The Appendices to the interleaved report were the subject of a motion to exclude the press and public from the meeting as they contained exempt information relating to the business or financial affairs of any particular person.

We noted that for the purpose of the eligibility criteria for core funding, Infrastructure and Client Specific voluntary organisations were defined as voluntary and community organisations that played a supporting, coordinating, representation, policy-making and development role for other voluntary and community organisations and/or their clients who lived in the Borough. We also noted that following our meeting on 10 July an independent review of the twenty Infrastructure and Client Specific Voluntary Organisations whose three-year core funding agreements expired on 31 March 2009 had been carried out to establish whether the Organisations were still fit for purpose and financially viable for the continuation of core funding for another three-year period from 1 April 2009 to 31 March 2012.

We were informed that CARA Housing Association was to merge with Central and Cecil Housing Trust on the 5 January 2009 and that following the merger, CARA would cease to exist as legal entity in its own right and would not be eligible for grant funding. Confirmation was given that CARA's funding up to 31 March 2009 would continue to allow them to consolidate the merger while continuing their services in Haringey.

Our views were sought on a proposal that the grant that would otherwise have been made to CARA from 1 April 2009 be carried over and ring fenced subject to a further report by officers following any necessary consultations. We indicated that while we supported this approach consideration should be given to the grant being made to organisations working with vulnerable groups in the community and those which would

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(address the strategic gap that had been filled	by CARA.

We noted that in September 2008 the availability of three year core cost funding for disabled people representation and advice to commence from 1 April 2009 to 31 March 2012 had been advertised. All applications received had been assessed by an officer assessment panel against set criteria relevant to the needs of disabled people, the strategic aims of the Council and the quality of the applications. Based on the assessment criteria the assessment panel were proposing that the full requested funding of £77,000 per annum over 3 years 2009-2012 be awarded to the Haringey Disability First Consortium for both Disability Advice and Representation. The Disability First Consortium's appointed lead and accountable body would be the Haringey Racial Equality Council.

We also noted that the total funding available was £80,000 per annum and that it was also proposed that the remaining £3,000 per annum be set aside to support Shop Mobility based at the Wood Green Shopping City. With regard to the disability budget under spend for 2007-08 and 2008/09 it was intended that this be awarded to the Haringey Disability First Consortium for recruitment start-up costs and any Disability Discrimination Act (DDA) 1995 premises adaptation costs and that any remaining under spend be awarded to Council funded voluntary and community organisations that had to make adaptations to premises to ensure compliance with the Disability Discrimination Act 1995.

Whilst the proposals contained in the report were supported, concern was expressed that there was not sufficient detail of how the Consortium would operate and we asked that officers provide Members of our Committee with a briefing paper on how the Consortium would develop effective representation and advice services for disabled people including details of defined outcomes and outputs.
