3 ward councillors and by the local MP. He also mentioned that, previous meetings of Licensing Sub-Committees, had refused late licenses on several occasions for areas between the railway bridge and Turnpike Lane.

The applicant mentioned that his clients tend to be older men. Many were over 50. As such, he stated they were unlikely to cause disturbances. He said that noise pollution in the area was often caused by others who were standing in the street and milling around, not by his customers. He also stated that he would not be playing music. In his opinion, the noise generated by the café would thus not be great.

Cllr Patel enquired as to whether the premises was currently open late. The applicant stated that, as the premises did not serve alcohol, until the 2003 Act came into effect there were no licensing rules restricting his opening hours and so he sometimes kept the premises open until late.

Concern was expressed about the outdoor toilet area and the fact the back door of the café was kept open to allow access to this. This was thought to be a major reason why noise was being transmitted. The officer from Noise Team present at the meeting concurred.

RESOLVED:

Having considered the representations made, the Sub-Committee resolved to grant the application subject to the closing time being 2 am on every night.

As an informative, the Sub-Committee urges the applicant to take measures to enclose the way to the toilet area to prevent the transmission of noise. Up until the toilet area is enclosed, then the door must be kept closed except for access purposes.

In addition, there is a condition that the applicant complies with the provisions of the operating schedule.

This is a further statement with regards to Police and community objections for the forthcoming application for the sale of Alcohol at 'Polish Food and Wine' 78 High Road, Tottenham, N15 by Mr Haci Korkut.

Since the last hearing the problems associated in and around the Wargrave vicinity have not gone away and if anything are worse than ever. The Safer neighbourhood team I am apart of does not have the capacity resource wise to deal with the low level anti social behaviour being displayed by the members of the Polish Community. This is clearly evidenced by one of the local residents who has kept a diary of all anti social behaviour since the last hearing. The diary covers the area at the top of Wargrave Avenue from High Road to No 10 Wargrave.

21st November(Date of rejection)

Drunk Eastern European males vomiting in the street which has not been cleared up. This has now began to attract rats and pigeons.

Large groups purchasing alcohol and using the road as a meeting place, throwing rubbish in the form of glass bottles, cans and uneaten food on the pavements and in the gardens on a regular basis.

3rd December between 9-11pm

Outside No1 Wargrave, three men and two girls drinking alcohol and smoking and snorting drugs.

6th December

Man lying in the front garden of No 3 Wargrave, could not tell if he was dead or drunk however next day found out he was blind drunk and had vomited all over the front garden.

10th December

Five men drinking and asking passers by on the High Road for money. Some people gave these males money and they were again seen to purchase strong alcohol with there funds from the shop. Two of these men were then seen to enter the alleyway which has a gate on in Wargrave. They left a few minutes later and were seen pulling up there lower clothing.

15th December 6am

Outside No 5 Wargrave, Eastern European males noisily walking up and down the road drinking strong alcohol.

17th December 8pm

Eastern European males with carrier bags full of alcohol fighting outside the residents house. The males were shouting and swearing. One of these males was later seen urinating from the pavement into the front garden of No 6 Wargrave. The resident was too afraid to confront the male.

19th December 7am

Resident woken up by Eastern European males shouting outside Polish Food and Wine. Four males were outside the premises throwing empty cans of alcohol along Wargrave.

Later on in the day the same males were seen slumped outside No 10 Wargrave with 3 bags of alcohol. These males were 'Paraletic' and shouting at members of the jewish Community who were walking along the street.

21st December 3pm

Group of approx 15 Eastern European males congregated outside Polish food and Wine. Most of these males were drunk and abusive to passing members of the public. They were asking people for money and then buying alcohol from the shop at the top of Wargrave.

On this occasion they were moved on by officers but then returned at 10pm where they stayed until approx 3am. There behaviour was extremely loud and many of them ended up fighting in the street. When they eventually left there was approx 50-60 empty cans and vomit all over the pavement.

28th December 8am

Two Eastern European males sleeping on the pavement on Wargrave. Next to them was vomit and a large quantity of empty cans.

29th December between 5pm – 2am

Large group of Eastern European males loitering outside the shop, all of them seemed drunk. Two of these males were seen to openly urinate along the pavement next to Polish Food and Wine. Another male entered the alleyway which had the gate shut. He left a few minutes later fixing his jeans. The resident checked the alley and found a large quantity of empty cans and more disturbingly excrement and fresh urine all over the floor. The resident describes the smell as ‘unbearable’.

3rd January 2007 – 8pm

Two Eastern European Males drunk and holding cans in the middle of the road of Wargrave obstructing passing motor vehicles then shouting and intimidating the drivers. One of these males was seen to openly urinate in the middle of the road.

8th January 5am

Two Eastern European Males and two females congregated outside the shop drinking cans. They were shouting and singing in the street. The same group were again seen at 11am with three carrier bags full of Alcohol. This group was later joined by another six Eastern European Males who carried on drinking and shouting throughout the night. The empty cans were just left on the pavement rolling down the street.

12th January 8:30pm

An Eastern European Male collapsed in the garden of No 6 Wargrave. Woken up by a resident and the male began to vomit all over the garden and the pavement. He then picked up a carrier bag next to him containing Polish alcohol and immediately began to drink again. He walked off from the resident shouting in Polish and began to loiter outside Polish Food and Wine with another group of males.

17th January 1am

Resident woken by large disturbance in the street. Witnessed approx 15 Eastern European Males throwing empty cans of alcohol at each other. One of these males was then witnessed defecating the pavement outside Polish Food and Wine. The excrement was then kicked by another one of the males onto the wall. At 9am the excrement was still there and had dried and was causing another unbearable smell in the area.

Later this day at 7pm another group of Eastern European Males were congregated outside the shop drinking, shouting and swearing until 2am.

21st January 5pm – 9pm

Males seen urinating on the wall next to Polish Food and Wine. These males stayed in the vicinity heavily drinking alcohol from the shop on the corner. All the empty cans were thrown on the floor in Wargrave.

23rd January 7am

Resident again woken by Eastern European Males shouting and swearing in the street. All the males were holding cans of Polish alcohol. One of these males was seen to climb into a front garden and attempt to sleep. He was awoken by the resident who he began to shout at in Polish and threw his empty can at in anger.

This same male was seen 10minutes later urinating over the wall in the same garden.

25th January 8pm

Large group of Eastern European Males drinking cans outside Polish Food and Wine. These males seen harassing passers by for money and then buying alcohol from the shop on the corner opposite Polish Food and Wine. Four full carrier bags were purchased which the group managed to last until just 10pm. Then the same fighting and shouting carried on until approx 1am.

The resident goes on to state that a great number of Eastern European males are consistently still congregating in and around the top end of Wargrave where Mr Korcut is again applying for his alcohol licence. It would appear that the standards of Hygiene and behaviour these males are displaying are not acceptable. As a member of the local Safer Neighbourhood Team I have also noticed the continued anti social behaviour being displayed by these males and have on numerous times had to spend time moving these obviously drunk males on. I have also noticed the extremely strong smell of Urine in and around the Polish Food and Wine shop which has without a doubt worsened in recent months.

I have also noticed excrement smeared on the walls and across the pavement outside the shop which is always next to empty cans of Polish alcohol.

As before this application is opposed by numerous members of the community and is fully supported by the Officers from the Safer neighbourhood team located at St Ann's Police Station.

Since the last hearing my team have been consistently receiving complaints on a now daily basis from members from our community with regards to the Anti social behaviour being displayed by the members of the Polish Community around the Wargrave Avenue vicinity. As before this is being caused mainly by young males which is a direct result of the Alcohol constantly being supplied to them by these types of premises, with the owners displaying no regard to the dramatic impact this is having on the lives of our community.

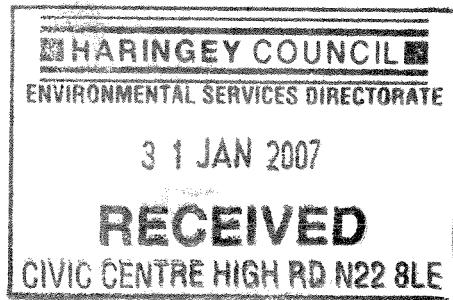

We feel still that at present there are sufficient outlets in the area around Wargrave Avenue for these males to purchase their alcohol.

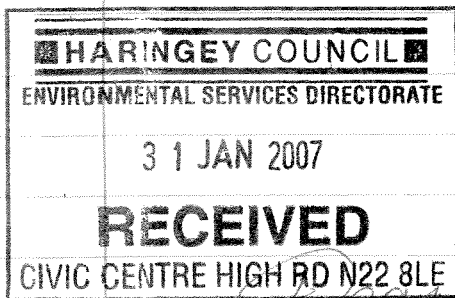

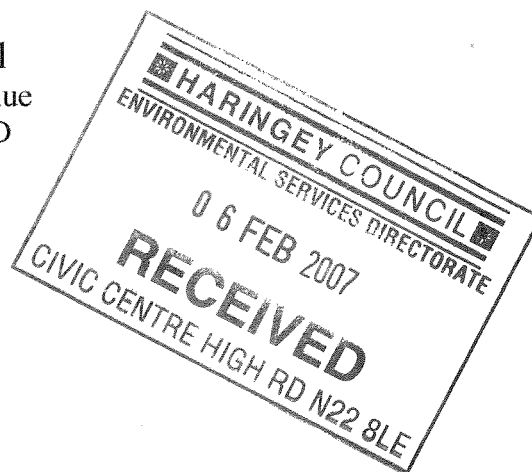

Alcohol is already easily available locally and I am concerned for more shops to sell alcohol, and for longer periods, that there will be an increase in crime and an increased threat to safety.

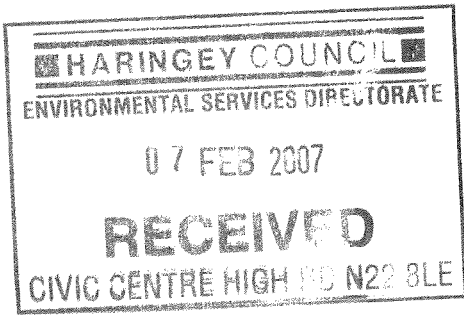
