	The Licensing Officer, Dale Barrett, introduced the application to allow the Supply of Alcohol and the Provision of Late Night Refreshment at Devran Restaurant, 485-487 Green Lanes, London, N4 1AJ, as laid out in the agenda pack, including:  • The opening times requested within the application documents (pages 46-48 of the agenda pack) differed to those in the covering report (page 2 of the agenda pack) as the Applicant had agreed to the representations suggesting that the

restaurant closed at the same time as other businesses in the Green Lanes area.

- The Applicant had agreed to the Police conditions (pages 60-61), namely to install CCTV, which the Applicant's representatives confirmed had been completed, and to cease the supply of alcohol 30 minutes before closing time.
- The comments of the planning service were noted and the Service was in dialogue with the restaurant owner relating to a separate enforcement matter which was not relevant to the licensing application.
- The majority of representations by interested parties had been withdrawn due to agreement of the recommended opening times.

The Committee noted the statement of Mr Sharman, who lived above the premises, regarding nuisance from the extractor flue, including:

- Mr Sharman was pleased to report that the Applicant had taken steps to reduce the noise from the extraction system and a dialogue between the Applicant and Mr Sharman had been established.
- There were still concerns about noise and smell from the extraction system and the late opening hours and conditions should be imposed to ensure the Applicant continued to maintain the extraction system regularly.
- In response to questions Mr Sharman confirmed that he owned the property which had been visited by a representative of the Applicant during a day when the restaurant had not been particularly busy. The Applicant had agreed that the extraction unit would not be set higher than a maximum setting of 7 when the restaurant was busy.

The Committee noted the statement from Mr Ballay, Chair of the Gardens Residents' Association, regarding the potential detrimental event on the local neighbourhood of the original opening hours requested, including that a closing time of 02:00hrs on weekdays was still excessive but residents had been reassured about the application as the opening hours were now in line with other businesses in Green Lanes.

The Committee noted the statement of the Applicant's representatives, Mr Jun Simon and Cecil Gutimore including:

- Confirmation of acceptance of the Police conditions and that the installation of CCTV had been completed as had the maintenance works to the extraction system.
- The premises had not received any complaints further to recent temporary notices during the Christmas period.
- Most interested groups were satisfied with the new closing time of 02:00hrs and they had the right to request a review of the license should there be non-compliance of any conditions imposed.
- In response to questions it was noted that the Applicant had employed a specialist to conduct maintenance and repair

works to the extraction system to reduce the noise and Mr Sharman had been provided with contact details of the Applicant's representatives if any issues arose. The Applicant would continue to maintain the extraction system.

• It was acknowledged that little could be done to reduce the smell of food emitting from the extraction system.

The Committee noted the statement from Shefik Mehmet, Chairman of the Harringay Traders Association, supporting the application, including that until recently the area in which the premises was situated had been poorly kept and the applicant had improved the visual outlook by replacing the restaurant signage. Mr Mehmet believed that the Applicant would continue good communications with local residents.

All parties were offered and declined the opportunity to summarise their cases and the Committee adjourned at 20:03hrs.

The Committee reconvened at 20:30 hrs and it was:

#### **RESOLVED**

The Committee carefully considered the application, all representations, the Council's Licensing Policy and the Section 182 Guidance. The Committee decided to grant the application but imposed a number of conditions considered necessary and proportionate to promote the licensing objectives.

The prevention of public nuisance was the only objective that required particular attention based on the nature of the representations.

The revised opening hours are agreed, namely:

Monday – Sunday 08:00 hrs to 02:00 hrs the following day

#### Supply of alcohol:

Monday to Sunday Noon to 01:30 hrs the following day

#### Provision of late night refreshments:

Monday to Sunday 23:00 hrs to 02:00 hrs the following day.

All of the conditions within the operating schedule area were imposed except where they contradicted the agreed conditions from the police, which were also imposed.

In relation to the extractor fan and flue system it was noted that there was a real risk of public nuisance particularly in relation to Mr Sharman, who lived above the premises and who addressed the Committee. It was noted that through constructive dialogue the concern of the extractor fan and flue (in relation to noise and smell) had already begun to be addressed. The Committee required that the applicant regularly maintains the system in order to optimise its effectiveness in keeping noise and smell to an absolute minimum.

The applicant was also required to keep the setting of the extractor fan at the most minimal level possible taking into account the level of demand on the kitchen at any given time.

The Committee considered the applicant credible and therefore did not consider it necessary to be any more specific in this regard.

As an informative the Committee expected the dialogue between the applicant and affected parties such as Mr Sharman, to continue indefinitely.

The Committee also advised that it would be in the applicant's interest to keep a record of the maintenance works to the extraction system.

- (2) Supply of alcohol: No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
    - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
  - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-
  - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
  - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
  - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- **3.** The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

## **Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions**

- 4.—(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
  - 5. The responsible person shall ensure that-
    - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
      - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
      - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
      - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

# Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

### THE PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

All exterior areas to be illuminated.

All interior trading areas will be visible to staff from behind the bar servery.

All toilets will be checked regularly.

The licensee and staff will monitor customer behaviour especially during busy periods.

Toilets access shall be clearly visible from the bar.

Drug prevention methods will be employed and signs shall be displayed.

A drivers' shelf with a selection of soft drinks shall be always available.

On Friday and Saturday nights a minimum of two door staff approved by the Security Industry Association will be employed on the premises to control the entry and exit of customers.

#### **PUBLIC SAFETY**

The premises will be equipped with emergency lighting, illuminated exit signs.

The premises will have a first aid box available for staff and customers.

Fire fighting equipment will be serviced regularly.

Current electric and gas certificates will be in place.

Mechanical extraction will be provided in the bar.

Maximum effort shall be placed on providing a smoke free environment with the use of extractors and smoke filters.

Some members of staff will hold Basic Food Hygiene certificates.

### THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

Windows in the bar area shall not be opened.

Staff will organise taxis to transport customers home when necessary and customers will be seen off the premises and encouraged to disperse at closing.

Standard glasses will gradually be replaced with toughened glasses.

### THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN

Unaccompanied children will not be permitted on the premises and no children will be permitted after 20.00 hours.

AWP (amusements with Prizes—Fruit Machine) machines will be positioned in sight of the bar counter.

Alcohol may only be sold to individuals over the age of 18 with valid proof of identification with one of the following:



The operating schedule does not address the prevention of public nuisance from:

- airborne entertainment noise
- Structure borne noise or vibrations from entertainment
- Noise generated from patrons queuing to enter
- Noise from patrons exiting the premises
- Litter nuisance


The proposed operating hours are inappropriate due to the close proximity of residential dwellings.

The noise caused by patrons exiting the premises and locating suitable transport home is likely to be detrimental to the residential amenity. This may be exacerbated by the level of public transport available at the proposed closing hours.

If the sub-committee were to grant this application then we would recommend the following following alterations/conditions to the operating schedule:

# Operating hours

That the premises closes no later than 02:00

That regulated entertainment ceases at 01:30

Reason: To allow time for clients to drink up and leave quietly.

### Prevention of nuisance from noise / vibration

All doors and windows will remain closed during the licensed regulated entertainment activities or in any event after 11pm. The entrance door will be fitted with a self-closing device and staff required to ensure that it is not propped open. A member of staff shall be made responsible to ensure the door is opened for as brief a period as possible. Where necessary adequate and suitable mechanical ventilation should be provided to public areas areas

Entry to the premises will be restricted to *persons over 18 while* the premises is being used used for regulated entertainment licensed activity

Entrance/exit from the premises whilst regulated entertainment licensable activities are ongoing shall be via a lobbied door to minimise noise breakout.

The regulated entertainment licensable activity shall conclude 30 minutes before the premises is due to close to prevent excessive noise breakout as the premises empties Other doors e.g. fire doors

The entrance doors shall be monitored by 2 SIA staff when regulated entertainment is on, and at weekends Friday to Sunday morning during licence hours even if there is no regulated entertainment.

### Structure borne noise

All speakers are mounted on anti-vibration mountings to prevent vibration transmission of sound energy to adjoining properties

### Sound limits

The licensee shall ensure that no music played in the licensed premises is audible at or within the site boundary of any residential property.

All regulated entertainment amplified activity will utilise the in-house amplification system, the maximum output of which is controlled by the duty manager

The level of amplified regulated entertainment shall be controlled by means of limiting device set at a level which upon request may be agreed with the licensing authority

### **Outside Areas**

No music will be played in, or for the benefit of patrons in external areas of the premises

No form of loudspeaker or sound amplification equipment is to be sited on or near the exterior premises or in or near any foyer, doorway, window or opening to the premises

Signs shall be displayed in the external areas/on the frontage requesting patrons to recognise the residential nature of the area and conduct their behaviour accordingly. The management must reserve the right to ask patrons to move inside the premises or leave if it is felt that they could be disturbing neighbours

It will be forbidden that clients will drink outside on the frontage of the pub.

### Deliveries and collections.

Deliveries and collections associated with the premises will be arranged between the hours hours 08:00 and 20:00 so as to minimise the disturbance caused to the neighbours

Empty bottles and non-degradable refuse will remain in the premises at the end of trading hours and taken out to the refuse point at the start of the working day rather than at the end end of trading when neighbours might be unduly disturbed

## Plant and machinery

All plant and machinery is correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from noise

### Dealing with complaints

A complaints book will be held on the premises to record details of any complaints received received from neighbours. The information is to include, where disclosed, the complainant complainant's name, location, date time and subsequent remedial action undertaken. This record must be made available at all times for inspection by council officers

Regular liaison meetings will be held where specifically requested by residents to enable neighbours to raise concerns about any aspect of the licensed activities.

### Patrons entering/exiting premises.

There will be no queuing outside the premises.

Where people queue to enter the premises a licensed door supervisor shall supervise and ensure the potential patrons behave in an acceptable manner

Signs should be displayed requesting patrons to respect the neighbours and behave in a courteous manner

### Door supervisors

When the premises turn out, a licensed door supervisor shall supervise patrons and ensure they leave in a prompt and courteous manner, respecting the neighbours.

A licensed door supervisor will be positioned on the exit door to ensure, as far as reasonably practical, that patrons do not leave drinks.

A licensed door supervisor will patrol the curtilage of the premises to prevent patrons urinating in public areas in the vicinity of the premises.

### Prevention of nuisance from litter

Adequate receptacles for use by patrons will be provided in the local vicinity. The positioning of the receptacles will be agreed with the licensing officer

### Prevention of Nuisance from Odour

All ventilation and extraction systems shall be correctly maintained and regularly serviced to to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from odour.

# Prevention of nuisance from light

Illuminated external signage shall be switched off when the premises is closed

Security lights will be positioned to minimise light intrusion to nearby residential premises
