Background

5.1 An application for a new Premises Licence, by Mr Ogur Yilmaz in respect of Rose Cafe, 435 Lordship Lane, London N22 5DH under the Licensing Act 2003.

The standard practices listed below will be maintained at all times. All reasonable steps will be taken to ensure that the premises will have a positive impact upon the local environment and its residents at all times.

5.3 Crime and Disorder

CCTV system shall be installed and maintained inside and outside the premises, including a CCTV unit, which monitors the immediate vicinity of the premises. All cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and the recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days with time and date stamping. Recordings shall be made available to an authorised officer or a police officer within 24 hours of any request.

5.4 Public Safety

Appropriate fire safety procedures are in place along with appliances including fire extinguishers (Foam, H20 and CO2), fire blankets, internally illuminated fire exit signs, a smoke detector and emergency lighting. All appliances are checked annually and comply with relevant British Standards.

All fire escapes/escape routes will be clearly marked and kept free from obstructions at all times.

5.5 Public Nuisance

All customers are asked to respect the surroundings and behave in an orderly manner.

Signs will be installed to remind customers to respect neighbours and leave quietly.

Patrons will be discouraged from congregating outside the premises.

All waste generated by the premises will be dealt with appropriately.

5.6 Child Protection

Restrictions under the Licensing Act 2003 will apply.

Alcohol will only be served to over 18's.

The licensee and staff will ask persons who appear to be under the age of 18 for photographic ID such as proof of age cards, the Connexions Card and Citizen Card, photographic driving licence or passport, an official identity card issued by HM Forces or by an EU country, bearing the photograph and date of birth of bearer.





I would like to confirm that I have considered the above proposal with regard to the prevention of public nuisance on behalf of the Enforcement Response (Noise) Team & would like to:

Make representations to the Application.

On the following grounds:

That the proposed operating hours are inappropriate due to the close proximity of residential dwellings due to.

- 1. The close proximity of residential dwellings. Both noise caused by patrons exiting the premises and locating suitable transport home may be detrimental to the residential amenity.
- 2. Noise from music being played at the premises is likely to affect local residents if played into the early hours of the morning without suitable conditions.

The operating schedule does not address the prevention of public nuisance from:

- Airborne entertainment noise
- Structure borne noise or vibrations from entertainment
- Noise generated from deliveries
- Noise generated from refuse collections
- Noise from plant and machinery
- Cooking odour

Supporting Information

There are no reported complaints under the previous ownership at this address.

<u>Informative</u> If the committee are minded to grant the license we would recommend the following alterations/conditions to the operating schedule:

Prevention of nuisance from noise/vibration

Airborne

All doors and windows will remain closed during the licensed activities. Where a door is used for patrons to enter or leave the premises the door will be fitted with a self-closing device and staff told to ensure that it is not propped open. [if necessary] A member of staff shall be positioned at the door to ensure it is opened for as brief a period as possible.

Entrance/exit from the premises whilst licensable activities are ongoing shall be via a lobbied door to minimise noise breakout.

Where necessary adequate and suitable mechanical ventilation should be provided to public areas.

Structure borne

All speakers are mounted on anti-vibration mountings to prevent vibration transmission of sound energy to adjoining properties.

A report to be provided detailing the current level of sound insulation between the restaurant and the flats above and flats to the rear and the level of sound insulation upgraded such that no noise is audible in any residential accommodation from licensable activity

Sound limits

The licensee shall ensure that no music played in the licensed premises is audible at or within the site boundary of any residential property.

The level of amplified entertainments shall be controlled by means of limiting device set at a level agreed with the licensing authority.

Outside Areas

No form of loudspeaker or sound amplification equipment is to be sited on or near the exterior premises or in or near any foyer, doorway, window or opening to the premises.

Deliveries and collections.

Deliveries and collections associated with the premises will be arranged between the hours 0800 hrs to 1800 hrs so as to minimise the disturbance caused to the neighbours.

Empty bottles and non-degradable refuse will remain in the premises at the end of trading hours and taken out to the refuse point at the start of the working day rather than at the end of trading when neighbours might be unduly disturbed.

Plant and machinery

All plant and machinery is correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from noise.

Dealing with complaints

A complaints book will be held on the premises to record details of any complaints received from neighbours. The information is to include where disclosed, the complainants name, location, date time and subsequent remedial action undertaken. This record must be made available at all times for inspection by council officers.

Patrons entering/exiting premises.

Where people queue to enter the premises a licensed door supervisor shall supervise and ensure the potential patrons behave in an acceptable manor.

Prevention of Nuisance from Odour

All ventilation and extraction systems shall be correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from odour.

Prevention of nuisance from light

Illuminated external signage shall be switched off when the premises is closed.

Security lights will be positioned to minimise light intrusion to nearby residential premises.

My son has to go to school and do his homework - the area is noisy enough being on the main road without having to put up with more noise either from loud music that will no doubt be coming from the venue or from the crowds of people who will no doubt congregate around the premises. Apart from the noise, I as a grown up will find it very intimidating having crowds of people who no doubt would have been drinking hanging around the entrance to where I live. I fear for the increase of unsociable behaviour which we already have to put up with because of the location of the entrance to the flats. I already fear for my son (coming home from school) and myself accessing the premises and my fear will be compounded by all this. It is an inviting place for people to loiter as it shelters them being seen committing all manner of unsociable behaviour such as urinating on the stairs, eating from the chip-shop downstairs and leaving rubbish and smoking drugs. I feel all this will increase if such a venue is allowed to open and I will feel even more of a prisoner where I live.




Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

Late night opening will lead to even later disturbance outside the bar as customers leave. In fact despite the fact that 'Elementz' has had no change to their hours and performance licence there has been such rowdy behaviour, including vomit outside the shops in proximity to the bar. Clearly one can only anticipate increased **crime and disorder**.

The use of the roof terrace late at night can cause a very significant **public nuisance** by disturbing those of us who live locally, as happened on Monday 7th / Tuesday 8th April 2008. This will only become worse if the bar becomes a nightclub.

Since the opening of 'Elementz' it has on occasions been extremely busy in the area, not only in very close proximity to the bar but also in the surrounding area. There are not only issues relating to **public safety**, but also a lack of parking.

In appealing to Haringey Council to turn down this application to allow performance of live music and extended opening hours I would also urge them to consider enforcing the existing terms that this bar operates on.

These include

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

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

This representation is an **objection** to the granting of the Premises Licence being applied for the above, for the following reasons:-

The prevention of crime and disorder

- a) Late night opening and frequent breaches of current licensing hours mean increased amounts of violent and drunken disturbances inside and surrounding the bar, very few of which have the police been able to attend as our nearest police station is in Wood Green.
- b) Surrounding doorways are often littered and vandalised by guests leaving Elementz in the small hours and loitering in the streets, and gardens belonging to houses opposite the bar are frequently urinated in.
- c) Despite having no change to their current opening hours and performance licence, Elementz continues to remain open and playing loud music well past 1am during the weekend evenings, and also after midnight on week nights when they hold private parties.
- d) Further to (c), if Elementz is granted extended opening hours they will continue to flout their licence and remain open even later (2 2:30am) which is very unhealthy for the suburban nature of the area, as it will put off future homeowners and surely add to the current drop in house prices seen across the UK as no one wants to buy a house near a nightclub, especially one known for disturbances.
- e) Due to the type of clientele Elementz draws in, there are frequently under-age drinkers that are granted service within the bar.
- f) Cars belonging to residents and parked on the street (the only available parking) have been damaged and vandalised by the teenage drunks that frequent Elementz.

2. The prevention of public nuisance

a) Due to high volume at which the bass heavy music is played in Elementz, and the nature and age of the buildings surrounding the bar, the noise pollution is so severe that it is driving residents away (I personally stay elsewhere at the weekends as it is un-liveable in my apartment). If Elementz is granted extended hours during the week it is unfair on residents living above the parade as the noise pollution is of an unacceptable level.

Furthermore the owners are aware of their noise pollution, yet actively turn up the volume later in the evening (between 10:30pm and 1am), adding to the disturbance.

- b) The roof terrace added behind the bar (without planning permission) leads to further noise disturbance as it impossible to use your kitchen and living room (for all apartments above and surrounding the bar) as the noise level is high enough to drown out even a television or radio, and customers can see into the surrounding apartments and frequently shout offensive remarks or throw things at our windows.
- c) The roof terrace is open for the same amount of time as the main bar meaning drunken shouting / singing well after midnight -1am every night.
- d) People waiting for buses after Elementz closes means noise disturbance for all the surrounding apartments between midnight and 1am, where 2 out of 3 bedrooms face the road, and also for houses opposite the bar.
- e) The area does not need a Nightclub. It is far too residential and with Broadway a 5 minute walk away with plenty of well run late night bars and nightclubs, as well as the Maid of Muswell pub across the road (also open until midnight however very considerately and never with disturbances), there is no need for another late night bar in this area.

3. Regarding public safety

- a) Customers driving to Elementz are parking in the bus stop outside the bar and preventing buses from stopping close to the pavement, meaning people having to walk into the road to use the public transport.
- b) The buildings surrounding Elementz are densely populated (generally the 2 storeys above the parade each contain two 3 double bed apartments for each address), and the nature and age of the buildings means none have fire escapes. Due to the very quick time in which Elementz was refurbished, I doubt it has a fire restraint ceiling, making it a fire hazard to all of the surrounding properties.
- c) Further to (b), the "smoking terrace" is often over-crowded and always un-staffed, one stray cigarette and you have a major fire risk for all properties between Rosebery Rd and Grove Ave (roughly 50-70 apartments) as all properties are terraced between those two roads.

4. Protection of Children from Harm

a) There is no security whatsoever in place at Elementz; due to lack of I-d checking, under-age children (14-17yrs) are frequently served alcohol as there is only ever a maximum of 2 or 3 staff working in the bar even on a busy weekend. This often leaves under-age customers running around in the streets late at night (especially during private parties) and creating potential road accident risks to anyone driving down Alexandra Park Road, which is a busy route.

Please also take into account:

Recent Failure to Apply for Planning Permission

- The roof terrace has been rebuilt without planning permission, and an outside bar building has been added also without permission.
- The walls surrounding the roof terrace are made from flimsy wooden garden panels, which would not withstand the weight of a person who may trip or fall through a panel, which is a one storey drop into a concrete alley.

In appealing to Haringey Council to turn down this application for extended alcohol service hours, extended opening hours and performance of live music, I would also urge you to make note of the current frequent breaches of licence and consider enforcing the current terms of licence the bar operates on.

Including:

- Enforcing the current opening hours and music licence all people should be off the premises by midnight and no music should be playing after that time.
- Staffing the roof terrace and restricting access i.e. not exceeding a certain number of customers at any one time.
- Restricting use of the basement (which is not licensed for use as a function room) as it is crowded and not air conditioned, so when in use the rear door is left open creating extra noise disturbance as guests congregate outside the rear door (on land that does not belong to Elementz) and use it as an extra dance floor, creating noise pollution for all surrounding residents.
- Enforcing UK alcohol laws to prevent under-age drinkers, which is clearly an issue overlooked by Elementz, maybe impose spot-checks?
- There is no disabled access, the only toilet facilities are at the bottom of a very steep and dangerous staircase, slippery with spilt drinks during evenings.

I would like to add, the owners of Elementz are also my landlords, and myself, and my flatmates have on numerous occasions made them aware of the unacceptable level of noise, as well as the cigarette butts, bottles and smoking customers that frequently collect in our doorway (as it is under cover) next to the front entrance. They continue to ignore our requests to keep the noise levels down and close on time, and will not clean up the street after they close no matter how much mess their guests have caused, saying, and I quote "that's what the road sweepers for, innit".

They also did not properly advertise their application for extension of licensing hours, showing only a small inward facing notice, I had to personally ask them before they informed me of the application.

We were extremely happy in our apartment before Elementz opened, but each week it gets louder and later into the night, to the point where it now frequently prevents sleep until 1am even during week nights (especially during private parties) when most local residents (including myself) have to get up for work before 7am. Our landlord often knocks on our door to collect the (very frequent) letters of complaint they receive in the post.

From having numerous meetings with the owners of Elementz, it is clear to see they are only in it for the quick cash and have no regard whatsoever for residents - we are their tenants, yet they took over 4 months to replace our oven (with no rent decrease for the inconvenience), and on finally replacing it they chose to do so as cheaply as possible -installing it themselves without calling a qualified engineer which left us with a severe gas leak overnight as well as breaking an item of ours that is still yet to be replaced...

I am trying to maintain that Elementz should not be granted this application, based on the lack of morals and disregard for others that is already seen by the owners, and the frequent breaches of licence that need to be focused on and prevented - before any extension can be even thought about.

I wish for this letter to stand as valid representation for the refusal of the application in question.

Little is done to control the existing noise coming from both in the front and back area of their premises. I wish to object strongly application for the extension of licencing hours, and bid for a music licence, currently under consideration by Haringey Council for ELEMENTZ bar, situate at 96 Alexandra Park Road, London N10. This bar is situated in a densley populated residential area, with small children sleeping not just nearby, but even next door. There are dozens of flats contiguous too it - all part of the same block, above and around it. Both front and back of the bar faceonto a row of residential dwellings. It should be noted in the application that they wish to serve alcohol up to precisely the same time that they supposedly are to close, which is not logical and could only lead to a breach of their licence - uless they were going of pour drinks away immediately after seriving them, which highly unlikely. Such breaches already take place of the licence they already have often they are open and paying loud music an hour after they should have closed. This bar is already a big noise/behaviour nuisance in the area. Elementz has an open roof garden (which is unstaffed and very rowdy) which is a particular noise nuisance for local residents. Elementz regularly holds private parties for young teenagers; htese children have been observed on several occasions climbing onto adjoining roofs and the fencing surrounding the bar's roof garden; inbetween Elementz and adjoining propereties there is lots of sharp debris, and the drop os quite steep. As you are surely aware, Alexandra Park Road is a largely residential area and this bar has already caused major disruption since its opening, an extension to its license will only exacerbate an already unsatisfactory situation.

I live at 90A Alexandra Park Road and whilst am not adjacent to the bar itself, have suffered the negative results of this "nightclub" opening in the vicinity.

I object to the application as this will increase the number of rowdy and frequently violent revellers (I have witnessed loud arguments and fighting in the street outside the bar, and the police have been called at least on one occasion). I also object to the loud and obnoxious bass-heavy "garage" music which is audible in my flat long after the current licensing hours are supposed to be over. My third objection is the vandalism which I suspect is caused by the clientele of this establishment, specifically in reference to the broken bus shelter, empty beer bottles and pint glasses strewn around the vicinity and of course the hundreds of cigarette "butts" left on the pavement.

My other concern is that the license states the "provision of late night refreshment" until 12 midnight Mon-Thurs – if alcohol is being sold until this time, people will not start leaving until much later, causing major annoyance to residents.

I find it incredible that this bar has been granted a license at all in such a family friendly residential area, where I am sure that I am not the only person to work full time leaving the house at 7.30 each morning and therefore do not appreciate being subjected to obnoxious behaviour and loud music 7 nights a week.

I would request that you reject this application based on the valid points mentioned above.

Re proposed license extension, Elemenz bar.

I would like to protest strongly to this proposal. I live at 109A Alexandra Pk Rd and as a light sleeper am already disturbed almost nightly by noisy, drunken and frequently violent people leaving in the small hours of the morning, well after midnight when I usually go to bed. The front of my drive has been vandalised, my doorway has been peed in and vomitted over and cigarette ends have frequently been dropped by these people, as I am not brave enough to go out to confront them. I know that this has been done by Elementz customers as I live between Elementz and the Maid and so can tell the direction people come from if they are noisy, as well as sometimes getting up out of bed and seeing them.

There was also no problem during the time the premises were closed. The existing license arrangements are clearly not being followed or the place would be quiet by midnight, and this is exceptional. It is therefore virtually certain that extended hours would cause even greater disruption. A proprietor who already allows performances eg music without a license should not be rewarded by being allowed to get away with such a breach.

Our otherwise peaceful residential road is very near to Muswell Hill, Crouch End and Wood Green, all of which provide ample opportunities for late-night entertainment. I have talked to neighbours and not met anyone who would use a nightclub there. It is entirely unsuitable for Elementz to try to

change the nature of the area in this way.

In my opinion the premises are dangerous - there is no disabled access to the roof terrace or subterranean function room, the stairs are incredibly steep and a hazard for drinkers seeking the toilets, which are down there. I thought there was a law which covered things like this. I once took a group of families there and had complaints about this. I was asked not to use the venue again. And do the recently rebuilt and flimsy-looking walls around the roof terrace and the extension buildings on it comply with legal requirements?

Parking is another issue. Cars already regularly park across my drive and block the bus-stop and this is likely to worsen if these proposals go through. The proposals should also be considered in the light of the proposed closure of the post office. These two proposals together represent an unacceptable shift from quiet suburban community towards urbanised decay.

Please acknowledge this communication, answer the questions I have raised and let me know what are the next steps in this process. I will be notifying Councillor Oatway of my objection.



This representation is an objection to the granting of the Premises Licence being applied for by the above.

- 1. The prevention of crime and disorder
 - a) Late night opening has led and will lead to many weekend disturbances outside the bar in the past. Drunken shouting and rowdy behaviour have been reported to the Police as revellers leave the bar.
 - b) Despite having no change to their hours and performance licence 'Elementz' has already been operating as if it has been granted the changes. In recent weeks there has been rowdy night time behaviour, including vomit outside the shops. This is not good for the suburban nature of the parade.
 - c) If these hours are extended there will be little to prevent further flouting of these hours as the nearest police station is in Wood Green. Disturbances at this venue in the past have gone un answered as Haringey police did not have the manpower to enforce the opening hours.
- 2. The prevention of public nuisance
 - a) The use of the roof terrace at the rear (built with no planning permission) leads to noise disturbance until after midnight. This is loud enough to drown out TV and radio in the living rooms of the flat owners.
 - b) Noise on Alexandra Park Road as clients leave.
 - c) Does this area really need a Nightclub is it suitable? It is out of keeping with the local residential make up. This is not a busy 'Broadway'
- 3. Regarding public safety
 - a) Congestion rises on Alexandra Park Road as may clients drive here and park in the bus stop.

b) The shops are under densely populated residential premises. A late night nightclub would add risk to fire in the parade. Unless these premises were fully up graded it is unlikely there is a fire resistant ceiling.

4. Protection of children from harm

a) The secluded rear aspect roof terrace has been observed with under age drinkers in the evening.

In appealing to Haringey Council to turn down this application to allow performance of live music and extended opening hours I would also urge them to consider enforcing the existing terms that this bar operates on.

These include

- Enforcing the existing opening hours which are clear all people shall be off the premises by midnight.
- Enforcing the ban of performance of live music
- Restricting access to the roof terrace.
- Enforcing the restrictions on the use of the function room in the basement. This room is not air conditioned and has no current licence for use a function room. When in use the rear door has to be opened as it gets over heated. The noise echoes down the mews at the rear and the guests spill into the alley creating a 'street party'.

The 'Maid of Muswell' manages to operate in a quite, considerate manner. It does not see the need to open until after midnight and have live performing acts.

No Disabled Access

It is worth stressing to Haringey council that 'Elementz' Bar has no disabled access. These premises fail the DDA as its toilet facilities are all below ground, down a very tight stairwell. These is no way for a wheelchair to access the toilets at all. There is no disabled access to the function room at the rear, or the roof terrace.

Recent Failure to Apply for Planning Permission

It is also worth noting the walls round the roof terrace have been rebuilt recently with no application for change. They do not appear strong enough to resist strong wind.

The extension buildings on the roof terrace were also built with no planning application and now an outside bar area has been added.
