EL MEZON, 189-191 BROAD LANE, TOTTENHAM, LONDON N15 4QT (TOTTENHAM GREEN) For the Licensing Team, Robin Payne introduced the report on the application for a new premises licence at El Mezon, 189-191 Broad Lane, Tottenham, and Derek Pearce, Enforcement Response, outlined the proposed conditions, as set out on pages 47 to 48 of the agenda pack. Three local residents spoke in objection to the application, and raised concerns regarding noise, an increase in crime and disorder, litter and broken glass, smoking, parking in the area, public urination and other antisocial behaviour. The residents stated that they had no objection to the principle of licensing a restaurant operating for normal hours, but were concerned about the very late hours applied for and the impact this would have on local residents. Concerns were also raised that people would try to use the entrance onto Antill Road, as this was more obvious than the entrance from Broad Lane, which would cause a disturbance to residents on Antill Road. There was a further concern that people would use Antill Road to stand outside and smoke. The applicants addressed the Committee and stated that they needed a licence in order to be able to serve drinks with meals in the restaurant.

They confirmed that they had no intention of operating the premises as a nightclub, and that it would be a family restaurant with occasional small private functions in the evening; the hours applied for in the licence were to ensure that they could accommodate such parties without breaching any regulations. It was noted that, as the events would be private functions, those attending would know that the correct entrance was via Broad Lane.

In response to questions from the Committee, the applicant confirmed that, in the evening, access to the premises would be via Broad Lane and through a corridor within the premises. It was confirmed that the other business units within the building would be secured and that there would be no access to these for customers entering the premises via this route. It was also confirmed that up until 10pm the restaurant would be open to the public, but that any evening functions taking place after the restaurant closed would be for invited guests only.

Robin Payne asked for clarification of the plans that had been shown to the fire officer, as the plans in the agenda pack did not show the whole area of the premises. It was agreed that any licence, if granted, would be made conditional on confirmation being obtained from the fire officer that they had seen the full plans and had no objection. In response to a question from a local resident, the legal officer confirmed that there was a right to appeal the decision of the Committee to the Magistrates Court.

In summing up, residents emphasised their concerns regarding the opening hours, noise breakout when doors were opened, smokers using Antill Road, litter and the risk to local residents. The applicant summed up by saying they did not intend to open as late as applied for, but wanted to cover all eventualities. Late events would not be regular and would only be private functions; it was noted that, culturally, the community served by the premises tended to eat later in the evening. The applicants understood residents concerns about noise, but felt that the conditions agreed with Enforcement Response would address these.

The Committee retired to deliberate.

RESOLVED

The Committee carefully considered the application, the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, the Section 182 guidance and all the representations. The Committee decided to grant the application, but only on the following terms:

All the conditions imposed by the Responsible Authorities referred to in the agenda pack are imposed, this includes where representations have been withdrawn based on the agreement to conditions. The Enforcement Response conditions are amended in that the Antill Road entrance is not to be used past 10pm on any day, save in emergency.

As additional conditions, the following requirements are imposed:

- No drinks will be taken outside the restaurant.
- A member of staff, at the end of each day, shall check the entrances for any litter, such as cigarette butts, and sweep any such litter clear.
- This licence is only to be considered granted once the applicant has received written confirmation from the Licensing Authority that the Fire Authority has no objections. This is because it became apparent that the Fire Authority may not have seen the entire plan of the premises in conjunction with the Enforcement Response team's representations.

The Committee came to this decision taking into account the objective of the Prevention of Public Nuisance in particular, balancing the proximity

INTRODUCTION	
1.	The Chair introduces himself and invites other Members, Council officers, Police, Applicant and Objectors to do the same.
2.	The Chair invites Members to disclose any prior contacts (before the hearing) with the parties or representations received by them
3.	The Chair explains the procedure to be followed by reference to this summary which will be distributed.
NON-ATTENDANCE BY PARTY OR PARTIES	
4.	If one or both of the parties fails to attend, the Chair decides whether to:
	(i) grant an adjournment to another date, or
	(ii) proceed in the absence of the non-attending party.
	Normally, an absent party will be given one further chance to attend.
TOPIC HEADINGS	
5.	The Chair suggests the "topic headings" for the hearing. In the case of the majority of applications for variation of hours, or other terms and conditions, the main topic is: Whether the extensions of hours etc. applied for would conflict with the four licensing objectives i.e.
	(i) the prevention of crime and disorder,
	(ii) public safety,
	(iii) the prevention of public nuisance, and
	(iv) the protection of children from harm.
6.	The Chair invites comments from the parties on the suggested topic headings and decides whether to confirm or vary them.
WITNESSES	
7.	The Chair asks whether there are any requests by a party to call a witness and decides any such request.
8.	Only if a witness is to be called, the Chair then asks if there is a request by an opposing party to "cross-examine" the witness. The Chair then decides any such request.
DOCUMENTARY EVIDENCE	
9.	The Chair asks whether there are any requests by any party to introduce late documentary evidence.
10.	If so, the Chair will ask the other party if they object to the admission of the late documents.
11.	If the other party do object to the admission of documents which have only been produced by the first party at the hearing, then the documents shall not be admitted.

12.	If the other party object to documents produced late but before the hearing, the following criteria shall be taken into account when the Chair decides whether or not to admit the late documents:	
(i)	What is the reason for the documents being late?	
(ii)	Will the other party be unfairly taken by surprise by the late documents?	
(iii)	Will the party seeking to admit late documents be put at a major disadvantage if admission of the documents is refused?	
(iv)	Is the late evidence really important?	
(v)	Would it be better and fairer to adjourn to a later date?	
THE LICENSING OFFICER'S INTRODUCTION

I would like to confirm that I have considered the above proposal with regard to the prevention of public nuisance on behalf of the Enforcement Response (Noise) Team & would like to make representations to the Application

The operating schedule does not address the prevention of public nuisance from:

- Noise generated from patrons queuing to enter
- Noise from patrons exiting the premises
- Littering in the vicinity and local area

The proposed operating hours are inappropriate due to the close proximity of residential dwellings and in excess of present commercial outlets closing times.

The noise caused by patrons exiting the premises and remaining in the area, consuming their purchase. Also the added visits of customers outside the area, whether on foot or turning up by vehicles would further add to the possibility of further noise nuisance and likely to be detrimental to the residential amenity in the area.

Also extended hours would encourage people to remain in area causing a noise nuisance.

Littering in the local and extended road in the area by patrons discarding their purchases (whether food or containers).

Supporting Information



Although, there are no actual noise complaints registered to the premises, there are noise nuisance complaints regarding the night club spots in the area, regarding people noise, exiting venues and loitering in the area.

To this, I am aware that the local police have recently been monitoring the area regarding people noise and public order.

If the sub-committee were to grant this application then we would recommend the following alterations/conditions to the operating schedule:

Operating hours

That the premises closes no later than Sunday – Thursday	02.30am
Friday – Saturday	03.45am

Reason: As these are the time of other local eatery take away.

Patrons entering/exiting premises.

There will be no queuing outside the premises.

Where people queue to enter the premises a licensed door supervisor shall supervise and ensure the potential patrons behave in an acceptable manner

Signs should be displayed requesting patrons to respect the neighbours and behave in a courteous manner

Door supervisors

When the premises are open a licensed door supervisor will be present from 22.00hrs till closing to supervise patrons and ensure they leave in a prompt and courteous manner, respecting the neighbours

A licensed door supervisor will be positioned on the exit door to ensure, as far as reasonably practical.

The supervisor will ensure that no patrons are permitted to enter the premises for good 15 minutes prior to closing.

My name is Paul Wallace. My address is 286 Muswell Hill Broadway N10 2QR. I have been a homeowner at this address since March 1985.

I wish to object to Kentucky Fried Chicken - being able to extend its operating hours into the weekend mornings. Either during the week, or on a ~~weekday~~ ^{weekend}. In fact, I would be relieved if their operating hours were reduced not extended.

The amount of rubbish that is generated by KFC is disgusting. They are bad neighbours and do not clean up adequately the mess their customers leave behind on the Broadway. There are not enough rubbish bins outside their premises to collect the rubbish. Staff seem to be reluctant, terrified or afraid to come out of the KFC shop and clean up the mess and filth left behind by their customers.

There is a serious problem with antisocial behaviour centred around their premises. The

staff seem reluctant to report crime and violence which occurs both inside and outside their business premises. KFC is synonymous with violent crime and antisocial behaviour by the poor residents who live in the neighbouring streets. This at a time when it seems that Police manpower that is available ~~to~~ ^{to control} may have to be reduced.

Late night and into the morning KFC's clientele seems to be based on verbally abusive hooded youths supported by aggressive ~~dogs~~ looking dogs. The younger customers seem to think it is ok to leave their bikes lying around on the pavement.

Sometimes I work into the early hours of the morning. I have come home to find that there are numerous youths blocking the pavement and the road. It is extremely intimidating. In June 2011 I had a beer glass thrown at me while trying to get into my home, which is adjacent to KFC.

KFC are inconsiderate to their commercial and residential neighbours on this stretch of the Broadway. KFC have had a serious problem with a rat infestation at the rear of their premises.

I have called Haringey Pest Control a number of times over the years. More operating hours will only increase this problem. The other adjacent food establishments actually lay poison bait traps. I have never seen KFC bother to do this in 25 years.

The staff seem to use the rear courtyard as an extension of their staffroom, chatting and smoking into the early hours. Their neighbours are trying to get some sleep.

About 3AM in the morning they push their large rubbish wheelie bins out to be collected from the road/Dulles Mews. This is extremely noisy. Then the refuse lorries come at 6AM. Meanwhile the staff raise their voices and are laughing and joking.

Trying to get a reasonable night's sleep in a bedroom at the front or the rear of 286 Muswell Hill Broadway is becoming more and more difficult. The prospect of KFC still being ^{open} at 4AM/5AM in the morning is quite stressful to residents.

The balance between the interests of residents and traders seems to be diverging. Residents and traders should be living and working together. To share, a common goal, a commercially viable, and successful and attractive Muswell Hill Broadway.

On a nighttime Muswell Hill Broadway has always been a busy and vibrant place. But

now the noise and antisocial behaviour generated from certain late night food and drink establishments is becoming intolerable.

I challenge a Haringey Councillor to stay a night in my home on a Saturday night to see if they can get a decent night's sleep.

No to KFC being able to extend it's operating hours!

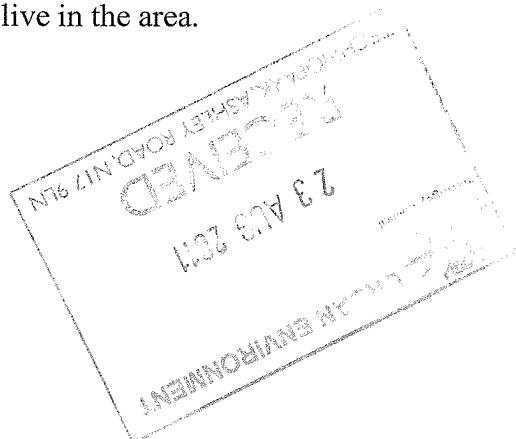

I would like to object to this proposed extension of hours on behalf of myself and Cllr Newton.

This week I have spoken to Sergeant David Williams from the Fortis Green SNT. He stated that the police would not support this application.

Sergeant Williams is currently looking at ways of reducing late night anti-social behaviour and disorder in the vicinity of the KFC and clubs in Muswell Hill. These issues are an ongoing concern and at times this area is a crime generator for the local police.

He has difficulty in seeing how an extension to opening hours for the KFC would be anything other than a contributory factor to existing ASB, crime and disorder.

He has been in contact with both the residents association and council Highways Asset Group following concerns late at night and early hours of the morning with crowds attending the existing late night open venues and associated illegal and dangerous parking. The pavement and road layout in conjunction in Sergeant Williams' opinion are not suitable for a large late night economy.

I agree with Sergeant Williams' assessment of the situation.

I have also spoken to local residents and the feedback I received was that if KFC stays open later than other food outlets in and around The Broadway it will just attract people from outside the area. Attracting people from outside the area will only make worse the sort of problems Sergeant Williams outlined to me, as explained above.

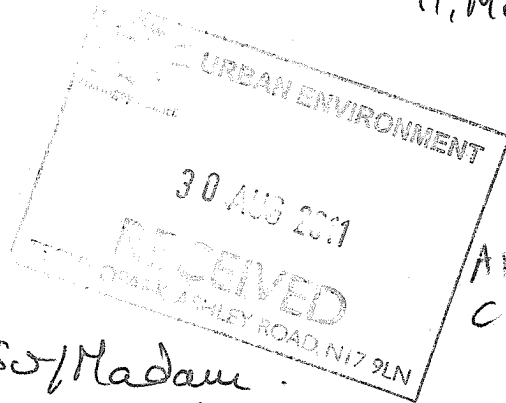

Behaviour in the early hours of the morning, any day of the week.


My 21years daughter is very nervous of the hoodys standing outside because male hoody grapping her outside our home door which is

Objecting To KFC Application for A late License to 11am - 5am Fri-Sat, 11am-2am Sun-Thur (bank holidays)

I am writing On behalf of some of the business In Muswell Hill Broadway. Please note that some business managers and owners have put their home address. These have observed the 'fallout' of the

1. Crime and disorder. If trouble starts inside KFC, the staff step back merely because of fear. When trouble inside or outside KFC nothing is done to quell it, hence the disorder spills over, other retails and residents have to pick up the brunt of it whether seem economics

2. Anti social behaviour -(public safety) the shouting the intimidation at night and day time. KFC attracts a high proportion of young hoodys of varied ethnicity. Still 6yrs on since the death of Padraig Sheeran in Dec 2005 (Chairman Of Club Watch) , no security can be seen at KFC.

- 6wks ago approx Pizza Express restaurant was smashed by youths from KFC the cost for a side panel. (£450)

KFC is synomous with hoodys of all ethicity this well recognised and been know for 10yrs to my knowledge. Hoodys I define as groups of young boys, usually of mixed ethnicity with, bikes and dogs, hoods tops/jackets very few being resident to this area. (KFC is called the 'Chicken shop lets get some chicken'- farrel children banter.)

3. Childrens and young people from harm - On the Wednesday before the riots, the proprietor of Art For Art Sake/ Crocodiles/The Scullery Chris -his son and a friend (9yrs of age about) were chased by hoodys with pit bulls. Later the same day outside 5 Dukes Ave 1 Dukes Ave 11pm hoodys with pit bulls fighting others from afro-caribbean community separated they went to KFC as a gathering point. witnessed this along with shouts of they stabbed my bro...! [brother].

4. Public nuisance Haringey sub contractor for street cleansing inform me that Muswell Hill is dirtier than Tottenham as rubbish from KFC and this bring the vermin . All the local people have contributed to the eradication of vermin but KFC have continually refused to recognise that there is a problem. Cars park outside hooting of horns talk, music systems blasting from cars (this behaviour is out lawed in California).

There is a problem of noise from the groups as KFC is located amid residential properties above, adjacent and opposite. KFC hours encourage a late night gathering point that prevents residents having peaceful nights. Despite restrictions on their current opening times, these are regularly flouted as they continue to remain open when possible custom is around.

This is despite the police regularly passing the front of the premises throughout the night. There is also the fact that they leave their extractor units condensor / cooler unit running through the night and morning staff come in a 10am for start.

After closing and also arrange for rubbish collection at 06.00am, that's no sleep as a 5am clear up kitchen staff operating noise leave 6am push bins out and collect day starts again other scenerio 2am is a 3am close ihr normal operating procedure kitchen duties clear up equals 3hrs sleep this is totally inappropriate for the residents and their young families.

I also had the privilege of sitting on the Committee of Club Watch at the dawn of these late Licenses. This was seen then as a potential problem that has actually happened and continues to get worse. This petition requires that the Council begins to reverse the decisions of late licences that promote the opportunity for anti-social behaviour in a predominatly residential area.

This has been successfully implemented in Chelsea to control inappropriate public behaviour and can be equally applied in our borough.
