<p>CNCL21.</p>	<p>TO RECEIVE SUCH COMMUNICATIONS AS THE MAYOR MAY LAY BEFORE THE COUNCIL</p> <p>1 The Mayor was sad to report the deaths of two former Councillors: Chris Zissimos and Len Silverstone. Chris Zissimos passed away on 6th July following a long illness and his funeral took place in Finchley on 13th July attended by close family and friends. Chris Zissimos was a Councillor for 16 years. He represented Harringay Ward from 1982 – 1994. He was the Deputy Mayor from 1992-93. From 1994 -1998 he represented Alexandra Ward.</p> <p>Len Silverstone died unexpectedly in June following a recent fall and was buried in Dundee in Scotland – his native home. Len Silverstone served the Borough for 10 years. He represented Turnpike Ward from 1972 -1978 and Harringay Ward from 1978 – 1982.</p> <p>The Mayor on behalf of the Council extended her deepest sympathy to the family and friends of Chris Zissimos and Len Silverstone</p> <p>The Leader of the Council and Leader of the opposition paid tribute, as did other members.</p> <p>The meeting observed one minute silence as a mark of respect.</p>

Members asked questions of the petitioner and the replies were duly noted.</p> <p>Councillor B Harris – Executive Member for Social Services and Health advised that that he had made personal representations to the North Middlesex Hospital concerning the closure and had advised that the process of closure and consultation had been fundamentally flawed.</p> <p>The Mayor reported that three deputation requests in relation to Controlled Parking Zone issues had been referred by her to the Executive.</p> <p>The Mayor reported that there had been three requests for deputations to the Council meeting all in respect of the UDP.</p>

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	<p>6-10 were not reached in the allotted time and written answers would therefore be supplied to these questions.</p>	
CNCL30.	<p>VARIATION OF ORDER OF BUSINESS</p> <p>A procedural Motion to vary the order of business, to permit Motion D to be taken next, was put to the meeting and declared carried.</p>	
CNCL31.	<p>MOTION D</p> <p>It was moved by Councillor Oakes and seconded by Councillor Davies that:</p> <p>“This Council:</p> <p>Acknowledges the very high level of public concern over the current proposals for parking schemes in the borough;</p> <p>Acknowledges that the level of consultation undertaken by the Council with residents, businesses and elected members of this Council on these schemes has been entirely ineffective and is not acceptable;</p> <p>Believes that parking schemes need to be seen by residents and businesses as a positive contribution to their immediate local environment, and not as the careless creation of a remote authority greedy for every pound it can get;</p> <p>Believes that a ‘one-size-fits-all’ solution is not correct, and that proper consultation is necessary in order to ensure that in each area the parking scheme is tailored to meet local needs;</p> <p>and mindful of the new Statutory Guidance on parking imminently expected from the Department of Transport;</p> <p>Resolves to suspend the current consultation process indefinitely while this new statutory guidance is pending;</p> <p>Resolves to further suspend the consultation process until such time as an effective and thorough consultation process has been undertaken in every area affected, to include public meetings in each area.</p> <p>An amendment to the motion was moved by Councillor Haley and seconded by Councillor Cooke proposing :</p> <p>Delete all after “Acknowledges” in the first line, and replace with:</p> <p>... that the Council’s current parking strategy has several</p>	

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	<p>aims, in particular:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • to improve the road safety of residents of Haringey; • to ensure residents may park close to their homes, for the security of themselves, their families, and their vehicles; • to ensure the proper movement of traffic on key routes through our borough; • to enable the rapid movement of emergency vehicles across our borough. <p>Notes that income generation is not a primary aim of parking schemes in Haringey unlike the schemes of some other local authorities;</p> <p>Believes that it is important that residents understand that revenue from controlled parking schemes and their enforcement is used only for scheme administration and for transport and road safety improvements, and not as a general income stream;</p> <p>Believes that feedback from residents is crucial to shaping future detailed proposals on Controlled Parking Zones in our borough, ensuring that a fair settlement is reached allowing parking for residents and providing parking spaces for visitors who support our traders;</p> <p>Recognizes that the Council's current consultation exercise, based on lessons learned from previous consultation exercises, is designed to secure the maximum amount of data and feedback possible from residents in order to shape future proposals rather than to impose CPZs against resident's wishes and to ensure that in each area the parking scheme is tailored to meet local needs;</p> <p>And therefore encourages residents and traders to engage with the consultation process and to feed their views back to the Council.</p> <p>The Amendment was then put to the meeting and declared CARRIED.</p> <p>The substantive Motion was then put to the meeting and declared CARRIED.</p>

Item 2 – Adoption of the Haringey UDP

Density policy as clarified

HSG 8: DENSITY STANDARDS

4.27 Residential development in the borough should normally be provided at a density of between 200 – 700 habitable rooms per hectare (hrh) and should have regard to the density ranges set out in Table 4B.1 of the London Plan.

Higher density development up to 1,100hrh may be acceptable provided the proposed development is in:

- a) a central area with good public transport accessibility (PTAL levels 4-6, see Map A.1) and predominately comprises flats;
- b) an Opportunity Area (Tottenham Hale see policy AC2);
- c) an Area for Intensification (Haringey Heartlands see policy AC1);
or
- d) within a mixed use scheme; and
- e) where a planning brief for the site has been adopted and recommends higher densities

4.27i For the purposes of this policy higher density development is defined as development within a range of between 650 – 1,100 hrh.

4.27a The density ranges will be applied flexibly in light of local circumstances. Therefore, the Council will adopt a 'design-led' approach to density and will consider the following factors:

- a) the character of the surrounding area, in terms of existing building form, massing and building heights;
- b) historic heritage context, including listed buildings and conservation areas;
- c) the characteristics of the site;
- d) the quality of the design;
- e) the range and mix of housing types;
- f) the level of service provision and public spaces; and
- g) car parking provision.

4.27b As such, proposals should conform with other policies of the Plan, notably Policies UD2 (General Principles), UD3 (Quality Design) and UD11 (Tall Buildings).

4.27c New development should be compatible with the existing pattern of development and character of an area. Paragraph 4.47 of the London Plan refers to appropriate density ranges being related to location, setting in terms of existing building form and massing and PTAL index, and then also defines 'site setting' with existing very dense, dense and lower density development being the first characteristic in the site setting definition.

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
