1. Describe the issue under consideration

- 1.1 To acknowledge the steps taken to date, and recommended next steps, to progress the development of a West Green and Bruce Grove Area Action Plan.

2. Cabinet Member introduction

- 2.1 As part of the Council's new governance arrangements seven Area Committees have been established under the Council's constitution. These Committees meet quarterly and their terms of reference include a commitment to develop an area plan which will set out priorities for the year.
- 2.2 The Council sees the following as the principal reasons for their use:
- To offer informed choices to a range of local residents and traders
 - To target resources at evidenced need
 - To initiative two-way information sharing and joint local priority setting
 - To strengthen collective responsibility (Ward Members, Liaison, Cabinet)
 - For transparency of expenditure
 - To improve attendance through stronger public stakes
 - To improve the resolution of local problems
 - To improve the delivery of priority local services

4. Background information

- 4.1 In order to initiate the development of an Area Action Plan, West Green & Bruce Grove Hill Area Forum & Committee Councillors held a bespoke workshop on 23 January 2011. This workshop was attended by approximately 28 individuals; residents, traders and service providers, with the aim of identifying key issues and prospective activity for the Area Plan. Participants worked in groups to identify issues and activity, aided by area profile data. The following issues were raised as priorities:

1. Active Community Life
2. Broadwater Farm District Centre
3. Crime & Anti-Social Behaviour
4. Early Intervention
5. Health
6. Housing
7. Parks & Green Spaces



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8. Public Realm
9. Tottenham Regeneration Programme
10. Unemployment
11. Youth Provision

4.2. Since the workshop, the Committee Chair has agreed these eleven key priorities as issues the area plan will address. The recommended next step is to negotiate measurable short, medium and long-term activity with the relevant Council and partner services for inclusion in a final plan. This plan will be signed off by the Area Forum & Committee on 23 April 2012.

5. Comments of the Chief Finance Officer and financial implications

5.1 There is no specific budget allocation to implement any Area Action plans developed and thus any actions would need to be funded from existing resources being re-prioritised or targeted as necessary. If this is not possible actions could only be pursued once a Cabinet decision to provide funding is made.

6. Head of Legal Services and legal implications

6.1 The Head of Legal Services has been consulted in the preparation of this report and confirms that the Council's protocol covering Area Committees sets out the responsibility of each Area Committee to develop its 3 year area action plan. There are no legal implications arising from this report.

7.1 The development process for the plan will continue to ensure the views of a wide range of stakeholders are sought and listened to. WGBG AC 12	MAKING THE DIFFERENCE FUNDING AGREEMENTS The Chair of the Committee explained that the making the Difference Fund was established to help improve the quality of the local environment and lives of local residents, promoting a lasting impact where possible. A total of £25,000 has been allocated to each of the 7 Committee areas and applications had been invited from recognised or constituted groups. All projects were to be delivered and accounted for within the financial year ending March 2012, with a maximum of £5,000 being given to any individual project. Members of the Committee had considered 22 funding applications and had took a balanced view of projects supporting youth, older residents, environment and the wider community. They also considered value for money and sustainability alongside a match with the stated criteria. The outcome of their considerations were set out in Appendix 1 and contained details of the groups to be funded .

<p>WGBG AC 13</p>	<p>PLANS FOR TREE PLANTING IN WEST GREEN AND BRUCE GROVE WARDS</p> <p>The Committee Chair had invited Alex Fraser, the Council's Arboricultural Officer, based in the Place and Sustainability service, to provide information to local residents about the tree planting activities taking place in Bruce Grove and West Green wards. It was noted that there were 35 new trees to be planted in the West Green and Bruce Grove area and that priority was being given to planting in existing new tree pits. The locations for planting the tree had been decided upon following a survey however there was an opportunity to receive feedback from residents before November 2011 where the trees were to be planted. Committee members recommended that in future planting exercises, local resident associations are contacted at the survey stage so that they have an input on the selection of locations.</p> <p>Residents were assured that if they objected to a tree being planted outside their home then the tree would not be placed here. Ideas were put forward for planting trees outside of the Tottenham Green centre.</p> <p>RESOLVED</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. The Committee noted the information provided by the Arboricultural officer. ii. It was agreed that the Arboricultural officer meet with the West Green and Bruce Grove Resident's Associations before the list of locations for tree planting were finalised and that he continue to consult with these residents in future tree planting activities . <i>Please see attached final list of tree plant plots</i> iii. That tree planting activities were publicised on the Council's websites with key consultation dates listed. 	
<p>WGBG AC 14</p>	<p>POT HOLE FUNDING</p> <p>West Green and Bruce Grove wards had been allocated £17,190 to fund pot hole repairs. A list of roads has been compiled from suggestions provided by the public and following an intensive survey of all roads in August 2011. The Committee were asked to consider this list and agree the roads to be repaired or resurfaced. Addressing all the identified potholes would reduce the need for future repairs and help</p>	

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	<p>seal the carriageways before the winter weather commenced.</p> <p>Dunlow road was assigned to have a pothole repairs and Members asked if this could be considered for resurfacing instead due to the poor condition of this road. Members were advised that to qualify for resurfacing the conditions of the potholes would need to be more than 60 millilitres deep. However Dunlow Road as well as Kitchener Road could be investigated in the coming financial year for resurfacing. <i>To confirm that these two roads have been added to a provisional list of roads to be considered for resurfacing in the new financial year. Decisions on the roads to be resurfaced will be made after assessments in early March, following the winter period when there is further deterioration. An update can be further provided to the April meeting if requested.</i></p> <p>A further query was raised about the condition of Gloucester road which had been previously resurfaced. However, part of this road was in Broadwater Farm Estate and had not received the same treatment. This was the responsibility of Homes for Haringey but as the Council had a working relationship with Homes for Haringey and were able to inspect this part of the road and pass any concerns onto them.</p> <p>Further information was sought on the process for reporting damages to bollards caused by buses. The Committee noted that the highways service did pursue damages to bollards but would need to have the evidence to submit to the bus company when reporting this. <i>Councillors and residents can report damages caused by buses to Frontline services on 0208 489 1535.</i></p> <p>RESOLVED</p> <p>The Committee agreed that the allocation £17,100 be spent on repairs to the roads listed in Appendix 1.</p>
