Where the publication of the intention to make a key decision is impracticable, that decision may only be made where the Chair of the Overview and Scrutiny Committee has been informed of the matter about which the decision is to be made, notice to the Chair has been made available for public inspection at the Council offices and published on the Council's website, and after 5 clear days have elapsed following the day on which notice to the Chair was made publicly available<sup>4</sup>.
- 3. This notice is to inform the Chair of the Overview and Scrutiny Committee that it has been impracticable to give 28 clear days public notice of the item(s) set out below for the reasons set out below and that it is intended that the key decision(s) will be made on the date specified below.
- 4. Notice is also given to the public that the reasons why compliance with the requirements for publicity in connection with key decisions are impracticable are set out below.

The opportunity to roll out mass testing was made possible by government funding from the DHSC which was available at very short notice on 13 December 2020. An application for this was made under part three section E sub section 3 – sub paragraph 9 of the Constitution which allows expenditure in the event of an emergency.  This decision will provide a record of decisions made as part of this process and to record the funding made available from the DHSC to do so.  This report follows the opening of Council's final mass testing site, as set out in these plans.  Taking the retrospective decision on the 19th of March will help meet pre
