#### Subject: Neighbourhood Renewal Fund

#### 1. Purpose

1.1 To report on the projects agreed to cover the projected NRF underspend.

#### 2. Summary

2.1 The report informs HSP of the projects approved for NRF underspend following the process agreed by HSP in November 06.

#### 3. Recommendations

3.1 HSP to note the decision taken by the Chair of the HSP under delegated authority to approve NRF under spend projects as set out in paragraphs 4.2.1. – 4.2.3.

#### 4. Background Information

4.1 This report informs HSP of the current position for the NRF programme.

#### 4.2 The current position 2006/07 (NRF)

- 4.2.1 In November 06, the HSP was informed of the potential risk of the 2006/07 programme under spending, unless immediate remedial action was taken. To mitigate this risk a central call for reserve projects was made.
- 4.2.2 In total 48 project proposal bids were received. The programme management team appraised the projects against the set criteria agreed and the chair of the HSP reviewed and approved the final list of reserve projects using delegated authority.
- 4.2.3 Ten reserve projects were approved to the value of £343,302. Please refer to appendix A.

#### 5. Conclusions

5.1 To reduce against the risk of under spend; it is important to incorporate an agreed level of over programming at the start of the financial year and to enhance planning and delivery of the capital programme.

5.2 To enable effective programme delivery early decisions are required to enable continuation projects to plan ahead and existing projects to wind down activity and expectation.
