



We, the residents of the streets bordering onto Gladesmore Community School are vigorously opposed to the above application. We are appalled at the underhanded and deceitful way this application has been made knowledge to us. It is an impertinence to tie a little laminated letter onto a small tree at the bottom of the road detailing these preposterous plans, instead of delivering a proper letter to each resident in the local and surrounding area. It is clear that the school has hoped that this would miss the attention of the residents and that these plans would go through unopposed.

This will not happen. There are many reasons that we will not support this application.

- Noise pollution. It is ludicrous to imagine that residents would support live music and noisy performances from 9am to 11pm, 6 days a week. Noise abuse is unacceptable and illegal.
- Litter. Residents are totally fed up with the copious litter that is thrown down on a daily basis by the school pupils. Roads are infested with vermin, and stink of rubbish. The school has never implemented a plan to control this problem, despite numerous promises that they would. This was contingent upon the children using the gate entrance at the bottom of Gladesmore Rd.
- Rowdy, unacceptable behaviour. Residents have to put up with verbal abuse and intimidation on a daily basis. This will surely increase with the proposed plans as there will be endless streams of people wandering up and down the road.
- Parking problems. Parking is already a scarce commodity as it is. With the new block of flats estimated to bring another 30 vehicles to the area, we are curious to know where we will put our vehicles. Your proposition is bound to bring many other vehicles to the area, and this can only lead to confrontation and unhappiness on a daily basis for the residents. We would like to emphasise that this is a residential area, not a commercial one.

- Criminal behaviour. As you are aware, music and other such functions draw a crowd, and they won't all be law abiding citizens. We are sure you are also aware that we have a large number of roving criminals in the area already, gangs on bikes, gangs with dogs, etc. Their activities will surely intensify as the number of pedestrians suitable for mugging increase, and as the number of cars to have their windows smashed will increase. There are STILL no cameras (CCTV) installed on the streets and park, despite numerous requests for this every year.

- Drugs and alcohol. Events such as these planned will certainly attract problems that go with drug and alcohol-related behaviour. Again, no control

can be guaranteed.

These are merely some of the points raised by the residents, and we urge you to consider very seriously the implication of your proposal. We are a residential community, and will stand together in our opposition to these plans.

Noise Nuisance, Litter and Disorderly Behaviour

Having events at the school mean a traffic of young people down our street from morning until nearly midnight. At the moment, when the school lets out we have screaming and loutish behaviour from many students during the breaks and recesses. This is a quiet residential street with many young Orthodox Jewish Families with babies and young children, and other families with children as well as single and elderly residents.

Live music and making music are particularly obnoxious, as the sound is very loud and travels over the whole area. This will interfere with normal life of the community. Also the hours listed are quite outrageous for normal community life, going from 9.00 A.M. until 11.00 P.M. six nights of the week.

We have regularly to deal with disorderly conduct of young people, most of whom do not come from the local area and therefore do not have any allegiance or concern for the local residents and community.

Litter is a great nuisance already, and no extra concern is given to the residents of this street and area who not only have normal use of the street, litter from users of the park at the next to the school, and now the extra stress of young people and their litter –from early morning to late at night if this application is approved.

Crime and Disorder

There is also a known problem of drug dealers in the area who we worry will find an increased opportunity to deal their deadly wares under the cover of nightfall to young people



Most of the activities listed offer the potential for aggravation of already disturbing community relationships with the local Gladesmore Community School and certainly will contribute to an increase in the fearfulness of the local Jewish Community who already feel threatened by rising anti-Semitic behaviour.

We do not have the infrastructurhere to have such activities take place in a safe and non threatening manner – from a person-centred point of view and from the point of view of litter, filth and the environment. We are already invaded by rats because of food which is regularly thrown onto our street.

Public Nuisance

Parking is already difficult here owing to school staff and teachers in the daytime, and we will now experience the same problems at night. This will mean people will have to park further away and walk a long way to their homes with children, shopping, heavy packages, etc. This may lead to further crime owing to confrontations with roving young people in the local area.

We hope you will consider the above representations regarding the licensing objectives and not permit this application for premises license to proceed.






Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

As a business neighbour of Wetherspoons, I wish to make the following representations with regards to their application to permit live music, live entertainment, dancing and recorded music from 7am to 2am Sunday to Thursday, and 7am to 3am Saturday and Sunday.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

By permitting Wetherspoons to carry out these licensable activities 19 hours a day during the week and 20 hours a day at weekends, there is a probability that crime and disorder related to the area will rise.

Dispersal at the end of the evening on Friday and Saturday becomes an issue in relation to public place violent crime. It is recognised that staggered finishing times of licensable activities in venues within close proximity helps to reduce crime and disorder. By finishing some licensable activities at 3am, Wetherspoons' customers would be exiting onto the street at the same time as Shout customers, thus creating a potential flashpoint.

Public Safety

Wetherspoons does not currently operate with SIA registered door supervisors. According to their application, they have not suggested that this should be a condition, allowing them to continue trading without door supervisors. This has a major impact upon their ability to meet the public safety objective of the Licensing Act 2003.

The building is designed to be, and has been operated successfully as, a public house, with the emphasis on "value for money" drinks prices and food. The application signifies a substantial change of use, to a venue providing dancing, live music, recorded music, and live entertainment until 3am, the activities of a late night discothèque. Because the operating policy and building design are that of a public house rather than a night club, public safety becomes an issue.

It would be unthinkable for an experienced operator of late night entertainment premises to apply for the activities and times that have been requested, without proposing the employment of SIA registered door staff as a condition.

Public Nuisance

There is obvious potential for nuisance to the local residents by operating live music, live entertainment and dancing for up to 19 hours per day (20 hours at weekends) in an area which is primarily residential. Whilst Wetherspoons may not, at this moment in time, intend to utilise the full extent of their licensable activities, there would be nothing to stop them doing so should their application be approved.

For the reasons stated above, I believe that the application should be rejected because it does not fulfil the objectives of the Licensing Act 2003.
