LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE HEARINGS PROCEDURE SUMMARY	
INTRODUCTION	
1.	The Chair introduces himself and invites other Members, Council officers, Police, Applicant and Objectors to do the same.
2.	The Chair invites Members to disclose any prior contacts (before the hearing) with the parties or representations received by them
3.	The Chair explains the procedure to be followed by reference to this summary which will be distributed.
NON-ATTENDANCE BY PARTY OR PARTIES	
4.	If one or both of the parties fails to attend, the Chair decides whether to:
	(i) grant an adjournment to another date, or
	(ii) proceed in the absence of the non-attending party.
	Normally, an absent party will be given one further chance to attend.
TOPIC HEADINGS	
5.	The Chair suggests the "topic headings" for the hearing. In the case of the majority of applications for variation of hours, or other terms and conditions, the main topic is:
	Whether the extensions of hours etc. applied for would conflict with the four licensing objectives i.e.
	(i) the prevention of crime and disorder,
	(ii) public safety,
	(iii) the prevention of public nuisance, and
	(iv) the protection of children from harm.
6.	The Chair invites comments from the parties on the suggested topic headings and decides whether to confirm or vary them.
WITNESSES	
7.	The Chair asks whether there are any requests by a party to call a witness and decides any such request.
8.	Only if a witness is to be called, the Chair then asks if there is a request by an opposing party to "cross-examine" the witness. The Chair then decides any such request.
DOCUMENTARY EVIDENCE	
9.	The Chair asks whether there are any requests by any party to introduce late documentary evidence.
10.	If so, the Chair will ask the other party if they object to the admission of the late documents.
11.	If the other party do object to the admission of documents which have only been produced by the first party at the hearing, then the documents shall not be admitted.

12.	If the other party object to documents produced late but before the hearing, the following criteria shall be taken into account when the Chair decides whether or not to admit the late documents:	
(i)	What is the reason for the documents being late?	
(ii)	Will the other party be unfairly taken by surprise by the late documents?	
(iii)	Will the party seeking to admit late documents be put at a major disadvantage if admission of the documents is refused?	
(iv)	Is the late evidence really important?	
(v)	Would it be better and fairer to adjourn to a later date?	
THE LICENSING OFFICER'S INTRODUCTION		
13.	The Licensing Officer introduces the report explaining, for example, the existing hours, the hours applied for and the comments of the other Council Services or outside official bodies. This should be as "neutral" as possible between the parties.	
14.	The Licensing Officer can be questioned by Members and then by the parties.	
THE HEARING

CLOSING ADRESSES

Background

5.1 An application for a new Premises Licence, by Mr Muharrem Atesogullari in respect of Lordship Lane Snooker Club, 407 Lordship Lane, Tottenham, London N17 6AG under the Licensing Act 2003.

The Licensee will ensure that all staff will undertake training in their responsibilities. Records will be kept of training and refresher training.

5.3 Crime and Disorder

Any incidents of a criminal nature that may occur on the premises will be reported to the Police.

5.4 Public Safety

Appropriate fire safety procedures are in place including fire extinguishers (foam, H₂O and CO₂), fire blanket, internally illuminated fire exit signs, numerous smoke detectors and emergency lighting (see enclosed plan for details of locations). All appliances will be inspected annually.

All emergency exits shall be kept free from obstruction at all times.

5.5 Public Nuisance

All customers will be asked to leave quietly.

Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed to remind customers to leave quietly and have regard to our neighbours.

5.6 Child Protection

A suitably worded sign of sufficient size and clarity must be displayed at the point of entry to the premises and in a suitable location at the point of sale, advising customers that they may be asked to produce evidence of their age.

A register of refused sales shall be kept and maintained on the premises.

It recently came to our attention that this snooker club, which is in a residential area and situated beneath our flat, has put in an application for an alcohol license. We object to this because we have previously had problems with nuisance behaviour and litter left by the customers of this club, and we are concerned that these problems would be exacerbated, were alcohol to be served on the premises.

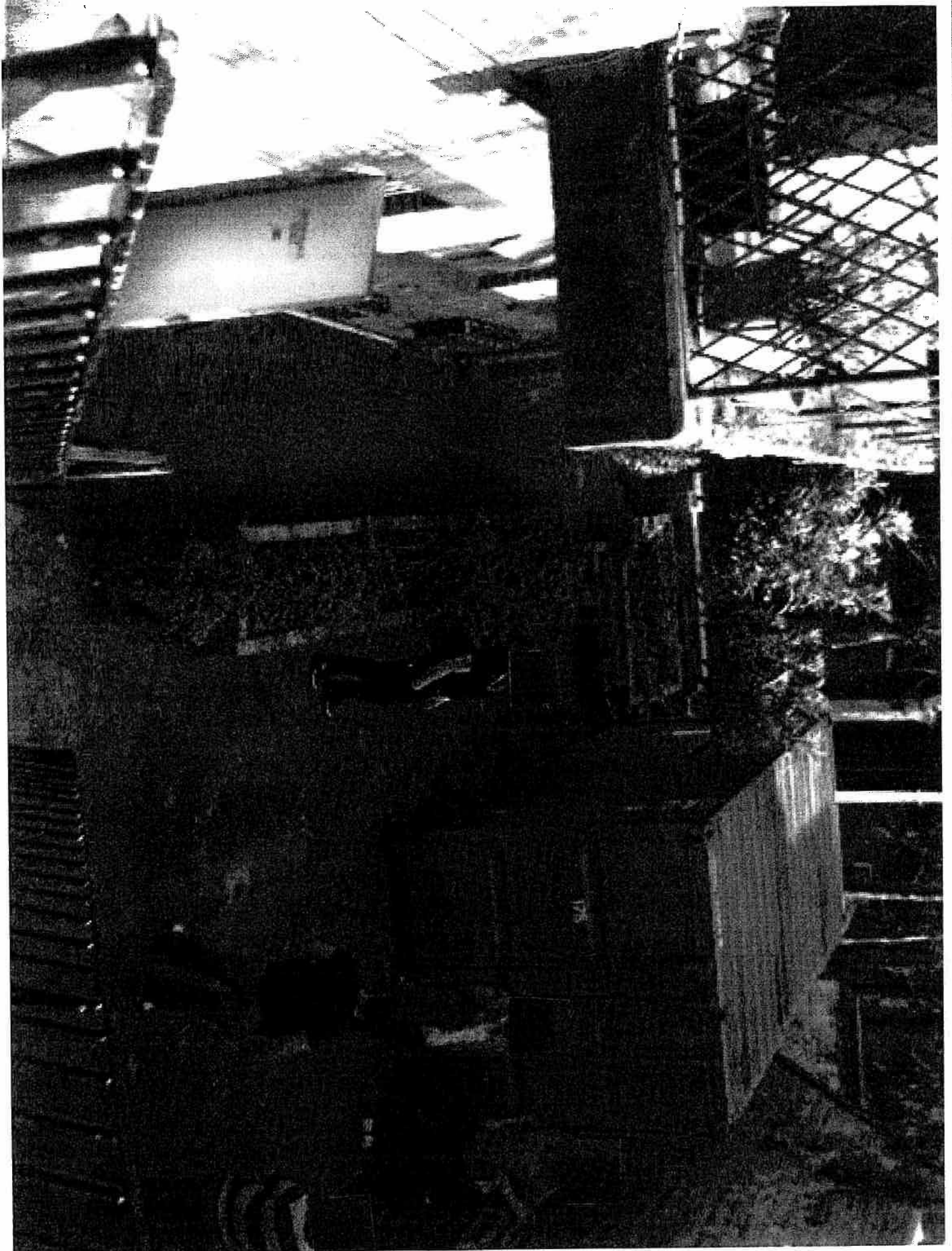
Since the indoor smoking ban came into effect in 2007, the patrons of this club have been leaving the fire exit open and smoking in the courtyard outside the building at all hours of the day and night; this is an area which mostly does not belong to the club, and furthermore is the only way by which we can access the stairs leading to the entrance of our flat. I have attached some jpegs illustrating typical scenes we come home to, where chairs have been moved out into the courtyard and they are using it as a recreational area, or standing around having heated arguments among themselves.

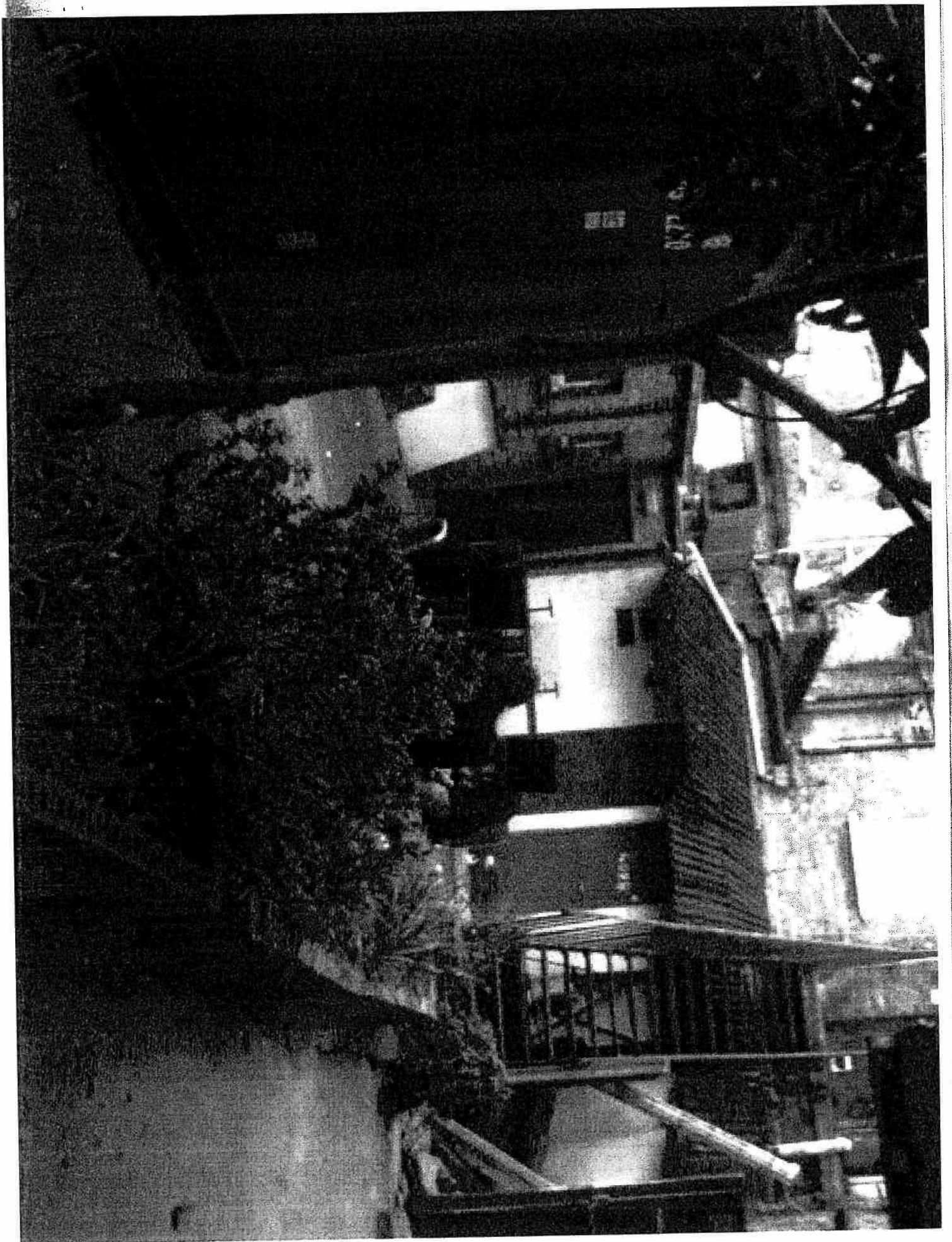
This is an invasion of our property, it infringes our privacy, they drop litter on our space and - especially at night - we, and particularly my girlfriend, feel intimidated to come home and sometimes have to walk through groups of strange men who have gathered by the entrance to our flat. We have objected to this behaviour several times, usually with the result that we are either ignored or told to go away using physically intimidating gestures. On at least one occasion in the three years I've lived at this address, we have returned home late one night and found the courtyard a police crime scene, owing to an incident which had occurred earlier in the night within the club.

Last year in March, I raised a formal complaint with Haringey Council's Enforcement Team (ref. HC-067438), but the problems with the club have still not been resolved. I'm sure you can appreciate that, were alcohol to be served there, these issues would surely get worse.

We are making a representation as an interested party: a residential household, (family) living in the vicinity of the premises.

Firstly, we would like it to be noted that the organisation in question has not upheld its obligations in the consultation process of applying for a licence to supply alcohol. The notices in the window of the premises state that the closing date of the consultation is 24th August 2009 (ie last year). We wondered why they were displaying an old licence application but phoned Haringey Council just to be sure. It was only then (16 August 2010) that we found the application to be current. Therefore we suggest that the consultation period is extended for a further 28 days with accurate notices being displayed.

We have the following concerns in relation to the four licensing objectives:

1. The prevention of crime and disorder

The premises in question has snooker tables, however it also hosts cards and dice games. The cards and dice games take place in the rear section of the premises, usually at night.

23/08/2010

The no smoking law is also flouted by the gaming patrons. The snooker tables are rarely used, and when they are, it is by children and younger teenagers, so the sale of alcohol would be mainly for the patrons of the cards and dice tables. To grant a licence for the supply of alcohol would encourage an increase of the gaming activity and smoking inside the premises.

2. Public safety

Instances of violence have occurred in or behind this premises in recent years. Alcohol supply would increase the chances of further incidents. It should also be noted that the majority of patrons drive to the premises and supply of alcohol would encourage drink driving.

3. The prevention of public nuisance

The gaming patrons of the establishment loiter in neighbouring property when the games break. They cause obstruction and nuisance to neighbours entering their residences, often late at night, and also leave litter. Alcohol supply would in our opinion exacerbate this public nuisance.

4. The protection of children from harm

The snooker tables in the premises are rarely used, but when they are, it is most often the school holidays or weekends, and the snooker players are young teenagers and children. If the organisation is applying to sell alcohol for the snooker players, not the cards and dice players, then the potential market is under age.

I declare that the information in this representation is correct. A site visit by council officials during the day, and to the rear of the premises at night (when a gambling session is on) would confirm the details submitted above.

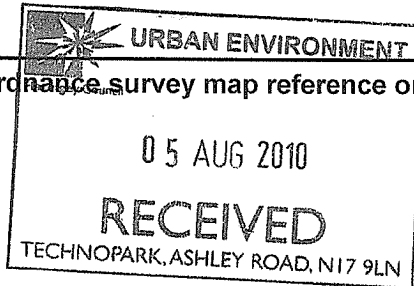

The Licensee, that is the person in whose name the premises licence is issued, shall ensure that all times when the premises are for any licensable activity, there are sufficient competent staff on duty at the premises for the purpose of fulfilling the terms and conditions of the licence and for preventing crime and disorder. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff will undertake training in their responsibilities in relation to the sale of alcohol, particularly with regard to drunkenness and underage persons. Records will be kept of training and refresher training.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Any incidents of a criminal nature that may occur on the premises will be reported to the Police. Toilets shall be checked an average of two hourly while the premises are open to the public to deter the use of drugs. Details of checks shall be documented and made available to Police on request.

The Licensee will install comprehensive CCTV coverage at the premises and it is operated and maintained at the premises.

The CCTV system shall conform to the following points:

1. Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance and exit doors both inside and outside.
2. Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification.
3. Cameras viewing till areas must capture frames not less than 50% of screen.
4. Cameras overlooking floor areas should be wide angled to give an overview of the premises.
5. Be capable of visually confirming the nature of the crime committed.
6. Provide a linked record of the date, time and place of any image.
7. Provide good quality images –colour during opening times.
8. Operate under existing light levels within and outside the premises.
9. Have the recording device located in a secure area or locked cabinet.
10. Have a monitor to review images and recorded picture quality.
11. Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture retention.
12. Have signage displayed in the customer area to advise that CCTV is in operation.
13. Digital images must be kept for 31 days.
14. Police will have access to images at any reasonable time.
15. The equipment must have a suitable export method, e. G. CD/DVD writer so that the police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. This data should be in the native file format, to ensure that no image quality is lost when making the copy, if this format is non-standard (i.e. manufacturer proprietary) then the manufacturer should supply the replay software to ensure that the video on the CD can be replayed by the police on a standard computer. Copies must be made available to Police on request.

c) Public safety

Appropriate fire safety procedures are in place including fire extinguishers (foam, H2O and CO2), fire blanket, internally illuminated fire exit signs, numerous smoke detectors and emergency lighting (see enclosed plan for details of locations). All appliances are inspected annually.

All emergency exits shall be kept free from obstruction at all times.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

All customers will be asked to leave quietly.

Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed to remind customers to leave quietly and have regard to our neighbours.

e) The protection of children from harm

The licensee and staff will ask persons who appear to be under the age of 21 for photographic ID such as proof of age cards, the Connexions Card and Citizen Card, photographic driving licence or passport, an official identity card issued by HM Forces or by an EU country, bearing the photograph and date of birth of bearer.

The operating schedule does not address the prevention of public nuisance from:

- Structure borne noise or machinery noise
- Noise generated from deliveries
- Noise from plant and machinery
- Light nuisance
- Litter nuisance

Supporting Information

Having check local noise nuisance complaint for the area, from noise from other licensed premises (public house) and delivery noise to superstores behind premises. I have made further recommendations.

Deliveries and collections.

Deliveries and collections associated with the premises will be arranged between the hours of 08.00 to 20.00 so as to minimise the disturbance caused to the neighbours

Use of external area's

External area's for loading, storage or putting out refuse will not be used between the hours of 11pm and 7am, to minimise noise disturbance to local residents.

Plant and machinery

All plant and machinery is correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from noise

Dealing with complaints

A complaints book will be held on the premises to record details of any complaints received from neighbours. The information is to include, where disclosed, the complainant's name, location, date time and subsequent remedial action undertaken. This record must be made available at all times for inspection by council officers

Regular liaison meetings will be held where specifically requested by residents to enable neighbours to raise concerns about any aspect of the licensed activities

Prevention of nuisance from litter

Adequate receptacles for use by patrons will be provided in the local vicinity. The positioning of the receptacles will be agreed with the licensing officer

Prevention of Nuisance from Odour

All ventilation and extraction systems shall be correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from odour

Prevention of nuisance from light

Illuminated external signage shall be switched off when the premises is closed

Security lights will be positioned to minimise light intrusion to nearby residential premises and turned off between 11pm and 7am.

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to express my **strong objection** to the above premises to be granted with a license to sell alcohol until midnight during weekdays and 2am on weekends. My concern is that these late hours will echo the effects of the pub further down the road which has similar hours. The result of a late license at the Jolly Anglers at 33 Station Road is that there is lots of noise and disturbance late at night which could be heard regularly from where I reside, 6th floor apartment in Solar House.

The increasing frequency of **fight, violence, anti social behaviour** and **litter and vomit** in the early hours of the morning causing general public and residents alarm, distress and harassment. I work shift and have personally witness the anti-social behaviour walking down from Station Road to the High Road or Bus stop or vice versa when returning home after a night out are intimidating and always fearful that being picked on as drunk do not talk rationale or common senses. As a law abiding citizen, I strongly believe that I have the right to live a life with a reasonable level of peace and without the fear of being a victim of crime or anti social behaviour. My concerns are as follow:

1. Having another establishment with late license will only create further noise and disturbance late at night causing further public nuisance
2. There is a correlated link between alcohol and crime – another late license will attract undesirables to the area trying to buy alcohol when other licensed shops are closed
3. More drunk and disorderly behaviour poses a risk to the safety to the residents and the general public

There are currently more than sufficient venues that sell alcohol into late hours 7 days a week within **5 minutes walking distance** from Solar House, 37 Station Road:

- a) Morrison Supermarket which opens from 0800 hours – 2200 hours weekdays; 0800 – 2100 hours on Saturday and 1100 hours – 1700 hours on Sunday
- b) Jolly Anglers Pub opens from 0800 hours – 0000 hours Sunday to Thursday; 1200 hours to 0200 hours Friday and 1200 hours – 0300 hours on Saturday

- c) Station Supermarket, 5 Station Road, N22 opens from 0800 hours – 0000 hours Monday to Sunday
- d) The Goose Pub, 203 High Road, N22 6DR opens from 1000 hours to 2300 hours Sunday to Thursday and 1000 hours to 0000 hours Friday to Saturday
- e) Spouter's Corner, Weatherspon locates at 180 High Road, Wood Green N22 6EJ and opens from 0700 hours to 0000 hours Sunday to Thursday and 0700 hours to 0100 hours on Friday to Saturday
- f) Greenwood convenience store at 736 Lordship Lane N22 opens 0800 hours – 0100 hours from Monday to Sunday
- g) Spar Convenience store at 740 Lordship lane opens from 0800 hours to 2100 hours from Monday to Sunday

Station Road is an increasingly residential area, with seven premises supply alcohol, four off licenses and three pubs within 5 minutes walking distance. In addition, there is an area next to the supermarket and outside Solar house which is sheltered makes it an ideal spot for drunks and homeless to loiter there to continue drinking alcohol.

I wish to reiterate that I strongly believe that having another premises selling alcohol into late hours will cause unnecessary disturbance and draining the already strained public resources such as the police and ambulance services and local resources from borough Haringey such as the cleaning services. Please step into my shoe and consider how you would feel when you experience the above situations. Peace, anti social behaviour and crime free is priceless.

I hope that my comments will be taken into careful consideration.

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- More drunk and disorderly behaviour poses a risk to the safety of residents and the general public.

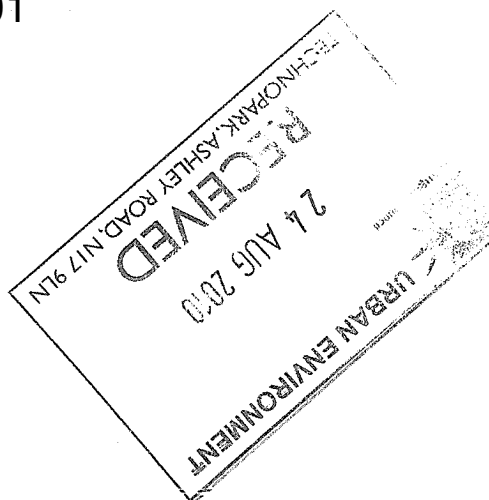
