





The Licence application we wish to make a representation on is 456 West Green Rd. Dardana Chinese and Albanian restaurant.

The prevention of Crime and Disorder

There are already three public houses, a lap-dancing bar and sauna and several membership only establishments within an 100 metre stretch at the top of West Green Road near Green Lanes. These premises are frequently open into the early hours. I have witnessed several violent disturbances recently. There is already a lot of public traffic on this stretch of road very late at night and reducing the number of late night businesses would reduce the number of violent crimes that happen there.

Public Safety

With the increase in late night drinking and gambling establishments and the like this tends to attract drug dealers and drug abusers, street prostitutes and kerb crawlers. A lot of people I talk to, women in particular, do not feel safe around here. We would like the council and the police to come and take a look at this section of West Green to see how it may be improved.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

On several occassions I have walked past the establishment in question and been subject to excessive noise levels due to their music and entertainment activities. It is already operating as an unofficial 'members only' establishment. This is entirely unacceptable in a residential family orientated area. The council must refuse any more such applications in this locale and support businesses which contibute to the greater good and are of benefit to the wider community.

The Protection of Children from Harm

Sadly, as you walk from Green Lanes down West Green Rd there is an overwhelming presence of drinking and gambling establishments. This is not a positive environment for our children to grow up

in. We need to concentrate on the social economy of Haringey. Why not restrict gaming and entertainment licenses and promote social enterprises like community art galleries, healthy food shops, drop in centres and youth clubs. It is the council's responsibility to help develop sites such as these into community focused areas where children have positive images surrounding them with positive activities to participate in which promote well being and self-empowerment.

We would like Haringey council to help us acheive a vibrant West Green promoting ethical businesses and supporting a strong community.

We are currently devising a public campaign to change the face of our high street with legal protests outside businesses and a local and national press campaign. Any advice on how else we may achieve our aims would be very grateful.
