Dear Daliah,

We were woken by the sound of a group exiting the bar. (As has happened every Friday since the bar reopened, anywhere from 2:15-3:00am). The commotion developed to shouting and screaming, with a fight ensuing and moving into the road as can be seen in the footage. This continued until the police arrived about 10 minutes later. Thankfully, no weapons were involved.

In the previous years while we have been living across from Kiss the Sky, I cannot think of a single incident involving Kiss the Sky that required the police. In the few short weeks since the bar reopened under new management, the police have attended to deal with violence related to the bar at least twice.

The area is typically very quiet, with few on foot on Park Road at 2:15 any night of the week, as everything in the area is closed. However, as can be seen in the footage, there is a group of people out front of the bar. These are not random people on the street, but have likely just exited the bar. Why are there this many people, still at the bar at this hour? Prior to new management, we were never woken at these hours by a second or third wave of Kiss the Sky customers drunkenly leaving.
