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(2) Supply of alcohol: No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

(3) The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Door supervision: At specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity and each of these individuals must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

THE PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

Premises to implement regular toilet checks.

Premises to employ appropriate security, registered with the Security Industry Authority.

Security to manage the door, minimise disorder and prevent drunken people from entering.

Premises to have sufficient lighting and visibility at all times.

Premises will provide regular staff training with regard to drugs awareness and petty theft prevention.

To maintain closed-circuit TV cameras inside the premises and to keep the recordings for 28 days. The premises will be closed no later than 45 minutes after the end of all licensable activities.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Premises will have a comprehensive procedure in place emergency use. .

Fire extinguisher and fire alarm checks to be made and inspected on an annual basis.

Toughened glassware to be used at all times on the premises.

Signage and lighting to be fully maintained and regular emergency lighting battery drainage checks made.

Premises to carry out risk assessments for activities taking place on the premises and devise and implement health and safety plans for the premises. Plans to be made available to local authorities and police upon request.

Staff to receive regular health and safety training.

The maximum occupancy of the premises tol be as recommended by the fire authority and building control.

THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

Any amplified music to be filtered via a noise limiting device.

Signs requesting that customers leave the premises quietly to be displayed.

Premises to ensure regular and adequate refuse collection from the premises.

All external windows and doors will be kept closed when regulated entertainment is being provided, except for access and egress to and from the premises and/or in the event of an emergency.

Premises will maintain efficient ventilation systems.

THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN

Unaccompanied children will not be allowed on the premises.

Staff will be trained age of identification laws.

Premises will provide approved high chairs for young children and infants.



Dear Daliah,

I am a local resident who lives 300 yards in Beechwood Road from this establishment, and I have the following comments and objections to certain aspects of their new application. I first must note that this club/resturarant has been trading for a number of years, albeit under another managment, and my comments are based on the experience of the premises and its size in coping with the entertainment they propose and the hours they are proposing in their application.

First, the applicants ask for their hours to be up to 1 am Monday to Wednesday, and up to 2 am Thursday to Saturday.

My objection is that this would prolong the noise and disruption that the numbers attending this venue cause, and disturb local residents on what any reasonable person would consider to be a working night.

From about 10 pm when this club is open, in my experience customers are standing about on the pavement outside, holding drinks and generally making a lot of noise as the evening wears on, because the club is not big enough inside to contain the ammount of people it attracts. The pavement is partially blocked to ordinary residents going about their business, and the noise from the outside customers gets louder and louder until closing time.


The club has been successful in monuting a continuous advertising campaign for their events, but then in my opinion cant cope with or manage the numbers that turn up on some nights.

I would want to raise my objection as a local resident therefore to the late hours being granted on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday evenings. I would ask that further local police and residents opinions are looked into about the pavement being blocked, loud drinking outside, taking place. I also object to this application on the grounds that the premises is too small to have large numbers of customers, dancing and that the customer activity outside needs to be planned for and contained or the consideration be given to the application being refused.

I have no objection to late licences at New Year and Christmas, but again the issue of customer control on the narrow pavement needs to be considered.

I would like to object to the application of a late licence for Viva Viva at 18 the High street Hornsey. This Bar has regularly flouted the law.

When the bar was first opened planning put stipulations in place to contain the noise nuisance they create i.e. double entrance doors to act as a sound buffer. They have adapted the front so as to open the front up allowing noise to escape.

I have spoken to my Local councillor Robert Gorie who has been into the bar with me to ask them to keep the doors closed when they have live music. They agreed but have not made any effort to stick to this agreement.

We have reported them for noise several times, & almost weekly I have to go across & ask them to close the doors post 10.00pm When they should not be open at all.

The bar has now put tables outside blocking the pavement & this also means we have noise pollution on Saturday & Sunday afternoons which affects the enjoyment of my property.

When we attended the appeal against their original licence various promises were made to us that there would be no disturbance none of these have been kept.

In short this bar is a nuisance in another wise peaceful residential area. Please do not renew its licence or if you decide to give them another chance do not allow them to open passed midnight. They have already shown you their willingness to break the law. Please show us your willingness to support us & uphold the law.

Dear Members,

Sorry about the recent opening and closing of ViVa ViVa but all comments must go to Haringey council licensing Department. We had a company change over 2 years ago and the license wasn't transferred. Haringey Council walked in one day and said we couldn't have live music or sell alcohol or open after 11 because of a paperwork issue over 2 years ago and we were all breaking the law and an outrage to society!

We put in an immediate notice to renew our license and were met with objections from our friendly neighbour over the road; well this guy, the rather large caretaker of the school opposite us, Ian, caused a stink saying we are a nuisance to the so peaceful residential area (I think he must be blind to the pub blaring live music out every Saturday with its doors wide open), and the estate behind us churning out all kinds of trouble. He originally went to court with us 4 years ago objecting to our opening and has basically been kicking up a storm since, phoning us, coming over and saying we are a trouble to the area. I am not quite sure how salsa, Elvis, Frank Sinatra and Flamenco are so threatening, but I guess we all have our own opinions.

Well let's put it this way, the noise team have been called in to come with our friendly Ian and stand at his house and do a noise test with us playing music. So when ever Ian says he is happy with the level, the council have made me buy a £1000 limiter (his reason was that businesses have the money to afford such things) even though we have been closed for a month with no income and had to lay our staff off. Well come on it is Haringey for the people right? And Haringey will help small businesses make it???????? So when Ian is happy he can't hear us, the council will set this limiter and seal, it and if the music goes above this level everything shuts down so there is no noise pollution. Fine, but shouldn't we have some say in the matter seeing as Ian was originally chucked out of Court for his ridiculous suggestions?
