## LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE HEARINGS PROCEDURE SUMMARY INTRODUCTION The Chair introduces himself and invites other Members, Council officers, Police, Applicant and Objectors to do the same. The Chair invites Members to disclose any prior contacts (before the hearing) with the parties or representations received by them The Chair explains the procedure to be followed by reference to this summary which will be 3. distributed. **NON-ATTENDANCE BY PARTY OR PARTIES** If one or both of the parties fails to attend, the Chair decides whether to: grant an adjournment to another date, or (i) (ii) proceed in the absence of the non-attending party. Normally, an absent party will be given one further chance to attend. **TOPIC HEADINGS** The Chair suggests the "topic headings" for the hearing. In the case of the majority applications for variation of hours, or other terms and conditions, the main topic is: Whether the extensions of hours etc. applied for would conflict with the four licensing objectives i.e. (i) the prevention of crime and disorder, (ii) public safety, (iii) the prevention of public nuisance, and (iv) the protection of children from harm. The Chair invites comments from the parties on the suggested topic headings and decides whether to confirm or vary them. WITNESSES The Chair asks whether there are any requests by a party to call a witness and decides any such request. Only if a witness is to be called, the Chair then asks if there is a request by an opposing party to "cross-examine" the witness. The Chair then decides any such request. **DOCUMENTARY EVIDENCE** The Chair asks whether there are any requests by any party to introduce late documentary evidence. 10. If so, the Chair will ask the other party if they object to the admission of the late documents. 11. If the other party do object to the admission of documents which have only been produced by the first party at the hearing, then the documents shall not be admitted.

### 5.3 Crime and Disorder

A digital Closed Circuit Television System will be installed and maintained on the premises. The CCTV system will be recording at all times when the premises are open and the recordings shall be kept for at least 31 days and made available to the Police and Council on request within 24 hours.

A Minimum of two door supervisors will be stationed on the premises between 21.00 and the closing of the premises when regulated entertainment is taking place.

### 5.4 Public Safety

Fire Safety equipment will be checked regularly and any requirements made by the Fire Safety Officer will be complied with.

The Maximum capacity of the premises at any time will be restricted as required by the Fire Safety Officer.

### 5.5 Public Nuisance

A noise limiter will be installed at a level set by the Environmental Health Officer. Signs will be displayed at the exit reminding customers to leave quietly and respect the neighbours.

Staff will call Taxis/Mini Cabs for the use of customers leaving the premises when requested to do so.

#### 5.6 Child Protection

All staff will be trained that alcohol will only be sold to persons who can produce photographic identification where there is any doubt that they are over the age of 18. All persons who appear to be under 21 will be challenged to produce photographic identification.





Fire safety equipment will be checked regularly and any requirements made by the Fire Safety Officer will be complied with.  The maximum capacity of the premises at any one time will be restricted as required by the Fire Safety Officer.

A noise limiter will be installed at a level set by the Environmental Health Officer.  Signs will be displayed at the exit reminding customers to leave quietly and respect the neighbours  Staff will call Taxis / Mini cabs for the use of customers leaving the premises when requested to

All staff will be trained that alcohol will only be sold to persons who can produce photographic identification where there is any doubt that they are over the age of 18 All persons who appear to be under 21 will be challenged to produce photographic identification..

I would like to confirm that we have considered the above proposal with regard to the prevention of public nuisance and wish to make representations to the Variation on the following grounds

Due to the close proximity of residential dwellings, the proposed operating hours are inappropriate.

The premises opening later is likely to lead to the Enforcement Response out of hours team continuing to receive complaints about music and other noise from the premises

Noise caused by patrons exiting the premises and locating suitable transport home is likely to be detrimental to the residential amenity.

#### Supporting Information

Bar Apogee is a detached property situated on a busy main road. Residential accommodation is situated to the right (as viewed from the front) and across the road.

In excess of 30 complaints have been received about noise since 15<sup>th</sup> April 2007 Noise nuisance has been witnessed in the past year on a number of occasions resulting in the issue of warning during May 2007 and abatement Notices, under section 80 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 in July 2007 and October 2007 with a final warning issued on 15<sup>th</sup> October 2007

Bar Apogee have addressed some of the concerns & a noise limiter has been recently installed and speakers relocated.

However, on the weekend of the 8/9<sup>th</sup> December 2007, an officer from the Enforcement Response Team received a complaint of noise nuisance from Bar Apogee. The noise was clearly audible from across the street during the early hours of the morning.

This indicated that the recommendations made are not being adhered to and that it is inappropriate for the premises to be open later than the currently agreed time. In fact having

regard to the absence of effective sound insulation at the premises there is the likelihood of complaints increasing if the premises opens later

We therefore recommend that the premises closes no later than currently agreed time and that regulated entertainment ceases at the currently agreed time.

However if it is seen fit to extend the hours then the following conditions should be placed upon the license

## Prevention of nuisance from noise/vibration

#### Airborne

The lobbied door to minimise noise breakout used for patrons to enter or leave the premises should be fitted with a self-closing device and staff required to ensure that it is not propped open & a member of staff shall be positioned at the door to ensure it is opened for as brief a period as possible

#### Sound limits

The licensee shall ensure that no music played in the licensed premises is audible at or within the site boundary of any residential property level of amplified entertainments & sound levels shall be controlled by means of a limiting device set at a level agreed with the licensing authority / Enforcement Response team.

#### **Outside Areas**

No music will be played in, or for the benefit of patrons in the external areas of the premises

No form of loudspeaker or sound amplification equipment is to be sited on or near the exterior of the premises or in or near any foyer, doorway, window or opening to the premises

#### Dealing with complaints

A complaints book will be held on the premises to record details of any complaints received from neighbours. The information is to include where disclosed, the complainants name, location, date time and subsequent remedial action undertaken. This record must be made available at all times for inspection by council officers

Regular liaison meetings will be held to enable neighbours to raise concerns about any aspect of the licensed activities

#### Patrons entering/exiting premises.

Where people queue to enter the premises a licensed door supervisor shall supervise and ensure the potential patrons behave in an acceptable manor

When the premises turn out a licensed door supervisor shall supervise patrons and ensure they leave in a prompt and courteous manor, respecting the neighbours

Signs should be displayed instructing patrons to respect the neighbours and behave in a courteous manor

A licensed door supervisor will be positioned on the exit door to ensure, as far as reasonably practical, that patrons do not leave with drinks



I refer to the above and wish to register my opposition to the recent application for a premises licence made by Thespoula Athanasi and Anastasia Pieris.

I live in close proximity to Bar Apogee, together with my partner and three young children. I am self-employed and work mainly from home.

From around April 2007 the peaceful enjoyment of my home has been disturbed by noise emanating from Bar Apogee, and also from its customers arriving and leaving the premises, particularly after 11 pm on Friday and Saturday nights.

I did approach Ms Athanais and Ms Pieris directly on a number of occasions to discuss the problems I am experiencing. Initially they appeared to be receptive to my concerns. I have also contacted the Noise Team at Haringey.

The music emanating from Bar Apogee is disruptive. It is in my opinion excessive and inappropriately loud given the proximity of the bar to local residents, and the construction of the bar itself. I do not think the building has adequate sound proofing to deal with the level and type of music played. The bass is a particular problem causing vibration to my property.



I am also disturbed by the noise made by customers arriving and leaving what is essentially a destination venue. A particular problem is the noise made by customers hanging around outside after 11 pm on Friday and Saturday nights, and after the bar has closed. There is also noise from cars reviving engines, sounding horns, accelerating away fast etc. On occasion customers appear to have left the bar well after the official closing time.

The back of my property, which is relatively quiet, overlooks the car park at the rear of Bar Apogee. I am disturbed by customers of the bar using the car park, particularly after 11 pm. This includes the reviving of car engines, loud in-car music with heavy base, and conducting loud and raucous conversations. It is a small car park and even when empty it is not possible to turn round without using reverse gear. The difficulty in getting in and out of the car park is increased when the car park is congested.

The above problems cause sleep and more general disturbance to my family. My partner fully endorses the points raised in this letter.

I very much hope the above will be taken into consideration when making a decision regarding this application.

I have just discovered today that the Bar Apogee (115 Park Road N8 8JN) has applied for an extension of its trading license hours.

I am wholly opposed to this application. Since this bar started trading I have been frequently disturbed, particularly on Friday and Saturday nights due to the following forms of nuisance:

- 1. Loud music. (Public Nuisance)
- 2. Patrons having no regard for the area and its residents by shouting and shrieking in the vicinity of the bar and along the street. Also by slamming car doors, starting and revving car engines when they arrive and leave. (Public nuisance and disorder)
- 3. Cars parked along a very narrow section of road, often on both sides of the road and on the pavements.

Dear Mr Barrett,

I am writing to object to the proposed late night extension of licencing hours for Bar Apogee, 115 Park Road N8.

I live close to Bar Apogee and feel that extension of hours as late as 4am will cause further unreasonable disturbance to myself and other residents.

Having lived here for over 10 years, I have noticed an increase in noise disturbance at night since Bar Apogee opened earlier this year, especially at weekends, in the form of shrieking and shouting from

revellers, car door slamming and reving of engines. I feel this has increased due to the type of young "club scene" clientelle the bar seeks to attract, as I have not noticed such pronounced nuisance from the premises when under previous management.

I have also observed cars cruising round the area after 12pm playing music loudly whilst apparently looking for space to park. To extend opening hours to 4am I feel will encourage similar behaviour from clientelle even later into the night.

The current appearance of the bar in the evenings I have to say I find somewhat intimidating, as at weekends I have often had to step past groups of people congregating outside Bar Apogee, presumably smokers, but who have at times been rowdy and have clearly been drinking. The

Bar does sometimes have bouncers on the door, and whilst this may indicate that the management are prepared to deal with troublesome clientelle, it also indicates that the Bar by the nature of its "nightclub" style is encouraging potentially troublesome clientelle into a residential area, who will only drink more if hours are further extended.

My impression is that there has been an increase over the past year of violent attacks in the area around Bar Apogee, and I have seen bloodstains on the pavement nearby on several occasions this year.

Park Road is a residential area, and a number of my close neighbours have children. I do not feel it is beneficial or fair to have them exposed to this kind of environment, nor to have our sleep disturbed further by noise into the night.

Finally, I would add that the increased pressure on car parking in the area at night can be hazardous. At some weekends after 11pm cars have been parked outside Bar Apogee and my house on both sides of the road (including stretch limousines on a number of occasions). This appears to be due to overspill from Bar Apogee's car park. This narrows the road further and means buses and wide vehicles have to brake (often noisily) to give way to oncoming traffic.

It has come to my notice that the local Bar Apogee has applied for an extension to it's current opening hours, which would now take the time it currently serves alcohol to 4 am and I am no writing to you as a concerned adjacent resident to say that I must most strongly contest the granting of such an extension. I have lived in this property for nearly 22 years, love the area for the residential oasis that it is and would want to see the atmostphere of family life maintained as much as possible. This move would, I feel, run counter to that.

While I appreciate that London has an increasing population with it's additional recreational demands, it doesn't make sense to me to add to the stress levels of the people for whom this is home, and I do consider this a home for my 2 children and I. I have seen such an increase in disorderly behaviour in the immediate vicinity brought on by excessive alcohol consumption that I am starting to have concerns for my 20 year old daughter returning home late at night from visiting friends who live in other boroughs or even other houses here. She is imminently sensible about the route she takes and how she behaves, but there is no way she can avoid walking home without passing the bar. We have never before felt unsafe in this neighbouhood and want that not to become the norm; as I have said, it is still home to my family and all the residents who live along this road, so public safety will continue to become a growing concern with extended licensing hours, bringing into the area a lot of people who have no vested interest in the neighbourhood or the effects their behaviour may have on it.

I myself have been in the road outside at 3 am, sweeping up after a group of 2/4 men who had been loitering on the pavement and were very much 'under the influence' and decided it would be fun to take the revolving glass advertising stand from the bar/pub/garage (who knows!), smash it onto the road in a show of absurd bravado and then kick the glass around for a while for additional mirth. The noise of the traffic braking to swerve round the glass and the noise of other cars driving over it kept me up for an hour before I could no longer tolerate it, got dressed, took my broom and swept the debris off the road and into a bin before returning to try and get to sleep for what was left of the night. In the past we have had dreadful problems with late night swimmers in the Lido behind us, having just vacated the local pub as it was then and deciding that a late night swim was what was needed on a balmy summer night; the Pool authorities were very sympathetic and did their utmost to increase security and the nuisance swimmers did eventually stop. It would be awful to see that state of affairs return again, with a small sector of the community having further opportunity to cause more trouble simply because they are under the influence of alcohol and still in the area, rather than going home at an earlier hour and sleeping it off!

Early last year I witnessed a bicycle theft in the property opposite me, having already alerted the police

but being unable to leave my house as my son was asleep and I didn't want to run the risk of potential retaliation from the 2 men who were intent on stealing the bike in the garden across the road. It was obvious that they were both drunk and rather the worse for wear, but these recurring incidents just add to the worry of being an innner city resident. I appreciate that a lot of this kind of crime is opportunity related, but when you extend opening hours like this, there are more opportinities for visitors to add to the police figures of local theft and vandalism in this area and that cannot ever be a good thing.

In terms of public safety, the verbal/physical violence of some of the customers who have frequented both the bar on the Apogee site and the Princess Alexandra across the road is also on the increase and it is getting to be a very literal nightmare for those of us who live nearby, not being made any better for those with small children. My own car has been "keyed" and we've had car mirrors smashed, beer thrown over some vehicles and beer bottles/glasses left on the road or the adjoining walls from the night before. The noise of VERY lound music plus people shouting/swearing on the pavements outside is a regular 'early hours' occurrence. It wears you down with it's regularity and often makes working the next day appalingly hard when your degree of sleep has been so heavily compromised. The weekends are the only time most of us have to recover/regain our life/work balance and I am gong to admit that I have often gone to stay with friends rather than run the risk of continously disrupted sleep at night in my own home.

Add to this the problem of even more parking and traffic congestion as cars circle the area looking for somewhere to park off road and I just do NOT see how any real consideration of granting this licence application is feasible, let alone advisable.

I apologise if this seems like a diatribe of complaint, but I am appalled that such a licence is even being considered by the establishment in question, given that the owners know full well that it is a residential area, with families living all around it!! It just doesn't make sense to me and I would even like to see the current licence revoked to a time that is more appropriate for it's place in the vicinity.

Please do not hesitate to contact me with any queries at all regarding this email and I would very much appreciate a return email to say that you have received it. I understand that the deadline for it's receipt it Sunday, so I should be well within time for that.

### **Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions**

This licence has been granted upon the conversion, under Schedule 8 to the Licensing Act 2003, of the existing justices' license and such rights and restrictions that applied thereto are hereby incorporated into this license, subject to any terms herein to the contrary and / or any limitation or restriction imposed by the Licensing Act 2003 or any subsequent amendment thereto.

- 1) Intoxicating liquor may be sold only to members of the club meeting at premises for consumption by those members and their bona fide guests.
- 2) No person shall be admitted to membership of the said club without an interval of at least two days between nomination or application for membership and admission as a member of the club.
- 3) There shall be no OFF sales.
- 4) There shall be no external advertisement of the availability of alcohol within the premises.
- 5) No application for an occasional licence shall be made under the authority of a licence.

Supply of alcohol: No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (3) The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

RE: formal representation – objections to extending the alcohol selling hours to 9am-3am at the Edge's snooker club.

I am writing to inform you that I strongly oppose allowing the Edge Snooker club to sell alcohol from 9 am to 3 am.

Over the last year Bruce Grove neighbours have had many problems with noise and rowdy behaviour on the streets. Extending the Edge's alcohol selling hours would only boost antisocial behaviour in the neighbourhood, and would make living in Bruce Grove even harder.

I believe it is also a health and safety risk to allow increased alcohol consumption in the Edge when there is a youth centre 50 yards from it. Young people usually gather at the front of the youth centre after finishing their activities even late in the afternoon. It is just not safe to have a youth centre next to the Edge, and extending the Edge's alcohol selling hours would make it even less safe.

Our quality of life has worsen as a result of the illegal raves that took place at the Edge over the past months: after the raves there were incidents of drunken people shouting on the street, people urinating in our front yards, and cars racing up and down Bruce Grove. Extending the Edge's alcohol selling hours would make these incidents more likely to occur.

I look forward to hearing from you and I would appreciate it if you could confirm that you have received this message.

Dear Daliah,

I writing in response to the application made by The Edge to extend the hours of the sale of alcohol. I would like to register my objections to the proposals because, in my opinion, they are totally inappropriate for a residential area such as Bruce Grove.

Extending this licence is likely to result in increased noise in the area late at night. I am also concerned that inebriated customers leaving The Edge might engage in antisocial behaviour such as throwing litter and urinating in front drives. In addition, there is no parking in Bruce Grove, so we will probably see more illegally parked cars blocking our drives.

Last summer a number of local residents complained about illegal raves that were being held at the Edge. These have, for the time-being, come to an end, but at the time we experienced the difficulties described above.

I would be grateful if you could consider this letter as a formal representation against the extended licence being granted and forward it to the appropriate authority.

I hope the committee will reject this application as it will any subsequent threats to what remains of a peaceful life for inhabitants of this part of Bruce Grove.

#### Dear Daliah

I have just passed 'The Edge Snooker Club' in Bruce Grove and have seen a small, unofficial pices of blue paper posted on the door at a height where it is difficult for me (5' 11") to read it. This says that they are applying for an extension to their licensing hours and any issues must be raised in writing by 17 November (yesterday!).

### I have 3 concerns:

- 1. A number of raves have been held on these premises, keeping us awake with music, cars coming and going and rowdy, drunken behaviour in the street. You are aware of of our complaints.
- 2. Despite our complaints, we were not informed of this application. There is no official document posted on the premises to inform the public. It is too late to look at the plans.
- 3. There are large posters on the doors advertising drinks at £1.50 for members. Anything posted on the outside of the building is clearly intended for non-members and not members.

We have had a lot of problems in the last year with noise and rowdy behaviour, both at these premises and at 'Bar 3'. Bar 3 now seems to be quiet and we do not want additional problems.

Please advise me on what we should do.
