made a submission that the Ladder Community Safety Partnership (LCSP) was not an interested party, and that their representations should not be considered by the Committee. Mr Dadds reported that he had contacted the LSCP in advance of the meeting to ask for details of who the LSCP was making representations on behalf of and whether they had the authority of these individuals to do so, and that this information had not been supplied. Mr Sygrave, representing the LSCP, reported that, in response to the request from Mr Dadds, he had made clear that the LSCP was making representations on behalf of residents living at the east end of Mattison Road, for which the LSCP had signed authority from individual residents. The legal officer advised the Committee that names and addresses of individuals making representations relating to applications under the Licensing Act 2003 must be supplied in advance of any hearing, in order to demonstrate their proximity to the premises and to enable the applicant to prepare for the hearing.

The Committee adjourned for five minutes to take legal advice.

On the resumption of proceedings, the legal officer advised the Committee that the LSCP would be permitted to submit their representations on this application but that in future details of the individuals being represented must be provided when representations were made, so that the applicant had the opportunity to prepare fully for the hearing.

The Licensing Officer, Ms Barrett, presented the report on an application for a new premises licence at Anadolu Turkish Coffee House, 33B Grand Parade, Green Lanes to allow supply of alcohol at the premises. Representations on the application had been made by the noise team, and it was reported that the conditions put forward by the noise team had been agreed with the applicant. Representations and a petition had also been submitted on behalf of local residents, relating to the issues of noise nuisance, disturbance to residents and the inappropriateness of the location on a residential street and the close proximity of housing for vulnerable adults.

Eubert Malcolm, Enforcement Response Service Manager, outlined the noise team representation and reported that the operating schedule did not adequately address the issues of noise caused by patrons outside the premises, patrons exiting the premises and deliveries. Mr Malcolm advised the Committee that the premises had been visited by the noise team but that a statutory noise nuisance had not been established. Mr Malcolm confirmed that the conditions put forward by the noise team had been agreed by the applicant.

In response to a question from the Committee, Mr Malcolm advised that the first occasion on which officers had visited the premises was 18 March 2009. As a point of clarification, Mr Dadds advised that the application was for a licence until 2300hrs and closing time of 2330hrs to enable patrons to disperse. Mr Malcolm confirmed that this was acceptable to the noise team. Further to a question from Mr Dadds, Mr

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Malcolm confirmed that he was satisfied that, with the proposed conditions in place, the licensing objective on the prevention of public nuisance would be met.

Mr Dadds advised the Committee that each application must be judged on its merits and on the evidence provided in the application before the Committee.

Objections were presented on behalf of local residents that the premises was situated on an entirely residential street and would be the first such premises in the vicinity. With the agreement of Mr Dadds, a photograph of the premises was submitted for consideration by the Committee, illustrating the proximity of the site to residential accommodation occupied by families and vulnerable adults. Objections were raised that customers of the premises would need to smoke outside on the pavement and that nuisance would also be caused by deliveries and by customers parking outside, damaging the local amenity. Concerns were also expressed that the hours applied for suggested that the premises would be operating more as a bar or social club than a café. The objectors reported that they were concerned about nuisance from noise, litter, disorder, anti-social behaviour, customers loitering in the area and obstruction caused to local residents. In response to a question from the Committee regarding the small size of the premises, objectors advised that a nuisance could still be caused by a small number of patrons, particularly in a residential area.

Mr Dadds addressed the Committee and clarified that patrons would not be permitted to take alcohol outside the premises and that the side passageway within the curtilage of the property would be used for smoking to ensure that customers would not be standing out on the pavement. It was reported that the number of people permitted outside to smoke would be limited to five at any one time. Mr Dadds advised the Committee that the capacity of the premises would be 20 persons including staff, and suggested that this be added as a condition to the licence.

Mr Dadds noted that the noise team had confirmed that, with the agreed conditions, the licensing objective on noise nuisance would be met and also that the police had made no representations on the application. Mr Dadds also noted that the premises had previously been a commercial premises and would remain a commercial premises, and that an application for planning permission was in the process of being prepared.

The Committee was informed of the previous occasion when the premises had been found to be operating without a licence. The applicant accepted that this had been wrong, had co-operated fully with the responsible authorities and had ensured that the premises remained closed since that time.

Mr Dadds reported that there would be no regulated entertainment at the premises, there would be a television and a small kitchen for the

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provision of snacks and drinks for the local Turkish community. By imposing the conditions agreed with the noise team, and the additional conditions offered by the applicant at the hearing, Mr Dadds reported that the licensing objectives would be met and that the application should be assessed on its merits. Mr Dadds advised the Committee that the conditions proposed addressed all the issues raised by the objectors.

The Committee asked about the applicant's intent to apply for planning permission, and Mr Dadds responded that a planning application was being prepared and would be submitted on the basis of the outcome of the licensing hearing. Mr Dadds also confirmed that no music would be played at the premises, just the television. In response to a question from the Committee regarding the hours applied for, it was reported that the hours applied for took into account the residential location and would ensure that all patrons had left the premises at an acceptable time so as not to undermine the licensing objectives. In response to a question from the Committee regarding the single entrance to the premises and access to the side passageway for smoking, it was confirmed that customers would need to use the public footpath to access the passageway to smoke but that limiting the number to five smokers at any one time and encouraging people not to stay outside by not providing outside seating and not permitting drinks outside would mitigate the disturbance caused.

Mr Dadds clarified for the Committee that the proposed licensee and designated premises supervisor (DPS) were brothers, and that the proposed licensee also intended to apply for a personal licence to become a DPS.

In response to questions from the objectors regarding the proximity of the smoking area to residential accommodation, Mr Dadds reported that in addition to limiting the number of smokers to five, staff would take proactive measures to ensure that customers behaved respectfully, and that anyone breaching this would be banned from the premises. In response to questions regarding planning issues, Mr Dadds advised that planning matters could not be considered by the licensing hearing and that applicants could apply for licensing and planning consents in any order. The Licensing Officer clarified that planning and licensing were separate regimes, and had to be considered separately as such.

In response to a question regarding the choice of location for the premises, Mr Dadds reported that the applicant had an existing interest in this property and that having operated the site as an estate agent for a time, had been required to start a new commercial venture as a result of the effect of the current financial climate on the property market. In response to a question from objectors regarding the proposed opening hours, Mr Dadds stated that the hours applied for and the conditions agreed would enable the licensing objectives to be met. The objectors asked what proactive measures the premises would take to address noise issues, in response to which Mr Dadds advised that the number of customers in the premises and permitted outside to smoke would be limited, that there would be no seating outside or drinks permitted outside, in order to prevent customers lingering outside, and that

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customers would be advised that if they did not behave appropriately they would not be served.

In response to a question from Mr Malcolm, Mr Dadds reported that staff would be responsible for monitoring the number of smokers outside at any one time, and that this would be controlled by means of distributing one of five tags to each customer wishing to smoke outside. It was reported that the small size of the premises would enable staff to monitor the number of patrons. Mr Dadds suggested a condition requiring a telephone number to be available to enable local residents to contact the premises directly if they had any concerns.

In response to questions from the legal officer, Mr Dadds confirmed that CCTV at the premises would cover both the interior and the side passageway. Mr Dadds also confirmed that the applicant was fully aware of all the conditions being agreed to, that, as representative, he had been provided with clear instruction in his meetings with the applicant prior to the hearing, that the applicant's English was of a reasonable standard, and that an agent was also present at the hearing to provide any additional translations as required.

In conclusion, the objectors reiterated their concerns that the granting of a licence would be detrimental to the residential nature of the vicinity and added that this would be a damaging precedent in the area.

Mr Dadds advised the Committee in summing up that the application must be considered on its own merits. He requested that the application be granted as applied for.

RESOLVED

The Committee considered the licensing objectives, licensing policy and all the representations made by the responsible authority (namely noise), the objectors and the applicant at the hearing. Whilst the Committee was not happy with the fact that the premises appeared to be a garage being used as a social club without planning permission, they were quietly confident that the impending planning permission would be lodged and the applicant would no doubt have been advised of the Council's powers under the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, should planning permission not be granted and they use the premises as a coffee house / social club.

Unfortunately, applications under the Licensing Act cannot directly consider planning issues, in so saying the Committee appreciated the representations on behalf of the residents of the area but were minded to grant the premises licence and condition it as follows:

- Hours for the supply of alcohol: Monday – Sunday 1100 – 2300
- Opening hours: Monday Sunday 1100 2330

General-all four licensing objectives

A fire risk assessment has been done and all recommendations made by the fire safety contractors have been followed. All the fire escapes were inspected and found to be sufficient and safe. Turkish Cypriot Community Centre was visited by Haringey's Health and Safety Officer Bill Cassidy who made recommendations and all of those were achieved.

5.3 Crime and Disorder

The measurements will be taken to avoid any incidents by introducing a calming period during the last one hour of the events. During the calming periods the music will be lowered and attendants to the event will be encouraged/warned to leave the premises quietly at the end of the events to avoid disturbance to the neighbours. Also during the events over consumption of alcohol will not be allowed.

5.4 Public Safety

Turkish Cypriot Community Centre has an up to date risk assessment and have achieved all the recommendations. There is also a health and safety policy in place which is used on a day to day basis. Turkish Cypriot Community Association workers and members are always cautious and very organised and strictly follow the Health and Safety policies and pay more attention to these policies when there are members of the public in the building.

5.5 Public Nuisance

The building is sound insulated also when leaving the building after an event the visitors are being warned to leave the building quietly to ensure that nearby residents are not disturbed.

5.6 Child Protection

Turkish Cypriot Community Centre have projects involving addressing the needs of children, e.g. mentoring project, therefore a Child Protection Policy is in place.





During the 3 years described above the council have taken a variety of action including warning letters and service of a noise abatement notice.

Most of the noise nuisance has occurred as a result of use of the rear garden by patrons and associated opening and closing of the doors leading to the rear garden. For this reason we recommend that the garden is out of bounds to patrons whilst regulated entertainment is in progress and that no windows are permitted to open

If the sub-committee were to grant this application then we would recommend the following alterations/conditions to the operating schedule:

Operating hours

That regulated entertainment ceases no later than 23:00.

Prevention of nuisance from noise/vibration

All doors and windows will remain closed during the regulated entertainment licensed activities.

The doors leading to the rear garden will be kept shut during the regulated entertainment licensed activities and used only for emergency egress

Adequate and suitable mechanical ventilation should be provided to public areas

Structure borne noise

All speakers are mounted on anti-vibration mountings to prevent vibration transmission of sound energy to adjoining properties

Sound limits

The licensee shall ensure that no music played in the licensed premises is audible at or within the site boundary of any residential property

All regulated entertainment amplified activity will utilise the in-house amplification system, the maximum output of which is controlled by the duty manager

Outside Areas

No music will be played in, or for the benefit of patrons in external areas of the premises

No form of loudspeaker or sound amplification equipment is to be sited on or near the exterior premises or in or near any foyer, doorway, window or opening to the premises

Signs shall be displayed in the external areas/on the frontage requesting patrons to recognise the residential nature of the area and conduct their behaviour accordingly.

The rear garden/frontage will be out of bounds to members of the public / users of the premises whilst regulated entertainment is in progress.

Plant and machinery

All plant and machinery is correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from noise

Dealing with complaints

A complaints book will be held on the premises to record details of any complaints received from neighbours. The information is to include, where disclosed, the complainant's name, location, date time and subsequent remedial action undertaken. This record must be made available at all times for inspection by council officers

Regular quarterly liaison meetings will be held to enable neighbours to raise concerns about any aspect of the licensed activities where this is requested by any local resident

Patrons entering/exiting premises.

Signs should be displayed requesting patrons to respect the neighbours and behave in a courteous manner

Prevention of nuisance from light

Security lights will be positioned to minimise light intrusion to nearby residential premises

- 1. Accommodation figures not submitted. These are required to determine exit widths, sanitary facilities required etc.
- 2. No emergency lighting or signage provided to rear escape route.
- 3. External side exit route blocked by brick built structure.
- 4. Final external exit door widths do not appear sufficient and do not have adequate ironmongery.
- 5. Plans submitted differ to premises on site.
- 6. Satisfactory electrical certificate to be submitted.
- 7. Satisfactory battery certificate to be submitted for the emergency lighting.

The above list should not be considered exhaustive as further queries may arise on the submission of revised plans and subsequent inspections.

I am writing to you both as a member of the Harringay Gardens Neighbourhood Watch, and as a concerned local resident, to oppose this licensing application for the 'Turkish Cypriot Community Centre'. This property is known to local residents as the Cyprus Kitchen, residents have never been consulted about a community centre at this location.

I believe that granting a licence for the activities and hours requested would be against the general principles of Haringey's Licensing policy and specifically the Prevention of Public Nuisance, not least in the light of the applicant's track record of noise nuisance.

My objection is based on the following:

The close proximity of The 'Turkish Cypriot Community Centre' to number 2, 4 and 6 Harringay Gardens is of extreme concern. This 'centre' is adjacent to the rear of these houses where I live. My property is a flat on the first floor of a converted two storey house, and my bedroom is at the rear of the property directly overlooks this 'centre'. The distance between my bedroom window and the 'centre' grounds is 7 meters!

The residents of Harringay Gardens have been suffering for years due to temporary licensed and unlicensed events held at this property and the Haringey noise team have been called out on many occasions. The problems these events have caused residents will almost certainly continue, only more persistently and for longer, later hours should they be given a license.

The most recent event the residents reported to the Haringey noise team was on Saturday 28th November when once again the loudness of the music reached unacceptable levels. Mr Roberts of the noise team visited my property at 2215hrs by which time they had shut the windows and the rear doors were shut, and although you could still hear the music from the venue, it was not as loud as it had been 20 minutes prior. After looking through his notes Mr Roberts commented that this 'centre' had already received a warning and also an abatement notice and this latest incident will be recorded. Mr Roberts telephoned me after he had visited the 'centre' and told me he had advised them to turn the music down and reminded them they had to finish promptly at 2300hrs. Mr Roberts also said that the venue manager told him that this was a private hire, so he had to speak with the person who was in charge of that particular event.

Other problems that have been reported to and recorded by the council include:

- Licensed events going on way past the time they are licensed to end at.
- The double doors leading from the property to the rear garden are in constant use during events with patrons continually going in and out of these doors to the garden to smoke or use their mobile phones, causing loud blasts of noise every time the doors open.
- Windows are opened periodically during an event causing the noise level heard from outside the venue to increase dramatically.
- Unsupervised children throwing fireworks at each other. (One firework landed in a resident's garden.)
- Unsupervised children throwing stones at a cat in a resident's garden.
- Children and adults attending the 'centre' being disrespectful to residents.
- Events and music going on until up to 2am.
- Residents are unable to enjoy their own gardens. One example is when a barbeque held in a neighbour's garden had to be abandoned due to the noise coming from this centre. They were forced to continue their social event in doors with doors and window closed on a lovely summer's evening.
- On many occasions after an event has 'finished', the patrons congregate in the rear garden directly below my bedroom window, drinking, talking and smoking. Not only does the talking keep me awake, I also have the smell of cigarette smoke coming in through my bedroom window, which is a major problem for me as I suffer with asthma.

- I am often forced to sleep on my sofa in the living room (at the front of my property) when the noise coming from the 'centre' is too bad, only to be woken up when the event finishes by patrons returning to their cars parked in Harringay Gardens, slamming car doors and having conversations in the street directly below my living room window.
- Before returning to their cars, many of the 'centre's' patrons purchase food such as kebabs and chips from local shops. After consuming their food and littering the streets with their food wrappings and uneaten food, they somehow mistake either the tree outside the Vet's or the tree near number 2 Harringay Gardens for a urinal.
- The organisers of many of the events held at this 'centre' have been less than truthful to the attending noise teams, wasting their time by claiming they have temporary licenses for events. On one occasion Mr Buckle had to visit them 3 times in one evening before he finally shut them down at almost midnight after it was confirmed they did not have a temporary license.

I believe that the following statement in the Borough's licensing policy 2008 supports my objection:

- This licensing policy statement is intended to support the Antisocial Behaviour Strategy by reducing the impact of drink related antisocial behaviour and the environmental crimes and nuisance that can be associated with licensed premises. (7.12)
- The Council will have special regard to the local impact of licensing on related crime and disorder ... particularly when concerning location, impact, operation and management of all proposed licenses, applications, renewals and variations of conditions. (8.6)
- Licensed premises, especially those operating late at night and in the early hours of the morning, can cause a wide range of nuisances that can impact on the people living, working or sleeping in the vicinity of the licensed premises. The Council is committed to protecting the residents in the vicinity of these licensed premises. (14.1)
- Noise nuisance is of particular concern. (14.3)
- The potential for additional crime and disorder and/or public nuisance is increased with longer hours. (19.1).
- In particular, late night activities cause much of this nuisance. Late night cafes can have a number of adverse effects on the residents in the vicinity of these premises. Nuisance such as noise, litter, anti-social behaviour, lights and odour all contribute to the loss of amenity to the general public. (14.2)

I work 5 – 6 days a week, staring work at 7am, which means I need to go to bed by 10pm (often earlier). An 11pm license every day would be injurious to the quality of my life and have a detrimental effect on my health and that of other residents that have to get up early to go to work or work shifts.

Many residents work every day and look forward to the festive break, and should be allowed to enjoy this time of year to spend quality time with family and friends and not be subjected to noise and aggravation that will result from events allowed to take place at this 'centre' until 2am on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve.

The above comments and objectives make it very clear that residents are extremely concerned about allowing late hours for premises which are surrounded by residential properties. The location of this 'community centre' as it is now calling itself is totally inappropriate to hold any kind of event that may cause noise and distress to residents.

It is with reluctance, I propose the following compromise, providing assurance is given that any contravention will result in the licence being revoked.

SUNDAYS: - No events at all to be held. (Residents need one full day of rest)

MONDAYS - THURSDAYS: No events at all after 7pm.

Events held during the day: Children must be supervised at all times and noise kept to a minimum. (This will allow residents to get to sleep on work/school nights).

FRIDAYS, SATURDAYS & CHRISTMAS EVE: until 11pm

NEW YEAR'S EVE: until 1am

Providing the following is adhered to:

- The rear doors and windows are kept closed all the time (as suggested by the noise team on more than one occasion). The large area at the front of the premises should be designated for smoking and mobile phone use.
- Install air conditioning so that they do not have to open the rear windows.
- Install sound insulation and ensure music is kept to a level that does not encroach on residents.
- Residents of Harringay Gardens (only 18 houses) and neighbouring houses on Green Lanes will be leafleted in advance of events to enable them to make provisions for parking.
- Residents are provided with a phone number for the event organiser.
- The event organiser is responsible for ensuring patrons leave quietly and do not litter/urinate in the streets.

Further to my letter dated 17th December opposing the licensing application for the venue at 628-630 Green Lanes.

After suffering music coming from this venue, thumping through my walls all evening, I finally called the LBH noise team at 2310hrs. I received a call back at 2320hrs. I was told that the venue only has a temporary license until 2300hrs and that another resident had also complained. I was told Mr Malcolm was on his way to visit my neighbour and that he would only call on me if he needed to.

Mr Malcolm of the noise team visited my neighbour at nbr 2 at 2330hrs and witnessed the event was still in full swing, and immediately went around to the venue to shut them down. The venue went quiet immediately after Mr Malcolm's visit.

I was given a reference for my call: 143821, and would like this incident to be included in my objection to the license being granted. I tried to go to bed at 2200hrs this evening and I can confirm the venue had all doors and windows shut and yet I still could not sleep because of the thumping bass.

As the LBH noise team have already confirmed to myself and other residents that this venue has already been given a warning and an abatement notice, please can you advise if you will be taking any further action against them for this latest infringement of their temporary license?

In my letter of 17th December I did try to be reasonable and suggest a compromise regarding times of licensing to this venue, however if they cannot abide by the rules of a temporary license granted to them in the period just before their licensing application hearing, I do not believe that they will have any consideration whatsoever to residents should they be granted any type of license.

I'm writing to you in regards to the above mentioned application, to join my neighbours and object to the licensing of the Turkish Cypriot Community Centre, 628-630 Green Lanes, N8 OJD.

My objection is based on the following:

I live in Harringay Gardens, at no 6 on the ground floor. My flat has a back garden which is adjacent to the outdoor area of Cyprus Kitchen where its guests gather to smoke cigarettes, socialise and let the children out to play.

Nothing wrong with that, only these people can be very loud, play loud music into the small hours of the night, and the children can scream continuously, and I think when someone's personal space takes over someone else's we have a problem.

When I chose to live here my decision was based on a nice and tranquil neighbourhood as well as other aspects, and I fear I'm going to lose that commodity I actually pay for.

In the summer for example, the only time of the year I could enjoy sitting in the garden after a day at work, I've often returned home only to find complete chaos at the other end of my garden. At times it got so unbearable that I was forced to shut the windows and doors to the garden and retreat indoors to boil in my own flat!

And because these people have carried on partying loudly into the night without care in the world and no respect for other people's lives, I've had to put up with the noise coming through my bedroom, which unfortunately faces the garden, so I had literally people partying in my face, while I was desperately trying to get some sleep.

No one should have to put up with that.

The times I've tried to enjoy the garden eventually i've had to retreat anyway, on one occasion because these people's children were throwing pebbles at my cats right into my garden, and of course I was hit by them too, just under the eyes of their parents/tutors, whom couldn't care less.

The other problem with Cyprus Kitchen is that their guests eventually live the premises to return to their cars parked on Harringay Gardens, (that's where most people's houses have their reception room, including mine), but not before having spent some time chatting loudly, slamming car doors and leaving behind a trail of rubbish generated by their take-aways.

So if I can't get any peace & quiet in my bedroom, and I can't get any in my living room either, am I supposed to stand in the hall until they decide to leave the premises?

The problem with them is that they've never tried to show any respect for anyone around them, neither their neighbours nor the law by hosting parties without a licence, not even when they've been directly solicited by Haringey Council's Noise Team to keep the noise down.

Their careless attitude and disrespect should not be rewarded with a licence, because even if they agreed to certain restrictions and regulations, they would treat the whole matter with completely disregard, and it's wrong that honest hardworking people who want to enjoy a bit of peace should have to suffer the consequences.

The application states this premises is called the Turkish Cypriot Community Centre, however residents know this as the Cyprus Kitchen. The local residents have never been consulted about a Community Centre at this location and would most certainly have opposed this due to the close proximity of residential houses. An analysis statute of statistic statute of statistic statutes and statistical statistics of the statistic statistics of the statis The problems caused to local residents by previous events held at this venue include excessive noise, anti social behaviour and intimidation. Their track record in respecting local resident's human rights

anti social behaviour and intimidation. Their track record in respecting local resident's human rights speaks for itself. You will find they have already been served with a warning and an abatement notice by the council noise team.

The Cyprus Kitchen (apparently now known as the Turkish Cypriot Community Centre) is only 7 meters from the back of house numbers 2, 4 and 6 Harringay Gardens. This 'Centre' runs adjacent to the rear of my house. The distress and anxiety that events held here have caused me over the years, many without council knowledge or permission has been excruciating. The council noise team have been regular visitors to my property during these events and have been very supportive and critical of these events. To consider giving a full license to this property would only increase the problems for both the residents and the council noise team.

The most recent event I called the noise team about was on Saturday 28th November. I was informed that they had been given a temporary license for this event, however, they left the rear doors and windows open and I was subjected to a whole evening of loud music, shouting and clapping, smoking and talking loudly in their garden.

I reach retirement age in February next year (2010) and was looking forward to spending my twilight years pursuing my hobbies of gardening and reading. As my garden shares a wall with this centre my plans and quality of life, after all my years of working, will be shattered.

I have incurred many sleepless nights because of loud music going on at this centre until up to 2am. On many occasions after an event has finished, their guests gather in the garden drinking, talking loudly and smoking. This is not considered by the noise team as loud enough to reprimand them about, but I am sure you will appreciate that in the quiet of the night consistent noise like this does stop me sleeping and with the sleep deprivation I get angry which causes anxiety and make me feel ill.

Other experiences with events held at this property have included objects and fireworks thrown into my garden and abuse directed at me when I have politely asked them to stop.

Very often children are left unsupervised, screaming in the centre's garden for many hours, causing me to have to retreat from my own garden and sit in my flat with all doors and windows shut in the height of summer. Even then I can still hear the thumping noise. On one occasion I had to abandon a barbecue I held for friends and neighbours as we could not hear each other speak due to the loudness of their music and also the intimidation of men attending the event at the centre looking over my garden wall.

Upon seeking advice I believe that granting a licence for the activities and hours requested would be against the general principles of Haringey's Licensing policy and specifically the Prevention of Public Nuisance, not least in the light of the applicant's track record of noise nuisance, and that the following statements in the Borough's licensing policy 2008 supports my objection:

- This licensing policy statement is intended to support the Antisocial Behaviour Strategy by reducing the impact of drink related antisocial behaviour and the environmental crimes and nuisance that can be associated with licensed premises. (7.12)
- The Council will have special regard to the local impact of licensing on related crime and disorder ... particularly when concerning location, impact, operation and management of all proposed licenses, applications, renewals and variations of conditions. (8.6)
- Licensed premises, especially those operating late at night and in the early hours of the morning, can cause a wide range of nuisances that can impact on the people living, working or sleeping in the vicinity of the licensed premises. The Council is committed to protecting the residents in the vicinity of these licensed premises. (14.1)

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Not only do I object to a 7 day a week license, I also object to a license until 2am on Christmas Eve and at New Year. As a Christian I value Christmas and I cook dinner for family and friends who visit me on Christmas day. I have to get up early on Christmas day and do not relish the thought of being kept awake until 2am plus on Christmas morning, hence ruining my Christmas Day.

I have spoken to few of the local residents and we have come up with a compromise that we feel could work for both parties, and we would be reluctantly willing to give our approval for the following licensing hours, providing assurance is given that any contravention will result in the licence being revoked.

SUNDAYS: No events at all to be held. As a Christian this is my day of rest.

MONDAYS - THURSDAYS: No events at all after 7pm.

Events held during the day: Children must be supervised at all times and noise kept to a minimum.

FRIDAYS, SATURDAYS & CHRISTMAS EVE: until 11pm NEW YEAR'S EVE: until 1am



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

I am writing to you in regard to the above licencing application for the Turkish Cypriot Community Centre which I would like to register my opposition to. I do realise that 'The Cyprus Kitchen. is a social resource for the local Cypriot community, but unfortunately residents have never been consulted about a community centre in our locality.

This community centre has an unfortunate track record of noise nuisance. My neighbours have been unable to sleep at night because of booming bass music coming from their social events which do not seem to follow the regulations as to ending times.

The Cypriot Community centre is close to number 2, 4 and 6 Harringay Gardens and this has always caused problems. The back of these properties directly overlooks this centre.

The residents of Harringay Gardens have been suffering for years due to temporary licensed and unlicensed events held at this property and the Haringey noise team have been called out on many occasions. The problems these events have caused residents will almost certainly continue, only more persistently and for longer, later hours should they be given a license. The most recent event the residents reported to the Haringey noise team was on Saturday 28th November when once again the loudness of the music reached unacceptable levels. Mr Roberts of the noise team was called out at 10.15 pm

Other problems that have been reported to and recorded by the council include:

- Licensed events going on way past the time they are licensed to end at.
- The double doors leading from the property to the rear garden are in constant use during events with patrons continually going in and out of these doors to the garden to smoke or use their mobile phones, causing loud blasts of noise every time the doors open.
- Windows are opened periodically during an event causing the noise level heard from outside the venue to increase dramatically.
- Unsupervised children throwing fireworks at each other. (One firework landed in a resident's garden.)
- Unsupervised children throwing stones at a cat in a resident's garden.
- Children and adults attending the 'centre' being disrespectful to residents.
- Events and music going on until up to 2am.
- Residents are unable to enjoy their own gardens. One example is when a barbeque held in a neighbour's garden had to be abandoned due to the noise coming from this centre. They were forced to continue their social event in doors with doors and window closed on a lovely summer's evening.
- On many occasions after an event has 'finished', the patrons congregate in the rear garden, drinking, talking and smoking.
- when the event finishes patrons return to their cars parked in Harringay Gardens, slamming car doors and having conversations in the street
- Before returning to their cars, many of the 'centre's' patrons purchase food such as kebabs and chips from local shops. After consuming their food and littering the streets with their food wrappings and uneaten food, they somehow mistake either the tree outside the Vet's or the tree near number 2 Harringay Gardens for a urinal.
- The organisers of many of the events held at this 'centre' have been less than truthful to the attending noise teams, wasting their time by claiming they have temporary licenses for events. On one occasion Mr Buckle had to visit them 3 times in one evening before he finally shut them down at almost midnight after it was confirmed they did not have a temporary license.

Many residents work every day and look forward to the festive break, and should be allowed to enjoy this time of year to spend quality time with family and friends and not be subjected to noise and aggravation that will result from events allowed to take place at this 'centre' until 2am on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve.

The above comments and objectives make it very clear that residents are extremely concerned about allowing late hours for premises which are surrounded by residential properties. The location of this 'community centre' as it is now calling itself is totally inappropriate to hold any kind of event that may cause noise and distress to residents.

We would like to propose the following compromise, providing assurance is given that any contravention will result in the licence being revoked.

SUNDAYS: - No events at all to be held. (Residents need one full day of rest)

MONDAYS - THURSDAYS: No events at all after 7pm.

Events held during the day: Children must be supervised at all times and noise kept to a minimum. (This will allow residents to get to sleep on work/school nights).

FRIDAYS, SATURDAYS & CHRISTMAS EVE: until 11pm

NEW YEAR'S EVE: until 1am

I am writing to you with regards to the application for a license to provide entertainment from the Turkish Cypriot Community Centre (628-630 Green Lanes, N8 OJD). I believe that granting this license fully would cause a public nuisance and so the application should be refused or heavily reduced.

Since we bought our home, 4a Harringay Gardens, in November 2006 here there have been problems with noise coming from the Turkish Cypriot Community Centre. Our garden (only several meters long) backs onto the centre, and often they hold events where loud music and singing disturb us throughout the evening and well into the night. It is especially difficult because their events often spill out into their garden, as large groups of people gather to smoke and children play very noisily.

We have contacted the harringey council noise team on several occasions to inform them of the problem however there have been many more times when we have not complained as we thought we would try to be 'good neighbours'.

The news that they have appiled for a permanent license is very concerning as it suggests that the frequency of these events will increase, indeed there is the potential for it them to occur every day.

When an event is being held we are unable to open our windows and back door or to enjoy time in our garden. This seems to be an unfair imposition on ourselves and the other residents whose properties are adjoin the Turkish Cypriot Community Centre. We have also had cigarette packets and other litter thrown into our garden and even stones thrown at our cats.

We would be happy for a compromise whereby the days, hours and / or frequency of their provision of entertainment is limited but we strongly oppose the granting of a permanent license.

I find myself writing to you again, this time with regard the licence applications for the Turkish Cypriot Community Centre, 628-630 Green Lanes, N8 OJD

Re : Premise Licence: Turkish Cypriot Community Centre, 628-630 Green Lanes, N8 OJD Applying for: Provision of Regulated Entertainment: Plays & Films Monday to Sunday 7pm to 11pm Live Music, Recorded Music, Performances of Dance, Provision of facilities for dancing, and Provision of facilities similar to that of making music or dancing Thursday to Sunday 7pm to 11pm New Year's Eve and Christmas Eve: 7pm to 2am Provision of Late Night Refreshment: New Year's Eve and Christmas Eve only: 11pm to 2am Supply of Alcohol (for consumption on the premises): Monday to Sunday 7pm to 11pm New Year's Eve and Christmas Eve: 7pm to 2am **Opening Hours** Monday to Friday 9am to 11pm Saturday and Sunday 12 noon to 11pm New Year's Eve and Christmas Eve: 9am to 2am

In view of the circumstances I suspect that there is little of no chance of stopping late night events going on in the Turkish Cypriot Community Centre but I would like to see every effort to seriously provide reachable help when there is breach of licencing laws and disturption to our area. Ideally I would like to not have these sort events on my doorstep because it really is very unpleasant. I really don't know what you can possibly do with this application that will make it viable for them to hold these events and still provide some a satisfactory solution for local residents. If it were possible to restrict their times further then that would be something.

I will be really upset and disappointed if these events go ahead and we get the noise and other nuicances in the street afterwards. I will be wanting to hold someone responsible for this if it happens so if it is possible I would appreciate it if it is possible to have the full details names and mobile numbers of the owners of the property, and of the events and of any environment health officers or any other department who can step in to deal with issues.

I have lived in this area for a long time and past history shows that whoever has run those premises as an events venue have given very little regard for local residents. The noise coming from the front and the back of the premises is unbearable particularly in the summer when it is desirable to have the windows open. On top of that there are always guys who must quite clearly be somewhat drunk talking loudly in the street and urinating in our private yard and against the trees and out building wall. It is truly disgusting and it was a huge relief for us when the centre closed many years ago. This relief was fairly sort lived as it became a crack house. However I digress....

Whilst I appreciate that not every single person attending events and organiser has faulted on there but I can assure you that the vast majority of them do. It is in the Turkish and Kurdish culture to have loud music at these events. i know because I am Turkish. If in doubt get yourself invited to one of their events so you can see but make sure that you are not there on inspection business. I am sure that the environmental health noise officers are quite familiar with a typical party from such premises.

We have a 3 bedrooms in our house facing the open space neighbouring the garden of the Turkish Centre.

In view of my previous experience of opposing late night licensing of establishments I am including the following which should fit the necessary format of reasoning for you to accept this letter as an objection.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

I consider that the late opening of an establishment which serves alcohol until late hours will be the cause of fighting. There is a great likelihood of damage to local property and drunken disorder in the street.

From past experience I am sure that we will have patrons of this establishment making noise in the street late at night and urinating against my property along Harringay Gardens and even in my front yard facing Green Lanes.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

Whenever there has been a late night club of some description along this part of Green Lanes, we have always observed a great deal of Police activity - attending incidents such as brawls. Invariably I end up having my driveway blocked by patrons of such places. I would certainly consider that I put myself at risk to ask someone to move their car. You would think that people can be observant, civil and respectful but clearly from my experience there is always a certain proportion of people who could not care less and are prepared to be abusive. I have had first hand experience of this on more than one occasion.

Noise from the Centre is of great concern to everyone. When the premises has been used for events, invariably the whole stretch of neighbours adjacent to the centre and along Harringay Gardens do not get enough peace to be able to sleep in their own homes. I have known local residents to arrange their social life around to go and visit friends in order to avoid the disturbances that we have experienced.

The Protection of Children from harm

My child is too young to be out there late but they go out in the day and no doubt we will have to check every morning to see if someone has left their bottles of beer o the windowsill or smashed them on the street. It is really horrible to have broken glass on your doorstep on a regular basis. I consider this a threat to the well being of my child.

Iam replying to the letter sent to our flats, regarding an application made by the Turkish Cypriot Community Centre for a new premises license at 628-630 Green Lanes, London N8 0JD. My response to this is that Iam totally against this application and utterly appalled that this is actually being considered. This is an area which already experiences problems and is unsafe. Iam a resident that lives directly opposite these premises and I have been subjected to high volume of noise, shouting and raised voices which trangress to agressive arguments. I have had to call police and I also called the owner of these premises who was extemely hostile and would do nothing about the excessive noises erupting outside his premises. Needless to say I have been unable to sleep and my daughter has been woken up by the noise. I feel if you allow this license to proceed you would be giving ammunition for things to excalate out of control. There will be alcholol consumption and that would lead to arguments and worse. I have experienced these when this premises have had events and with noise already from the busy Green Lanes there is a high risk of further problems. There are families in this area that you need to consider, those with children, people who work and those who may have medical conditions that require peace and quiet.

Therefore, I would seriously ask you NOT to allow this license to pass. It is destrimental to the safety and well being of this community. Please don't let us have more problems which will occur if you allow this to pass.

Thank you for allowing us this opportunity to air our views about this. Iam not sure how much you know about this Turkish Cypriot community place and the Green Lanes area but it has a bad reputation and will attract the wrong type of people and there will be police involved.
