ROYAL ISTANBUL RESTAURANT, 1 QUEEN'S PARADE, GREEN LANES, LONDON N8 <p>The Licensing Sub Committee (the Committee) were asked to consider an application for a Premises Licence for the supply of alcohol, the provision of Regulated Entertainment and provision of Late Night Refreshment.</p> <p>The Licensing Officer presented the report and advised the Committee that representations had been received from the Police in respect of the hours for the sale of alcohol. The Police had requested that the hours be reduced by 30 minutes each day before the premises closed and this had now been reflected in the details of the application sought. The Committee were further advised that the premises were open and operating with no licensable activities taking place however, the playing of background music did not require a licence.</p> <p>The Licensing Officer informed the Committee that representations had also been received from interested parties. Local residents had raised concerns regarding noise late at night and weekends. Litter and mess was frequently left in the immediate area and there was a daily occurrence of people urinating in the streets. The applicant had responded to the letter of objection from residents and had offered measures to address residents' concerns by withdrawing his request for recorded music and to reduce the operating hours at the weekend. The applicant had since requested that the opening hours applied for would be those requested on the original application.</p> <p>The Committee enquired about the letter on page 96-97 of the agenda and who the author was. In response the Committee were advised that the letter was signed by the residents of Falklands Road. The legal officer clarified that normally a letter would not be accepted if it was not signed by an individual and did not have an address. In respect of this letter, it was signed by several residents who lived in the immediate vicinity and therefore, was accepted as a letter of representation. The issues raised in the letter were the same as those raised by the objector present at the hearing.</p> <p>An objector addressed the Committee and stated as a local resident living in on the road since 1961, he was continually experiencing disturbances of noise pollution. He was constantly disturbed by people leaving premises and walking to their cars. People were inconsiderate, it had become unbearable and had reached an intolerable point. There had been an overkill of these types of premises in the area.</p> <p>The objector was asked whether he had experienced any problems directly related to the Istanbul restaurant. The Committee was informed in response that there had been none however, problems experienced with other premises influenced his decision to object to any premises being granted late night operating hours. Members further enquired what objections he had to the applicant's premises. The objector responded that there was an overkill of restaurant's in the area</p>

and people who used these venues were causing parking pressure for residents.

A local resident addressed the Committee concerned about the early opening hours of 7:00am. This was considered to be excessive before children were going to school. There was no necessity for the premises to be open before 10am as this was considered to be a more reasonable opening time. If the premises were permitted opening hours before 10am then deliveries and collection of waste would be during the early hours of the morning. Litter and rubbish left in the immediate area in the mornings was considered to be disgusting along with vomit, urine and needles.

The Committee enquired whether the concerns raised could be attributed to a restaurant. The objector responded that there was an excessive number of businesses in the area with long operating hours which attracted unsavoury customers and it was the community which suffered the consequences.

The applicant addressed the Committee and confirmed that the business would be operated as a restaurant and not a night club or private venue holding parties. Other venues mentioned in the locality were night clubs, pubs and entertainment venues with later operating hours. The restaurant would provide low background music and would meet the needs of customers requirements. The application to open at 7am was in order to also offer breakfast to customers. It was proposed that CCTV would be in operation throughout the opening hours and assistance would be provided to the police and the community when requested. The applicant further commented on the signatures on the petition and explained that some of the local residents had been to the restaurant after they had signed the petition. Upon confirmation that the venue would not be a night club those residents had withdrawn their representations.

The committee questioned the applicant and raised concerns about:

- Proposals to place chairs and tables outside the restaurant.
- Where would customers go to smoke.
- When offering snacks/light foods to customers would they be consuming alcohol.
- Was there an intention to hire the premises for private functions.

In response the applicant stated that it was not his intention to put tables and chairs outside the restaurant as the location was a corner premises and therefore, this would not be possible. There was no designated smoking area within the restaurant so customers would only be able to smoke once they had left the restaurant. It was also the applicant's intention to provide whatever customers wanted in terms of meals/snacks/light meals and alcohol. There was no intention to hire the premises for private functions as the size of the premises could not accommodate functions like weddings etc.

The objectors summed up their representations and stated that the premises would be advertised as a bar.

The Licensing Officer advised that Committee that they could not take into account the demand or overkill of restaurant's in an area. The application for the provision of alcohol could be conditioned with alcohol only being served ancillary to eating a meal.

The applicant summed up by stating that the concerns raised by the objectors were not directly related to the premises and therefore requested that the application be granted.

RESOLVED

The Committee decided to grant the application as requested with the following further conditions:

1. Signs will be displayed at the exist reminding customers to leave quietly and respect the neighbours.
2. All CCTV recordings are to be of a sufficient quality to enable it to be used for evidential purposes if necessary and all records of all CCTV recordings inside and outside the premises to be kept for three months and made available to the police and Licensing Authority upon request.
3. Alcohol is only to be served ancillary to substantial meals (other than snacks).
4. No alcohol shall be taken outside of the premises by customers.
5. Mandatory condition 19.

The Committee heard evidence from objectors stating that they were experiencing problems with noise and anti social behaviour in the area but confirmed that this was not attributable to this particular premise. The objectors made reference to over proliferation and saturation of restaurants, pubs and clubs in the area but this was not a matter that the Committee could take into account under Licensing Legislation. Reference was also made to parking however; this was not attributable to the premises and would be out of the applicants control and not a matter that could be legitimately considered by the Committee.

The applicant confirmed that the hours of operation were necessary in order to serve breakfast in the morning and meals in the evening and that the hours for the supply of alcohol had been reduced in accordance with the Police request. The applicant also confirmed that the premises would be run as a restaurant only and alcohol would only be served ancillary to meals. Based on these findings and having taken all the evidence presented in writing and at the Committee into consideration the Committee decided to grant the hours as requested with the additional conditions.

INTRODUCTION	
1.	The Chair introduces himself and invites other Members, Council officers, Police, Applicant and Objectors to do the same.
2.	The Chair invites Members to disclose any prior contacts (before the hearing) with the parties or representations received by them
3.	The Chair explains the procedure to be followed by reference to this summary which will be distributed.
NON-ATTENDANCE BY PARTY OR PARTIES	
4.	If one or both of the parties fails to attend, the Chair decides whether to:
	(i) grant an adjournment to another date, or
	(ii) proceed in the absence of the non-attending party.
	Normally, an absent party will be given one further chance to attend.
TOPIC HEADINGS	
5.	The Chair suggests the “topic headings” for the hearing. In the case of the majority of applications for variation of hours, or other terms and conditions, the main topic is: Whether the extensions of hours etc. applied for would conflict with the four licensing objectives i.e.
	(i) the prevention of crime and disorder,
	(ii) public safety,
	(iii) the prevention of public nuisance, and
	(iv) the protection of children from harm.
6.	The Chair invites comments from the parties on the suggested topic headings and decides whether to confirm or vary them.
WITNESSES	
7.	The Chair asks whether there are any requests by a party to call a witness and decides any such request.
8.	Only if a witness is to be called, the Chair then asks if there is a request by an opposing party to “cross-examine” the witness. The Chair then decides any such request.
DOCUMENTARY EVIDENCE	
9.	The Chair asks whether there are any requests by any party to introduce late documentary evidence.
10.	If so, the Chair will ask the other party if they object to the admission of the late documents.
11.	If the other party do object to the admission of documents which have only been produced by the first party at the hearing, then the documents shall not be admitted.

12.	If the other party object to documents produced late but before the hearing, the following criteria shall be taken into account when the Chair decides whether or not to admit the late documents:	
(i)	What is the reason for the documents being late?	
(ii)	Will the other party be unfairly taken by surprise by the late documents?	
(iii)	Will the party seeking to admit late documents be put at a major disadvantage if admission of the documents is refused?

5. REPORT

Background

- 5.1** The Licensing Act 2003 establishes a regime to allow a person who holds a Personal Licence to be able to apply for a variation to a Premise Licence to be assigned as the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 5.2** The application is made to the Licensing Authority where the premises are situated. A copy must be served on the Police who may if there are exceptional circumstances, give notice of objection within 14 days where they are satisfied that the granting of the application would undermine the prevention of crime licensing objective.
- 5.3** For the variation of a Premises Licence to specify a Designated Premises Supervisor, the application is given effect immediately.
- 5.4** The application must be granted unless the Chief Officer of Police for the area submits a notice of representation. When a notice of representation is received the Licensing Authority must hold a hearing to consider the representation.

6.0 Current application and consultation –APP 1

Application was received from Admiral Taverns to assign a new designated premises supervisor, the application was served on the Police. Copies of the applications are included in the papers provided to the Sub-Committee.

- 6.1** The Metropolitan Police have raised a notice of representation as described by the Act to the variation applied for, a copy of the representation has been provided to the applicant and is included in the papers provided to the Sub Committee. **APP 2**

7.0 Points of clarification.

The Licensing Act 2003 Hearing Regulations 2005 requires that a notice of hearing be sent to applications and responsible authorities where relevant representation have been received within the statutory time frame.

Determination of applicants

Where notice of representation has been received from the Chief Officer of Police, the Licensing Authority must hold a hearing unless the authority, the applicant and the Chief of Police who gave the notice of representation agree that a hearing is unnecessary. There has been no such agreement in respect of these applications.

The Licensing Sub-Committee, therefore, have two options available to them:

(a) Having regard to the notice of representation, reject the application if it considers it necessary for the promotion of the crime prevention objective to do so ; or

(b) Grant the application.

Policy Considerations

In exercising its functions the Licensing Authority must have regard to the Governments Statutory Guidance. The Following sections are relevant to this application:-

(a) Chapter 2 paragraphs 2.1 – 2.16 and Annex D Part 1 (Crime and Disorder)

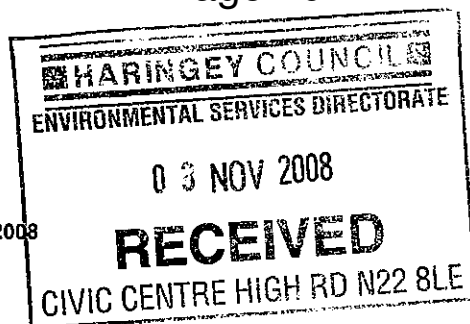

I am in receipt of an application made by Admiral Taverns to vary the Designated Premises Supervisor at the British Queen Public House Love Lane N.17. The application is in the name of Sandra Brunette who holds a personal licence issued by Waltham Forest Council.

I wish to make a representation under Sec 37 (5) of the Licensing Act 2003.

I believe that the granting of this application will undermine the Crime Prevention Objective.

This public house has for several years been a problem to the local police and the residents of the area with many complaints of noise and drug dealing taking place in and around the premises.

The Police have held regular meetings with the previous management and Mr. Colin Rawson the Business Development Manager of Admiral Taverns in 2007/2008. The purpose of these meetings was to work with the management towards improving the day to day operation of the premises.

In June 2008 the management absconded from the premises and Admiral taverns re possessed the property.

In September 2008 a Ms Helen Hocking with her business partner took possession of the premises. Ms Hocking applied to become the Designated Premises Supervisor. This application was granted.

The Public House re opened after re – furbishment on the 3rd October 2008. On the 17th October 2008 Ms Hocking contacted me and said that due to differences with her new business partner a Mr Roger Davis she was resigning as the Designated Premises Supervisor with immediate effect. I informed Mr. Rawson of this and requested that he informed Mr. Davis that he could not open the premises until a suitable D.P.S. was found. Mr. Rawson informed him of this.

The British Queen was visited by Police over this weekend and the premises were operating normally, even though they had been told that no sale of alcohol should be undertaken at the premise, this was not adhered. Police did not close the premises due to the number of customers and lack of Police resources.

On Monday 22nd October 2008 a Ms Sandra Brunette contacted me and said that she was to be the new D. P.S. at the British Queen. We had a brief discussion and I asked her re her involvement in the premises. She told me that she would not be working at the premises except at the weekends when she may work behind the bar. I asked her re her experience in the licensing trade and she told me that she is the D.P.S. at British Home Stores, Walthamstow Market E17.

I checked with the Police Licensing Officer for Waltham Forest and he confirmed this to be true. She's been on the licence since 15th November 2007.

This Public House has been a source of problems to the local Police for some time with Crime and Disorder a major problem. I do not believe that Ms. Brunette would be a suitable person due to the fact that she will not be working at the premises except for the occasional weekend and being the D.P.S for British Home Stores does not give her any experience to manage a traditionally difficult public house in a high crime area.







GROUND FLOOR PLAN**

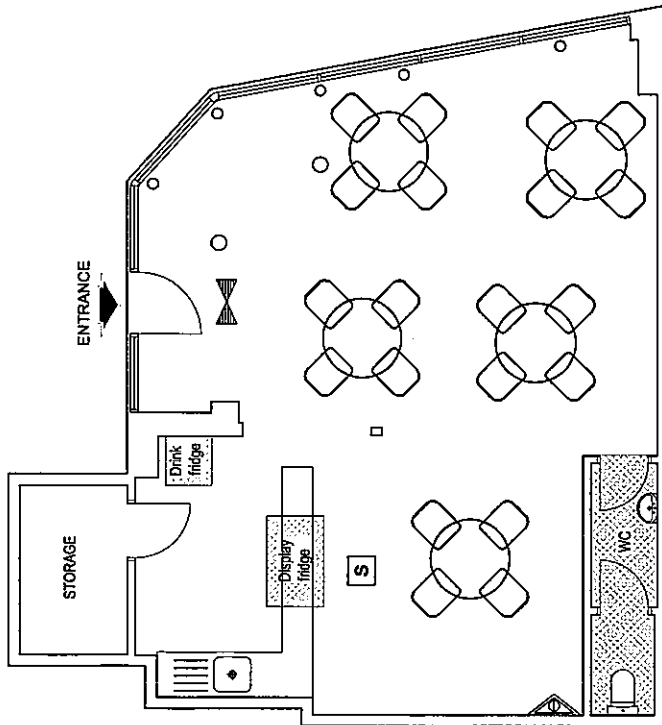

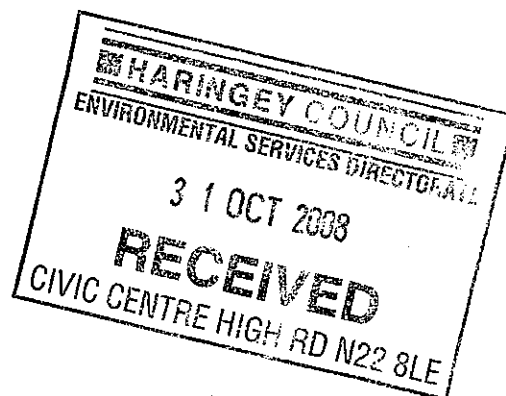

I wish to contest the application for Ocean Traditional Turkish Café House (210-212 Phillip Lane) to be allowed license to sell alcohol.

I live at 1A Kitchener Road, just next to the café, and this area already has significant problems with **litter and noise** – partially as a result of the 24-hour shop opposite the café site which itself has license to sell alcohol 24 hours a day and attracts undesirables late into the night and early morning. Currently the area directly outside the café is awash with cigarette butts and Kitchener Road is strewn with empty beer cans. Allowing alcohol to be sold at yet more premises in the area would only exacerbate these problems.

Also this is a residential, **family area**. A café selling alcohol from 9 o'clock in the morning is not what a family area needs – particularly as this area is heavily populated by Muslims whose lifestyle does not permit alcohol.

As well as this, on Thursday 23rd October, I arrived home to find a **Police** van outside the café site and a large number of police officers having emptied the café and questioning its patrons. I am not sure what the reasoning behind this was, but surely an establishment already meriting police involvement would not be improved by the addition of an alcohol license.

And I think I remember around a year ago, the large empty site opposite the café on Phillip Lane was not granted licence to be turned into a "gastro" pub as it was decided the area did not need more licensed premises. Please think of this when considering licensing the building directly opposite the premises that's license was rejected.

Until recently this was a butchers shop. It has not been advertised as a cafe but appeared to be operating as a "social club".



I would like to challenge the above proposal.

This is unfortunately not the first time I have had to challenge proposals for this property. Thankfully Haringey Council rejected previous plans to turn the Social Club into a taxi rank. I thank you for supporting that.

Before I outline my objections to the above application I would like to ask why, after highlighting and discussing with Haringey Council the fact that Mr Goris has no license for a Social Club at 72 Grand Parade, he is still running the property as just that - a social club? This was highlighted to Haringey Council in an in-depth email I sent on 5/9/2008 to 'planning enforcement' for which I am still awaiting reply. You do not seem to be so pro-active in this area. For all the times I have discussed this Social Club with yourselves I have not once been kept informed of progress with your investigations, no phone calls or emails, even though I have been given assurances they would be forthcoming. Therefore the question still remains - why does this premises still function as a social club (please come and check ANY day of the week.) when a license for such use does not exist? I would be extremely interested to hear what you have to say on this matter. My address is marked at the top of this letter, my mobile number is: 0774 037 1626.

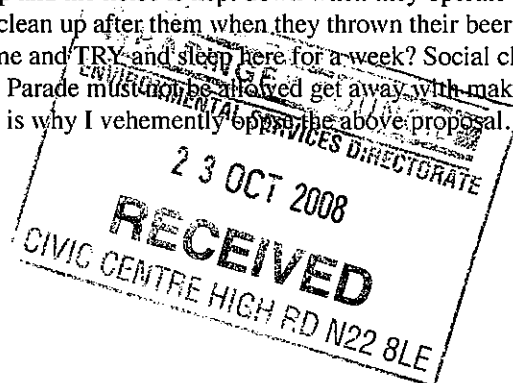
Regarding the matter of application for Ozan Turkish Coffee House with a license to sell alcohol until 23.00. (I am aware also that Mr Goris has applied to Haringey Police for an extension to this license past 23.00 - God forbid!) I have several points to make.

1. Ozan Turkish Coffee House will be a continuation of the horrendous conditions which the residents of 72A, 72B and 72C as well as surrounding buildings have to endure on a nightly basis. As I said above, you can come and check how this affects Haringey residents any night of the week.
2. A license for this property will only add to an already growing problem in this area of people consuming large quantities of alcohol in public. A consequence of this is people hanging around in the alley behind Grand Parade shouting on mobile phones, dropping litter and generally making the surrounding residents lives hell. These social clubs back onto suburban gardens! Can you imagine sitting in these gardens and trying to relax?
70 Grand Parade already functions as a social club (to the rear of the property) even though it has no license and is listed as an internet cafe. The noise from this property actually exceeds the noise from the social club in question. We therefore don't only have the noise of one social club but two.
3. A license for this property will have gross consequences for the cohesion of the community of this area as more and more properties are turned over to purely Kurdish/Turkish club houses. These clubs are blighting the lives of long standing residents of Haringey. It is we who bare the brunt for their loud out-of-hours activities. It seems there is more legislation in place for running a Public House than there is for these burgeoning social clubs. They seem to disregard any attempts at legislating them. At least with a Public House surrounding residents have some say in noise pollution, litter, rowdy behaviour and opening hours. Who will Police these social clubs? Nobody will. Who will ensure people can sleep and the noise is kept down when they operate secretly away from the public eye, to the rear of residential buildings? Who will clean up after them when they thrown their beer cans and cigarette packets on the floor. Maybe one of your team would like to come and TRY and sleep here for a week? Social clubs such as the illegal one that exist beneath my property and the one at 70 Grand Parade must not be allowed get away with making local residents lives a misery (having to sleep with the window shut!) and that is why I vehemently oppose the above proposal.
