LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE HEARINGS PROCEDURE SUMMARY

INTRODUCTION

1. The Chair introduces him/herself and invites other Members, Council officers, Police, Applicant and Objectors to do the same.
2. The Chair invites Members to disclose
 - i) any prior contacts (before the hearing) with the parties or representations received by them; and separately
 - ii) any declarations of interest.
3. The Chair explains the procedure to be followed by reference to this summary which will be distributed in advance.

NON-ATTENDANCE BY PARTY OR PARTIES

4. If one or both of the parties fails to attend, the Chair decides whether to:
 - (i) grant an adjournment to another date, or
 - (ii) proceed in the absence of the non-attending party.
 Normally, an absent party will be given one further opportunity to attend.

TOPIC HEADINGS

5. The Chair suggests the “topic headings” for the hearing. In the case of the majority of applications for variation of hours, or other terms and conditions, the main topic is:

Whether the extensions of hours etc. applied for would conflict with the four licensing objectives i.e.

- (i) the prevention of crime and disorder,
- (ii) public safety,
- (iii) the prevention of public nuisance, and
- (iv) the protection of children from harm.

6. The Chair invites comments from the parties on any other topic headings to be discussed.

WITNESSES

7. The Chair asks whether there are any requests by a party to call a witness and decides any such request.
8. Only if a witness is to be called, the Chair then asks if there is a request by an opposing party to “cross-examine” the witness. The Chair then decides any such request.

DOCUMENTARY EVIDENCE

9. The Chair asks whether there are any requests by any party to introduce late documentary evidence.
10. If so, the Chair will ask the other party if they object to the admission of the late documents.
11. If the other party do object to the admission of documents which have only been produced by the first party at the hearing, then the documents shall not generally be admitted.

12.	If the other party object to documents produced late but before the hearing, the following criteria shall be taken into account when the Chair decides whether or not to admit the late documents:
(i)	What is the reason for the documents being late?
(ii)	Will the other party be unfairly taken by surprise by the late documents?
(iii)	Will the party seeking to admit late documents be put at a major disadvantage if admission of the documents is refused?
(iv)	Is the late evidence really important?
(v)	Would it be better and fairer to adjourn to a later date?
THE LICENSING OFFICER'S INTRODUCTION	
13.	The Licensing Officer introduces the report explaining, for example, the existing hours, the hours applied for and the comments of the other Council Services or outside official bodies. This should be as "neutral" as possible between the parties.
14.	The Licensing Officer can be questioned by Members and then by the parties.
THE HEARING	
15.	This takes the form of a discussion led by the Chair. The Chair can vary the order as appropriate but it should include:
(i)	an introduction by the Objectors' main representative
(ii)	an introduction by the Applicant or representative
(iii)	questions put by Members to the Objectors
(iv)	questions put by Members to the Applicant
(v)	questions put by the Objectors to the Applicant
(vi)	questions put by the Applicant to the Objectors
CLOSING ADRESSES	
16.	The Chair asks each party how much time is needed for their closing address, if they need to make one.
17.	Generally, the Objectors make their closing address before the Applicant who has the right to the final closing address.
THE DECISION	
18.	Members retire with the Committee Clerk and legal representative to consider their decision including the imposition of conditions.
19.	The decision is confirmed in writing within five working days of the hearing.

2 Background

- 2.1 The premises has held a late licence in the past under the previous owner this licence was subject to a Review by residents due to noise nuisance and related anti social behaviour from patrons leaving the venue in the early hours of the morning and causing noise nuisance out in the side streets. The Council determined to reduce the hours to ensure that the noise nuisance did not prolong into the early hours. This was then endorsed by the Magistrates on appeal.

The current operators took over the premises on 27th May 2016 and have received a Simple Caution due to breaching of licence conditions in operating beyond the terms of the licence in May 2017.

- 2.2. Council officers are satisfied that the application has been made and advertised correctly.

3 Relevant Representations

- 3.1 All representations have to meet a basic legal and administrative requirements. If they fail to do so they cannot be accepted. The person or body sending the representation must give an explanation for rejection in writing.

- 4 All the responsible authorities have been consulted about this application. They are as follows:

- The Licensing Authority
- The Metropolitan Police
- The London Fire and Emergency Planning Authority
- Planning
- Health and Safety (includes Building Control)
- Noise Environmental Health
- Food Environmental Health

- Public Health

6 Licensing Officer comments

- 6.1 The following information is intended to advise Members of the relevant aspects of the Statement of Licensing Policy, guidance issued by the Secretary of State, legislation and good practice. Members may depart from the Councils Policy and or Section 182 Guidance provided they consider it appropriate to do so and provide clear reasons for their decision.

- 6.2 Committee will also wish to be aware of the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Licensing is about regulating the provision of licensable activities on licensed premises, by qualifying clubs and at temporary events within the terms of the Licensing Act 2003. The terms and conditions attached to various permissions are focused on matters which are within the control of individual licensees and others granted relevant permissions. Accordingly, these matters will centre on the premises and places being used for licensable activities and the vicinity of those premises and places.

- 6.3 The objective of the licensing process is to allow for the carrying on of retail sales of alcohol and the prevention of public nuisance, prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and protection of children from harm. It is the Licensing Authority's wish to facilitate well run and managed premises with licence holders displaying sensitivity to the impact of the premises on local residents.

- 6.4 In considering licence applications, where relevant representations are made, this
-

Licensing Authority will consider the adequacy of measures proposed to deal with the potential for public nuisance and/or public disorder having regard to all the circumstances of the case.

- 6.5 Where relevant representations are made, this authority will demand stricter conditions with regard to noise control in areas that have denser residential accommodation, but this will not limit opening hours without regard for the individual merits of any application. This authority will consider each application and work with the parties concerned to ensure that adequate noise control measures are in place. Any action taken to promote the licensing objectives will be appropriate and proportionate.
- 6.6 Also The Licensing Authority may not impose conditions unless its discretion has been exercised following receipt of relevant representations and it is satisfied as a result of the hearing that it is appropriate to impose conditions to promote one or more of the four licensing objectives. Therefore conditions may not be imposed for the purpose other than promoting the licensing objectives and in some cases no additional conditions will be required.
- 6.7 The Licensing Act 2003 permits children of any ages to be on the premises which primarily sells alcohol provided they are accompanied by an adult. It is not necessary to make this a condition.
- 6.8 In cases Members should make their decisions on the civil burden of proof, that is the balance of probability.
- 6.9 Members should consider in all cases whether or not primary legislation is the appropriate method of regulation and should only consider licence conditions when the circumstances in their view are not already adequately covered elsewhere.
- 6.10 The Government has advised that conditions must be tailored to the individual type, location and characteristics of the premises and events concerned. Conditions cannot seek to manage the behaviour of customers once they are beyond the direct management of the licence holder and their staff.
The Councils Licensing policy generally expects applicants to address the licensing objectives and discuss how to do this with the relevant responsible authorities.

7 Options:

- 7.1 The Authority must, having regard to the application and the representations, take such steps (if any), as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are:

In determining this application the Sub-Committee may take any of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, namely:

- To grant the licence subject to such conditions as are consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application, modified to such extent as the authority considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates.
- To refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor.
- To reject the application.

For the purposes of the Licensing Act 2003 the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them are altered or omitted or a new condition added.

- 8 The licensing authority's determination of this application is subject to a 21 day appeal period or if the decision is appealed the date of the appeal is determined and /or

disposed of.

9. Other considerations

Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 states:

“Without prejudice to any other obligation imposed on it, it shall be the duty of each authority to which this section applies to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those function on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent crime and disorder in its area”.

9.1 Human Rights

While all Convention Rights must be considered, those which are of particular relevance to the application are:

- Article 8 – Right to respect for private and family life.
- Article 1 of the First Protocol – Protection of Property
- Article 6(1) – Right to a fair hearing.
- Article 10 – Freedom of Expression

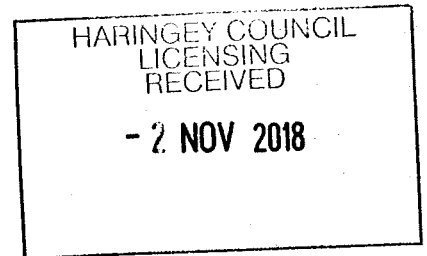

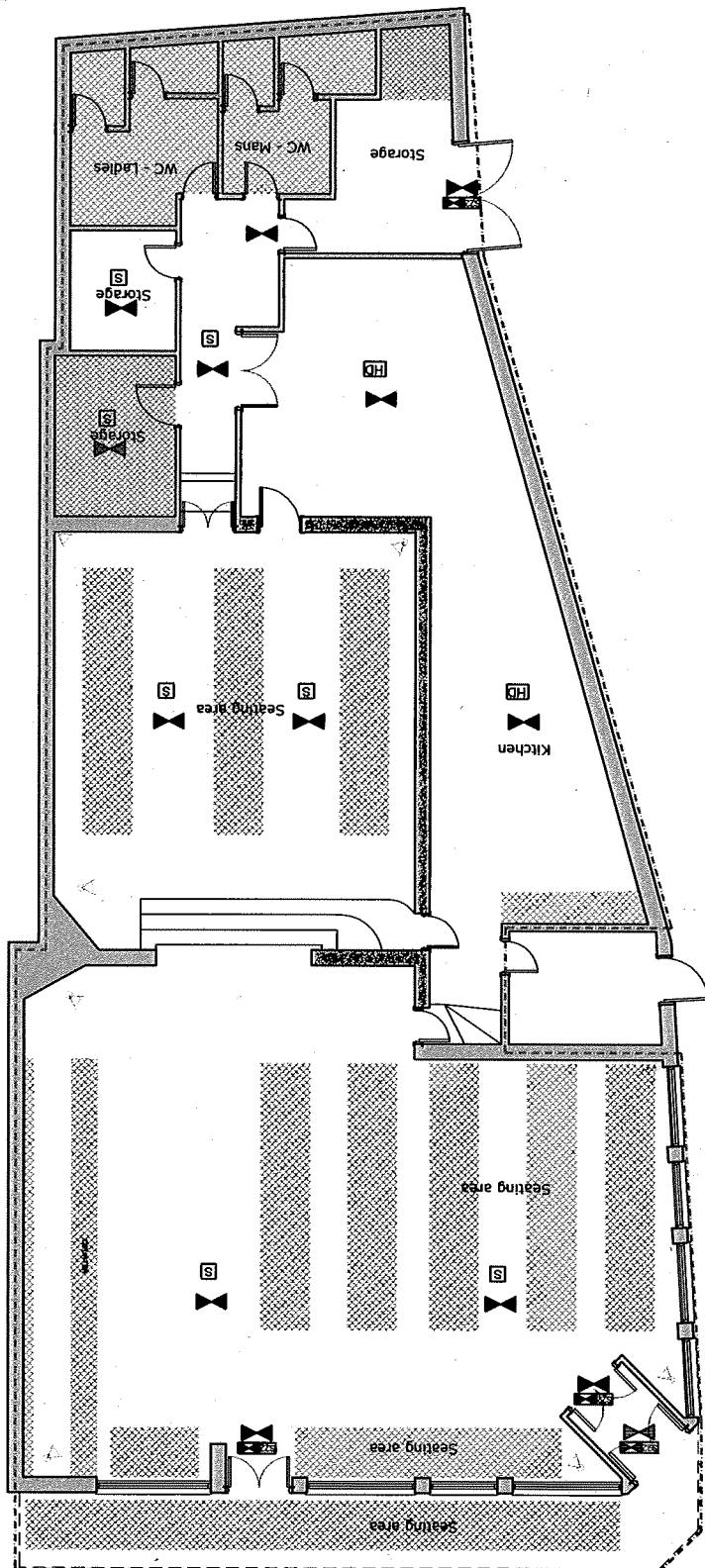

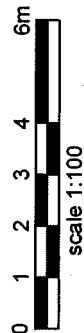

The premises has in the past been a source of noise complaints that affected nearby residents, the location of the venue is also on a very busy street corner that has had anti social behaviour problems. The premises previously held a late licence that was reviewed due to noise related issues from the late night operation. The premises are not best suited for such late hours as the noise from patrons affects nearby residents.

Within the Councils own Statement of licensing Policy state that the Council will generally deal with the issue of licensing hours having due regard to the individual merits of each application, considering the potential for nuisance associated with the style, characteristics and activities of the business and type of premises, examining any steps that might reduce the risk of nuisance.

However, although the Council will treat each case on its individual merits, generally it will not grant permission for licensable activities beyond 2330 hours on Sundays to Thursdays and Midnight on Fridays and Saturdays in respect of public houses situated in areas having denser residential accommodation. The Council would expect good reasons to be given to support any application for extensions beyond these hours, including addressing possible disturbance to residents and local parking. Additionally, in these areas consideration will be given to imposing stricter conditions in respect of noise control.

We note that the conditions offered do not actually offer anything specific other than actions that are already law and need to be complied with in any event.

We therefore propose that the premises licence not be extended and the hours of operation remain as they currently are.

The requested times for regulated activity including alcohol sales in the application it to extend alcohol them until 0200 Sunday to Thursday and 0330 Friday and Saturday with the venue closing 30 minutes later.

This venue under previous ownership was Reviewed in 2015 relating to noise related public nuisance emanating from venue and crime and disorder at venue and outside venue. The result was appealed to Magistrates Court and

heard on 2nd February 2016 upholding the reduction in licensable hours instigated by the original Licensing Committee. Whilst the venues present license holders have successfully had removed a Condition relating to all drinks must be served in plastics as the acts of violence associated with the venue has ceased Police consider the risk of noise related anti-social behaviour to be the same as venue is still in a residential area, side of venue in Stanley Road N15 a residential street where with limited parking available in vicinity clients are likely to legally park. Stanley Road had long-term noise related public nuisance from this venue when it opened until 0330 as alcohol fuelled clients return to their cars making noise from talking and playing radios and after some years the Licensing Review was brought to stop the problem resulting in a reduction of hours. The venue now wishes to open until 0400 Friday and Saturdays. Police do not consider reversing the Licensing Committees decision, supported by the Magistrate, to be reasonable as the same noise related anti-social behaviour is likely to reoccur and therefore object to any extension in licensable hours or time of opening.

I as a representative of the Director of Public Health act as the responsible authority under the Licensing Act 2003 and would like to make a representation against the application from GOLDEN SANDS LIMITED, 433-435 WEST GREEN ROAD, LONDON N15 3PL

Tackling alcohol misuse is key to achieving the outcomes in Haringey's Health and Wellbeing Strategy: giving every child the best start in life, reducing the gap in life expectancy between the east and west of the borough and improving mental health and wellbeing. We want to create a culture that prevents problem drinking from starting and provides help for people early on should they be struggling. One of the ways we will be doing this is ensuring health considerations are taken into account in any licensing decisions, through community safety efforts to tackle alcohol crime and anti-social behaviour.

The representation is made under the following licensing objectives:

- Public Nuisance
- Protecting Children From Harm

After reviewing the application, I believe that the premises have not given enough careful consideration as to how they will uphold the licensing objectives, particularly relating to public nuisance and protecting children from harm.

Background:

Haringey experiences some of the greatest levels of alcohol-related problems in London and the harm due to alcohol is a growing concern. In the five year period of 2009/10 – 2014/15, alcohol related hospital admissions increased by 38% with the local cost of these admissions now estimated to be £7.5 million annually. During the same time period, the (DSR) rate of admissions per Haringey person also increased for both men and women, 31% and 26% respectively. Across the borough, there are currently over 800 licensed premises for the sale and supply of alcohol and this figure continues to rise, with some areas of high level clustering. Increasingly, evidence shows us that an increased number of alcohol outlets results in significant increases in both alcohol consumption and alcohol-related harm, including injury, violence and medical harm. Many factors are known to influence this including density of licensed premises and trading hours.

The premises is located on West Green road, a busy main road, with a number of businesses in the area. Turnpike Lane underground station, a busy commuter underground station, is 0.5km away. There are 3 primary schools and 1 secondary school located within 500m of the premises (see Figure 1). There are residential areas nearby. The premises on West Green Road falls within the St Ann's Ward.

The venue has previously been licenced until 03:00, but clients parked in Stanley Road N15, a nearby residential street. When clients left in the early hours of the morning, they woke residents of the street with loud talking, arguing and playing music in their cars. The license hours were reviewed and reduced.

Protecting Children from Harm:

There are 3 primary schools and 1 secondary school within 500m of the premise.

Therefore, we would encourage any license holder to be responsible and clear on implementing the Challenge 25 policy.

Recommendation:

Whilst Public Health welcomes the consideration given in the existing operating schedule as to how the applicant will uphold the licensing objectives, we have significant concerns over the requested operating hours, given the proximity to the residential area with a high number of schools in close proximity to the premises. Therefore, we have concerns that licensable activities into the early hours of the morning may cause nuisance and disruption to local residents living in the surrounding area.

Whilst the applicant has proposed use of a noise limiter for recorded and live music played in the premises, Public Health are not satisfied with the proposals for controlling patrons that would be leaving the premises at all hours of the morning.

I as the Director of Public Health therefore recommend that the application to extend the hours for the supply and sale of alcohol by GOLDEN SANDS LIMITED, 433-435 WEST GREEN ROAD, LONDON N15 3PL is refused, as the extension of licensing hours is unlikely to uphold the licensing objectives in relation to Public Nuisance and Protecting Children from Harm.

If the extension of the licence is to be granted, Public Health recommend that the following conditions are to be attached (in addition to those listed in the existing operating schedule) to minimise any potential harm to our local residents:

Public nuisance

- Litter – clearing public area immediately surrounding premise daily if consumption is taking place off premises

Safeguarding children

- Display notice where it can be clearly seen about operating a 'Challenge 25' policy

Dealing with drunkenness

- All staff shall be trained in recognising signs of drunkenness, how to refuse service and the premises duty of care. Documented records of training completed shall be kept for each member of staff. Training shall be regularly refreshed and at no greater than 6 monthly intervals. Training records shall be made available for inspection upon request by a police officer or an authorised officer of the Council.

Map of Schools within a 500m radius of N15 3PL

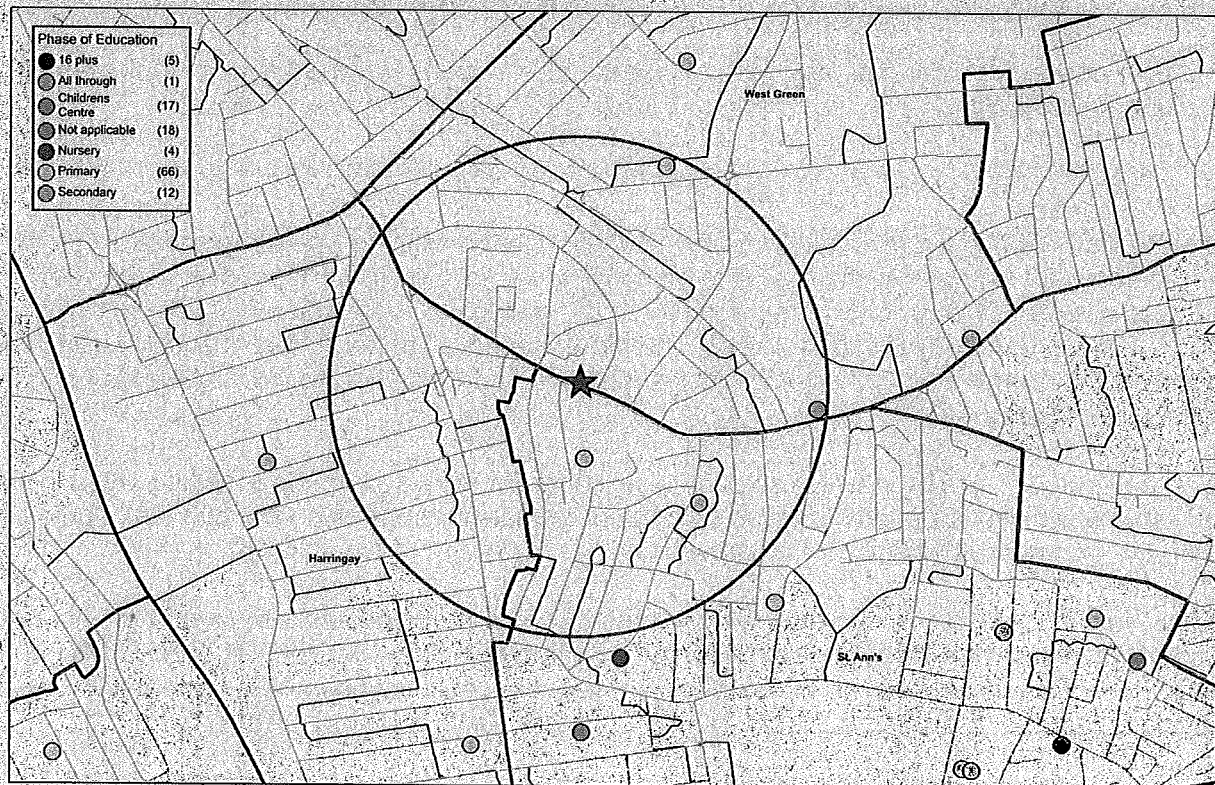

Public Nuisance:

As stated in Haringey's Statement of Licensing Policy 2016-2021 "licensed premises, especially those that operate late at night or in the early hours of the morning, can give rise to a range of nuisances that may potentially impact on people living, working or sleeping in the vicinity of the premises. Principal concerns relate to noise nuisance, light pollution and noxious smells."

The application to serve alcohol Sunday to Thursday 2300 to 0200 hours, Friday to Saturday 1100 to 0330 hours, and supply of alcohol ON and OFF the premises on Good Friday, Christmas Day, St. Patrick's Day from 1100 to 0330 hours and New Years day 24 hours, goes against what is stated in the Alcohol Licensing Policy 2016 – 2021 on opening / alcohol supply hours.

The Alcohol Licensing Policy 2016 – 2021 states 'While the Council will treat each case on its individual merits there will be a presumption that permitted hours for the sale of alcohol will be restricted to between 8am and 11.30pm on Sunday to Thursday and 8am to midnight on Friday and Saturday in respect of premises in residential areas and areas being adversely affected by street drinking issues'.

The premises' current licence for supply of alcohol is currently Monday to Thursday 1000 to 2330, Friday 1000 to 0030, Saturday 1100 to 0030, Sunday 1200 to 2330, Good Friday 1200 to 2220, Christmas Day 1200 to 1450 hrs and 1900 to 2220.

We have specific concerns about the impact of operating later in the night / into the early hours of the morning on local families living in this area, with residences nearby.

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
