

Wetherspoons have now submitted an amendment to the times originally applied for and these amendments are shown in the body of the report.

5. REPORT

Background

- **5.1** An application for a New Premises Licence Variation, by JD Wetherspoon PLC in respect of Wetherspoon, 258 Muswell Hill Broadway, Muswell Hill, London N10 3SE for the removal of all regulated entertainment, to remove all non- Mandatory Conditions and replace with those shown below at 5.3. The LSC is asked to note that the times initially requested in the Variation application have been amended. Wetherspoons have considered the representations received by residents and have now offered amendments that would see a reduction in the hours that the premises would have been able to trade too had they just transferred the existing license.
- 5.2 A copy of the original license is attached at App 1A.

5.2 Details of the application being sought under the Premises Licence Variation – the details shown below are the revised/amended times now offered by Wetherspoons at the end of the consultation period. APP 1

To remove all regulated entertainment

To remove all non-Mandatory Conditions and replace with those specified in the application.

Sale of alcohol to remain to 1000 start time as per the existing premises licence on all days.

Terminal hour for sale of alcohol on Friday and Saturday to be reduced to 0100 (reduction of 1 hour from the current terminal hour for those days)

Closing time of the premises on all days to be reduced to an additional 30 minutes from the terminal hour for sale of alcohol in place of the hour allowed currently.

Terminal hour for late night refreshment to match that for the sale of alcohol on all days.

For the avoidance of doubt, the non-standard timings remain as per those in the application(i.e. as per the current premises licence).

Supply of Alcohol

Monday to Wednesday	1000 to 0030
Thursday and Sunday	1000 to 0100
Friday and Saturday	1000 to 0100

New Years Eve licensable activities from the start of permitted hours on 31

December until the start of permitted hours on 1 January.

Provision of Late Night Refreshment

Monday to Wednesday	2300 to 0030
Thursday and Sunday	2300 to 0100
Friday and Saturday	2300 to 0100

On St David's Day, St Patrick's Day, St George's Day and St Andrew's Day, the finish time will be extended by one hour, with seven days notice and agreement with the police.

For statutory bank holiday weekend periods and for the Thursday before Good Friday and for Christmas Eve, the finish time will be extended by one hour.

On occasions of local, national or international significance or for charitable events, limited to twelve per year, the finish time will be extended by one hour, with fourteen days notice and agreement with the police.

The opening hours of the premises:

Monday to Wednesday	0900 to 0030
Thursday and Sunday	0900 to 0130
Friday and Saturday	0900 to 0130

New Years Eve opening hours from the start of permitted hours on 31 December until the start of permitted hours on 1 January.

General-all four licensing objectives

The premises licence holder will ensure that all staff at the premises have been trained in accordance with established JD Wetherspoon plc training procedures. Specifically the premises licence holder will ensure that all employees who work front of house are trained in their responsibilities to prevent alcohol being served to anybody who is under the legal age limit or to anyone who appears to be drunk ot to anyone who is trying to purchase alcohol on their behalf

5.3 Crime and Disorder

The premises licence holder will ensure that there are sufficient staffing levels including managers to encourage responsible behaviour on the premises at all times.

CCTV shall be installed in the premises. Images will be retained for a minimum of 30 days and will be available to the Police upon request. Members of the management team will be trained in the use of the system.

Non-alcoholic beverages including soft drinks, water, coffee and tea shall be available at all times, sale by retail of alcohol carried out at the premises.

5.4 Public Safety

5.5 Public Nuisance

Notices will be displayed asking customers to respect the neighbours when leaving the premises.

5.6 Child Protection

The premises licence holder will operate a "Challenge 21" Policy at all times







(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

Public safety will be reviewed regularly through the Health and Safety policy. This policy will be fully briefed and trained to all management and staff, premises will continue to train staff to the standards required by relevant legislation.

Free drinking water will be available at all times.

THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

Additional patrols will take place by members of staff, internally and externally, to limit any noise pollution when entertainment is being offered within the premises.

Notices will be displayed asking customers to respect the neighbours when leaving the premises.

Where already used text/radio pagers will continue to be used for the additional hours of trading and will be monitored by a responsible member of staff.

Soft drinks and non-alcoholic refreshment will be available if the premises should decide to use the option to stay open for an extended period between the cessation of the supply of alcohol and the closure of the premises.

THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN

When children are allowed upon the premises, any entertainment offered within the premises will be suitable for young persons.

Children will be required to be supervised by the accompanying adult at all times.

A no smoking area will be provided.

Soft drinks and non-alcoholic drinks will be available.

Alcohol may only be sold to individuals over the age of 18 with valid proof of identification with one of the following:

- A valid passport
- A photo driving license issued in a European Union Country
- A proof of age standard card system
- A citizen card, supported by the Home Office

I would like to confirm that I have considered the above proposal with regard to the prevention of public nuisance on behalf of the Enforcement Response (Noise) Team & would like to make representations to the Application

The operating schedule does not address the prevention of public nuisance from:

- Noise generated by patrons in external areas of the premises
- Noise generated from patrons queuing to enter
- Noise from patrons exiting the premises
- Noise generated from deliveries
- Noise generated from refuse collections
- Noise from plant and machinery
- Light nuisance
- Cooking odour
- Litter nuisance

It is accepted that the premises will be able to offer Live Music between the hours of 8am-11pm without the need for a license.

It is also accepted that background music will be permitted without the need for a license. We note the application seeks to remove the ability to offer regulated entertainment at the premises in its entirety.

There should be a lobbied doors to the rear of the premises.

The rear garden should cease being used at 22.00 each day, patrons should be encouraged to use the front external area for smoking after this time.

All speakers are mounted on anti-vibration mountings to prevent vibration transmission of sound energy to adjoining properties

Sound limits

The licensee shall ensure that no music played in the licensed premises is audible at or within the site boundary of any residential property.

The level of amplified background music shall be controlled by means of a limiting device set at a level which upon request may be agreed with the licensing authority. It will be a responsibility of the Premises Licence holder to request assistance, in writing and to ensure that the limiter is working effectively.

Outside Areas

No music will be played in, or for the benefit of patrons in external areas of the premises.

No form of loudspeaker or sound amplification equipment is to be sited on or near the exterior premises or in or near any foyer, doorway, window or opening to the premises.

Signs shall be displayed in the external areas/on the frontage requesting patrons to recognise the residential nature of the area and conduct their behaviour accordingly. The management must reserve the right to ask patrons to move inside the premises or leave if it is felt that they could be disturbing neighbours

Deliveries and collections.

Deliveries and collections associated with the premises will be arranged between the hours 08:00 – 20:00 so as to minimise the disturbance caused to the neighbours

Glasses will be collected from the external area at the beginning of the day rather than at closing time when neighbours in close proximity might be unduly disturbed

Empty bottles and non-degradable refuse will remain in the premises at the end of trading hours and taken out to the refuse point at the start of the working day rather than at the end of trading when neighbours might be unduly disturbed

Plant and machinery

All plant and machinery is correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from noise

Dealing with complaints

A complaints book will be held on the premises to record details of any complaints received from neighbours. The information is to include, where disclosed, the complainant's name, location,

I am writing due to my immense concern that the proposed new Wetherspoon's pub on Muswell Hill is going to cause significant noise and encourage antisocial behaviour.

I am a director of the developers of 56 Muswell Hill, a scheme for 28 new residential units and a special needs facility located directly opposite the proposed new pub.

I am very concerned that the pub is going to cause a nuisance to the residents, especially those in the 8 flats situated in the former 'Green Man' directly opposite the Wetherspoons with windows and views on to it.

The creation of an outdoor drinking area or 'beer garden' is wholly inappropriate if it is to be located at the front area of the pub on Muswell Hill itself. It will undoubtedly create noise and potentially antisocial behaviour too. The London Centre for Children with Cerebral Palsy will be operating from its new purpose-built facility at the front of our site opposite the pub and the children who attend are highly sensitive to the local environment. A rowdy pub opposite will harm their specific educational and physical therapy and at the very least cause anxiety for the pupils, many of whom suffer from learning difficulties along with Cerebral Palsy.

We are also building a new community centre as part of the development, again located opposite the proposed pub and this centre will be used for fundraising events, social gatherings and children's birthday parties.

If the potential users of this facility feel in anyway uncomfortable about using the space, it will simply not succeed. Any move by the pub to serve alcohol from 9am in the morning as I understand is being requested will cause a major issue for the viability of the LCCCP and Community facility and cause a massive inconvenience for the residents who will be living in the 8 newly converted flats overlooking the pub from our development.

Dear sir / madam,

I am writing to register my objection to JD Wetherspoon's application for a licence to serve alcohol between 9am and 2am. While I understand the previous pub (the Village) had a 2am licence, this (together with the remarkable 4am licences enjoyed by Cafe Loco and the Socialite Bar) was not a positive thing for the community. As a local resident (Wellfield Avenue) I have had to call the police because of clubbers congregating outside my house, and on the corner of the street (where Wellfield meets Dukes Avenue) at c. 4am once the clubs close. I have had my car broken into on my drive more than five times this year early on Saturday or sunday mornings while finding empty beer bottles in the gutter and vomit on the pavement is a frequent saturday and sunday morning occurrence because of these late night establishments.

Having just returned from the Wetherspoon community consultation evening (disappointingly held in mid-August when many locals who may have had concerns are on holiday) there appeared to be a broad consensus that a 2am licence would be both incongruous and certainly not in the community's interest. No other pub in Muswell Hill claims a 2am licence (O'Neills - 12am, John Baird - 12am, Maid of Muswell -11pm) presumably because it is a suburban area with families trying to sleep at the time that JD Wetherspoon would like to be playing music and serving alcohol.

I am also struggling to understand why Wetherspoon's would want to serve alcohol from 9am. How on earth can it be in the interests of Muswell Hill residents for an establishment to be serving alcohol at that time, particularly when there is a primary school and a new Cerebral Palsy centre opposite the pub?

Please consider my concerns that I am sure are widely felt across the community, but particularly by those who live in close proximity to a part of muswell hill that has long been blighted by late night drinking at the Village, and the two clubs that do nothing for the local residents at all.

To Whom it May Concern

I reside at 65, Muswell Hill and have done so for the last eleven years. During the first few years i lived in my flat I was regularly woken up early in the mornings at weekends by the sounds of drunken revelry, disorder and sometimes violence from persons returning from the pubs and clubs on the roundabout at the top of Muswell Hill Broadway. On several occasions I sat down at my computer and emailed a complaint. The degree of the disturbance varied according to the weather and the affluence of the clientele and, since the financial crash and the resulting austerity, the nuisance has been sporadic. Matters also improved with the closure of the nightclub attached to The Hill public house which also saw an improvement in the use of the planted areas on both sides of the road for drug dealing. Although I feel that Muswell Hill would benefit from a well-managed public house, I wish to voice my objections, not to JD Wetherspoon's application to transfer the existing licence to themselves but to the hours during which that licence will operate. I see no reason why a company which wishes to emphasise its commitment to providing families with food and drink, alcoholic and soft, needs to have a licence which operates until 3.00 or 4.00 am. I fail to see how operating a licence during the hours after midnight can do anything else except add to the possibility of public disorder and crime. f Cafe

My further concern is that, by allowing JD Wetherspoon the extra hours after their intended closure time, you will be contributing to reactivating the public disorder and nuisance which made living in the area of The Village pub, Cafe Loco and the Socialite club a miserable experience for many residents in the past when all of these venues were operating. In my experience, people used to congregate at the Village at the weekends to allow themselves ready access to all three venues and this led to many incidents of crime and public disorder. By allowing JD Wetherspoon the same facility and failing to review how these three venues with their completely unacceptable late opening hours will run counter to the stated objectives of the licensing authority's obligation to ensure 1. The prevention of crime and disorder and 2. The prevention of public nuisance, I feel that you are failing in your duty to the community of Muswell Hill. After all, I think that most people are agreed that the deregulation of licensing hours was a mistake and goes against current notions of responsible alcohol consumption and the public health concerns that are currently being raised. Public opinion has changed since the time when these licences were initially granted and I would expect my local licensing committee to reassess and review their commitment to their objectives in the light of the changing ethos and culture. Additionally, in the past, I have sometimes returned home in the early hours of the morning by car or taxi, having come from babysitting for my grandchildren only to find that some of the clients of these three venues have parked their cars directly outside on double yellow lines causing a considerable traffic hazard. As there seems to be no police presence during these extended licensing hours such infringements of the law and other low level public nuisance goes unremarked.

I attended the public meeting held at the Raglan on 12th August and I am aware that there is a considerable body of opinion which agrees with my contention that JD Wetherspoon's licence application should be allowed to operate only until midnight at the latest and that the time has come for the other two licences, of the former Cafe Loco and The Socialite Club, to be reviewed.

Thank you for the list of current applications under consideration and also the details that you sent Cllr Pippa Connor about the Wetherspoons applications for 258 Muswell Hill Broadway, N10 3SH.

Nearby residents have raised concerns, both in correspondence and at a public meeting held by Wetherspoons, about the impact of the beer garden in terms of noise and smoke nuisance on their quality of life. The proposed open beer garden at semi-basement level is overlooked by both the flats behind in Summerland Grange, a number of flats above shops on Muswell Hill Broadway and some of the proposed new flats in 77 Muswell Hill N10. The fact that the beer garden is sunken and surrounded by walls will only serve to amplify the noise and funnel any smoke into the windows of surrounding flats.

Concerns have also been raised by the London Centre for Children with Cerebral Palsy about the use of the front terrace for sale of alcohol at such an early hour when children are arriving at the school. This special school which is has planning permission and is due to be constructed soon is going to be sited opposite Wetherspoons.

We are therefore requesting on grounds of 'Public Nuisance' that the use of the rear of the premises as a beer garden, if this is approved by Planning, is severely restricted in hours of use and that conditions are imposed on where smoking can take place and if possible that this is restricted to the front of the premises.

We would also request that you take into consideration the concerns of the London Centre for Children with Cerebral Palsy when considering this Licensing Application.


I do not object to Wetherspoons operating a pub with normal licensing hours of say 11.00 a.m. to 11.00 p.m.

While it is impossible to demonstrate the causality of these events, it is clear that the presence of late night drinking establishments attract a number of individuals who enter our community for malevolent reasons (theft, drugs) not least because there is <u>no police</u> <u>presence</u> during these extended hours which also means that other infringements are not recorded.

Public Safety

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

Muswell Hill Broadway becomes a different, threatening environment during the early hours of Saturday and Sunday morning. After the 4am nightclubs close, there are groups of drunk, threatening people hanging around the Broadway, shouting, littering and continuing to drink in the streets. Our road (Wellfield Avenue) is a popular spot for post club arguments / scuffles / drunken antics and we have been woken up on numerous occasions by groups of inebriated youths after 4am. These groups are often large and aggressive (c. 5-7 people) and we have had to call the police, rather than attempt to disperse them ourselves. Granting a 2am license to a large pub in central Muswell Hill will only exacerbate these problems as it will undeniably act as an initial port of call before many of its patrons cross the road to continue their drinking until 4am. Not only should the licensing authority reconsider the 2am licence that Wetherspoons will inherit (why?) as a matter of course, but this appears an opportune moment to review the other late night licenses (former Café Loco, Socialite Club) because the existence of three late night drinking establishments in the immediate vicinity of each other is incongruous in a suburban setting.

The Protection of Children from Harm

It is difficult to even conceive of a reason why granting a licence to serve alcohol from 9am could be in the interests of our community, particularly when the establishment is opposite a school and a centre for cerebral palsy. I strongly urge you to reject Wetherspoon's application to extend their licence to when children are arriving at school. It is incredible that Wetherspoon claim to work with local communities and yet feel able to apply for a licence to serve alcohol for 17 hours/day.

I am writing in relation to planning application **HGY/2014/1905**, which relates to the licensing application for a new Wetherspoons pub at 258 Muswell Hill Broadway.

I would like to raise serious concerns regarding the proposals being put forward for extended opening hours at this establishment. My understanding (taken from documentation submitted by Wetherspoons) is that the new site will be open from 7:00-01:30 Mon-Thurs; 07:00-02:00 Thurs and Sun; 07:00-03:00 Fri and Sat; and 07:00-04:00 on Sunday's before a Bank holiday and on certain days such as Boxing day etc.

I believe the above proposal is wholly excessive and out of kilter with the wider development plans for the Muswell Hill area. Whilst the plans for regenerating the area are really positive – and I'm conscious of the large investment Wetherspoons are willing to make in restoring the building – I have serious concerns regarding these opening hours. To put this into context, the Village (when still open) operated the following opening hours: Mon-Fri 16:00-23:00, Sat 12:00-00:00 and Sun 12:00-22:30. I do not, therefore, understand why the proposal for such a significant increase.

As a resident of Muswell Hill, I would like to voice my concerns in the strongest manner – both as an individual and a member of the community.

The impact extended opening hours will inevitably have on the local area will be huge. It is not only the noise – which will continue until far later than normal – but there will also be an impact in terms of level and types of reported crime, safety of residents and visitors (due to the number of individuals remaining in the area in an inebriated state until later in the evening), hygiene and litter and the general business health of the area. The type of businesses and residents you attract to this area will without question be impacted – and I strongly believe this goes against what the council are trying to achieve through all the regeneration plans for the area.

I have only recently joined the community in Muswell Hill and one of the key factors in my doing so was around the family friendly culture – which I believed was actively supported and promoted by the council. I strongly ask you to consider this – along with all the above factors – when reaching a decision regarding the proposed opening hours for this establishment. Experience of previous establishments with late night opening in this very area resulted in the trading of drugs and on one occasion the discharging of a firearm in Dukes Mews. Mr. Osy Wade, the recently retired caretaker of the Baptist Church who resided at 1 Dukes Avenue, showed me live ammunition that he discovered in front of the Church at the top of Dukes Avenue.

Wetherspoons are proposing to greatly increase the "drinking area" and have no restrictions on the entertainment permitted.

Public Safety

Patrons park their cars and minicabs wait on double yellow lines irrespective to the dangers caused to other road users and pedestrians. In the past there has been no policing of this.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

Again from previous experience of late night drinking establishments in this area at closing time when the patrons leave they are noisy and usually urinate on front doors or gardens. A favourite is to damage car aerials, tear off car wing mirrors and tip over dustbins and scatter the contents over the road.

The patrons, invariably drunk, stagger down the nearby residential roads shouting and arguing with little care for the language they use and who the disturb.

All this we have suffered in the past.

At the top of Dukes Avenue minicabs gather and block the street, illegally plying for hire. This was confirmed and stated by Councillor Dodds when the application for a minicab office in Dukes Mews was declined. Councillor Dodds took time to visit the area at night and confirmed that what the residents were saying was true in relation to nuisance and the illegal plying for hire by minicabs. A record of this should be in the Planning Departments Minutes of the Council under their reference HGY2009/1897.

As mentioned earlier Wetherspoons are proposing to greatly increase the "drinking area" *and have no restrictions on the entertainment permitted.* This will mean the residents will be asked to suffer more noise and nuisance, especially those who live in flats above and around the venue as Wetherspoons propose extending and creating a large external terrace to the existing building.

The Protection of Children from Harm

The application is for an opening time of 7 a.m. with a licence to serve alcohol from 09.00 a.m.

The premises are situated directly opposite The Muswell Hill Childrens' Cerebral Palsy Centre and very adjacent to Muswell Hill Primary School and it would be irresponsible for children of that age to be exposed to the idea that it is Okay to drink in a Pub at that time of the day.


