Normally, an absent party will be given one further chance to attend.

TOPIC HEADINGS

5. The Chair suggests the "topic headings" for the hearing. In the case of the majority of applications for variation of hours, or other terms and conditions, the main topic is:

9.0 Licensing Officers Comments

The Blue Bar was originally granted a licence in 2005 under Mr Neza and traded as Bar Harmonia under him.

Mr Neza is the leaseholder of the property, in 2007 Mr Neza sub let the property to Omar Wadar, (the licence was transferred to Mr Wadar in September 2007), who became the premises licence holder. Mr Neza remained on the licence for s short period of time as the DPS to permit the sale of alcohol at the premises. Mr Wader had a number of problems at the premises which stemmed from cultural differences within the Somalian Community which the business catered for. Mr Wader also applied to vary the licence to remove the ability for the sale of alcohol.

It is fair to say that Mr Wader had problems at the premises and there were incidents of disorder from the premises at the time. In 2009 Mr Wadar varied the licence to add sale of alcohol back onto the licence, he then further leased the premises on to Mr and Mrs Kabeya, (they transferred the premises licence into their name in Jan 2010) who operated the premises in a manner that lead to the police reviewing the premises licence in September 2010. The licensing sub committee saw CCTV footage of fights taking place outside the premises and also evidence of the premises being operated beyond its permitted licensable times. The Sub Committee revoked the licence from Mr & Mrs Kabeya in October 2010. Mrs and Mrs Kabeya tried to get a family member to re-apply for the licence but this was blocked by Mr Neza, who took steps to secure the building and stop any further use by that party. . . .

Mr Neza still has an interest in the property as he is still the leasholder, but due to the Premises licence being revoked while under the management of Mr and Mrs Kabeya, it has now become necessary for him to re-apply for a premises licence.

Members may wish to consider if the conditions offered by Mr Neza are adequate for the licensable activities and the hours being requested. I have attached a copy of the previous revoked licence. Appendix 7.

With reference to the above Police wish to make representations under the Prevention of Crime & Disorder, Prevention of Public Nuisance and Protection of Children from Harm Objectives.

Prevention of Crime & Disorder:-

A full digital C.C.T.V. system to be installed capable of taking head and shoulder images of people entering the premises and the images to be kept for 30 days and made available to Police on request. The cameras should also be positioned to cover inside and outside of the premises. The system should be operating whilst the premises are open to the public. Members of the management of the premises to be trained in the downloading of the images.

The system should be installed to the following standards:-

1. Guidance is contained in the C.C.T.V. Operational requirements Manual published by the Home Office Scientific Branch. Publication N0 28/09.

2. The system should be certified to European Standard BS EN 50132 - 7

3. The design and installation must be carried out by a NACOSS accredited company.

A minimum of 2 door staff who are Security Industry Authority registered to be employed on the premises on Thursday/Friday/Saturday and Sunday nights from 21.00 to close. The door staff will monitor the entry and exit of customers to prevent any disorder taking place and also search for drugs and weapons.

On Tottenham Hotspur Football Club match days.

1. Premises not to open for the sale of alcohol before 11.00 on Saturday and Sunday.

2. All drinks dispensed from the bar are poured into plastic containers - 4 hours before the scheduled kick off time until 1 hour after the end of the match.

3. No glass bottles are sold over the bar - 4 hours before the scheduled kick off time until 1 hour after the end of the match.

4. A Minimum of two Door Staff who have been approved by the Security Industry Authority to be employed on the premises to control the entry and exit of customers - 4 hours before the schedule kick off time until 1 hour after the end of the match.

Prevention of Public Nuisance.

A notice to be displayed prominently at the exit asking customers to leave quietly.

Customers exiting the premises to smoke to be restricted to no more than 3 at a time.

Protection of Children from Harm:-

Alcohol may only be sold to individuals over the age of 18 with valid proof of identification with one of the following:-

- 1. A valid passport
- 2. A photo driving licence issued in a European Country
- 3. A proof of age standard card system
- 4. A citizen card supported by the Home Office.

Unaccompanied children will not be allowed on the premises at any time.





Prevention of nuisance from noise / vibration

All doors and windows will remain closed during the licensed regulated entertainment activities or in any event after 11pm. The entrance door will be fitted with a self-closing device and staff required to ensure that it is not propped open. A member of staff shall be made responsible to ensure the door is opened for as brief a period as possible. Where necessary adequate and suitable mechanical ventilation should be provided to public areas

Entry to the premises will be restricted to main entrance located on High Road whilst the premises is being used for regulated entertainment licensed activity

Entrance/exit from the premises whilst regulated entertainment licensable activities are ongoing shall be via a lobbied door to minimise noise breakout.

The regulated entertainment licensable activity shall conclude 30 minutes before the premises is due to close to prevent excessive noise breakout as the premises empties

The rear fire escapes (on ground and basement level) doors will be fitted with an alarm that instructs staff when the door has been opened

All speakers are mounted on anti-vibration mountings to prevent vibration transmission of sound energy to adjoining properties

Dealing with complaints

Liaison meetings will be held where specifically requested by residents to enable neighbours to raise concerns about any aspect of the licensed activities

Patrons entering/exiting premises.

Where people queue to enter the premises a licensed door supervisor shall supervise and ensure the potential patrons behave in an acceptable manner

Signs should be displayed requesting patrons to respect the neighbours and behave in a courteous manner

<u>Door supervisors</u>: Required to prevent breach of the peace and to be on duty from 1900 hrs to close of premises on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

I am writing to make a representation against the licence application and reopening of the;

BLUE BAR, 675 Tottenham High Road. N17 8AD

Please read the reasons why the above mentioned application must be rejected.

TRACK RECORD

- The former/current owner and applicant of the Bar Mr Neza is ultimately to blame for the serious problems we have had to endure in the past couple of years for which he took no responsibility.
- To permit him to begin this cycle of disruption as the venue carries with it a lengthy track record of association that proves it should be closed down for the benefit of the wider community.
- As the ownership of the venue has not changed hands and I strongly believe this is another reason the club should never reopen after clearly seeing the carnage and utter disregard their customers have had for the last two years.

PUBLIC SAFETY

- The level and frequency of violence was unprecedented, was witnessed regularly and captured on CCTV with emergency vehicles attending to the aftermath of large scale fighting on the streets.
- The Blue Bar drains valuable public resources as the emergency services are constantly attending disturbances week in week out.
- The fighting would resume in adjacent streets as venue security could not intervene off site.
- Customers will be driving visibly drunk causing a threat to **public safety**.
- I believe that the permission for this club to operate on the same basis and by the same occupants regardless of new restrictions will not change the conduct of the customers once they have left the venue.
- The level of violent provocation and subsequent fighting by customers who drink alcohol irresponsibly will resume.
- The elderly people in our street are fearful and our local businesses feel threatened if they complain for fear of being targeted.

Please treat this letter as a formal defence against the objection of Mrs. Ashleigh Trezise and Mr. Paul Bruce against the reopening of THE BLUE BAR 657, Highroad, Tottenham N178AD, dated 22 of March 2011, who described my management as irresponsible. Regarding their objection, I would like to provide few points to insure Mrs. Ashleigh Trezise and Mr. Paul Bruce that these kind of

incidents will never happened again.

Track Record

• As a lease holder, I legally subcontracted the business in good faith to one by one to two different managements with references, so I did not have any reason to presume that the premises would be misappropriated.

• Unfortunately, I did not have knowledge about the incidents in the bar and serious problems and their impact on neighborhood.

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• About the serious problems around the premises, I was informed in the end of the October 2010, when I called the Licensing department, after misleading information from my in that time tenants.

• In that time, tenants with their new business partner applied for new license, but after I was informed about the track record of the bar

and I asked Daliah Barret Administrator of Licensing department, Haringey Council, to withdraw their application form.

• I would like to point out regarding to the track record, when the Bar was directly under my management, there was no problem with customers, neighborhood or London Metropolitan Police.

Public Safety

• It is not my intention to serve customers who use

inappropriate behavior, but I would like to create a homely atmosphere for customers from all around the neighbourhood to enjoy their drink or cup of tea.

• The Blue Bar is not going to be used us club, and the late opening hours are asked just for occasional private parties of customers, who do not have bad manners and can conduct themselves in a decent manner.

• I did all needed steps to insure safety in and around the premises and regularly I have spoken to the members of Local Authorities and London Metropolitan Police.

• My CCTV system has all necessary standards and is approved by London Metropolitan Police and EU, plus has direct connection with my Iphone, so I will be informed about the situation in and around the bar constantly around the clock.

Doors and windows will be kept closed (except for access and egress) to reduce noise nuisance from the premises.

During final hour of opening the music will be played at a lower volume than previously.

Conditions agreed with The Noise Team:

Operating hours

That the premises closes no later than 02:00 on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday; that the premises closes no later than 03:00 on Wednesday and Sunday; and not later than 05:00 on Friday and Saturday.

That regulated entertainment ceases 30 minutes before closing times in order to minimise noise breakouts as the premises empties.

Prevention of nuisance from noise/vibration

All doors and windows will remain closed during the regulated entertainment licensed activities or in any event after 11pm. The entrance door will be fitted with a self-closing device and staff required to ensure that it is not propped open. A member of staff shall be made responsible to ensure the door is opened for as brief a period as possible. Where necessary adequate and suitable mechanical ventilation should be provided to public areas

Entry to the premises will be restricted to a particular entrance whilst the premises is being used for regulated entertainment licensed activity

Entrance/exit from the premises whilst regulated entertainment licensable activities are ongoing shall be via a lobbied door to minimise noise breakout.

The regulated entertainment licensable activity shall conclude 30 minutes before the premises is due to close to prevent excessive noise breakout as the premises empties

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Structure borne noise

All speakers are mounted on anti-vibration mountings to prevent vibration transmission of sound energy to adjoining properties

Sound limits

The licensee shall ensure that no music played in the licensed premises is audible at or within the site boundary of any residential property

All regulated entertainment amplified activity will utilise the in-house amplification system, the maximum output of which is controlled by the duty manager

Outside Areas

No music will be played in, or for the benefit of patrons in external areas of the premises

No form of loudspeaker or sound amplification equipment is to be sited on or near the exterior premises or in or near any foyer, doorway, window or opening to the premises

Signs shall be displayed in the external areas/on the frontage requesting patrons to recognise the residential nature of the area and conduct their behaviour accordingly. The management must reserve the right to ask patrons to move inside the premises or leave if it is felt that they could be disturbing neighbours

The frontage will be closed and patrons requested to come inside the main structure of the premises at 23:00 hours

Deliveries and collections.

Deliveries and collections associated with the premises will be arranged between the hours 08;00 and 18:30, Mon- Sat, and none on Sundays and Bank Holidays so as to minimise the disturbance caused to the neighbours

Glasses will be collected at the beginning of the day rather than at closing time when neighbours in close proximity might be unduly disturbed

Empty bottles and non-degradable refuse will remain in the premises at the end of trading hours and taken out to the refuse point at the start of the working day rather than at the end of trading when neighbours might be unduly disturbed

Plant and machinery

All plant and machinery is correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from noise

Dealing with complaints

A complaints book will be held on the premises to record details of any complaints received from neighbours. The information is to include where disclosed, the complainants name, location, date time and subsequent remedial action undertaken. This record must be made available at all times for inspection by council officers

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Regular state frequency liaison meetings will be held where requested to enable neighbours to raise concerns about any aspect of the licensed activities

Patrons entering/exiting premises.

Where people queue to enter the premises a licensed door supervisor shall supervise and ensure the potential patrons behave in an acceptable manner

Signs should be displayed requesting patrons to respect the neighbours and behave in a courteous manner

When the premises turn out a licensed door supervisor shall supervise patrons and ensure the leave in a prompt and courteous manner, respecting the neighbours

A licensed door supervisor will be positioned on the exit door to ensure, as far as reasonably practical, that patrons do not leave drinks in public areas.

A licensed door supervisor will patrol the cartilage of the premises to prevent patrons urinating in public areas in the vicinity of the premises

Prevention of nuisance from litter

Adequate receptacles for use by patrons will be provided in the local vicinity. The positioning of the receptacles will be agreed with the licensing officer

Prevention of Nuisance from Odour

All ventilation and extraction systems shall be correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from odour

Prevention of nuisance from light

Illuminated external signage shall be switched off when the premises is closed

Security lights will be positioned to minimise light intrusion to nearby residential premises

THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN

Alcohol may only be sold to individuals over the age of 18 with valid proof of identification with one of the following:

- A valid passport
- A photo driving license issued in a European Union Country
- A proof of age standard card system
- A citizen card, supported by the Home Office

Unaccompanied children will not be allowed on the premises at any time.

The premises will only be open to adults.


Proof of identity will be checked when necessary.
