Advice To Members On Declaring Interests

Information on declaring an interest is set out in the Council's Constitution in Part 5 Section A. However, you may need to obtain specific advice on whether you have an interest in a particular matter.

If you need advice, you can contact:

- Monitoring Officer
- the Legal Adviser to the Committee; or
- Democratic Services.

If at all possible, you should try to identify any potential interest you may have before the meeting so that you and the person you ask for advice can fully consider all the circumstances before reaching a conclusion on what action you should take.

Nature of the business

- Thompson's Beer Shop is first and foremost a specialist independent beer shop.
- On-sales are intended to complement the retail business in a quiet, relaxed environment.
- The premises is very small with only a handful of seats and is not intended to operate as a traditional pub or late-night drinking venue.
- I will be running the business personally and have lived locally for almost 15 years.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

- No outdoor seating as part of this application.
- Customers will not be permitted to take drinks outside.
- The frontage will not be used as a smoking area.
- Customers who wish to smoke will be asked to leave drinks inside and move away from the front of the premises.
- Any customers gathering outside will be politely asked to move on.
- Recorded music will only be low-level background music.
- The rear outdoor area will not be used by customers at any time.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- I have agreed to the conditions proposed by the Metropolitan Police.
- I am requesting a closing hour of 10pm on Fridays and Saturdays, with last orders at 9.30pm, as agreed with the Police.
- The premises will be actively managed by myself to maintain a calm and respectful environment.

Public Safety

- The London Fire Brigade has raised no objection, subject to the agreed conditions.
- Customers will not have access to the rear outdoor area.
- I am committed to operating the premises safely and responsibly.

Protection of Children from Harm

- The rear outdoor area, used by residents and children, will not be used by customers.
- I will comply with all licence conditions relating to age verification and the sale of alcohol.

Community Commitment

- I want Thompson's Beer Shop to become a positive addition to the local area.
- I intend to work with other local independent businesses, artists and community events.

- If concerns are ever raised, I will engage openly with residents and the Council to resolve them quickly.
- Should I ever wish to introduce limited seasonal outdoor seating in the future, I would submit a separate licence application so it could be considered on its own merits.

Responsible Authority Support

- The Metropolitan Police, the Council's Noise and Nuisance Team and the London Fire Brigade have all confirmed that they have no objection to the application, subject to the agreed conditions.
