

		Provide good quality images - colour during opening times.

Have a monitor to review images and recorded quality. Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture and retention. Staff trained in operating CCTV. Digital images must be kept for 31 days. The equipment must have a suitable export method, e.g. CD/DVD writer so that Police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. Copies must be available within a reasonable time to Police on request.

This is under the Protection of Children from Harm Objective.

I recommend that the following form of verification of a person's proof of age is:

A valid passport.

A photo driving licence

A proof of age standard card system

A citizen card, supported by the Home Office.



This record must be made available at all times for inspection by council officers

All ventilation and extraction systems shall be correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from odour.

Illuminated external signage shall be switched off when the premises is closed

Security lights will be positioned to minimise light intrusion to nearby residential premises





Reason: From support information above, we have had seven (7) noise complaints made by one local resident, on two occasion. One the level was not deemed loud and the proprietor of The African Village was spoken to and the position of the offending speaker was removed. On the second occasion loud intrusive music was witnessed and a Noise Warning letter issued. The fact that the noise was reported and witnessed just after the premises permitted closing time, gives a strong indication that local residents appear to accept the premises present permitted hours and any increase in those opening hours may result in further noise complaint, if not from the premises, from associated noise from patrons leaving later.

Please take this email as my formal objection to the licencing application that has been submitted by The African Village for a licence for 81 Broad Lane, N17. The application is essence is to create a bar/ club that will operate unit! 5am Mon-Sun.

The provision of a bar/club opening every night until 5am is hugely detrimental for the local population. There are many businesses and residents living in the vicinity including above the proposed site of this bar/club. The noise coming from such a place for starters will cause a huge nuisance for people. In addition the volume of people coming to such a premises will be a huge nuisance in terms of traffic, parking and people who may have been drinking throughout the night up to 5am causing a nuisance. Broad Lane is a narrow pavement area which is not suited to having large numbers of people stood outside which I would imagine will happen particularly those patrons who wish to smoke.
