## 1. Purpose

To approve fees and charges for the year 2008/2009 in relation to services administered by Streetscene business unit.

#### 2. Recommendations

- (a) That the Lead Member agree the increases in fees and charges being proposed for Streetscene business unit to be implemented from 1 April 2008.
- (b) Note that inflationary increases in parking fees and charges will be reported separately to be implemented from 1 July 2008.

## 3. Policy summary

3.1 The fees and charges raised for various Streetscene services generated income of £13.8m in 2007/8 (summary attached Appendix B) which partly offsets costs by around 25% for the Council. The Council's Budget Setting Process for 2008/09 assumed that service fees and charges budgets will increase by 2.5%. The price increases proposed in this report will at least meet this requirement as set out in the pre business plan review for 2008/9 approved by the Council.

#### 5. REPORT

5.1 The fees and charges proposed are as detailed in Appendix A to this report covering the following services:-

Highways

- 5.2 A summary of Streetscene services gross income and expenditure budget for 2007/08 is attached at appendix B.
- 5.3 In preparing this report the following factors have been taken into account:
  - The fees and charges of neighbouring boroughs
  - The increase in materials and other costs.
  - Where applicable, the current market rates
  - VAT implications
- 5.4 The Council's external income policy has two fundamental principals that: Services should raise income wherever there is the power or duty so to do; and the income should (at least) cover the full cost, including all overheads of the service. Streetscene increases generally reflect increases in line with the RPI which is currently running at about 4%
- 5.6 Fees and Charges are inclusive of VAT where applicable

# 6. Legal Implications

# Comments of the Head of Legal Services

6.1 The Council is able to charge for dealing with such functions as set out in this report. The amount of a charge is to the Council's discretion and in determining the amount the Council shall have regard to the cost to the Council of dealing with the matters in question.

## 7. Comments of Chief Financial Officer

7.1 The Council's budget setting process for 2008/09 assumes inflationary increase in income of 2.5%. The increases proposed in this report are reflective of the RPI at 4% and therefore will be sufficient to meet the Streetscene budget target assumptions in respect of the services included. Generally fees and charges should be set in line with the Council's external income policy agreed by Members. The policy requires budget holders to review fees and charges against corporately set criteria as well as other factors that may be relevant. The fees and charges being considered in this report have been reviewed in line with this policy.

### 8. EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES COMMENTS

8.1 In the context of anti-poverty policies, any charging or increase in charges for the services listed would have a detrimental impact on some low paid/unwaged members of the community. However, people in need are protected from adverse effects in many instances by the concessions made.

## 9 ENVIRONMENTAL COMMENT

9.1 Many of the services listed are associated with improving the environment of those who live, work and travel within the Borough. It is clearly important therefore that the right balance is achieved between the level of fees for services and the sustainable consumer demand for those services.
