INTRODUCTION	
1.	The Chair introduces himself and invites other Members, Council officers, Police, Applicant and Objectors to do the same.
2.	The Chair invites Members to disclose any prior contacts (before the hearing) with the parties or representations received by them
3.	The Chair explains the procedure to be followed by reference to this summary which will be distributed.
NON-ATTENDANCE BY PARTY OR PARTIES	
4.	If one or both of the parties fails to attend, the Chair decides whether to:
	(i) grant an adjournment to another date, or
	(ii) proceed in the absence of the non-attending party.
	Normally, an absent party will be given one further chance to attend.
TOPIC HEADINGS	
5.	The Chair suggests the "topic headings" for the hearing. In the case of the majority of applications for variation of hours, or other terms and conditions, the main topic is:
	Whether the extensions of hours etc. applied for would conflict with the four licensing objectives i.e.
	(i) the prevention of crime and disorder,
	(ii) public safety,
	(iii) the prevention of public nuisance, and
	(iv) the protection of children from harm.
6.	The Chair invites comments from the parties on the suggested topic headings and decides whether to confirm or vary them.
WITNESSES	
7.	The Chair asks whether there are any requests by a party to call a witness and decides any such request.
8.	Only if a witness is to be called, the Chair then asks if there is a request by an opposing party to "cross-examine" the witness. The Chair then decides any such request.
DOCUMENTARY EVIDENCE	
9.	The Chair asks whether there are any requests by any party to introduce late documentary evidence.
10.	If so, the Chair will ask the other party if they object to the admission of the late documents.
11.	If the other party do object to the admission of documents which have only been produced by the first party at the hearing, then the documents shall not be admitted.

12.	If the other party object to documents produced late but before the hearing, the following criteria shall be taken into account when the Chair decides whether or not to admit the late documents:	
(i)	What is the reason for the documents being late?	
(ii)	Will the other party be unfairly taken by surprise by the late documents?	
(iii)	Will the party seeking to admit late documents be put at a major disadvantage if admission of the documents is refused?	
(iv)	Is the late evidence really important?	
(v)	Would it be better and fairer to adjourn to a later date?	
THE LICENSING OFFICER'S INTRODUCTION		
13.	The Licensing Officer introduces the report explaining, for example, the existing hours, the hours applied for and the comments of the other Council Services or outside official bodies. This should be as "neutral" as possible between the parties.	
14.	The Licensing Officer can be questioned by Members and then by the parties.	
THE HEARING

5.2 Crime and Disorder

CCTV cameras on the premises.

Red Care Alarm System connected to the police via a 24 hours monitoring station to be installed and maintained at the premises.

Customers will not be allowed to congregate outside the premises.

5.3 Public Safety

Smoke detectors, fire escape lights and signs, fire extinguishers and fire blankets will be maintained on the premises.

5.5 Public Nuisance

All occasions when persons have been refused service will be recorded in a refusals book, which shall be kept at the premises for not less than 12 months.

Suitable signage will be displayed at the point of exit advising customers to leave the premises quietly.

5.6 Child Protection

We will be very strict about not selling alcohol to children and those under age. Where a person appears to be under the age of 21, identification in the form of Passport, Photographic driving licence or a Proof of Age card bearing the PASS hologram will be sought and if not provided service of alcohol will be refused. Suitable signage will be displayed at the point of entry and at the service area advising customers that the premises operates the Challenge 21 Proof of Age scheme.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

The alley beside this shop is already a meeting place for what looks like drug-dealers. Many times, especially in the evenings, I have seen small groups of young men meeting there – and it looks like they are probably there for some purpose apart from a chat, as they skulk round the corner in the alley rather than just chatting outside. I believe that if this extension is allowed then drug-dealing on this corner will be more common. Before the shop opened there was frequent dealing in Whittington Road, opposite my house, and it has moved to the alley and appears to involve younger people and is more often. I know from the Safer Neighbourhood panel meetings and personal observation that there is a lot of drunkenness and drug-dealing late at night outside the late night shops etc by Bounds Green Tube, and this situation will be replicated here. We do not need a replication of what happens on Queens Parade in the early hours here, and because this is less 'public' I believe that both prostitution and drug-dealing would be encouraged.

It will be less safe for people coming home late at night if there are people hanging about on the corner.

Residents near the corner of Whittington Road already experience noise from people leaving the local pub late at night/early in the morning. It often wakes me up. I believe that this extension will lead to more night noise for local people. This is otherwise a quiet residential street and we do not need a shop open selling alcohol till the early hours, especially as a 24 hour shop is only two minutes away by the tube.

It is clear from the attached photos that the licensee has very little regard for the local environment as he has not removed the ugly graffiti from the shop – it has been there a long time. He appears to have very little regard for the effect that his establishment has on the sensitivities of local people. The notice for this extension was also not displayed in a way in which the local public could see it unless they were customers. I believe this also shows the licensee's lack of interest in doing the right thing and his disregard for local people. This attitude makes me think that it is likely that there will be no attempt to ensure good behaviour in the extended hours.
