LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE HEARINGS PROCEDURE SUMMARY	
INTRODUCTION	
1.	The Chair introduces him/herself and invites other Members, Council officers, Police, Applicant and Objectors to do the same.
2.	The Chair invites Members to disclose <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i) any prior contacts (before the hearing) with the parties or representations received by them; and separately ii) any declarations of interest.
3.	The Chair explains the procedure to be followed by reference to this summary which will be distributed in advance.
NON-ATTENDANCE BY PARTY OR PARTIES	
4.	If one or both of the parties fails to attend, the Chair decides whether to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) grant an adjournment to another date, or (ii) proceed in the absence of the non-attending party. Normally, an absent party will be given one further opportunity to attend.
TOPIC HEADINGS	
5.	The Chair suggests the “topic headings” for the hearing. In the case of the majority of applications for variation of hours, or other terms and conditions, the main topic is: <p>Whether the extensions of hours etc. applied for would conflict with the four licensing objectives i.e.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) the prevention of crime and disorder, (ii) public safety, (iii) the prevention of public nuisance, and (iv) the protection of children from harm.
6.	The Chair invites comments from the parties on any other topic headings to be discussed.
WITNESSES	
7.	The Chair asks whether there are any requests by a party to call a witness and decides any such request.
8.	Only if a witness is to be called, the Chair then asks if there is a request by an opposing party to “cross-examine” the witness. The Chair then decides any such request.
DOCUMENTARY EVIDENCE	
9.	The Chair asks whether there are any requests by any party to introduce late documentary evidence.
10.	If so, the Chair will ask the other party if they object to the admission of the late documents.
11.	If the other party do object to the admission of documents which have only been produced by the first party at the hearing, then the documents shall not generally be admitted.

12.	If the other party object to documents produced late but before the hearing, the following criteria shall be taken into account when the Chair decides whether or not to admit the late documents:	
(i)	What is the reason for the documents being late?	
(ii)	Will the other party be unfairly taken by surprise by the late documents?	
(iii)	Will the party seeking to admit late documents be put at a major disadvantage if admission of the documents is refused?	
(iv)	Is the late evidence really important?	
(v)	Would it be better and fairer to adjourn to a later date?	
THE LICENSING OFFICER'S INTRODUCTION		
13.	The Licensing Officer introduces the report explaining, for example, the existing hours, the hours applied for and the comments of the other Council Services or outside official bodies. This should be as "neutral" as possible between the parties.	
14.	The Licensing Officer can be questioned by Members and then by the parties.	
THE HEARING		
15.	This takes the form of a discussion led by the Chair. The Chair can vary the order as appropriate but it should include:	
(i)	an introduction by the Objectors' main representative	
(ii)	an introduction by the Applicant or representative	
(iii)	questions put by Members to the Objectors	
(iv)	questions put by Members to the Applicant	
(v)	questions put by the Objectors to the Applicant	
(vi)	questions put by the Applicant to the Objectors	
CLOSING ADRESSES		
16.	The Chair asks each party how much time is needed for their closing address, if they need to make one.	
17.	Generally, the Objectors make their closing address before the Applicant who has the right to the final closing address.	
THE DECISION		
18.	Members retire with the Committee Clerk and legal representative to consider their decision including the imposition of conditions.	
19.	The decision is put in writing and read out in public by the Committee Clerk once Members have returned to the meeting.

The Licensee will ensure the use of CCTV in the premises, use of SIA door personnel at main entrance, A strict over 25 years old(age) entry policy. Signs displayed in the premises to advice clients of their responsibilities when leaving the bar.

5.4 **Crime and Disorder**

The Licensee will ensure:

- Use of CCTV, logged and recorded system
- Signs up in the bar of a 'No Drugs' on the premises, all matters reported to the Police
- On busy nights SIA personnel at the main door. Anybody who is drinking heavily will be spoken to and a cab called to take them home as not to cause nuisance in the streets.

5.5 **Public Safety**

The Licensee will ensure:

- All drinking will take place inside the premises (No drinking outside the bar). If a client wants to smoke outside they will have to leave their drink inside otherwise they will be asked to leave.
- Anybody who seems drunk or under the influence of other substances will be refused entry/service and asked politely to leave.

5.6 Public Nuisance

The Licensee will ensure:

- CCTV monitoring, recording, SIA Personnel.
- Anybody who is drinking heavily will be spoken to and a cab called to take them home as not to cause nuisance in the streets.

We have a zero entry to minors on the premises. Anybody who looks under age will be asked for identification and a number of questions to determine their age (this is due to the number of fake ID's available on the internet)

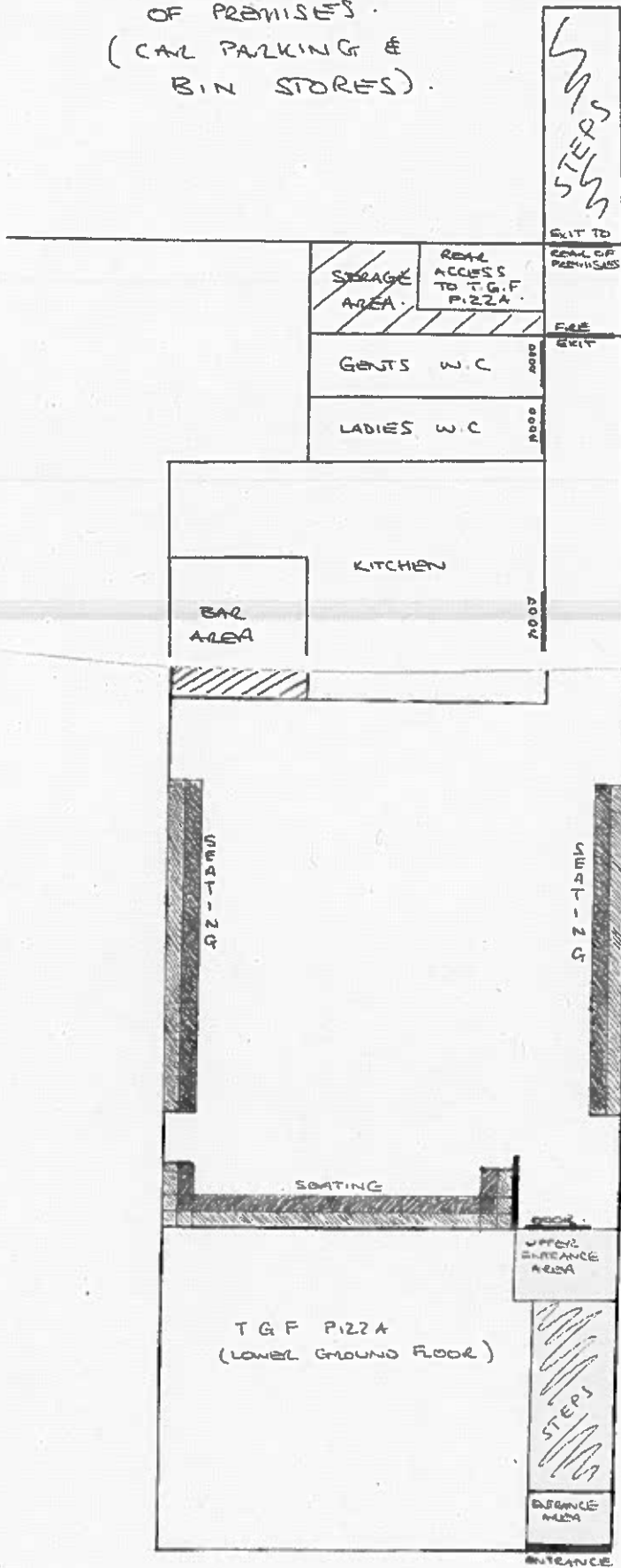

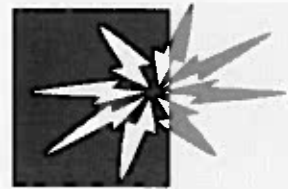

I would like to confirm that I have considered the above proposal with regard to the prevention of public nuisance on behalf of the Enforcement Response (Noise) Team & would like to make representations to the Application

The operating schedule does not address the prevention of public nuisance from:

- airborne entertainment noise
- Structure borne noise or vibrations from entertainment
- Noise from patrons exiting the premises
- Light nuisance
- Litter nuisance

Supporting Information

The Phoenix Lounge and Bar is situated above a pizza shop on a mezzanine floor. The entrance doorway is between two businesses and opens to a flight of steps up to the bar. This position makes the premises nearer to residential properties above than a normal ground floor commercial property.

The bar itself is fairly small inside with seating for approximately 30 people.

There have been significant noise nuisance problems in the past, mainly caused by poor sound insulation and the close proximity of the business to residents due to it being elevated on a mezzanine floor. Music has also been played at an excessive volume.

The proposed operating hours in regard to regulated entertainment are inappropriate due to the close proximity of residential dwellings. The construction and positioning of the bar and lounge is located between a pizza take away business on the ground floor and residential properties above. This has made the lounge bar closer to the residential properties above than for example a normal business premises located on the ground floor and therefore is wholly unsuitable for regulated entertainment.

This representation recommends that the following alterations/conditions to the operating schedule:

Patrons entering/exiting premises.

Where people queue to enter the premises a licensed door supervisor shall supervise and ensure the potential patrons behave in an acceptable manner

Signs should be displayed requesting patrons to respect the neighbours and behave in a courteous manner

Door supervisors

It is expected that busy times for such premises are most likely to be Friday and Saturday evenings, and therefore we would require SIA door supervisors be on duty from 21:00 hrs until close of business.

When the premises turn out, a licensed door supervisor shall supervise patrons and ensure they leave in a prompt and courteous manner, respecting the neighbours.

A licensed door supervisor will be positioned on the exit door to ensure, as far as reasonably practical, that patrons do not leave drinks.

Prevention of Nuisance from Odour

All ventilation and extraction systems shall be correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from odour.

Prevention of nuisance from light

Illuminated external signage shall be switched off when the premises is closed

Security lights will be positioned to minimise light intrusion to nearby residential premises

Structure borne noise

All speakers are mounted on anti-vibration mountings to prevent vibration transmission of sound energy to adjoining properties

Sound limits

The licensee shall ensure that no music played in the licensed premises is audible at or within the site boundary of any residential property

Outside Areas

Signs shall be displayed in the external areas/on the frontage requesting patrons to recognise the residential nature of the area and conduct their behaviour accordingly. The management must reserve the right to ask patrons to move inside the premises or leave if it is felt that they could be disturbing neighbours

Plant and machinery

All plant and machinery is correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from noise

Dealing with complaints

A complaints book will be held on the premises to record details of any complaints received from neighbours. The information is to include, where disclosed, the complainant's name, location, date time and subsequent remedial action undertaken. This record must be made available at all times for inspection by council officers

Regular four monthly liaison meetings will be held where specifically requested by residents to enable neighbours to raise concerns about any aspect of the licensed activities

Operating hours

That regulated entertainment ceases at 23:00 hrs

Reason: Significant recent intrusion of music and amplified voice noise amounting to a noise nuisance into residents properties above the bar have resulted in a warning letter and Noise abatement Notice being served on subsequent nights.

Should the application come before a committee hearing and if the committee wishes to allow regulated entertainment after 23:00hrs, we would wish for the following conditions be applied:

Prevention of nuisance from noise / vibration

All doors and windows will remain closed during the licensed regulated entertainment activities or in any event after 11pm. The entrance door will be fitted with a self-closing device and staff required to ensure that it is not propped open. A member of staff shall be made responsible to ensure the door is opened for as brief a period as possible. Where necessary adequate and suitable mechanical ventilation should be provided to public areas

REASONS FOR DENYING LICENCE FOR PHOENIX BAR & LOUNGE:

I live in [redacted] and have reported many incidents involving noise nuisance over the past two years. The purpose of my contact with you is to oppose the application from the above owner for a Provision of Late Night Refreshment, Supply of Alcohol licence, Playing of Recorded 12pm - 3am Music - Monday to Sunday performance of live Music - Friday and Saturday 8pm - 11:30pm licence.

The music coming from the [redacted] premises has been unbearable at times and the high level of music can continue and prolong till early hours of the morning. As a working Optician, I do work on Saturdays from early morning to evening and for me to be kept awake till 2am is neither fair nor healthy. I have been suffering from an unsteady cycle of sleep and insomnia due to the constant loud music emanating from the premises due to the inconsiderate nature of the previous owners. I myself have been residing at my above address for the whole duration of my life and I still remember my Mother calling the council for over a decade now to make them aware of the situation and the fact that she at the time had girls living in the same flat who were studying and still at school and that their sleep was being disrupted every weekend and on several occasions weekdays as well. Now that I am working, it should not make it any less of a problems that I cannot get to sleep until 2am for at least three days in the week because the council have granted a licence for the below bar to play music at a 'low level', which as we both know that promise has not and most likely will not be upheld. My parents are both above 60 years old, my father reaching 70 and I think it is fair to say that they deserve their rest more than I do.

We have had several owner of the below premises promising us that the music level shall be kept at a low; some owners have asked us to contact them directly if the noise exceeds beyond their promised level. This has been attempted in the past, where I have been in direct contact with the owner to lower the noise however after a few weeks of interaction with them I have eventually faced the phone being rudely put down on me, dismissal of my request to lower the music and refusal to cooperate with me. I have then been resulted to contact the council repeatedly to complain about the noise. It is not fair that I have been kept awake till the early hours of the morning with music pounding through my walls. It is not fair that I have to hear the music all the way up into the f of my flat to my bedroom till the early hours of the morning. It is not fair that do not look forward to coming back home any more from work on Friday as I anticipate the music to start raging through my floor at 9pm. It is not fair that I cannot have a quiet night in just as how others are entitled to. I don't think anyone would tolerate this way of life.

The licence for alcohol that they are appealing and applying for has also affected us, the residents. Due to high consumption of alcohol it has been witnessed that men come to urinate near the minicab office next to the bar, which is also happens to be an entrance for us residents to get to our flats. I do not appreciate having to walk through someone else's filth on my way to work early in the morning on a Saturday after they have had their Friday night at the bar. Alcohol as we all known can instigate violence and antisocial behaviour as well as noise from the bar goers themselves and this within itself is another noise nuisance as well as danger to my family. People have been witness loitering and drinking at ridiculous hours of the night and day. As a young woman myself, it is unfortunate that I have to be twice as cautious coming back home even at a reasonable hour of 9pm from work as there are already drunken individuals roaming around the entrance to my residence. Even though my gender should NOT be a factor however it is and I have been approached SEVERAL times by drunken males loitering around the area and emerging from the bar itself. It is NOT FAIR that I have to fear my own safety and quite literally run and fumble through the entrance to my OWN residence in the fear that I could be attacked or sexually assaulted by a drunken individual. I do not appreciate that I have to live in fear around an area I have resided in for 24 years of my life just because a bar and lounge would like to open their antisocial and unreasonable services in a residential area.

I hope that my points will be taken into consideration. I appreciate that businesses need to go on however not at the expense of our safety, health and peace within our own homes within which we have resided far longer than they may have even proposed the idea of running their businesses.

REASONS FOR REPRESENTATIONS UNDER THE FOUR LICENSING OBJECTIVES:

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

I am [REDACTED] 2 Brownlow Road Bounds Green N11 2DN. This is the flat directly above the premises which an application has been made for a licence for Provision of Late Night Refreshment, Supply of Alcohol, Playing of Recorded 12pm - 3am Music - Monday to Sunday performance of live Music - Friday and Saturday 8pm - 11:30pm.

I oppose the grant of this licence on the grounds of it causing a public nuisance. My tenants live in the flat directly above and have complained about the loud music being played without any consideration for the residential premises above.

The noise interferes with the quality of sleep of the tenants and they are denied the quiet enjoyment of their premises. They are unable to watch TV in peace, or entertain their friends. The tenants are students and require solitude to be able to concentrate on their studies and are disturbed by the increased undesirable elements this licence brings.

I have had tenants move out of my flat in the past because it is easier for them to find a quieter place to live than to go through all this hassle about complaining to the Council, calling the out of hours noise abatement team, etc.

The Council has granted this licence previously, and are aware of the increased noise levels which generate complaints from the residential areas above. It is beyond my comprehension why the Council continues to entertain the grant of such a licence at this premises, without any consideration of the continual misery it causes the residents of the flats above.

The occupants of this restaurant has changed a couple of times and each time the residents of the flats are put through the misery and requirement of making repeated representations and complaints. This is very unfair! We do have better things to do with our time other than being forced to make applications to the Council to prevent this licence from being granted time and time again.

It is unfair that each time loud music is played at a late hour, the residents have to call the out of hours noise team, to attend the premises at ridiculous hours to monitor the noise levels, before something can be done to stop the music.

This is a time when people are meant to be resting, not forced to make complaints in order to fulfil a basic human need of undisturbed sleep! It is against the tenants human rights that they are subjected to this Inhumane behaviour. My tenants are kept awake by the loud music and find it difficult to get up in the morning due to the lack of sleep.

My neighbour has evidence they can present showing the number of times this disturbance has occurred going back over two years. Fortunately for me, I do not live at the premises, so I am unable to provide corroborating evidence however, the Council is fully aware of the complaints they have received.

I would like to put it to the members of the committee considering the grant of this licence and ask how they would feel if they were a resident of the flats above this type of establishment where they are harassed and subjected to loud music and undesirable louts hanging around outside of your residence in the early morning hours.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

The grant of this licence encourages crime and disorder, because people leaving the premises are at a high risk of being intoxicated. Men do at present urinate outside the front entrance to the flats (near the mini cab office) and make the place smell and it is unhygienic and disgusting to be have no alternative but to walk through other people's urine.

There is an increase of undesirable people hanging around late at night and into the early hours of the morning around the entrances to the flats. They also cause a disturbance.

Public Safety

The safety of the residents upstairs is compromised by the increase of undesirable types of people hanging around the entrances of the flats.

I would like you to consider that once someone gets past the entrance doors, it would be very easy for someone to slip in behind a resident and attack them out of view of the general public. You need to see a physical photo of the area and the entrances of the residential area to realise how dangerous and easily this can be accomplished.



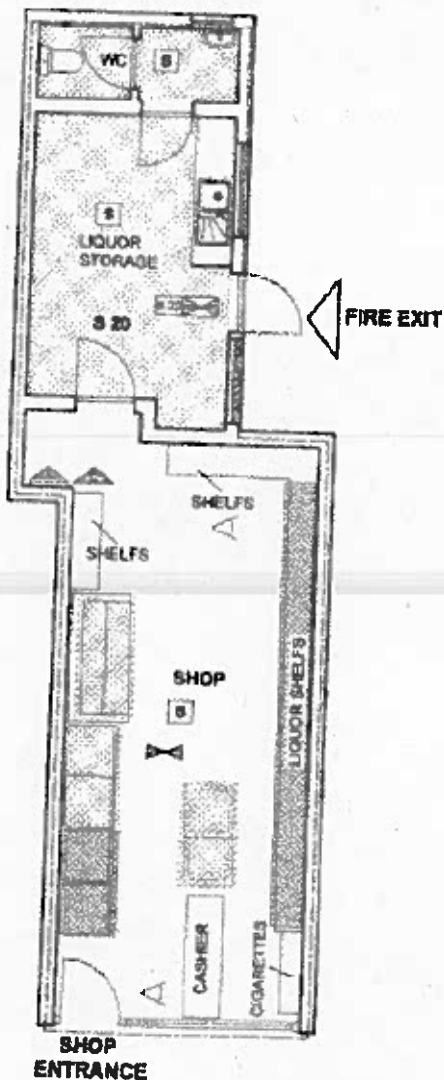



This venue has applied to vary its times authorised to sell alcohol from the present:

This venue is situated in Seven Sisters Road which is known for street drinkers. There is a Public Houses near to venue. Police consider that whilst they must be proportionate with regards allowing a business to thrive they must be equally proportionate in not allowing a business to risk contributing to crime / disorder and anti-social behaviour.

Police consider the suggested hours below to be reasonable.

Monday to Sunday 07.00 – 2.00am

With regards the application to sell alcohol 24 hours Police feel that persons frequenting the venue to purchase alcohol after 0200 may well be already alcohol fuelled from other 'On License' venues or previously consuming alcohol in the street or residential premises. The basic consideration is the requirement for the ability for members of the public to purchase alcohol in the early hours of the morning, in this case between 0200 and 0700, compared to the risk of increased drunkenness affecting others suffering crime / disorder and anti-social behaviour.

Whilst Police accept there are other venues selling alcohol throughout the night they do not consider that a blanket justification for nearby venues to be given the same authorised hours.

With regards the present Premises Licence Police consider it appropriate to request the following Conditions be applied under Crime & Disorder:

A digital CCTV system to be installed in the premises.

Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance doors from the inside.

Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification.

Cameras must be sited to cover all areas to which the public have access including frontage of venue.

Provide a linked record of the date, time of any image.

Provide good quality images - colour during opening times.

Have a monitor to review images and recorded quality.

Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture and retention.

Member of staff trained in operating CCTV present during times venue is open to the public.

Digital images must be kept for 31 days. The equipment must have a suitable export method, e.g. CD/DVD writer so that Police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. Copies must be available within a reasonable time to Police on request.

An incident log shall be kept at the premises, it will be in a hardback durable format handwritten at the time of the incident or as near to as is reasonable and made available on request to the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

I am writing to make representation in regard to your application for premises licence for the premise at 525 Seven Sisters Road, Tottenham, London, N15 6EP. The conditions offered in the application form do not reflect any consideration being given to the make up of the local area and the potential impact the business may have if it were to go for later hours.

In determining what conditions are appropriate, it will be necessary to consider the individual circumstances of the premises, including:-

- The nature and style of the venue,
- The activities being conducted there,
- The location, and,
- Anticipated clientele.

We would particularly like to remind applicants of their existing legal obligations regarding:-

- Not offering irresponsible Drinks Promotions,
 - Not selling alcohol to a person who is drunk, and
 - have a written underage sales policy
- Licensees and premises supervisors are also reminded of the offence of selling alcohol to a person who is drunk, and to ensure that all staff are aware of the consequences.

Street drinking issues already exist in the area and area cause for concern with the police and local authority having to carry out joint operations to deal with the men that gather and consume alcohol in this area and along Seven sisters Road.

We do not feel that there are any conditions offered that show how your client has thought of the make up of the area and the potential impact that this application will have. Applicants are expected to cover these issues and detail them in their operating schedule. Failure to do so may result in the refusal of the application.

We have concerns that this premises is situated in an area where there are also a number of premises that sell alcohol.

Under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, applicants are expected to demonstrate their knowledge of local issues and what they will do to adopt strategies to avoid the exasperation of such issues. The application is completely void of this important information. The applicant

demonstrates an inadequate understanding of the area and has failed to demonstrate in their application that their operation would not add to the existing issues already impacting on this area.

We would not support any extension to hours at this time as we do not have confidence in the management of the premises in ensuring that responsible retailing of alcohol will be at the heart of the day to day operation. If your client is able to put forward some conditions to demonstrate how they will better support the licensing objectives we will reconsider.

In doing so we would consider additional conditions such as:

No sales of single cans of beers/lagers/ciders.

Not to sell or stock beers/ciders/lagers with ABVs above 6.5%

Training of staff to ensure they are aware of who the DPS is and their social responsibility for selling alcohol.

Ensure that alcohol and tobacco are only purchased from reputable sources.
