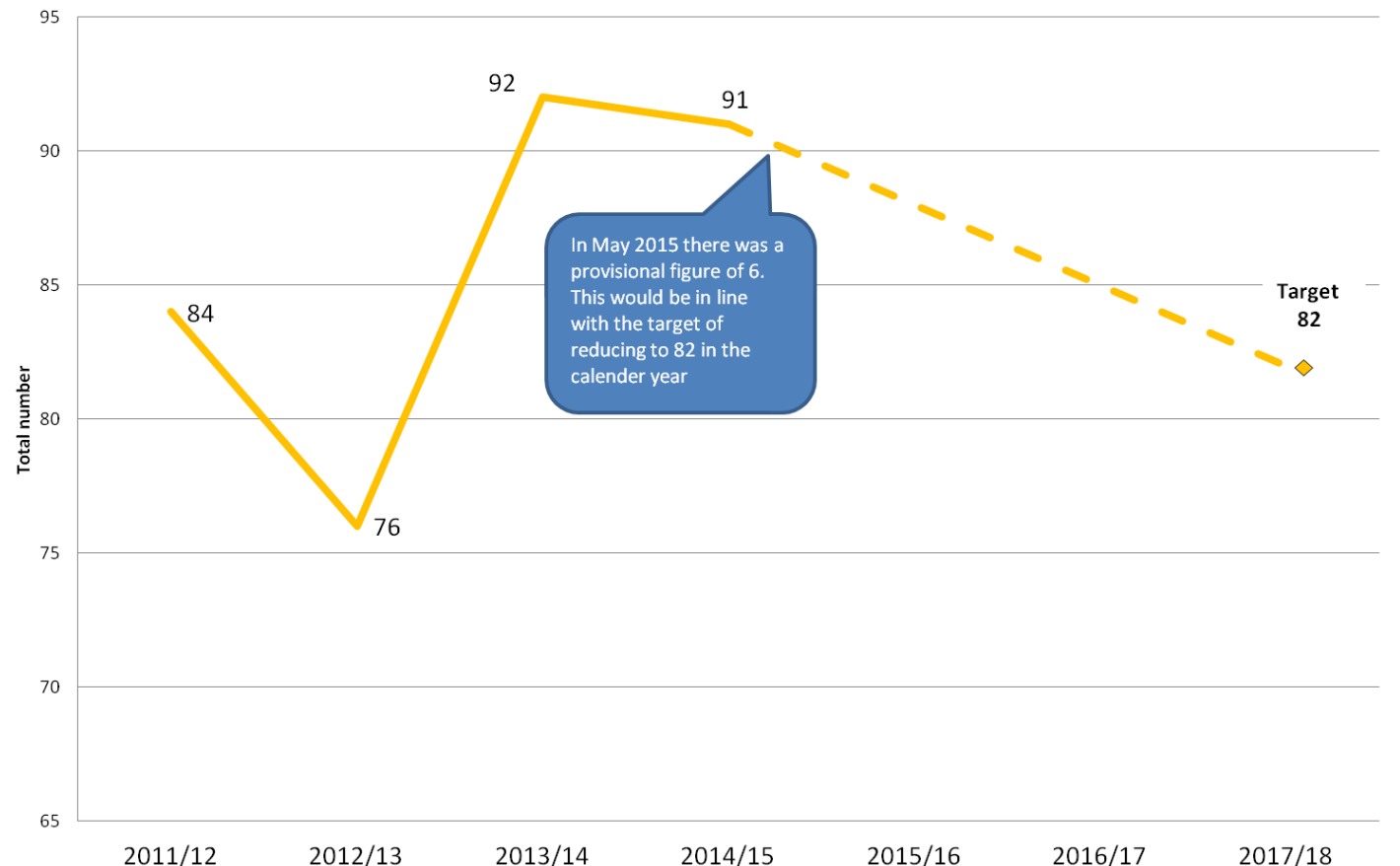
Number of people killed and seriously injured in road accidents



Target:

10% reduction by 2018

Number of people killed and seriously injured in road accidents in Haringey



What does the data say?

This is 37.1 per 100,000 population which is the 8th lowest performance in London. (rolling 3 year average)

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Objective 3:

Outcome Indicator:

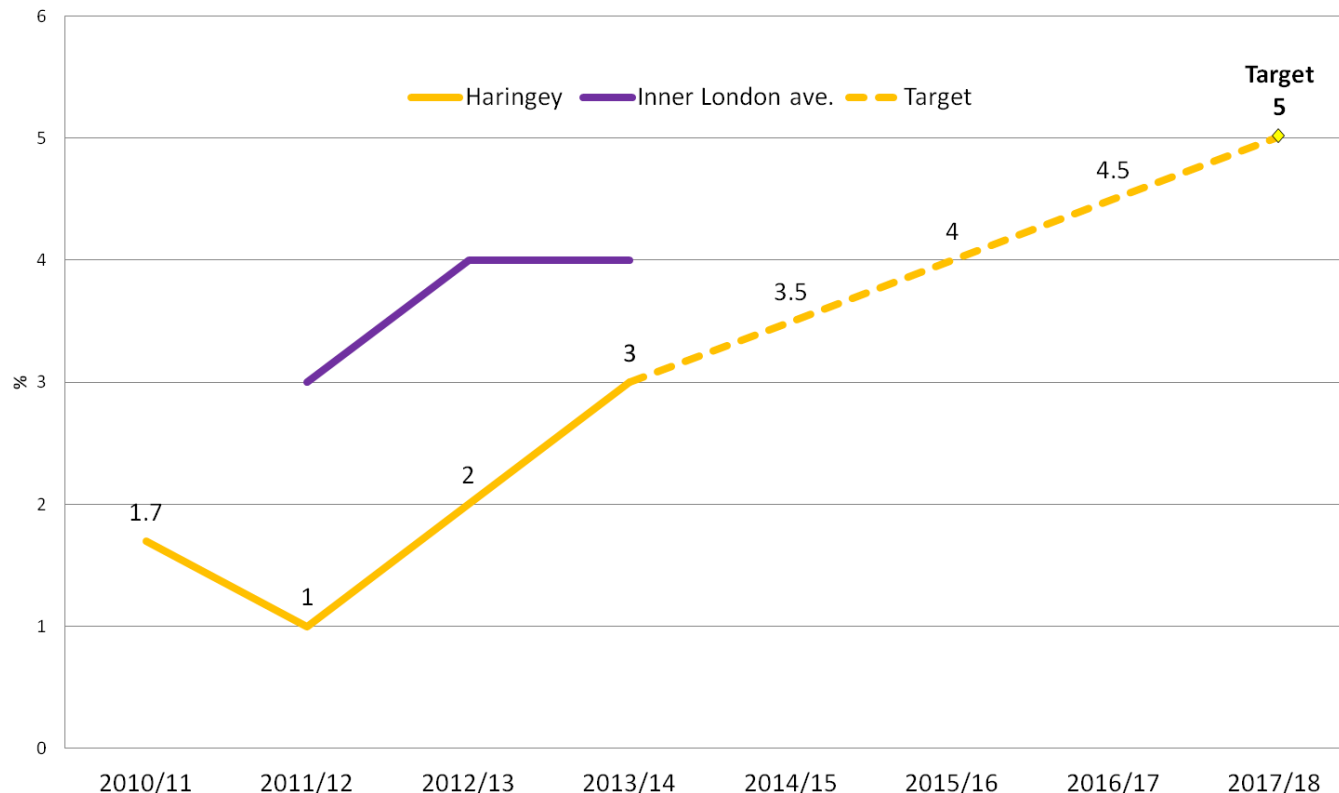
Proportion of people who travel by bicycle in London where trip origin is in Haringey



Target:

5% by 2018

Proportion of people who travel by bicycle in London where trip origin is in Haringey



What does the data say?

The 2013/14 score of 3 is the joint 12th highest out of all London Boroughs



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Objective 3:

More people will be cycling, walking and using public transport



Outcome Indicator:

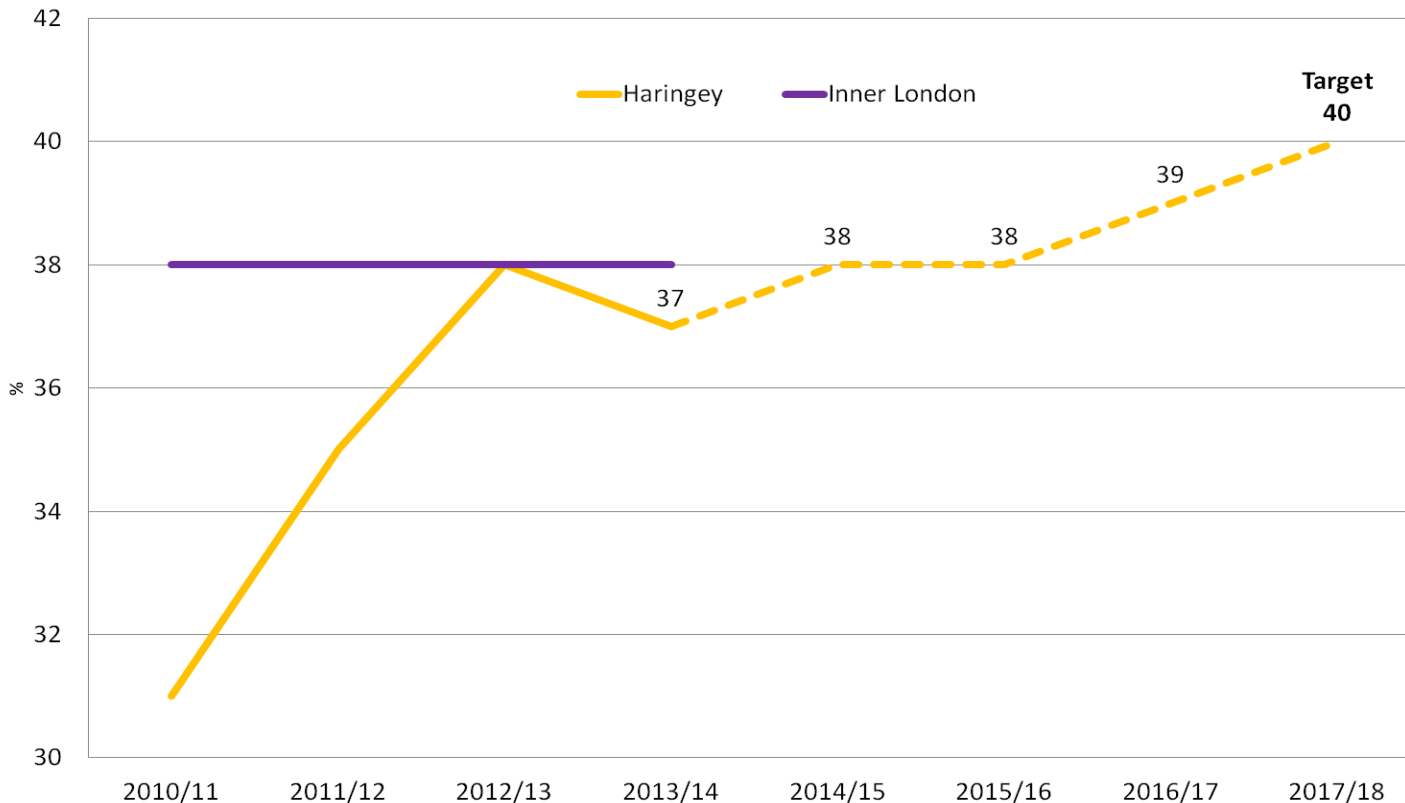
Proportion of people who travel by walking in London where trip origin is in Haringey



Target:

40% by 2018

Proportion of people who travel by walking in London where trip origin is in Haringey



What does the data say?

The 2013/14 score of 37 is the joint 7th highest out of all London Boroughs.



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Objective 3:

Outcome Indicator:

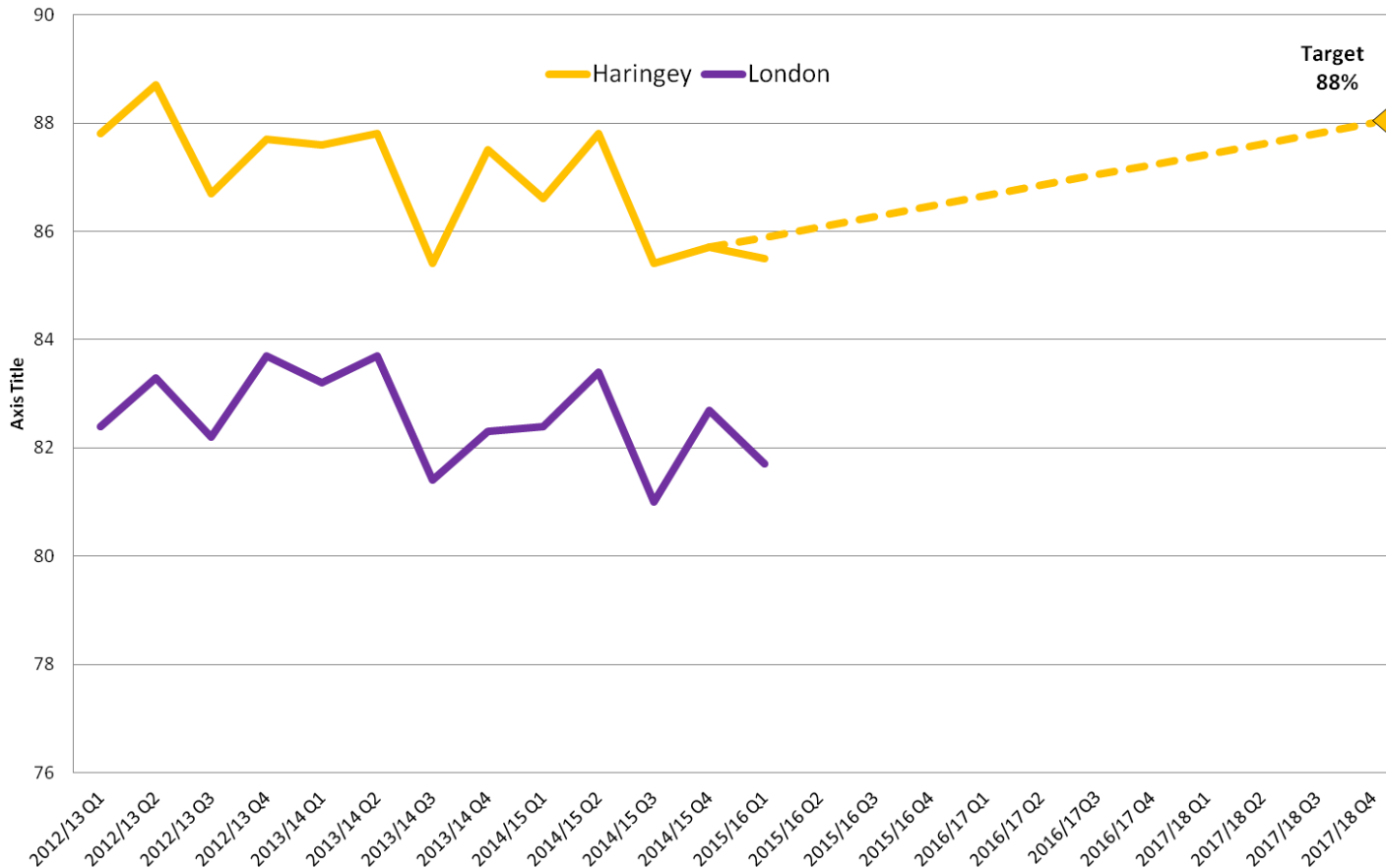
Probability of waiting under 10 minutes for a bus



Target:

88% by 2018

Bus Reliability - probability of waiting under 10 minutes



What does the data say?

In Q1 2015/16 performance dipped to 85.5% which is slightly below target.

Performance does remain above the London average.

Objective 4:

To prevent and reduce violence against women and girls (VAWG)



Outcome Indicator:

Increase in referral numbers to MARAC. MARAC is a multi agency risk assessment conference around domestic violence



Target:

To be 410 by 2017/18

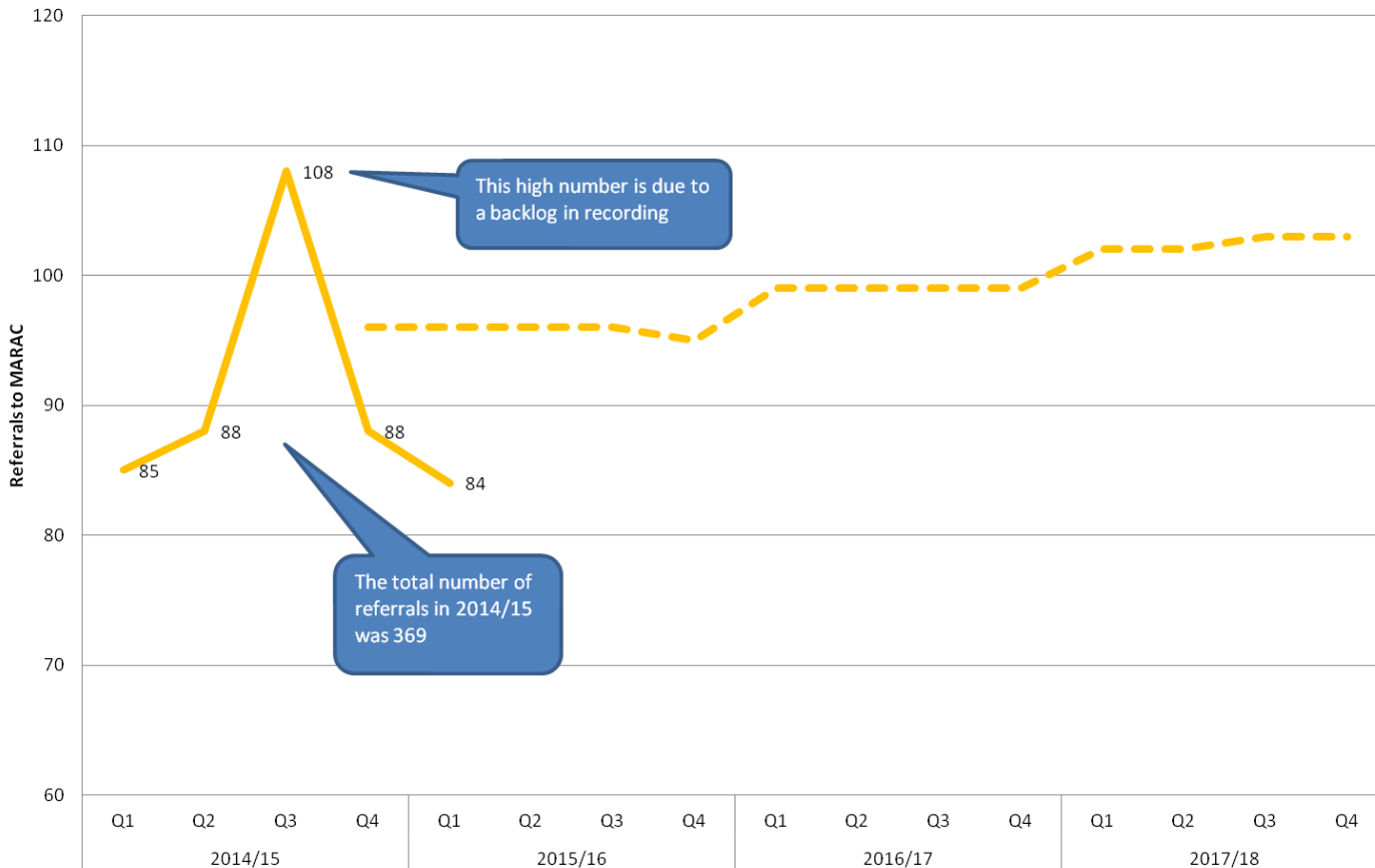
What does the data say?

Despite being below the challenging target Haringey MARAC is outperforming London and England.

369 referrals in 2014/15 was 90% of Co-ordinated Action Against Domestic Abuse (CAADAs) recommended volume.

London was 67.5% and England was 75% in the same period.

Target:

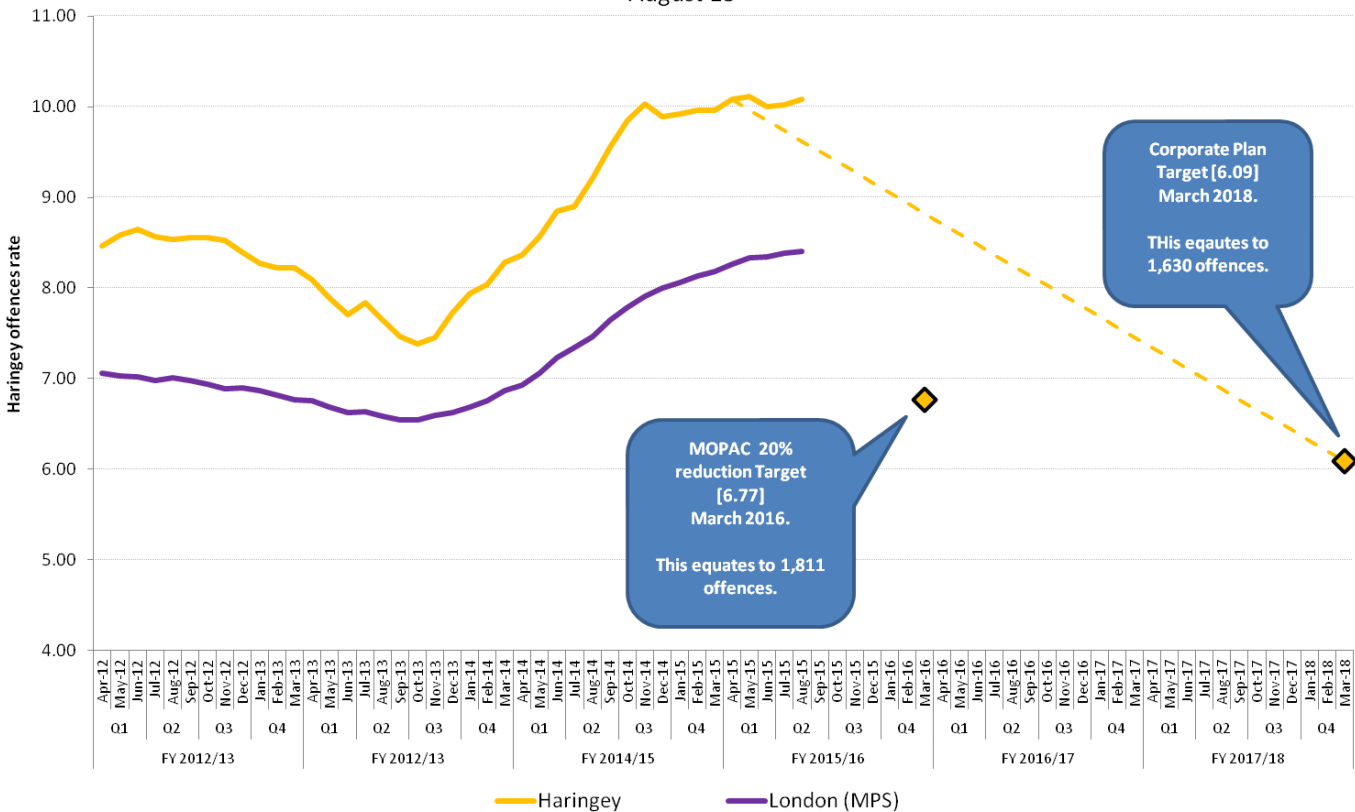
MOPAC target is a 20% by March 2016.

We plan to reduce a further 10% by 2018

What does the data say?

In August 2015 Haringey had the 12th Highest violence with injury rate in London.

Violence with Injury offences (rolling 12 months) rate per 1,000 pop: Haringey comparison March 12 - August 15



Corporate Plan Target [6.09] March 2018. This equates to 1,630 offences.

MOPAC 20% reduction Target [6.77] March 2016. This equates to 1,811 offences.

Robbery, (1 of the MOPAC 7 crime types)



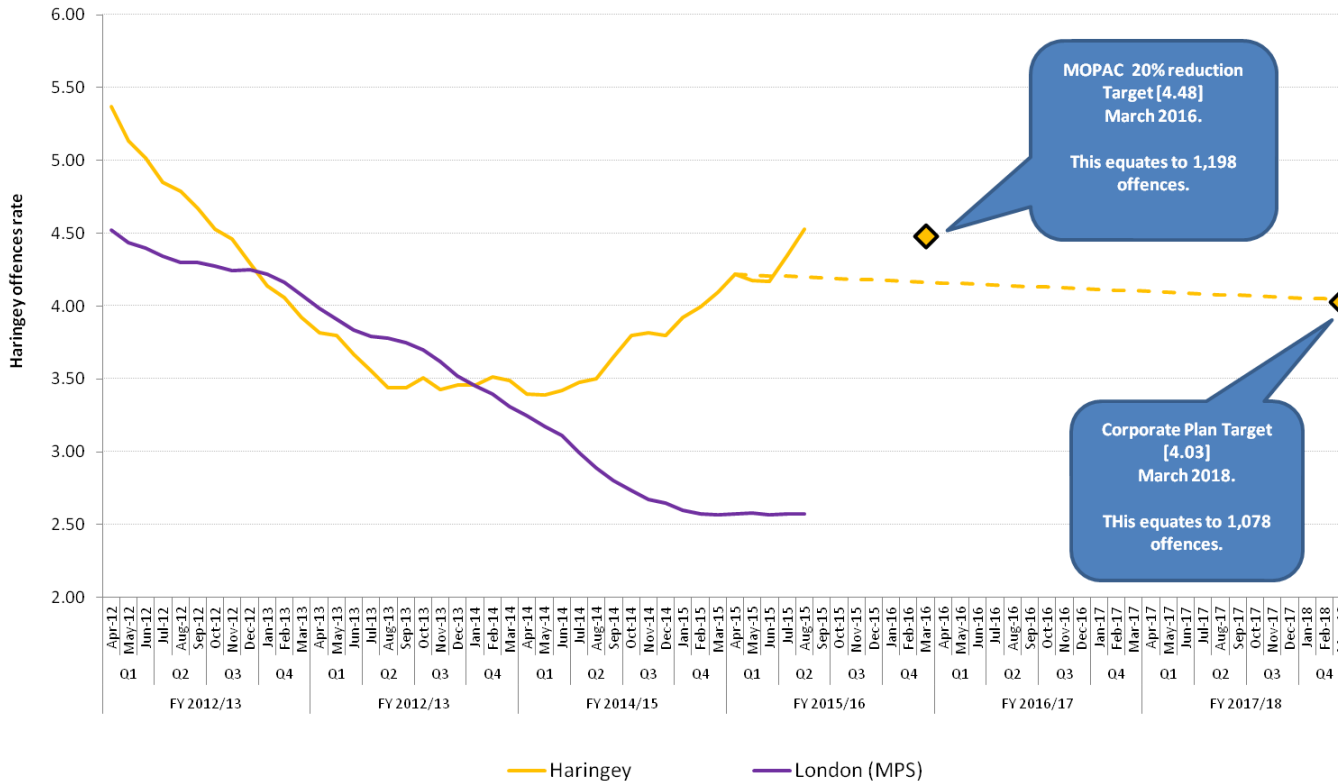
MOPAC is the Mayor's Office for Policing And Crime

Target:

MOPAC target is a 20% reduction by March 2016.

We plan to reduce a further 10% by 2018

Robbery offences (rolling 12 months) rate per 1,000 pop: Haringey comparison March 12 - August 15



What does the data say?

In August 2015 Haringey had the 5th Highest robbery rate in London.

In 2014/15 Haringey has been increasing, whilst the London rate has been decreasing.

There were 143 robberies in Haringey in July 2015. This is the highest since July 2011

Burglary, (1 of the MOPAC 7 crime types)

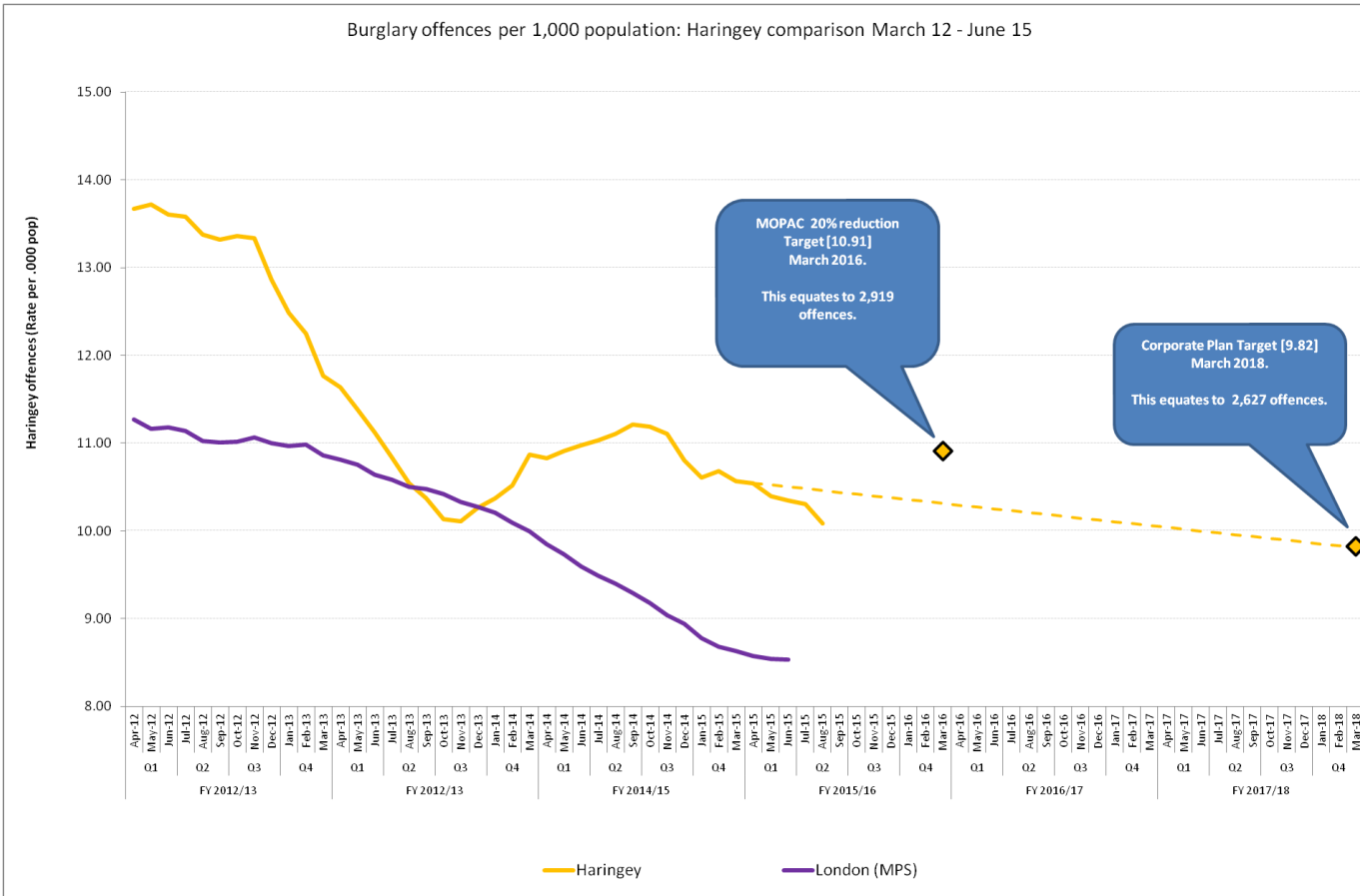


Target:
