# 6. PLANNED PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE, RESPONSIVE REPAIRS COMPLIANCE FOR COMMUNAL WATER BOOSTER/ PUMPS CONTRACT

The existing contract for maintaining and repairing communal water booster systems had expired in October 2025. To ensure continued service and compliance with health and safety regulations, a new contract had been awarded. This new arrangement had been procured through a competitive process, resulting in a single bid from a qualified contractor who demonstrated strong technical expertise and offered competitive pricing.

The contract operated on a call-off basis, with no fixed monthly or annual fees—payments were made only for completed work. Funding had come from both Capital



and Revenue budgets, with major upgrades covered by the M&E Capital budget. Performance had been monitored through monthly reviews and inspections by Haringey Council's M&E Contracts and Compliance team, ensuring quality, value for money, and timely completion of works.

# **RESOLVED**: That the Cabinet Member for Housing and Planning

- 3.1 The Cabinet Member for Housing and Planning (Deputy Leader) approved the award of a contract for the planned preventative maintenance and responsive repairs compliance for communal water boosters/ pumps to Contractor A with a start date of 1st October 2025 with a contract duration of 6 years (4 years plus up to 2 optional 1-year extensions).
- 3.2 The maximum contract value is £900,000.00 plus inflation. This included planned maintenance, responsive repairs and capital replacements where required.

#### Reasons for decision

- 4.1 Across Haringey there are communal pumps which service the housing stock with regard to cold water booster pumps, sump/sewage pumps and surface water pumps. These are vital to ensure the safe, healthy and constant supply of fresh water and removal of foul and excess surface water drainage.
- 4.2 It is a statutory requirement to maintain these assets and repair or replace when required to ensure compliance with regulation and bye-laws.

# Alternative options considered

- 5.1 Do Nothing This is not an option as it would result in loss of water and sewage/drainage issues due to lack of repairs and maintenance. This would lead to dissatisfied residents and significant health and safety issues, with Haringey not meeting it's decent homes standards.
- 5.2 Carry out the work through internal resources This is not an option due to not having the required level of qualified/trained operatives and specialist equipment and parts to maintain Haringey's current complexity of equipment.
- 5.3 Extend the existing contract. Whilst the current service provision is sufficient, we are unable to extend any further under the current contractual arrangements and procurement rules.
