- 4.1 On April 3rd, 2002 the H.L.F. advised us that they had awarded us a 75% grant towards the cost of £3,670,625 for refurbishing the Park. Contracts have now been exchanged and the formal go ahead was received on August 2nd, 2002.
- 4.2 The post of Development Manager (Parks) has been advertised and it is hoped that a suitable person will be selected by the end of next month.
- 4.3 Tenders are being sought for the services of a Landscape Architect and it is expected that an appointment will be made by the end of November.
- 4.4 It is envisaged the construction will start in Summer 2003 and be completed by December 2007. The first task of the Landscape Architect will be to develop a master programme and seek opinions and approval from the various bodies and Board of Trustees. This exercise should be completed by April 30th 2003.
