	The Committee noted the statement by Mr Jonathan Smith, Solicitor on behalf of the Applicant, including the following:  • The Application sought additional hours for recorded music and entertainment but already had a licence to supply alcohol until half an hour before closing time.  • The Applicant had agreed to the conditions suggested by the

Noise Enforcement Team except for the condition limiting the number of people outside the premises smoking at any one time to eight. It would be very difficult to distinguish between patrons and passing traffic and could also displace smokers into residential areas.

- The rear door of the premises would be closed at 22:30 hrs and patrons would be required to use the front entrance.
- The Licensee, Mr William Cook, offered local residents a telephone number with which they could contact him directly if they had any future complaints.

In response to questions put to Mr Smith by the Panel it was noted that the premises did not use any specific sound monitoring equipment and the ratio of door supervisors (1 supervisor per 100 patrons) was the standard requirement.

The Committee received the statement of the Environmental Health Officer, Mr Eubert Malcolm, as laid out in the agenda pack, including that the noise service had witnessed two incidents of the premises breaching its licence in October 2010 and a caution had been given.

In response to questions put to Mr Malcolm by the Panel and interested parties it was noted that no complaints had been received regarding noise emitted from the front of the premises and there had been no complaints to the Council's anti-social behaviour team and the premises had installed filters on the air conditioning ducts to reduce noise nuisance.

A resident in attendance highlighted that he had made a complaint at the weekend (30<sup>th</sup> January 2011) regarding loud music at 02:04 hrs but it had taken 50 minutes for the resident to get through to the call centre by which time the music had ceased.

The Committee heard statements from interested parties (local residents and Councillor Pat Egan) objecting to the application on the grounds that extending the licence would exacerbate the problems of noise disturbance and anti-social behaviour from people using the premises. Residents complained that patrons could not be controlled once they left the premises and their unruly behaviour affected the quality of life of residents.

Having heard the representations of the interested parties, Mr Smith proposed that the Application be amended so that no change to opening hours be sought and the variations for the provision of regulated entertainment, live and recorded music and provision of entertainment facilities be contained within the current opening hours. He also proposed that a noise limiter be installed within the premises.

The Panel heard the summary statements from all parties and noted residents' requests for the application to be rejected in order to prevent public nuisance and the Applicant's Solicitor's assurance that the additional hour for entertainment would not be utilised by the premises

until the noise limiter had been installed.

Clerk's Note: The Panel adjourned at 20:45 hrs and reconvened at 21:00 hrs when the Chair announced that consideration of the application for Kasabba would be postponed to allow more time for a fairer hearing. The Panel adjourned to consider the evidence in respect of The Nelson.

## **RESOLVED**

The Committee carefully considered the application, representations by the Environmental Health Officer and the interested parties. Committee took into account the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Section 182 Guidance issued under the Licensing Act 2003.

The Committee decided to grant the application to the variation as amended during the course of the hearing on the basis that additional conditions are imposed to promote the licensing objectives, in particular that of the prevention of public nuisance.

The additional licensable activities are granted:-

The provision of Regulated Entertainment:

Monday to Wednesday 11:00 to 00:00 hrs

Thursday 11:00 to 02:00 hrs (the following day)

Friday to Saturday 11:00 to 02:00 hrs Sunday 11:00 to 01:00 hrs

The provision of Late Night Refreshments:-

23:00 to 00:00 hrs

23:00 to 02:00 hrs (the following day)

Monday to Wednesday
Thursday
Eriday to Saturday 66 77 Friday to Saturday 23:00 to 02:00 hrs 66 77 Sunday 23:00 to 01:00 hrs

The hours permitted for Live and Recorded Music and anything of a similar description and for the provision of entertainment facilities, making music and dancing, will now be permitted from 11:00 hrs Thursday to Saturday until 02:00 hrs the following day.

Christmas Eve, Boxing Day, New Years Day, all Bank Holidays plus the day preceding a Bank Holiday, Easter Saturday, Easter Sunday 11:00 hours until 02:00 hrs. New Years Eve from the start of permitted hours on 31<sup>st</sup> December until the start of permitted hours on 1<sup>st</sup> January. the morning which summer time begins where the terminal hour is later than 01:00 hrs, the terminal hour shall be extended by one hour for all the above licensable activities.

Subject to the above, the conditions put forward by the Applicant in the written application are imposed.

Additionally, the following conditions which have been agreed by the Applicant are imposed:

## Prevention of nuisance from noise / vibration

The inner entrance door be fitted with a self – closing device and staff will be required to ensure this is not propped open. When on duty a member of door staff shall be made responsible to ensure the door is open for as brief a period as possible. Where necessary, adequate and suitable mechanical ventilation should be provided to public areas. At times when door staff are not required to be working the manager shall ensure that a member of staff is able to observe the main door and ensure it is not propped open

Entry to the premises will be restricted to the main door onto the high road whilst the premises is being used for regulated entertainment licensed activity i.e. the rear door to the external smoking area to be kept closed.

## **Sound Limits**

The Licensee shall ensure that no music in the Licensed Premises is played at a level that is audible at or within the site boundary of any residential property at such a level that is likely to be intrusive to local residents within their homes.

A noise limiter will be installed and used at all times and set at a level agreed with a Council Environmental Health Officer. For the avoidance of doubt this is a condition to the variation to the hours of licensable activities but will run for the entire period that licensable activities are permitted.

During regulated entertainment, half hourly checks will be made at the site boundary of the nearest residential property to ensure that such regulated entertainment is not likely to be so intrusive and a log will be kept of those checks and made available to the Responsible Authorities (as defined by The Licensing Act 2003).

All regulated entertainment amplified activity will utilise the in house amplification system the maximum output of which is controlled by the sound limiter.

#### **Outside Areas**

No music will be played in, or for the benefit of patrons in external areas of the premises

No form of loudspeaker or sound amplification equipment is to be sited on or near the exterior premises or in or near any foyer, doorway, window or opening to the premises

Signs shall be displayed in the external areas/on the frontage requesting patrons to recognise the residential nature of the area and conduct their behaviour accordingly. The management must reserve the right to ask

patrons to move inside the premises or leave if it is felt that they could be disturbing neighbours

#### Deliveries and collections.

Empty bottles and non-degradable refuse will remain in the premises at the end of trading hours and taken out to the refuse point at the start of the working day rather than at the end of trading when neighbours might be unduly disturbed

## Plant and machinery

All plant and machinery is correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from noise.

## **Dealing with complaints**

A complaints book will be held on the premises to record details of any complaints received from neighbours. The information is to include, where disclosed, the complainant's name, location, date time and subsequent remedial action undertaken. This record must be made available at all times for inspection by council officers.

## Patrons entering/exiting premises.

Signs should be displayed requesting patrons to respect the neighbours and behave in a courteous manner.

#### **Door supervisors**

When door staff are on duty a licensed door supervisor shall supervise patrons and ensure the leave in a prompt and courteous manner, respecting the neighbours.

When door staff are on duty a licensed door supervisor will be positioned on the exit door to ensure, as far as reasonably practical, that patrons do not leave drinks.

When door staff are on duty a licensed door supervisor will patrol the cartilage of the premises to prevent patrons urinating in public areas in the vicinity of the premises.

#### Prevention of nuisance from litter

Adequate receptacles for use by patrons will be provided in the local vicinity. The positioning of the receptacles will be agreed with the licensing officer. Smoking waste (e.g. cigarette butts) to be cleared from the main entrance area and rear external smoking area on a daily basis, preferably at the beginning of business.

# **Prevention of Nuisance from Odour and Noise** All ventilation and extraction systems shall be correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from odour or noise. Prevention of nuisance from light Illuminated external signage shall be switched off when the premises is closed Security lights will be positioned to minimise light intrusion to nearby residential premises The Committee accepted that there were issues of public nuisance and felt that the additional conditions, that could be imposed as part of a variation application (which could not have been imposed had the application been rejected outright) would in fact promote the objective of preventing public nuisance. As an informative, all parties were reminded that if there were issues relating to the licensing objectives with the operation of the licence, procedures exist to have the licence reviewed. LSCB32. 	The Licensing Officer, Dale Barrett, presented the report on a application for a premises licence variation at Kassaba, 1 New Rive Avenue, Hornsey, London N8 7QD. In response to the consultation of the application, representation had been received from the Council's Noise Team, and a number of letters had been received from local residents in objection. Ms Barrett clarified that in addition to the proposed extension of hours and increase in types of regulated entertainment offered, the application sought to replace the condition on the existing license with those put forward in the operating schedule.	er n s al e d
	In response to a question from local residents, it was clarified that the proposed additional hour in relation to British Summertime was onl applicable to the single day when British Summertime commenced.	
	Derek Pearce, Enforcement Response, presented the representation from the Noise Team. It was reported that the Noise Team had felt necessary to make representations, given the history of complaints in relation to the premises, however it was felt that the imposition of conditions would address the issues raised. Mr Pearce advised that the Noise Team had agreed a revised set of conditions for those presented in the paperwork with the applicant, and this was tabled for information.  In response to questions from the Committee, Mr Pearce confirmed that	it n of e d

the Council would inspect works such as the lobbied entrance and configuration of the sound limiter, to ensure these were completed satisfactorily. It was clarified that the external area formed part of the premises, but was not a site for any licensable activity to be carried out. Local residents asked how the Council would determine whether noise was at an 'intrusive level' or not, in response to which Mr Pearce reported that it shouldn't be possible to hear noise from a premises from inside anyone's home, so if noise was only just audible from outside the perimeter of a property, it was likely that this would be considered an acceptable level. Residents expressed concern that if noise were audible outside the premises, this could cause a nuisance in summer, when they wished to have their windows open.

In response to a question regarding the removal of the condition requiring lobbied doors to the premises, the applicant confirmed that work on a lobby for one set of doors was almost complete, and that a planning application had been submitted for the other set of doors; as this work was conditional on planning consent being granted, this could not be included as a condition on the licence.

Several local residents addressed the Committee to object to the application. Residents complained that they had been experiencing problems in relation to the premises since it opened; loud music had been played until the early hours of the morning on a regular basis, noise was caused by customers using the outside terrace and by customers leaving the premises. Residents reported having to call the police to break up a fight outside the premises, and also reported antisocial behaviour from people playing music and revving their engines in cars parked outside, long after the premises had closed. It was reported that the noise was so loud that residents could not sleep. Customers of the premises were also parking illegally in the private road and on the grass verges and pavements, causing a nuisance. Music from the premises was reported to be so loud that it could be clearly heard over the sound of the television within neighbouring flats, and when residents had contacted the venue to complain directly, staff had been unhelpful and occasionally rude in their response.

Residents reported that they had called the Noise Team on a number of occasions, but that due to the sporadic nature of the noise, the nuisance had not always been witnessed by the time an officer arrived. It was reported that a meeting had been held with management to address some of the concerns, but residents had been very disappointed that, following this meeting, the noise had been just as loud as before, and nobody had answered the contact telephone numbers which they had been given. Residents felt that the application would lead to the premises being run more as a nightclub than a bar and restaurant, and felt that this quiet residential area was not a suitable location for such an operation.

In response to questions from the Committee, local residents advised that the nature of the noise they could hear from people outside the premises included shouting, laughter, music from cars and people

talking loudly in groups. Residents reported that although the premises had a policy that the car park would be locked up after the premises closed, this was not being done and was enabling people to stay in the car park causing a nuisance after the premises had closed.

The applicant's representative, Ms Eames, addressed the Committee and reported that part of the purpose of submitting this application was to tidy up the licence: to regularise the hours, to include a more comprehensive list of forms of regulated entertainment and to put in place a more robust operating schedule in order to better promote the licensing objectives. It was reported that the applicants had spent seven months and a significant sum of their own money in refurbishing the premises, which was intended to be a business for the use of the local community. The ground floor of the premises was reported as being for fine dining, with the upstairs as a lounge / bar area for customers to relax after their meals. It was hoped that the premises could offer occasional entertainments such as belly dancing, stand up comedy and musical showcases for new acts, all aimed at an older clientele.

It was reported that all staff at the venue were fully trained as part of their induction, and that training would continue on an ongoing basis. Security staff were employed at weekends to enforce entry policies and ensure there were no issues arising in respect of crime and disorder. The applicant's representative noted that a number of conditions had been agreed with Environmental Health to address noise issues raised by local residents; a sound limiter had already been installed and the premises employed a sound engineer who would work with the local authority and residents to ensure that noise levels were not intrusive. It was reported that the premises wanted to be for the community, and not to compromise the wellbeing of local residents. In respect of the concerns regarding noise from the outside area, the applicant had agreed to restrict the hours when this area could be used by customers, and that staff would be on hand to ensure that noise was kept to acceptable levels and that the doors were not opened at any time other than for entry and egress.

The applicant confirmed that they were more than happy to meet with local residents to discuss any concerns, and advised that following the previous meeting with residents, a number of actions had been taken including insulating the windows, relocating the speakers and creating a dispersal policy. The applicant offered a condition that, if the Committee were to grant later hours, there would be no admittance to new customers after 1am. The applicant also recognised that the working week tended to be a quieter period, and offered revised hours from those set out in the report to a cessation of all licensable activities at midnight on Sundays, with a closing time of 0030hrs, and a terminal hour for all licensable activities of 1am Monday to Thursday, closing at 1.30am. It was hoped that these additional measures would address residents' concerns.

In response to a question from the Committee, the applicants estimated that the capacity of the venue would be around 360 in total, and it was

reported that as many as 80 people could be dancing at any time in the upstairs area. The Committee asked the applicant for their view on the comments of local residents that staff had been unhelpful when they had been contacted regarding noise issues, in response to which the applicant advised that they were not aware of any of their staff being rude, but would take action if staff were found to have behaved in that way. The applicants confirmed that steps had now been taken to ensure that no waste from the premises was taken outside late at night, and that all refuse was now retained inside the premises until the following morning so as minimise the disturbance to neighbours.

A local resident who supported the application addressed the Committee. He stated that he had been very impressed with the way the business was being run.

The Committee asked questions of the sound engineer for the premises, who advised that two sound limiters were now installed at the premises, that he was satisfied with the additional conditions agreed with environmental health and would ensure that these were adhered to and that he would welcome the opportunity to monitor sound levels from within a neighbouring property, to get an idea of the noise levels and adjust the limiters accordingly to ensure that no disturbance was caused to local residents. It was confirmed that the insulation of the windows had been undertaken two weeks previously, and that the windows were now permanently sealed shut.

In summing up, residents re-stated their concerns that the hours applied for under the new licence would turn the premises into a nightclub, and opposed the extension of the hours. The applicants concluded by drawing the Committee's attention to the more robust operating schedule offered and the additional conditions agreed with the noise team, and reported that they were taking all the issues raised by residents very seriously and were working hard to address them. The applicant confirmed that they and their sound engineer were committed to working together with the Local Authority in addressing the issues raised by local residents.

The Committee adjourned for deliberations.

#### **RESOLVED**

The Committee carefully considered the application, written and verbal representations of local residents, the responsible authorities and the applicants and also took into account section 182 of the guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy and resolved to grant the application by Kassaba on the following terms:

## Outside areas

4. The external seating area on the frontage will be closed to patrons and patrons requested to come inside the main structure of the premises from 23:30, Monday to Sunday, after which the area is to be used for the purposes of smoking only. Management will be required to carry out regular checks, minimally every hour, to ensure that no noise is at such a level that is likely to be intrusive to local residents within their homes.

## Dealing with complaints

- 6. The applicant is to make arrangements for formal liaison meetings with local residents on a six-weekly basis.
- 3) No new customers are to be admitted to the premises after 1am, Monday to Saturday.

For the avoidance of doubt, the variation of the premises licence is to be granted only once the Licensing Authority has provided written confirmation to the applicant that it is satisfied that the conditions have been met to their satisfaction. The licence is subject to review if the conditions are not met.

# LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE HEARINGS PROCEDURE SUMMARY INTRODUCTION The Chair introduces himself and invites other Members, Council officers, Police, Applicant and Objectors to do the same. 2. The Chair invites Members to disclose any prior contacts (before the hearing) with the parties or representations received by them The Chair explains the procedure to be followed by reference to this summary which will 3. be distributed. **NON-ATTENDANCE BY PARTY OR PARTIES** 4. If one or both of the parties fails to attend, the Chair decides whether to: grant an adjournment to another date, or (ii) proceed in the absence of the non-attending party. Normally, an absent party will be given one further chance to attend. **TOPIC HEADINGS** 5. The Chair suggests the "topic headings" for the hearing. In the case of the majority of applications for variation of hours, or other terms and conditions, the main topic is: Whether the extensions of hours etc. applied for would conflict with the four licensing objectives i.e. (i) the prevention of crime and disorder, (ii) public safety, (iii) the prevention of public nuisance, and the protection of children from harm. (iv) 6. The Chair invites comments from the parties on the suggested topic headings and decides whether to confirm or vary them. WITNESSES 7. The Chair asks whether there are any requests by a party to call a witness and decides any such request. 8. 





  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act):
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
  - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
    - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
    - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
  - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
  - 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

#### **Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions**

- **3.** The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- **4.**—(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that-
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
  - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
  - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
  - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
  - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.



On Saturday 12th March 2011 I was on duty in plain clothes conducting noise enforcement patrols with a member
of Haringey Council's Noise Enforcement team. In the early hours of the morning we received several calls from
local residents to a noise disturbance at the Kelco Bar, 18 HIGH STREET N8. We made our way to the location
and on arrival I could see a very large crowd gathered both directly outside the premises and also on the opposite
footway. I saw large groups of young black males, several of whom I recognised to be associated with gangs
within the borough, several were from the Broadwater Farm area and others I recognised to be from the
Campsbourne estate. We approached the premises on foot and as I neared the entrance, I noticed there was an
overwhelming smell of cannabis. I could also see there were several people outside the bar with drinks in their
hands, many looked intoxicated and some were also holding half drunken bottles of spirits. We walked through
the front door of the premises, which was unsupervised, and into the bar which was extremely busy. The noise
from the sound system was incredibly loud and inside the bar there was also a very strong smell of cannabis. We
struggled to walk through the bar due to the sheer weight of numbers and when we finally managed to get to the
bar we asked that the Designated Premises Supervisor meet us at the rear of the premises. We walked through to
the rear of the premises and waited by the back fire exit. We were joined shortly after by a male who identified
himself as Hardeep DHANOA, the Designated Premises Supervisor. Due to the noise, we asked that we talk
outside the premises. The fire exit at the rear was bolted shut. DHANOA unbolted the door and we moved
outside. We explained to DHANOA our concerns in relation to the noise, that we felt there were too many people
in the premises, that there was no-one supervising the door, that there appeared to be drugs being used at the
location and that the fire exit was locked. DHANOA appeared flustered and admitted that he hadn't expected as
many people at the venue and that he felt it had got a bit out of control. He explained that he had been
supervising the door but had been needed inside the premises. He also explained that he had checked ages of
persons entering the premises. He did however state that he had let several girls into the venue who showed that
they had tattoos and because you needed to be 18 to have a tattoo, he felt that this was sufficient proof of age. He

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advised us that he was going to turn the music off and ask people to leave. My colleague from the council and I made our way back to our vehicle. As we approached our vehicle I could see that the numbers outside the premises had increased to about two hundred. On Sunday 13th of March 2011 I was on duty in full Police uniform in a marked Police vehicle on serial 990C part of Operation Blunt. The driver was PC WHELDON 919YR along with PS SALTER 83YR and four other PC's. Shortly before 00:20 Hours I heard a call come over the radio stating that a unit needed more police assistance at the Kelco Bar on High Road N8 (CAD 877/13MAR11). The call was in relation to a large group of people causing a disturbance in the area.  On arriving at the location I noticed approximately 80 - 100 males/females were outside the bar in the street, they were aged between 17 - 25, majority of them IC3. I spoke to PS TISI 33YR who informed that he had attended the location in company with a council member and had closed the premises due to them breaching their licence. I recognised a few of the crowd as being members of The Grey gang. I could also smell that some people were possibly smoking cannabis in the area as there was a very strong distinctive smell of cannabis and drugs paraphernalia on the floor. Some of the people were carrying bottles of alcohol and drinking in the street, the bottles appeared to have been taken out of the club. Due to the large number of people loitering and their behaviour it was decided to encourage the crowd to move away from the location and get them to disperse. As						
the crowd was moved they broke up into several smaller groups and moved the other side of the road a short distance away from the club. The smaller groups were still loitering in the street, drinking and shouting to each other and using obscene language. It was decided that our serial were to remain at the location and monitor the group and let them disperse of their own accord.						
During this time I was aware that there had been several other calls to police stating that the group of youths were causing anti social behaviour.  Approximately 15 minutes later several fights began to break out in the groups however due to being greatly out numbered and the officer safety risks we did not get out of our vehicle. I was aware that more police units were

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on route to help control the situation and when they turned up we got out of our vehicle in order to further disperse the groups. As other units arrived another fight broke out right out side the Kelco bar where out vehicle was parked.

As police approached the group of males fighting and the large crowd that had gathered they all started to run away from police. During this time several bottles and bricks were thrown at police and due to this several police officers including myself got the short shield from our van to protect ourselves.

Police then continued to disperse the group from the area to which they did so running off in various directions, still throwing items at police and shouting abuse/ swearing at us.

Once the majority of the crowd had left the other police units left and our serial remained on scene for about another hour to make sure they crowd did not come back.

At this point I was aware more units were requested to attend the location and whilst monitoring another group on the High Road, directly outside the Kelco bar I noticed a fight broke out where the group of males were coming towards the Police van. As I feared for the safety of the persons involved as I was aware bottles were being used as weapons I decided to get nearer to the group and I deployed my CS canister through the Police van drivers side window in an attempt to stop the fight, which had a very good effect and the group involved stopped fighting and started to run away.

At this point majority of the groups were now in the side streets carrying on fighting and arming themselves with debris and weapons. I noticed at least one bottle being thrown onto my Police van whilst a number of items including bricks were thrown at Police Officers. A decision was made to deploy short shields as a defence option and for approximately the next 30 minutes Police were attempting to control the crowd who were causing a serious disorder. Using the tactical option of short shields/asp and CS the crowds were eventually dispersed and the situation was ended.



Whilst we have received several calls regarding loud music from the premises we have not been able to witness this problem. However we have witnessed a large group of people standing around outside the premises which resulted in Police having to attend after a passing car was damaged by persons in the crowd throwing items at the car.

There has also been an incident on Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> March 2011 at approximately 00:50hrs regarding a very large group of people outside the bar which resulted in a large police presence.

### **Door Supervisors**

I would recommend the following condition be added to the licence

SIA licensed doormen (a minimum of two) be on duty from 20:00hrs until close of premises from Thursday until Saturday and at any other time when events occur at the premises.

The Licencee or DPS should, or instruct others to, contact the Police by the red care alarm system and / or by any other means should any unruly behaviour occur at the premises that is beyond the control of the staff members.

All other conditions presently on the licence to remain.

## Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> Feb 2011

12.55am Sirens heard and police cars arrive on High Street, Hornsey outside Kelko bar. I can see 50 - 60 black youths on the High Street shouting and screaming and arguing with each other. They are banging on shop shuttering, running into the passing traffic and some of them appear to have drinks in their hands.

02.15am Police have left the area and the youths are still causing havoc. 999 call placed by myself to report it. Police car drives by but does not stop or return.

02.45am 999 call placed again as noise is still going on and I am asked if I have reported it to the council. As we are talking the gang finally disperse on their own and all is quiet again.

## Sunday 13th March 2011

12.50am Sirens heard and police cars arrive on High St, Hornsey outside Kelko bar. I can see 60 -70 black youths on the High street causing havoc, shouting and being verbally abusive to each other and the police. Some appear to have bottles of drink in their hands.

01.45am Big fight breaks out among the youths on the High street. Sirens and more police cars and vans arrive and the High street is blocked off by them. Youths are rocking a police van with police still inside and throwing bottles and other objects at each other and the police. Fighting and noise goes on for over 30 mins.

02.25am Police leave. There are still around 40 youths on the High street. Around half of them are the usual gang members that are constantly on the High Street known as the "Lightfoot Road" gang. They cycle in and out of traffic, shouting and banging on the shop shutters. Crowd gets bigger and more youths join them until there are around 50 of them. There is pushing and shoving and escalating violence.

02.35am 999 call placed by myself and I mention the CCTV camera on the corner of Campsbourne

Road and High Street as I have been told to do in the past. Police van drives by after a few minutes but does not stop or return.

- 02.50am 999 call placed by myself but no response seen. Gang move out of sight to Campsbourne Road can still hear all the noise but out of sight. No sign of the CCTV camera moving.
- 02.55am My partner arrives home and has had youths banging his car and riding their bikes in front of him as he tried to drive down the road. They are still being verbally abusive, drinking and throwing objects at each other. He calls 999 and reports this.
- 03.15am Police have slow driven past the gang and eventually stopped but didn't get out of the car.
- 03.45am All goes quiet as the gang disperses finally.

Hi kendra

I've spoken to Geoff Parker, and he has told me to email over my representation.

I am the landlady of the Hornsey tavern but I also reside at the property with my family. We have had several instances over the last 9 months for various reasons listed below.

- excessive noise coming from Kelko's after midnight and after they have closed
- smoking illegal substances outside
- Violence outside the property from their customers
- safety of my staff and customers.

On march 12th 2011 at 10:30pm large groups of youths formed outside the bar. They were drinking from glasses and bottles. Some were large spirit bottles obviously bought from elsewhere.

As the night progressed the crowds grew and the trouble began. It resulted in riots in the high street where my property and cars were damaged and my customers were not allowed to leave the my pub for nearly 2 hours while the police tried to bring the violence under control.

There must have been over 100 youths in the street many looked under age and were drinking. They did not appear to be local gangs but it was not long before they started to appear. My customers were mugged when leaving the property which causes a lot of distress. We have also had to be closing up around 11:30 pm on Friday and Saturday nights for some time to avoid the trouble. We have a 3:30am licence and this decision has cost us a lot of money but was necessary to avoid trouble and putting our licence in jeopardy.

The clientele from Kelko often sit outside the premesis in cars and drink in the street. No door staff are ever present to help control the situation and it is left to get out of control. On the night of the 12/3/11 police had to use riot gear and cs spray to control the violence that started at the bar. This continued to atleast 4:30am. My children were distressed as to what was going on and I was worried for all of our safety.

Having been in the Tavern for over 6 years the trouble from viva viva/Kelko bar has increased and no steps taken have been successful. I feel a late licence is not an option and it should revert to standard opening hours till 11:30pm

- advertise the review of the licence on the Council website;

If the request for a review is not rejected then the licensing authority will hold a hearing to consider the application, unless all parties agree that this is unnecessary. The licensing authority will write to you with the date and time of the the hearing and will inform you of the procedure to be followed at the hearing.

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# APPENDIX 4 SECRETARY OF STATE GUIDANCE

# 11. Reviews

#### THE REVIEW PROCESS

- 11.1 The proceedings set out in the 2003 Act for reviewing premises licences represent a key protection for the community where problems associated with the licensing objectives are occurring after the grant or variation of a premises licence.
- 11.2 At any stage, following the grant of a premises licence, a responsible authority, or an interested party, may ask the licensing authority to review the licence because of a matter arising at the premises in connection with any of the four licensing objectives.
- 11.3 In addition, a review of the licence will normally follow any action by the police to close down the premises for up to 24 hours on grounds of disorder or noise nuisance as a result of a notice of magistrates' court's determination sent to the licensing authority.
- 11.4 Licensing authorities may not initiate their own reviews of premises licences. Officers of the local authority who are specified as responsible authorities under the 2003 Act, such as environmental health officers, may however request reviews on any matter which relates to the promotion of one or more of the licensing objectives.
- 11.5 Representations made by a department of the local authority which is a responsible authority should be treated by the licensing authority in precisely the same way that they would treat representations made by any other body or individual.
- 11.6 In every case, the representation must relate to particular premises for which a premises licence is in existence and must be relevant to the promotion of the licensing objectives. After a licence or certificate has been granted or varied, a complaint relating to a general (crime

- and disorder) situation in a town centre should generally not be regarded as a relevant representation unless it can be positively tied or linked by a causal connection to particular premises, which would allow for a proper review of the licence or certificate. For instance, a geographic cluster of complaints, including along transport routes related to an individual public house and its closing time could give grounds for a review of an existing licence as well as direct incidents of crime and disorder around a particular public house.
- 11.7 Representations must be in writing and may be amplified at the subsequent hearing or may stand in their own right. Additional representations which do not amount to an amplification of the original representation may not be made at the hearing.
- 11.8 It is important to recognise that the promotion of the licensing objectives relies heavily on a partnership between licence holders, authorised persons, interested parties and responsible authorities in pursuit of common aims. It is therefore equally important that reviews are not used to drive a wedge between these groups in a way that would undermine the benefits of co-operation. It is good practice for authorised persons and responsible authorities to give licence holders early warning of their concerns about problems identified at the premises concerned and of the need for improvement. A failure to respond to such warnings is expected to lead to a decision to request a review.
- 11.9 Where the request originates with an interested party e.g. a local resident, residents' association, local business or trade association the licensing authority must first consider whether the complaint made is relevant, vexatious, frivolous or repetitious.

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Guildance Issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003

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11.10 Further information for interested parties about the review process is available in "Guidance for interested parties: applying for a review" which can be found on the DCMS website.

# REPETITIOUS REPRESENTATIONS

- 11.11 Relevance, vexation and frivolousness were dealt with in paragraphs 9.8 – 9.13 above. A repetitious representation is one that is identical or substantially similar to:
  - a ground for review specified in an earlier application for review made in relation to the same premises licence which has already been determined; or
  - representations considered by the licensing authority when the premises licence was first granted; or
  - representations which would have been made when the application for the premises licence was first made and which were excluded then by reason of the prior issue of a provisional statement;

and, in addition to the above grounds, a reasonable interval has not elapsed since that earlier review or the grant of the licence.

11.12 Licensing authorities are expected to be aware of the need to prevent attempts to review licences merely as a second bite of the cherry following the failure of representations to persuade the licensing authority on earlier occasions. It is for licensing authorities themselves to judge what should be regarded as a reasonable interval in these circumstances. However, the Secretary of State recommends that more than one review originating from an interested party should not be permitted within a period of twelve months on similar grounds save in compelling circumstances or where it arises following a closure order.

- 11.13 The exclusion of a complaint on the grounds that it is repetitious does not apply to responsible authorities which may make more than one request for a review of a premises within a 12 month period.
- 11.14 When a licensing authority receives a request for a review from a responsible authority or an interested party or in accordance with the closure procedures described in Part 8 of the 2003 Act, it must arrange a hearing. The arrangements for the hearing must follow the provisions set out by the Secretary of State in regulations. The details may be viewed on the DCMS website. The Secretary of State considers it particularly important that the premises licence holder is fully aware of the representations made in respect of the premises, any evidence supporting the representations and that they or their legal representatives have therefore been able to prepare à response,

# POWERS OF A LICENSING AUTHORITY ON THE DETERMINATION OF A REVIEW

- 11.15 The 2003 Act provides a range of powers for the licensing authority on determining a review that it may exercise where it considers them necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 11.16 The licensing authority may decide that no action is necessary if it finds that the review does not require it to take any steps necessary to promote the licensing objectives. In addition, there is nothing to prevent a licensing authority issuing an informal warning to the licence holder and/or to recommend improvement within a particular period of time. It is expected that licensing authorities will regard such warnings as an important mechanism for ensuring that the licensing

objectives are effectively promoted and that warnings should be issued in writing to the holder of the licence. However, where responsible authorities like the police or environmental health officers have already issued warnings requiring improvement—either orally or in writing—that have failed as part of their own stepped approach to concerns, licensing authorities should not merely repeat that approach.

- 11.17 Where the licensing authority considers that action under its statutory powers are necessary, it may take any of the following steps:
  - to modify the conditions of the premises licence (which includes adding new conditions or any alteration or omission of an existing condition), for example, by reducing the hours of opening or by requiring door supervisors at particular times;
  - to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence, for example, to exclude the performance of live music or playing of recorded music (where it is not within the incidental live and recorded music exemption);
  - to remove the designated premises supervisor, for example, because they consider that the problems are the result of poor management;
  - to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
  - · to revoke the licence.
  - 11.18 In deciding which of these powers to invoke, it is expected that licensing authorities should so far as possible seek to establish the cause or causes of the concerns which the representations identify. The remedial action taken should generally be directed at these causes and should always be no more than a necessary and proportionate response.

- 11.19 For example, licensing authorities should be alive to the possibility that the removal and replacement of the designated premises supervisor may be sufficient to remedy a problem where the cause of the identified problem directly relates to poor management decisions made by that individual.
- is a direct reflection of poor company practice or policy and the mere-removal of the designated premises supervisor may be an inadequate response to the problems presented. Indeed, where subsequent review hearings are generated by representations, it should be rare merely to remove a succession of designated premises supervisors as this would be a clear indication of deaper problems which impact upon the licensing objectives.
- 11.21 Licensing authorities should also note that modifications of conditions and exclusions of licensable activities may be imposed either permanently or for a temporary period of up to three months. Temporary changes or suspension of the licence for up to three months could impact on the business holding the licence financially and would only be expected to be pursued as a necessary means of promoting the licensing objectives. So, for instance, a licence could be suspended for a weekend as a means of deterring the holder from allowing the problems that gave rise to the review to happen again. However, it will always be important that any detrimental financial impact that may result from a licensing authority's decision is necessary and proportionate to the promotion of the licensing objectives.

# APPENDIX 5 STATEMENT OF LICENSING POLICY

# Health and Safety

- 10.2 The Health & Safety Team within the Enforcement Service is responsible for ensuring that businesses provide a safe working environment for employees, members of the public and other persons at the premises. The enforcement of Health & Safety is shared with the Health & Safety Executive with local authorities responsible for retail premises, warehouses, hotels, leisure type premises and certain service type industries. This enforcement covers all of the premises applicable to the licensing provisions of the 2003 Licensing Act.
- 10.3 Health & Safety Officers will work closely with other services such as Building Control and agencies such as the London Fire and Emergency Planning Authority. Their primary input will be to the Public Safety objective in licensing control.

#### **Environmental Health Noise Team**

10.4 The Noise Team has powers under the EPA 1990 to investigate reports of noise nuisance in any licensed premises.

# 10.5 Trading Standards

Trading Standards as Responsible Authorities will carry out test purchasing for underage sales in licensed premises and will be able to invoke any action required to ensure compliance with the mandatory code in relation to persistently selling alcohol to underage.

# 10.6 Environmental Health - Food Team

The Food Team will inspect all food premises and are able to take action in relation to any contraventions found under the Food Safety Act 1990.

# 11.0 Operating Schedule and Risk Assessments

11.1 The Act itself does not state that a risk assessment is mandatory, but this Licensing Authority encourages applicants to complete a risk assessment. Applicants should remember that any risk assessment must be followed by implementation of operating procedures and staff trained in these procedures to minimise and mitigate the risks identified. These procedures should be detailed through the operating schedule accompanying the application. This will be specific to the premises, the proposed licensable activities and hours of trading, the risk assessment will have regard to:

- The location of the premises, e.g. the nature of nearby premises, the times they area used, what they are used for, whether that use could affect the proposed activities at the licensed premises.
- If you had a pub which finished earlier than the adjacent nightclub, is there the risk of large numbers of people trying to gain access to the nightclub to continue their nights dinking?
- Are the surrounding properties residential, what steps can be taken to reduce the risk of nuisance to local residents.
- Is the premises adapted for purpose, does it have double glazing to minimise noise break out? Is there adequate means of ventilation without the need for windows and doors to be propped open?
- Are the means of escape in case of a fire adequate? Has the fire risk assessment been carried?
- If customers are required to queue to gain entry are they able to do so without causing an obstruction or putting themselves in harms way.
- The proposed licensable activities and use,
- The proposed hours of operation
- The capacity of the venue, the customer profile, the kind of people the operation of the premises is likely to attract.
- Consider the likely behaviour of the people while on the premises and the if this is likely to change at different times of the day or on specific days dependant on what is taking place on the premises.
- Consider the potential for public nuisance arising from customers smoking, eating and drinking in outdoor areas and on the public highway outside the premises

The operating schedule forms part of the completed application form for a premises licence. It sets out the type of licensable activity to be provided, the times during which the activity will take place and the times the premises is proposed to be open. The schedule needs to contain the information necessary to enable the Licensing Authorities, Responsible Authority or Interested Parties to assess whether the steps to be taken to promote licensing objectives are satisfactory. Applicants should therefore make informed judgements as to the steps that may need to be undertaken to promote the licensing objectives. Applicants are advised to volunteer conditions they are willing and able to comply with.

11.2 The steps set out in the Operating Schedule will form the basis of the conditions that are then attached to any licence granted.

If no relevant representations are made, the application will be granted in accordance with the application and be subject to conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule and the relevant mandatory conditions. If representations are received the Licensing Authority will hold a hearing. The Licensing Authority in determining the application at the hearing will have regards for the steps put forward in the operating schedule, and considers whether the proposed conditions adequately suit the proposed activities. Conditions should be expressed clearly, meaningfully and without ambiguity. The Authority will reword meaningless unenforceable or ambiguous conditions in Operating Schedules where necessary in order to ensure the objectives are promoted. Contact with applicants will be made as early as possible to clarify any questionable conditions offered.

With regard the licensing of garages and or filling stations, Section 176 of the 2003 Act prohibits the sale or supply of alcohol from premises that are used primarily as a garage. However, the Licensing authority approach these based on intensity of use, to establish primary use. Where such applications are submitted, the licensing authority will expect relevant evidence to accompany the application form and where there is any doubt the Licensing sub Committee will decide whether or not any premises is used primarily as a garage.

#### 12.0 The prevention of crime and disorder

12.1 The Home Office has identified that a large percentage of violent crimes, assaults and criminal damage are from offenders under the direct influence of alcohol. The Council is committed to reducing crime and disorder throughout the borough through its statutory duty under the Crime and Disorder Act and through the Haringey Safer Communities Strategy. It is acknowledged generally that alcohol related violence was found to be a problem in night-time entertainment areas and that almost a quarter of all arrests were drink related. Direct findings summarised that the misuse of drugs and alcohol had contributed to the increase of crime and disorder in the borough with young men being of particular concern. Alcohol has also been shown to be a factor in occurrences of domestic violence. The Council works with partners to reduce crime and the fear of crime for the communities we serve.

#### Crime and Disorder Risks

12.2 Good management, best practices and sound procedures in licensed premises do and can make an important difference to the level of alcohol related crime. When preparing the Operating Schedule there are various conditions that are considered best suited to promote the licensing objectives. Applicants for premises offering the sale of alcohol should pay close attention to this and fully consider the physical environment of the premises when proposing conditions.

Factors for consideration include, for example, what measures are necessary to prevent underage sales? what measures are necessary to prevent alcohol from being sold outside of permitted hours? will there be procedures in place to prevent sales of alcohol to intoxicated persons especially in areas with street drinking problems?.

# 13.0 Public safety

13.1 Members of the public visiting licensed premises have the right to expect that due consideration has been taken in relation to public safety. Licensees, as providers of the premises for the sale of alcohol and/or regulated entertainment, must be able to demonstrate that they have considered and put in effect measures to protect members of the public. Carrying out licensable activities may involve potential risks to the safety of performers and the public attending licensed premises. This does not refer to public health, which is covered by other legislation. Accordingly, where other legislation fails to make suitable provisions to ensure public safety, the Licensing Authority will exercise its licensing functions to secure the safety of members of the public and performers. Public safety varies according to the individual style and characteristics of the premises, the nature of the proposed licensable activities/ regulated entertainment to be provided at the premises and the anticipated number of persons attending the premises. In considering Public Safety the Licensing Authority may not consider issues covered by other legislation such as the Fire Safety Regulatory Reform Order, or the Health and Safety at Work Act. Where other legislation does not address specific risks they may be addressed by the licensing regime.

The Licensing Authority will expect applicants to consider the following matters, this is not an exhaustive list:

The blocking of public areas – this will apply both inside and outside areas. Applicants should consider the impact of patrons congregating in areas in close proximity to the premises and the possible safety issues arising from patrons or others being forced to walk in the road as a result.

Emergencies – means of escape in case of fire, bomb threats, emergency management, contingency planning and evacuation.

Environment – premises should be adequately ventilated. If premises are in residential areas keeping doors and windows open is not recommended as a means of ventilation due to public nuisance considerations on the Premises Licence.

Safe Capacity - not all premises have "safe capacities" set by the Licensing authority. For many applicants, the question of how many people to accommodate at the venue is determined solely by a the

venue risk assessment. This risk assessment should consider factors such as floor space, number of toilets, potential queuing time and available fire exits. Consideration should be given to the level of staff necessary to deal with the needs of persons attending the premises. If the venue does have a capacity limit there should be systems in place to ensure it is not exceeded. This could be achieved by door supervisors using clicker devices to count customers in and out.

Special effects – the Licensing Authority must be informed if special effects such as flames, lasers, pyrotechnics, smoke, fog, foam or firearms are to be used on the premises. A risk assessment must be carried out in respect of each activity detailing the steps to be taken to prevent and control risk to patrons and staff.

- 13.2 In order to promote public safety responsible authorities may make representations on the grounds of public safety. The Licensing Authority will encourage those applying for a premises licence to undertake the necessary fire safety risk assessment and to be compliant with all relevant building control rules and regulations.
- 13.3 The Council recommends that the Metropolitan Police Promotion/ Event Risk Assessment and the After Promotion/ Event Debrief Risk assessment be used as an effective tool in this process.

## Adult Entertainment

- 13.4 Nudity, striptease and other adult entertainment of a sexual nature no longer falls within the remit of the Licensing Act 2003. These premises are now regulated under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982, which classify them as Sexual Entertainment Venues (subject to the Council's adoption of the amendment to Schedule 3 by the Policing and Crime Act 2009 Such adult entertainment is known as "relevant entertainment" In summary, this will cover lap dancing / pole dancing and similar venues
- 13.5 However, we must be aware that the Act allows for premises to offer adult entertainment up to 11 times in a calendar year without the need for a licence under the LGMP Act 82. In such circumstances the Licensing authority will pay attention to the conduct of the premises and the activities being offered and will enforce the law diligently. This Authority will seek to ensure that applicants applying for 'the performance of a dance' on their licence are able to make clear that it will not involve any adult entertainment as a condition on their licence..
- 13.6 This Authority recognises that the Indecent Displays (Control) Act 1981 prohibits the public display of indecent matter and the Licensing Authority shall not therefore seek to impose conditions concerning such displays inside or outside the premises. The Licensing Authority shall, however, consider imposing conditions if it considers it

necessary,in certain premises following a hearing. This could be requiring conditions for the exclusion of minors from the premises.

# **Tables and Chairs Policy**

- 13.7 Under s115 of the Highways Act 1980 permission is required to place amenities such as tables and chairs on the public highway but permission is not required to place tables and chairs on private frontages. The Licensing Authority should ensure that where an Operating Schedule indicates that tables and chairs are to be included within the licensed area that an application is made to cover those areas. The Licensing Authority will liaise with the Enviro Crime/ Street Enforcement Teams about the grant of permission under Part 7A of the Highways Act 1980. However, when determining the permit the following matters will be considered:
  - Whether the grant of the permit is likely to have an adverse impact on the safety and amenity of local residents.
  - The history of the permit holder/premises, particularly in relation to past enforcement issues or complaints received.
  - Whether the application receives any objections and the nature of those objections.
  - Whether the grant of the permit is likely to conflict with conditions on any Premises Licence granted under the Licensing Act 2003 or meets the relevant planning requirements.
  - Whether appropriate measures have been agreed and put into effect by the applicant to mitigate any adverse impacts that may arise as a result of being granted the permit.
  - That the use of the tables and chairs will cease by 21.00 to minimise any late night noise that may arise.

## **Door Supervisors**

- 13.8 Whenever security operatives are employed at licensed premises to carry out a security function, they must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority (SIA).
  - Competent and professional door supervisors are key to public safety at licensed premises and the provision of door supervisors is an action point for the leisure industry to consider in the Home Office Alcohol Harm Reduction Strategy.
  - If a licensee directly employs security operatives, he/she will need to be licensed by the SIA as a supervisor/manager.
  - This licensing authority will be looking to ensure that licensees recruit SIA licensed door supervision staff from reputable companies with SIA Approved Contractor Status.
  - Licensees will need to have measures or procedures in place to check the SIA register of door supervisors to ensure their

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premises and customers are only protected by door supervisors with an SIA licence.

# 14.0 The prevention of public nuisance

- 14.1 Licensed premises, especially those operating late at night and in the early hours of the morning can cause a wide range of nuisances that can impact on the people living, working or sleeping in the vicinity of the licensed premises. The Council is committed to protecting the residents and businesses in the vicinity of these licensed premises.
- 14.2 In particular, late night activities cause much of this nuisance. Late night cafés, clubs, pubs and restaurants can have a number of adverse effects on the residents in the vicinity of these premises. Nuisance such as noise, litter, anti-social behaviour, lights and odour all contribute to the loss of amenity to the general public.
- 14.3 Noise nuisance is of particular concern; music, people talking, ventilation equipment and traffic can all be disturbing especially at night when ambient noise is low.
- 14.4 The conduct of customers leaving premises or spilling out into public and open spaces is often a source of disturbance and anti-social behaviour. Problems can include littering, the breaking of glasses and bottles, vomiting and urination.
- 14.5 Fly posting or any other illegal methods of displaying advertisements relating to a licensed premises or events is considered to be a public nuisance and will not be tolerated by the Council. The Council will take action (including prosecuting) those that fly post and will support action by other Councils against those that fly post.
- 14.6 The Council is aware of the importance of the licensing trade to the local economy and its culture and leisure aspirations. Accordingly, it will try and work together with individuals and bodies who are able to make objection to licence applications, the statutory agencies and licensed businesses to ensure that licensed premises can provide a service in a responsible way and co-exist with the wider community.
- 14.7 In considering all licensed applications, the Licensing Authority will consider the adequacy of measures proposed to deal with the potential for nuisance and/or anti-social behaviour having regard to all the circumstances of the application. The Licensing Authority will expect applicants to address these issues under prevention of public nuisance when preparing the Operating Schedule:
  - Amplified music noise from music played on the premises

- Customer noise this may take many forms but of particular concern:
  - Customers queuing to enter or leave the premises
    Customers loitering outside the premises waiting for transport
    Alcohol related drunken behaviour and shouting
    Customers eating, drinking, smoking in open air areas
    Car horns/ car radios/slamming of car doors late at night in the vicinity of licensed premises.
- Deliveries early morning deliveries and late night clearing up, e.g. the emptying of bottle bins
- Lighting excessive artificial lighting in the vicinity of licensed premises
- Litter/waste litter and waste generated by the carrying out of licensable activities, e.g. wrappers and cigarette butts. Where licensable activities give rise to the risk of customers dropping litter in the vicinity of the premises, whether adequate arrangements are in place to prevent littering and clearing it up
- Obstructions the blocking of footpaths by customers eating, drinking and smoking in the vicinity of licensed premises. Is there an effective door and queuing policy to encourage good behaviour outside the premises.
- Plant and machinery noise from plant and machinery, including air conditioning units, refrigeration units and kitchen extractors.
   This may include smell nuisance from ventilation ducting and kitchen extracts.

## 15.0 The protection of children from harm

15.1 The main concern of regulatory authorities involves the exposure of children to under age drinking, drug use and the necessary level of supervision and care that needs to be exercised to ensure a safe environment. Premises must ensure that children are protected from physical, moral or psychological harm.

Applicants in their Operating schedule should set the appropriate steps they will take to ensure proper protection of children from harm while licensable activities are taking place. When addressing the protection of children the applicant should initially identify any particular issues having regard to their particular type of premises and or activities that are likely to cause concern in relation to children.

These may include following:

A proof of age scheme and refusal book. Licensees may consider adopting a challenge 21 Policy. Displaying the Challenge 21 posters

throughout the premises. It is recommended that applicants, particularly supermarkets small retailers and off licences obtain best practice advice on 'No Proof No Sale' from Trading Standards Officers to ensure alcohol is not being sold to under 18's. Retailers who use price/code scanning devices may wish to consider the use of a till prompting mechanism on the tills and regular staff training on the laws relating to children and alcohol. The operating schedule should also state how the Licensee will discourage the sale of alcohol to customers on behalf of children in the vicinity.

Where appropriate and particularly with regard to late public events, the Licensing Authority advises licensees to include in the Operating Schedule's procedures for lost and found children.

In cases of under 18 events the Licensing Authority strongly recommends that applicants adopt a Code of Conduct/policy for these events to ensure the four Licensing Objectives are complied with. This could include;

- Searches on entry to prevent alcohol being brought onto the premises
- Policy to prevent under aged persons leaving and returning to the premises in order to consume alcohol outside
- Where there is normally a bar, ensuring that alcohol is not on display and is locked away
- Ticketed events to monitor capacity
- No adult entertainment
- CRB check staff assisting at the event and at the end of the event
- Sufficient stewards monitoring the event
- Ensure an efficient dispersal at the end of the event and the young people are not left hanging around outside the premises

#### Children & Alcohol

- 15.2 Young people aged 16 and 17 will only be permitted to consume beer, wine or cider on licensed premises if accompanied by an adult 18 years and over and are eating a table meal.
- 15.3 Children aged under 16 are not allowed into premises that are predominantly used for the supply and consumption of alcohol on the premises unless they are accompanied by an adult.
- 15.4 The Council however recognises the wide variety of premises for which licences may be sought. These include premises which are not predominantly used for the supply and consumption of alcohol including theatres, cinemas, restaurants, cafes, takeaways, community halls and schools. Access by children to these types of premises will not be limited unless specified in the Licensing Act 2003 or considered necessary to do so in order to protect them from harm.

The Licensing Authority encourages licensees to demonstrate in the Operating Schedule that they have considered guidance from the Portman Group Code of Practice on the naming, packaging and promotion of alcohol drinks to prevent children from being enticed into purchasing these products.

#### Children and Cinemas

- 15.5 Films cover a vast range of subjects some of which deal with adult themes and/or contain scenes that are considered unsuitable for children within certain age groups.
- 15.6 The Council shall impose a condition in all premises licences and all club premises certificates to prevent the viewing of films by children below the age restriction for that film as classified according to the recommendations of the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC) (or any other body designated under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984) or the council, as the case may be.
- 15.7 The Council must be satisfied that where age restriction films are shown, the premises are suitable in terms of the access and the film cannot be viewed by under-age children through any aperture. Access control shall be via the employment of suitably stationed adult staff.

## Children and Public Entertainment

- 15.8 Conditions may be imposed on licences for premises where children will be present at places of public entertainment to the effect that adult staff must be present to control the access and egress of children and to ensure their safety. In appropriate cases and where relevant the Licensing Authority will expect the licence to show how they intend to provide for the supervision of children as customers or as performers providing regulated entertainment. Licensees will have to demonstrate that consideration has been given to the welfare of children as performers or customers
- 15.9 Where a large number of children are likely to be present on any licensed premises, the Licensing Authority will impose conditions requiring an adequate ratio of adults to children in order to ensure the prevention of harm to children and to also ensure public safety.
- 15.10 The Council will expect the premises to provide adequate numbers of attendants in accordance with model conditions shown at appendix F of the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

15.11 Details of requirements for operating schedules in respect of protection of children from harm are contained in the Appendix to this policy.

(For the purpose of this policy a "child" means an individual aged under 16 or who is unaccompanied if he is not in the company of an individual aged 18 or over as defined in the Licensing Act 2003)

15.12 Measures will need to be in place to ensure the exclusion of persons under 18 from the premises when entertainment of an adult or sexual nature is taking place.

## 16.0 Transport

- 16.1 In meeting the licensing objectives the Council would expect the applicants to take into consideration the transport arrangements for dispersing people from their premises so to avoid concentrations outside their premises and in town centres. This could include directing people to public transport routes or making suitable arrangements with licensed cabs or mini-cabs.
- 16.2 The Council supports the Safer Travel at Night initiatives in conjunction with Transport for London, the Greater London Authority and the Metropolitan Police.

# 17.0 Live music, dancing and theatre

- 17.1 The Council recognises the value of cultural activities including live music, dancing, street art, circus and theatre, and will take proper account of these needs to encourage and promote them for the wider cultural benefit of the community. It will not seek to place unreasonable restrictions on these activities where the licensing objectives are not put at risk.
- 17.2 The Council will seek to obtain a balance between the potential for limited neighbourhood disturbances and the benefits of cultural activities to the whole community. It will take care not to deter such activities when the risk to the licensing objectives does not justify it. Only conditions strictly necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives will be attached to licences. The Council is aware of the need to avoid measures as far as possible that deter live music, dancing and theatre by imposing direct costs of a substantial nature.

# 18.0 Cumulative Impact & Saturation Policy

18.1 The Council will not take 'commercial demand' into account when considering an application as this is a matter for the planning committees and for the market.
