LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE HEARINGS PROCEDURE SUMMARY	
INTRODUCTION	
1.	The Chair introduces himself and invites other Members, Council officers, Police, Applicant and Objectors to do the same.
2.	The Chair invites Members to disclose any prior contacts (before the hearing) with the parties or representations received by them
3.	The Chair explains the procedure to be followed by reference to this summary which will be distributed.
NON-ATTENDANCE BY PARTY OR PARTIES	
4.	If one or both of the parties fails to attend, the Chair decides whether to:
	(i) grant an adjournment to another date, or
	(ii) proceed in the absence of the non-attending party.
	Normally, an absent party will be given one further chance to attend.
TOPIC HEADINGS	
5.	The Chair suggests the “topic headings” for the hearing. In the case of the majority of applications for variation of hours, or other terms and conditions, the main topic is:
	Whether the extensions of hours etc. applied for would conflict with the four licensing objectives i.e.
	(i) the prevention of crime and disorder,
	(ii) public safety,
	(iii) the prevention of public nuisance, and
	(iv) the protection of children from harm.
6.	The Chair invites comments from the parties on the suggested topic headings and decides whether to confirm or vary them.
WITNESSES	
7.	The Chair asks whether there are any requests by a party to call a witness and decides any such request.
8.	Only if a witness is to be called, the Chair then asks if there is a request by an opposing party to “cross-examine” the witness. The Chair then decides any such request.
DOCUMENTARY EVIDENCE	
9.	The Chair asks whether there are any requests by any party to introduce late documentary evidence.
10.	If so, the Chair will ask the other party if they object to the admission of the late documents.
11.	If the other party do object to the admission of documents which have only been produced by the first party at the hearing, then the documents shall not be admitted.

12.	If the other party object to documents produced late but before the hearing, the following criteria shall be taken into account when the Chair decides whether or not to admit the late documents:	
(i)	What is the reason for the documents being late?	
(ii)	Will the other party be unfairly taken by surprise by the late documents?	
(iii)	Will the party seeking to admit late documents be put at a major disadvantage if admission of the documents is refused?	
(iv)	Is the late evidence really important?	
(v)	Would it be better and fairer to adjourn to a later date?	
THE LICENSING OFFICER'S INTRODUCTION		
13.	The Licensing Officer introduces the report explaining, for example, the existing hours, the hours applied for and the comments of the other Council Services or outside official bodies. This should be as "neutral" as possible between the parties.	
14.	The Licensing Officer can be questioned by Members and then by the parties.

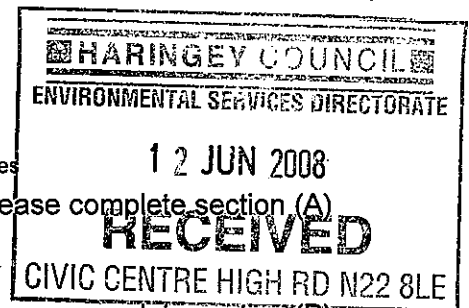

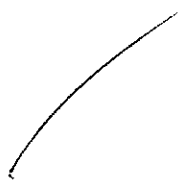

The Noise Team have received 16 noise complaints so far this year and have sent 1 noise Advisory letter on 19th April 2008 and one warning letter on 31st May 2008

Informative

I would recommend the following alterations/conditions to the operating schedule:

Operating hours

That the premises closes no later than 0130 Thursday to Saturday

That regulated entertainment ceases at 0130 Thursday to Saturday and 0030 Monday to Wednesday.

Reason: To Safeguard the enjoyment of their properties by adjoining residential occupier and the amenities of surrounding area.

Prevention of nuisance from noise/vibration

Airborne

All doors and windows will remain closed during the licensed activities. Where a door is used for patrons to enter or leave the premises the door will be fitted with a self-closing device and staff told to ensure that it is not propped open. if necessary a member of staff shall be positioned at the door to ensure it is opened for as brief a period as possible

The licensable activity shall conclude 30 minutes before the premises is due to close to prevent excessive noise breakout as the premises empties

Entrance/exit from the premises whilst licensable activities are ongoing shall be the main front door to minimise noise breakout except in an emergency

Where necessary adequate and suitable mechanical ventilation should be provided to public areas

Structure borne

All form of loudspeaker/sound amplification equipment should not be sited on or near the ceiling

All speakers are mounted on anti-vibration mountings to prevent vibration transmission of sound energy to adjoining properties

Reason: To prevent unwanted noise disturbance caused to the residents

Sound limits

The licensee shall ensure that no music played in the licensed premises is audible at or within the site boundary of any residential property

All entertainments will utilise the in-house amplification system, the maximum output of which is controlled by the duty manager

The level of amplified entertainments shall be controlled by means of limiting device set at a level agreed with the licensing authority and should be fitted immediately prior to any entertainment taken place.

Reason: To prevent unwanted noise disturbance caused to the residents

Deliveries and collections.

Deliveries and collections associated with the premises will be arranged between the hours 08:00 to 18:00 Monday to Friday and 08:00 to 13:00 on Saturdays and none on Sunday so as to minimise the disturbance caused to the neighbours

Glasses will be collected from the beer garden area at the beginning of the day rather than at closing time when neighbours in close proximity might be unduly disturbed

Empty bottles and non-degradable refuse will remain in the premises at the end of trading hours and taken out to the refuse point at the start of the working day rather than at the end of trading when neighbours might be unduly disturbed

Plant and machinery

All plant and machinery is correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from noise

Dealing with complaints

A complaints book will be held on the premises to record details of any complaints received from neighbours. The information is to include where disclosed, the complainants name, location, date time and subsequent remedial action undertaken. This record must be made available at all times for inspection by council officers

Dear Daliah,

I am a local resident who lives 300 yards in Beechwood Road from this establishment, and I have the following comments and objections to certain aspects of their new application. I first must note that this club/restuarant has been trading for a number of years, albeit under another managment, and my comments are based on the expereince of the premises and its size in coping with the entertainment they propose and the hours they are proposing in their application.

First, the applicants ask for their hours to be up to 1 am Monday to Wednesday, and up to 2 am Thursday to Saturday.

My objection is that this would prolong the noise and disruption that the numbers attending this venue cause, and disturb local residents on what any reasonable person would consider to be a working night.

From about 10 pm when this club is open, in my experience customers are standing about on the pavement outside, holding drinks and generally making a lot of noise as the evening wears on, because the club is not big enough inside to contain the ammount of people it attracts. The pavement is partially blocked to ordinary residents going about their business, and the noise from the outside customers gets louder and louder until closing time.

The club has been successful in monuting a continuous advertising campaign for their events, but then in my opinion cant cope with or manage the numbers that turn up on some nights.

I would want to raise my objection as a local resident therefore to the late hours being granted on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday evenings. I would ask that further local police and residents opinions are looked into about the pavement being blocked, loud drinking outside, taking place. I also object to this application on the grounds that the premises is too small to have large numbers of customers, dancing and that the customer activity outside needs to be planned for and contained or the consideration be given to the application being refused.

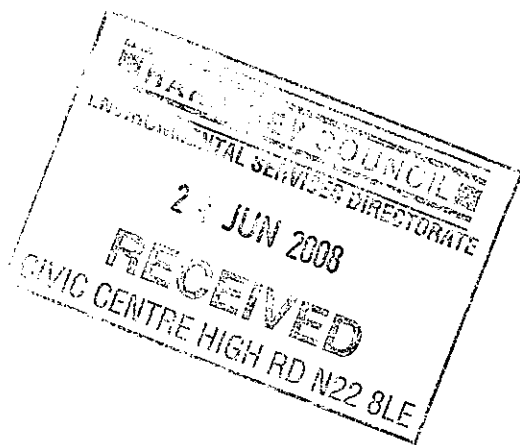
I have no objection to late licences at New Year and Christmas, but again the issue of customer control on the narrow pavement needs to be considered.

We have reported them for noise several times, & almost weekly I have to go across & ask them to close the doors post 10.00pm When they should not be open at all.

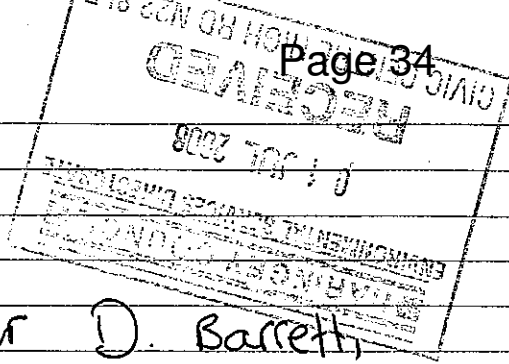
The bar has now put tables outside blocking the pavement & this also means we have noise pollution on Saturday & Sunday afternoons which affects the enjoyment of my property.

Dear D. Barrett,

I received your letter of Objection from Ian Bruce and would like to take the opportunity to respond. Ian originally objected to our late license and we went to court over it. Ian is saying the Court imposed special conditions that our doors are closed. The Court took none of his objections into making special conditions as they could see he was being totally unreasonable. They did not tell us to close our doors even though I suggested in court that we can put that as a condition to our license. They said it was not necessary. We do however always close our doors by 9.30, latest 10.00. It is too cold in the restaurant anyway to have them open and if we have loud bands on of course we don't want music blaring out. It would be a nuisance to neighbours and us as we would get a bad reputation.

Ian said to me from the initial Court case, "I will make sure you get closed down", in court I gave him my mobile number to call me direct if there were any problems when he called me at 2am, woke me up and my children shouting down the phone at me that we were causing noise disturbance and we were actually closed. He seems to ignore the fact, among others, that the other bars and restaurants in our strip on High Street Hammersmith advertise and have live music without license, without closed doors because I've seen Ian eating there and good friends with them.

We put £50,000 of sound proofing into our venue. We are not a disco bar. We are a performing arts venue with live world music, Congolese nights, Latin nights,

Jazz nights, Salsa and Moroccan. We are trying to bring culture to the area not a night club. We have a double acoustic doors, sound lobby, disabled access + disabled toilets, sound proofed walls. I think this much thought + cost into a venue means we are not trying to cause a noise.

However, I was out of the business having two children and have just returned to fully manage the business 2 months ago and realised the previous sound engineer had taken our limiter off our sound equipment, a device which means the noise cuts off when at a certain level. I have made sure this will go back on immediately as this may have meant noise levels could have risen. I did speak to environmental health about this as they sent a letter saying levels had risen. They also suggest I hang my speakers as this causes a lot less vibrations which I also agree to and will be done this week.

As for coming weekly, this is not true, I have seen Ian only once since three years ago that we went to court with him but he harasses us on the phone and tries to threaten us and if we continue without reason I will start a case of harassment against him.


I know that I have not been correct in transferring the license from company to another but I do not think this makes me a terrible person. I went through the whole application originally so it is of no benefit to me to not transfer the license, it's not as if I would have had a problem transferring it, it has only caused aggravation and was a genuine oversight.

I have not been able to trade as my business is live music and refreshment and have had to move out of my house as I cannot afford mortgage without an

income and with two children so think I have felt the full effects of it. I have also had to lay off staff which I don't think is beneficial to anyone.

Well that's my point of view if it means anything at all.

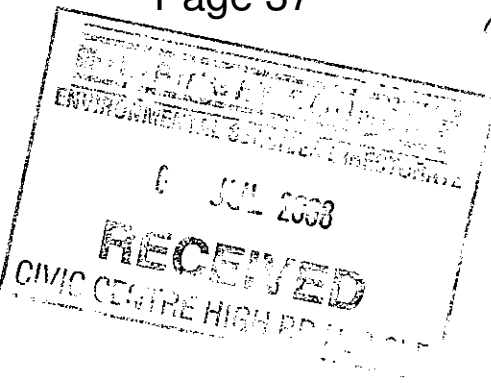

In response to Catherine Harris letter, I would like to say that as in my previous letter I was taken out of the management role as I had to children but am back working full time.

However, I can assure you midweek there is nobody outside our premises making noise as we are quiet midweek. We have been trading over two years with a license until 1am midweek and this letter is as if there would be problems if we traded until one. Obviously the resident hasn't realised we are currently trading until 1 already and there is no noise nuisance.

I think that with the non smoking laws now in restaurants people go outside to smoke which is why they stand there on weekends but they are not allowed to stand out making a lot of noise after midnight weekends. I could make a proposal that our doorman asks residents to walk down the road at night as keep the volume down while

they are outside. Page 38

I still do not know how we can be targeted for noise when the pub on the corner has a later license, live music, beer garden and lots of people outside smoking and drinking.


I suggest it is a street issue not just a viva viva issue and wasn't properly thought out when the smoking ban was put in place.
