	It was noted that construction work had overrun by seven weeks and as a result additional costs attached had been incurred. The Committee was advised that the charge placed on Enfield had recently increased significantly, in relative terms, and therefore it had not been considered appropriate to request an additional sum to meet this cost.	
	The Chair noted that fees applied to Enfield would be reviewed on a regular basis.	
	The Committee discussed options for generating additional income and there was agreement that any use of the facilities by external parties would have to be treated sensitively and discreetly.
