- alcohol, and a 24 hour licence at this premises would make the problems worse and attract more people to the area.
- People who had been drinking caused noise nuisance and litter, which damaged the area.

In response to questions from the Committee to Mr Yildiz, the following points were discussed:

- Mr Yildiz advised that he worked in a nearby off-licence, which opened from 6am-1am. He felt that he was particularly affected by issues caused by people who had been drinking, as he worked directly with the public in his shop.
- It was reported that there had been more problems since Teddy's had opened, as there had been a reduction in alcohol prices in the area and attracted more drunk and disorderly people to the area.
- In response to a question from the Committee, Mr Yildiz advised that the price competition he referred to was between the shop he worked in and Teddy's Off Licence.

Mr Waites addressed the Committee on behalf of the applicant and made the following points:

- It was material that no representation against the application had been submitted by the Police, as the main source of advice on crime and disorder. Environmental Health and the Licensing Authority had also expressed no concerns regarding the application.
- Any objections on the basis of trade should be treated with less weight.
- The points raised by the objector had been very general in nature, and were not supported by evidence. Crime statistics for the months before and after the premises had opened had remained consistent, no problems had arisen as a result and the premises was operated in line with good practice and robust management arrangements.
- The premises was already open for 24 hours, this application was simply to match the hours for the sale of alcohol to the opening hours. It was noted that the neighbouring premises also had a licence for the 24 hour sale of alcohol.
- The conditions proposed in the operating schedule were robust; if the Committee felt it necessary, the applicant would offer an additional condition relating to litter.

In response to questions from the Committee to the applicant's representative, the following points were covered:

 The Committee asked about the training for staff on issues around underage sales; it was confirmed that the applicant held a personal licence, and he and his staff also received training from

their licensing agent regarding age verification procedures, dealing with intoxicated patrons, etc. It was confirmed that the most recent training had been completed on 28 October 2012.

- This was the only premises operated by the applicant, who had previously run a café bar and convenience store and had a lot of local knowledge.
- It was confirmed that the premises sold a range of products as well as alcohol; spirits would be displayed behind the counter, and beer and wine would be displayed on either side of the counter.

In summing up, the objector suggested that the premises was very close to another premises with a 24 hour alcohol licence, and that customers did not need another such premises as it would have a negative impact on the local area, drunk and disorderly incidents and crime would increase, and there would also be litter and noise nuisance as a result. The applicant's representative noted that neither the police nor environmental health had made representations against the application, the premises had already proven that they could uphold the licensing objectives and robust conditions were in place. It was noted that the issue of need was not an issue the Licensing Sub Committee could take into account.

The Committee withdrew to deliberate.

RESOLVED

The Committee carefully considered the application, the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, the guidance under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the representations by the applicant and one interested party. It was the Committee's decision to grant the extension of the hours for the supply of alcohol, namely:

Monday to Sunday: 0000 to 0000

The conditions on the current licence (set out at pages 39 to 41 of the agenda pack) will be carried over to the new licence, in addition, the Committee imposed the condition offered by the applicant that staff at the premises carry out litter patrols on a regular basis in order to promote the licensing objective relating to the prevention of public nuisance.

As an informative, the applicant is reminded of the need for all staff to undertake training in their responsibilities in relation to the sale of alcohol, particularly with regard to drunkenness and underage persons and the need for records to be kept of training and refresher training.




There is a history of noise complaints (at a time when the premises had no licence for regulated entertainment and we therefore request appropriate conditions to be applied to protect residents from nuisance.

The operating schedule does not address the prevention of public nuisance from:

- airborne entertainment noise
- Structure borne noise or vibrations from entertainment
- Noise generated by patrons in external areas of the premises
- Noise generated from patrons queuing to enter
- Noise from patrons exiting the premises

The proposed operating hours are inappropriate due to the close proximity of residential dwellings.

The noise caused by patrons exiting the premises and locating suitable transport home is likely to be detrimental to the residential amenity.

The prevention of such activity is not adequately addressed in the Licensing Objective concerning the protection of children (Section P(e)).

Measures that we would expect to see in place are detailed below:

- All relevant staff must be trained in the prevention of underage sales including; knowledge of the law and guidance on how to assess age and recognise acceptable ID. Such ID must bear a photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark
- To keep a written record of staff training confirming they have understood the legal requirements

The application states that a Challenge 21 and Challenge 25 Policy will be in force. Only one of these policies can be implemented, not both at the same time so this inconsistency needs to be addressed.

It is recommended that a Challenge 25 Policy is adopted, though this does not form part of our representations.
