### 4. REPORT

- 4.1 A temporary roof is being considered for the South East Pavilion as the cost of providing one of permanent construction would be in excess of £64,000. A temporary solution may be more suitable at this time as the future use of the Studios and associated areas is under review.

- 4.2 The Theatre Foyer is now being used for meetings etc. and discussions are on-going with English Heritage in regard to funding for future works. New walkways are being installed above the ceilings which will enable a detailed inspection of the roof void to be carried out.

Lights above and below the stage have been installed together with floodlights in the Auditorium.

- 4.3 New skylights have been fitted to the Palm Court Suites 1 and 3 which have resulted in their being made more attractive to our Clients.
