HARINGEY LAW CENTRE PROGRESS REPORT (Report of the Assistant Chief Executive (Policy, Performance, Partnerships and Communications – agenda item 11) The report was the subject of a motion to exclude the press and public from the meeting as it contained exempt information relating to the business or financial affairs of any particular person (including the Authority holding that information). We received the update report on the continuation of core funding for the Haringey Law Centre and noted that the Centre has met the conditions attached to the original offer of grant aid. We were advised that the Chair of the Committee had approved the continuation of the core funding for the Law Centre at a Cabinet Member signing. **RESOLVED** That it be noted that approval had been granted by the Cabinet ACE -Member for Community Cohesion and Involvement to the release PPP&C of core continuation funding for the period 2008-2010 for the Haringey Law Centre as the Law Centre have, overall, met the independent review recommendations. The remaining two year funding is a contribution toward the provision of legal advice and representation for the Haringey community, particularly in such matters as immigration, welfare rights, housing and debt. VSC08. KURDISH ADVICE CENTRE - PROGRESS REPORT (Report of the Assistant Chief Executive (Policy, Performance, Partnerships and Communications – agenda item 12) The report was the subject of a motion to exclude the press and public from the meeting as it contained exempt information relating to the business or financial affairs of any particular person (including the Authority holding that information). We received the progress report for the Kurdish Advice Centre and noted that the Centre has demonstrated improvement and met the additional conditions set out in the report received by our Committee on 5th December 2006. **RESOLVED** ACE -To award the Kurdish Advice Centre the remaining year two and PPP&C three core cost continuation funding covering the period April 2008 until 31st March 2010. The amount of grant aid funding to be released in quarterly instalments in each of the above mentioned years is £28,500 per annum.
