1. Describe the issue under consideration

- 1.1 An application has been submitted by Taco Time Ltd for a licence to allow licensable activity of late night refreshment. App 1
- 1.2 The applicant is seeking the following hours:

Late Night Refreshment

Monday to Sunday 2300 to 0300 hours

Hours open to the Public

Monday to Sunday 1030 to 0300 hours

- 1.3 Representations have been received against this application by 'other persons'. APP2 Representations from RAs, Police, Licensing Authority withdrawn -App 3
- 1.4 As such, in accordance with the legislation the Licensing Authority must hold a hearing to consider the application and any relevant representations.

1.5 Representations

Residents representations can be found at Appendix 2. The Committee is advised that crime profile for the ward as been provided but does not reflect the Gladstone Ave location in particular. The statistics used cover the whole of the Noel Park Ward, which includes the entire Shopping City on Wood Green High Road, which in itself can be a hub of crime. It also covers Wood Green Underground Station and part of Turnpike Lane Underground Station, which are major travel hubs

2 Background

2.1 The premises has operated as a café on the and an estate agents in recent years. The cafe which operated as Black Tap Café held a premises allowing to to operate as follows;

Supply of Alcohol



Monday to Sunday 1100 to 2300

The opening hours of the premises:

Monday to Sunday 0700 to 2330

There are reports lodged in relation to waste issues against the previous cafe operation.

2.2. Council officers are satisfied that the application for Taco Bell has been made and advertised correctly.

3 Relevant Respresentations

- 3.1 All representations have to meet a basic legal and administrative requirements. If they fail to do so they cannot be accepted. When rejected the person or body sending the representation must be written and an explanation for rejection given in writing.
- 3.2 A responsible authority or other person can make a representation. There are two tests for other persons and only one for a responsible authority. The two tests are contained in Section 18 of the Act.
- 3.3 All representations must be "about the likely effect of the grant of the premises licence on the promotion of the licensing objectives" Likely means something that will probably happen, i.e on balance more likely than not.
- 3.4 Representations from responsible authorities do not have to meet the second test of not being vexatious and frivolous. Other persons have to meet this test.
- 3.5 The representations from Residents (Appendix 2) cite the potential for noise and anti social behaviour remaining into late in the morning from patrons attending the venue.
- 4 All the responsible authorities have been consulted about this application. They are as follows:

The applicant has offered measures in the operating schedule of the application that they say address the promotion of the Licensing Objectives. These can be found at Appendix 1.

6 Licensing Officer comments

6.1 The following information is intended to advise Members of the relevant aspects of the Statement of Licensing Police, guidance issued by the Secretary of State, legislation and good practice. Members may depart from the Councils Policy and or Section 182 Guidance provided they consider it appropriate to do so and provide clear reasons for their decision.



- 6.2 Committee will also wish to be aware of the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Licensing is about regulating the provision of licensable activities on licensed premises, by qualifying clubs and at temporary events within the terms of the Licensing Act 2003. The terms and conditions attached to various permissions are focused on matters which are within the control of individual licensees and others granted relevant permissions. Accordingly, these matters will centre on the premises and places being used for licensable activities and the vicinity of those premises and places.
- 6.3 It is the Licensing Authority's wish to facilitate well run and managed premises with licence holders displaying sensitivity to the impact of the premises on local residents.
- 6.4 In considering licence applications, where relevant representations are made, this Licensing Authority will consider the adequacy of measures proposed to deal with the potential for public nuisance and/or public disorder having regard to all the circumstances of the case.
- 6.5 Where relevant representations are made, this authority will demand stricter conditions with regard to noise control in areas that have denser residential accommodation, but this will not limit opening hours without regard for the individual merits of any application. This authority will consider each application and work with the parties concerned to ensure that adequate noise control measures are in place. Any action taken to promote the licensing objectives will be appropriate and proportionate.
- 6.6 Also The Licensing Authority may not impose conditions unless its discretion has been exercised following receipt of relevant representations and it is satisfied as a result of the hearing that it is appropriate to impose conditions to promote one or more of the four licensing objectives. Therefore conditions may not be imposed for the purpose other than promoting the licensing objectives and in some cases no additional conditions will be required.
- 6.7 In cases Members should make their decisions on the civil burden of proof, that is the balance of probability.
- 6.8 Members should consider in all cases whether or not primary legislation is the appropriate method of regulation and should only consider licence conditions when the circumstances in their view are not already adequately covered elsewhere.
- 6.9 The Government has advised that conditions must be tailored to the individual type, location and characteristics of the premises and events concerned. Conditions cannot seek to manage the behaviour of customers once they are beyond the direct management of the licence holder and their staff.
 The Councils Licensing policy generally expects applicants to address the licensing objectives and discuss how to do this with the relavant responsible authorities.

7 Options:

7.1 The Authority must, having regard to the application and the representations, take such steps (if any), as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are:

In determining this application the Sub-Committee may take any of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, namely:



- To grant the licence subject to such conditions as are consistent with the
 operating schedule accompanying the application, modified to such extent as
 the authority considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licesable activities to which the application relates.
- To refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor.
- To reject the application.

For the purposes of the Licensing Act 2003 the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them are altered or omitted or a new condition added.

8 The licensing authority's determination of this application is subject to a 21 day appeal period or if the decision is appealed the date of the appeal is determined and /or disposed of

9. Other considerations

Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 states:

"Without prejudice to any other obligation imposed on it, it shall be the duty of each authority to which this section applies to exercise its various functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those function on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent crime and disorder in its area".



We have been made aware that a license application for new premises has been submitted for number 1 / 2 Gladstone House, High Road, Wood Green N22 6JS.

As per information found outside these premises, we came to know that it would be a late-night refreshment business, open 7 days a week from late evening up to 3am.

This raises few concerns from our side; we moved to 9 Gladstone Avenue last September and we knew it would have been a busy area with several shops and restaurants although we were happy to rent in the proximity of 2 coffee shops knowing these would have been open only during daytime.

An activity open from 2300-0300 would severely disrupt our day-to-day life in our neighbourhood; we already experience clusters of people gathering outside our front gate at any given time playing loud music from their cars and generally being loud until late evening, to also add that daily we find rubbish been thrown in our front yard. An activity such as Taco-Time Limited opened at the times mentioned above would only add the noise pollution in our area and would encourage groups of people congregating until early mornings.

It is not specified if this activity has applied for an alcohol licence but if this were the case it would only increase our concerns; we often come back very late in the evening and/or leave very early in the morning and we would not feel safe to walk among individuals under the influence of alcohol whilst going home, which is just few doors away from this new business.

As we are aware that also few other neighbours have raised similar concern on this subject, we sincerely hope this email will be taken in serious consideration prior approving the mentioned licence for Taco-Time Limited.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance I would like the council to consider reducing the requested opening hours of Taco Bell, from 3am to midnight instead. The premises is on the edge of the Noel Park residential area. This area already suffers from high volumes of traffic, litter from the high street, and antisocial behaviour - mainly from individuals hanging around on the streets at night, running their car engines for lengthy periods, often in the middle of the night (after midnight), which is disturbing residents and adding to the already poor air quality in the area. No other premises on the high street is open beyond midnight, as far as I'm aware. I am concerned that allowing Taco Bell to open until 3am will encourage antisocial behaviour which will be a detriment to the residents of Noel Park.
Secondly I am concerned that another fast food restaurant will further exacerbate the litter problems in Wood Green high street, and Gladstone Avenue/ Noel Park area. Individuals regularly dump rubbish from their takeaways on the roads in Noel Park, as they eat the food in their cars and leave the remains on the road. This was already a very regular occurrence prior to the pandemic.  As Haringey council is already stretched for resources, it is clear that the litter has become difficult to stay on top of, and the presence of another fast food outlet will inevitably add to this issue. Unfortunately, we cannot rely on residents and visitors to Wood Green to make use of the public bins provided, or take their litter home with them.

## RE: Objections to Taco Bell application for a license to provide late night refreshments

Based on my experiences with the recent coffee shop that was operating on the same premises at Gladstone House until March 2021, I have experienced first-hand, the problems associated with a food/drink provider, ie. premises like a restaurant/cafe. My concerns remain high for several reasons with reference to the same premises where food was served before, albeit a different company. The following are reasons why I am objecting to Taco-Bell opening at Gladstone House under the current licensing proposals – the concerns have been categorized under the four licensing objectives. For your information, I also have concerns about ANY food provider operating next door, and will therefore also be in touch with the council planning team and anti-social behaviour team.

#### <u>Licensing Objective 1 - Prevention of crime and disorder</u>

People urinating outside the premises – I have seen people urinating outside Gladstone House on more than one occasion. It is a frequent occurrence, and I have informed the council about this. In England and Wales 'public urination' is an offence under the 1986 Public Order Act. The council are aware of this problem, and I am currently unsure what steps are being considered to tackle this problem. With more people using their premises, and also late at night, there is a strong likelihood of this becoming a worse problem. The business owners never do anything about this. I'm afraid this demonstrates a lack of responsibility in looking after the surrounding area of the building. If it happens late at night or in the early hours, are they prepared to report this behaviour? Whose responsibility is it to monitor/report urinating around the back of the building, as the previous proprietor didn't do any anything about this. Neither did the building owner. Please note this is an act of crime and disorderly behaviour, and is illegal

**People gathering outside the premises** – To the front of the premises, even though the pavement is spacious, the junction is very busy and there is often antisocial behaviour and violence against other customers and passers-by. Recent crimes and incidents reported in the area would verify this – the figures indicate a high number of reported crimes and the most popular crimes are listed on the metropolitan police website (<a href="https://www.police.uk/pu/your-area/metropolitan-police-service/noel-park/">https://www.police.uk/pu/your-area/metropolitan-police-service/noel-park/</a>) as follows:

- Anti-social behaviour 75
- Violence and sexual offences 45
- Vehicle crime 30
- Other theft 23

The above shows the most commonly reported crimes in Feb 2021 in this area (Please confirm if you wish to have further evidence of these – I would need to request these from the police, but the council should also have these records which may be accessible to the licensing team.)

My point is – any business that opens late at night would inevitably attract more people, and therefore there is a strong likelihood that there is an increased risk of crime and disorderly conduct in the area. Even though the proposed premises would

not be selling alcohol, people have access to alcohol at the Weatherspoon just opposite Gladstone House.

Cars parking illegally or loitering at the junction or performing U-turns – Every day, there are cars performing U-turns on the corner of Gladstone Avenue. On many occasions, there are people crossing the roads, and it is an accident waiting to happen! With more people gathering at Gladstone House, the likelihood of people stopping their cars and potentially causing an accident, remains high.

## Licensing Objective 2 - Prevention of public nuisance

Poor food waste management – the restaurant/cafe/fresh-food/drink provider failed to secure their food-waste, and this encouraged pests and vermin to have a constant supply of food. This became a problem for the whole local area. Complaints to the restaurant owner were futile. And despite having several complaints, the local authority was not able to correct the problem or impose any sanctions. Food waste bins were always full and left open. Rats would pick up food from the bins and then enter my back garden with the food, so I know that the rats had access to food at the cafe. Despite numerous complaints to the council, there have been no steps to address this problem. The poorly managed food-waste bins at the back were kept in a site which is never cleaned. It is basically 'rat-heaven'. Poor food waste management caused terrible smells, which together with the regular top-up of urine from passers-by and customers using the area as a public toilet, has caused the area to become an area of public nuisance. It is positively disgusting. Longer opening times (till 3am) means more business, which also means more waste, and I am NOT happy about the prospect of more mismanaged waste near my back garden!

**Poor general waste management** – The general-waste bins are also poorly managed in the back yard of Gladstone House. Bins are left open, and the whole area is unclean. As the back yard is slightly tucked away with an unsafe gate, it provides the perfect shelter for people to use this are to fly-tip and urinate. In the front of the premises on Gladstone Avenue, people throw their cups, tissues and other rubbish over the wall into my front garden and also onto the road, causing the whole road to be full of rubbish, all of the time. Poor general-waste management also encourages vermin, and we have seen rats around the building every day. I understand that the applicant has said that "Litter bins shall be available for customer use outside the premises at all times the premises are trading, these litter bins shall be emptied at regular intervals throughout every trading day" - however, this was poorly managed previously, and I am not reassured that the business will manage this sufficiently at the front or at the back of the property, based on the amount of litter on Gladstone Avenue. If I continue to get food/packaging/cups litter thrown in my garden (which I do), what reassurances can the licencing authority give me that this will be dealt with? The planning application does not give any details about the times between bins being cleared, and also does not give any reassurances about rubbish being cleared from the floors/road outside the premises, during the late evening. I am not convinced that they have demonstrated that would be pro-active in dealing with street-litter.

• Smoking in the front street-side seating area – This is a big nuisance as I can't enjoy a smoke-free environment in my own front garden. Not only that, but cigarette ends are thrown all over the street floor, and over the wall into my front garden. A burnt bin-lid can only suggest that a burning cigarette was thrown over to my bin which now has holes and eventually fell off and got lost! Lots of cigarette ends on the street is inevitably a public nuisance as nobody wants to see rubbish on the street floors. Late at night, this is much harder to monitor or maintain. The adjoining wall is

not very high, so it is easy for people to throw things over the wall into my front garden. Will the proprietor be obliged to put up signs and notices to prevent cigarette litter? Isn't there a law against air pollution from a business premise if it's near a residence? With longer opening times, people inevitable stand around and smoke and this will be a nuisance for me and my family.

- Food smells and noise from machinery is a predictable problem Under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 (EPA), smoke, fumes or gases from any premises is a nuisance and this includes steam and smells from that massive exhaust pipe at the back yard which is a metre from my back garden. All the food smells come into my back yard and it's not pleasant. This also makes noises, which is a problem if the premises are open till late. Even the lights staying on is a problem for my family, as it affects our sleep. With longer opening hours, there will be a lot of smell, noise, vibration, light and inevitably, this will lead to a greater public nuisance, and not just for my family.
- Loud noises both inside and outside the premises The number of people gathering in the outside eating area always consists of people who want to chat, which ordinarily would be fine, but if the business is next door to a residence and is on a residential street, it becomes an issue, as families basically want safety and peace. People argue and fight and I often hear loud shouts from the premises (both inside and outside). For me and my family (and for the families in the area), I do not want to be disturbed beyond early evening time. We all need to sleep by a certain time, and if we can't sleep on time, we can't work efficiently the next day. Again, people who sit and eat/drink at the premises will most likely be loud and inconsiderate to our family's needs. My husband is also disabled and a wheelchairuser, so we have to sleep on the ground floor. We can basically hear everything, including the toilet flushing, crockery clunking and people talking. I understand that the owner said they would put in noise-proofing in their planning application, but apparently, they will only do so on the ground floor, whereas on page 17 of the planning application, it states that "Licensable activities will be conducted and the facilities for licensable activities will be designed and operated so as to prevent the transmission of audible noise or perceptible vibration throughout the fabric of the building or structure to adjoining properties". Does the licensing authority know about the choice of materials that are being used to sound-proof the building in the current building work by the owner of Gladstone House? Will there be a guarantee that we will not hear anything from next door? Can you confirm whose responsibility is it to ensure that noise won't travel - the owner of the building or the owner of the business? What rights will me and my family have to challenge the proprietor to correct imperfections in sound-proofing? How will the licensing authority be able to impose sanctions for this to be addressed if I highlighted the issue to you? What level of proof would you need that sound is coming through, and will the council assist me and listen to me?

#### Licensing Objective 3 - Public safety

**Groups of people gathering** – In the licensing application, the applicant has not considered public safety in the area outside the premises. In this climate of reclaiming the streets, as a woman I have felt very unsafe when going out after dark. Men standing around in clusters is a big deterrent for me and my daughters when considering going out. Having a hot-food premise on the edge of a residential area is

not only a worry for the local residents (due to the potential overflow of customers) but as Gladstone house is also so close to public transport, it has the potential to attract people from other areas who have no vested interest in respecting the local area. Again, the number of crimes in the area have been disproportionately higher than other areas, so I am concerned that yet another food-place would attract more people who would inevitably gather to exchange drugs, steal/pickpocket or harass women. Making use of the outside space encourages crime amongst individuals who are there to cause harm to the public, including anti-social behaviour, sexual harassment, theft and vehicle crime, as seen in the latest figures for the area (see above). Although the proposed late-night opening will be for indoor use only, the safety issue relates to people loitering outside. As a resident next door to Gladstone House, I am worried that youths will loiter outside in the early hours (as they do at the McDonalds across the road) and it will create an element of fear for me and the other residents in the area. The planning application says that the PLH will ensure that patrons use the area which does not disturb the residents or local businesses, but no details are supplied as to how this will be done. The previous business said the same thing, but they were unable to prevent people gathering and talking loudly, and throwing things on the floor in the streets. Based on what I have seen, I remain extremely sceptical that the applicant would be able to do anything different, and I am therefore objecting to this licence application.

#### <u>Licensing Objective 4 - Protection of children from harm</u>

Children and young people living in the area – I know of many families in the area who are unhappy about how unsafe the streets are for their children. The foul language and behaviour of many of the people who visit some of these restaurants in the area is harmful to children, even if they visit with an adult, as they can see and hear what goes on. The atmosphere is not family-friendly, and instils a sense of fear in a young person.

#### **Conclusion:**

The licensing application from Taco Time Ltd shows that they are seeking a licence to offer Late night refreshment until 3am and they also propose to make use of the outside space which belongs to the premises up to 11pm in the evening for customers to sit and consume food purchased. The planning application is inadequate, with sparse details – section I on page 14 has no details in the first box. The application does not give me any reassurance that all the points I have raised will be addressed during the course of their business.

I strongly object to this licensing application and I do so within the consultation period. I do NOT want them to operate outside till 11pm, and I do NOT want their premises to operate inside till 3am.

The property itself is on a very busy road near to the junction with West Green High Road and Lordship Lane.

There are many retail premises in the locality as well as restaurants which hold late night refreshment licenses.

As with any other inner London Borough, the area is susceptible to High levels of crime and antisocial behaviour which are investigated by the police and local authority.

These types of offences can range from low level antisocial behaviour to theft from person or violence related offences.

From police records, it does not appear to be offences that have been specific to Gladstone House.

The only representation that I can give for this proposed premises is that the late night refreshment license operates to a time similar to other restaurants in the area. I do not believe that the premises will increase crime or asb in the area as it will not be doing anything different to other similar premises.

Three AM is too late for a fast food restaurant to be open on a residential street. The noise, litter and increased traffic will cause undue stress and reduced standard of living to the residents living above an adjacent to the location.

The fact that Noel Park is an article 4 conservation area I increases the inappropriateness of this type of late night business.

Please note that this an objection to the above.

I am surprised to see yet another application for a late night licence. I do not see nor understand the need. There are numerous issues around this and hopefully I can capture them all.

There are other premises which already have late night licences. It is a fact that these contribute to the general level of anti social behaviour seen in Wood Green. The best example of this is the nightclub. I have complained about the level of noise, litter and the number of people that linger around after the club closes. Why is it that the residential properties have to suffer. It is very easy to assume that a Taco Bell with a late night licence will continue to attract more people in the early hours of the morning. This will be an additional to an already busy area.

It is not unreasonable to want to be able to sleep in your own home without constant noise interruptions. You can take your pick: people sitting in their cars playing loud music; people lingering around on the street shouting, singing; the fights and random acts of violence; people being sick or taken ill; people urinating in the street; additional volume of traffic and people simply revving their car engines. This is already a problem which you do not seem to take seriously at all.

Let's remember a simple fact: Gladstone Avenue is a residential road. People live and sleep here. While the other places which open late night are not directly on a residential road, this Taco Bell will be. I cannot see how it is considered acceptable to want to add to the number of people in Wood Green in the early hours of the morning.

The current parking restrictions stop at 10pm and anyone can park on the roads after this. Given the location of the Taco Bell it is not hard to work out where everyone will park. Surely the council has some form of requirement to protect the people living in the area from additional noisemakers. Perhaps this is the time to introduce full parking restrictions with enforcement. I'm sure this will net a large amount of fines if the enforcement officers are capable in dealing with the frequent abuse and threats of violence.

Perhaps it is worth mentioning that people now think it is ok to park on the pavements around the proposed site for Taco Bell. This shows the level of respect that these people have for the laws and that fact no one takes any action to correct this. The police and the council simply turn a blind eye to this. Why do the residents have to put up with the issues that this causes.

For some reason, many people seem to use Gladstone Avenue as a meeting place to eat food and talk. The time of the day is irrelevant. This happens with people in cars and people standing in the street using people's walls as some form of a table. Taco Bell will not help this as it will encourage more people to eat their food on the streets in the early hours of the morning. Again Gladstone Avenue is supposed to be a residential road.

I'm pretty sure that you have received numerous complaints about rats and foxes living in the area. Having another source of food for these animals will only increase their numbers. Very few people take their food away. Most seem to eat in the surrounding area and the most convenient place for their rubbish is the pavement. Please explain how you plan to tackle the vermin and especially the rat issue that seems to be growing.

As I have just mentioned very few people use bins or take their food away with them. The road or pavement is the most convenient place. It is a simple assumption that the litter and food waste will get even worse. Again residents are the ones who have to suffer from this.

I do not understand the need to have a Taco Bell with a licence opening every day of the week until 3am. There are already several places which open late and the level and variety of anti-social behaviour is intolerable. An additional licence can only add to the problem. This is a residential road which makes this application different. The residents have to endure the problems caused by these licences. Perhaps you could review this every night for a month and then go and start your day job at the normal time. Perhaps you might actually appreciate the position of the residents. Is it unreasonable to want to try and get some sleep. Even during the lockdown Gladstone Avenue remains exceptionally busy. With lockdown coming to an end this can only get worse.

I cannot understand the need for another place which sells food and alcohol until 3 am every day of the week. There are already plenty of other places to which meet this requirement. The nightclub had to address the issue of people lingering after they closed. From experience the people will not leave the area after Taco Bell has closed and will continue with their anti social behaviour.

The reasons to object are numerous: this is a residential road; litter; noise; vermin; increased traffic; more pressure on parking; car revving: slamming of car doors: random car alarms going off: violence; urinating; being sick; loud music; shouting; lingering around after closing etc. There are few positive aspects to the proposal other than the concept of simple commercial profit. This is at the expense of quality of life for residents which must surely be a higher priority for the council in its consideration of the application, rather than simply ignored. There is simply no need for Taco Bell or any other fast food chain, to be open 16.5 hours every day, 7 days a week. This application is totally unacceptable for every reason stated. I OBJECT to this application.

#### In summary, I wish to make representation on the following:

- Prevention of crime and disorder
- Prevention of public nuisance
- Public safety
- 1) A digital CCTV system must be installed in the premises complying with the following criteria:
  - (a) Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance doors from both inside and outside.
  - (b) Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification.
  - (c) Provide a linked record of the date, time of any image.
  - (d) Provide good quality images colour during opening times.
  - (e) Have a monitor to review images and recorded quality.
  - (f) Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture and retention.
  - (g) Member of staff trained in operating CCTV at venue during times open to the public.
  - (h) Digital images must be kept for 31 days. The equipment must have a suitable export method, e.g. CD/DVD writer so that Police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. Copies must be available within a reasonable time to Police on request.
- 2) An incident log shall be kept at the premises, it will be in a hardback durable format handwritten at the time of the incident or as near to as is reasonable and made available on request to the Police, which will record the following:
  - (a) all crimes reported to the venue

- (b) All ejections of patrons
- (c) Any complaints received
- (d) Any incidents of disorder
- (e) Seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) Any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (g) Any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (h) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

Gladstone House is a building in close proximity to Wood Green underground station and the busy thourofare of West Green High Road.

The property itself is on a very busy road near to the junction with West Green High Road and Lordship Lane.

There are many retail premises in the locality as well as restaurants which hold late night refreshment licenses.

As with any other inner London Borough, the area is susceptible to High levels of crime and antisocial behaviour which are investigated by the police and local authority.

These types of offences can range from low level antisocial behaviour to theft from person or violence related offences.

From police records, it does not appear to be offences that have been specific to Gladstone House.

The only representation that I can give for this proposed premises is that the late night refreshment license operates to a time similar to other restaurants in the area.
