

I would like to confirm that I have considered the above proposal with regard to the prevention of public nuisance on behalf of the Enforcement Response (Noise) Team & would like to make representations to the Application on the following grounds:

Noise from music played at the premises is likely to affect local residents if played into the early hours of the morning without suitable conditions. As the premises have been found to be operating playing regulated entertainment recently without a licence we have concerns about how the applicant will operate the premises if a licence is given. We currently therefore oppose the application but in addition make the following points

Prevention of nuisance from noise/vibration

<u>Airborne</u>

All doors and windows will remain closed during the licensed activities. Where a door is used for patrons to enter or leave the premises the door will be fitted with a self-closing device and staff told to ensure that it is not propped open. [if necessary] A member of staff shall be positioned at the door to ensure it is opened for as brief a period as possible.

The licensable activity shall conclude 30 minutes before the premises is due to close to prevent excessive noise breakout as the premises empties.

Entrance/exit from the premises whilst licensable activities are ongoing shall be via a lobbied door to minimise noise breakout.

Where necessary adequate and suitable mechanical ventilation should be provided to public areas.

Structure borne

All speakers are mounted on anti-vibration mountings to prevent vibration transmission of sound energy to adjoining properties.

Dear Madam

I am writing to you to voice my oppostion to the recent application for a new premises license for Rush Hour, 78 West Green Road, London, N15 5NS. As a local resident, living in Beaconsfield Road, I would be badly affected if such a license was granted. In addition, having spoken to several of my neighbours, there is strong local opposition to the granting of any new licenses in the area as we already endure a considerable amount of anti-social behaviour, noise nuisance and disorder emanating from the West Green Tavern at number 68 West Green Road.

You should also be aware that I feel that I am putting myself, my neighbours and my property at risk of reprisals by opposing this application. Whilst I understand that oppositions to licensing applications cannot be made anonymously, I ask that you appreciate the personal risk being borne by anyone who lives in this area in opposing this application.

My opposition to the new premises license for Rush Hour, 78 West Green Road relates to the following licensing objectives, which I feel the granting of a license for this premises would clearly undermine:

- 1. the prevention of crime and disorder
- 2. the protection of children from harm
- 3. public safety
- 4. the prevention of public nuisance

I will cover each of these in turn.

1. The prevention of crime and disorder.

As you should already be well aware, this area already suffers from multiple crime, disorder and social problems. Drug dealing, anti-social behaviour, noise nuisance, public drunkeness, fighting and prostitution are all daily occurences that residents have to live with right outside their front doors. The granting of a late license to another premises in this area is going to make this situation considerably worse. The local police force is already stretched to the limit simply trying to keep this under control. There is already a 'Dispersal Order' in force in the local area, which was recently extended. This was seen as essential to try and maintain a degree of law and order in an area which is extremely challenging to police.

This area is home to a very diverse community and includes a large number of families, elderly and vulnerable people, many of whom already lead difficult lives and live in constant fear of crime and disorder. As a resident of this area for several years I can say without reservation that the establishment of another licensed premises would be a disaster for local crime and disorder problems. It would obviously become the 'destination' for every late night drinker and drug dealer in the area and further afield. I am sure you already appreciate the considerable problems associated with late licenses in this particular area but we should not need another situation like that at 'The Swan' a couple of years ago, where criminality was allowed to get so out of hand that a young girl was tragically shot dead before local opposition to the license and the advice of the police were taken seriously.

2. The protection of children from harm.

There are a large number of families with children living in this area. Indeed the area is one of the few in the borough where accommodation is actually affordable for families. It is a predominantly residential area with a number of late opening shops and several off-licenses. The opening of another licensed premises and the people who would clearly be attracted to such a venue would obviously put children at risk. Drug dealing, public drinking, prostitution and harrassment are already a problem in this area. Expecting children to 'run the gauntlet' of yet more of this on the way to the shops or coming home from visiting friends is putting them at risk and is completely unacceptable.

3. Public safety.

As already referred to in points 1 and 2 above, public safety would clearly deteriorate due to increased crime and disorder associated with the granting of another license in the area. I am also very concerned about adequate fire safety and fire escape routes in a premises which would no doubt be packed to the rafters with late night revellers, particularly as it is in a terraced building with a number of flats in adjoining premises and behind it.

4. The prevention of public nuisance.

This area already suffers from multiple public nuisance issues. Noise nuisance (from the West Green Tavern and the cars of its patrons with excessively loud music booming at all hours) and anti-social behaviour (such as public drunkeness, fighting, shouting late at night, reckless driving under the influence of drink or drugs, aggressive begging, littering and dumping, urination and worse in peoples front gardens and on pavements) are already depressingly regular occurrences. The granting of another late license in this area would make this situation even worse than it already is. Excessively loud music from this proposed licensed premises and the cars of those visiting it would clearly prevent adults and children from sleeping. It would be impossible for local residents to adopt sleeping patterns to accommodate the hours of this licensed premises.

Finally, increased reckless driving and parking problems would be inevitable if this license was granted. Local residential streets are already filled with cars of people visiting the West Green Tavern from Thursday to Sunday. Open air parties with music blaring from cars and drinking are a problem and I have seen several residents cars being crashed into and damaged at night by people visiting the Tavern. This situation would be made even worse if this license at 78 West Green Road was granted.

As I mentioned at the start of this letter, local residents already suffer from sustained loud music from the West Green Tavern and associated anti-social behaviour. The granting of another late license in this area would make a bad situation completely unbearable. It would also put an excessive burden on local policing which is already stretched to the limit. The location is totally unsuitable for a licensed premises.

I therefore oppose the application for a new premises license for Rush Hour, 78 West Green Road, London, N15 5NS.

Sound limits

The licensee shall ensure that no music played in the licensed premises is audible at or within the site boundary of any residential property.

Outside Areas

No form of loudspeaker or sound amplification equipment is to be sited on or near any foyer, doorway, window or opening to the premises.

The number of persons permitted to utilise the frontage will be restricted to 2 persons.

Deliveries And Collections

Deliveries and collections associated with the premises will be arranged between the hours 0800 and 1800 hrs so as to minimise the disturbance caused to the neighbours.

Empty bottles and non-degradable refuse will remain in the premises at the end of trading hours and taken out to the refuse point at the start of the working day rather than at the end of trading when neighbours might be unduly disturbed.

Plant and machinery

All plant and machinery is correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from noise.

Patrons Entering/Exiting Premises

There will be no queuing outside the premises.

When the premises turn out a licensed door supervisor shall supervise patrons and ensure the leave in a prompt and courteous manor, respecting the neighbours.

Signs should be displayed instructing patrons to respect the neighbours and behave in a courteous manor.

Prevention Of Nuisance From Odour

All ventilation and extraction systems shall be correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from odour.



I am a resident of the above address and for a long time I have been complaining about the level of noise disturbance from Rush Hour restaurant to the Haringey Environmental Health department. It has been brought to my attention that an application for a premises license has been made by Rush Hour. Since I have been complaining about this restaurant, the restaurant management have not taken any measures what so ever to reduce the volume of the music so as to not cause ay disturbance to the above residence or any soundproofing, because I am still having to complain about the noise.

It is not only noise that is a problem with Rush Hour. As you know, the premises must promote the following:

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- The prevention of public nuisance
- Public safety at licensed premises
- The protection of children from harm.

There have been many times when fights have broken within the restaurant and have come out onto West Green Road. The main window of the restaurant has a crack in it which is at present still there. If you look for yourself, you would be able to see the size of the crack and determine for yourself the level of violence it took to for some one to create such a crack. This as well as other previous occasions where fights have broken out does not promote "the prevention of crime and disorder". I would ask you to get in touch with the local police whom I know would back up my claim and be able to give you a clearer picture of the history of violence of this restaurant. Most of the time music is played until the early hours of 6am, and usually starts around 9pm the previous day. As my flat is directly above the restaurant, I hear the full rumble of the music being played and I cannot sleep with the level of noise at times.

I would request that you speak to and check the number of complaints I have made with the Haringey Environmental Health department who can also give you there opinion of Rush Hour restaurant when coming to a decision.
