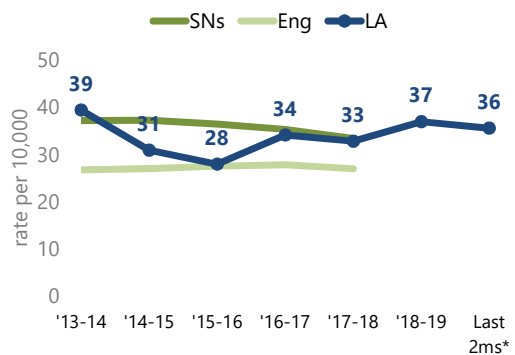

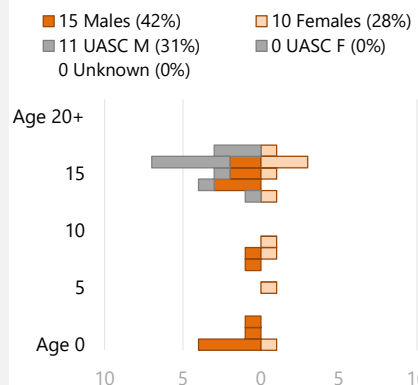

Rate of CLA started per 10,000 children



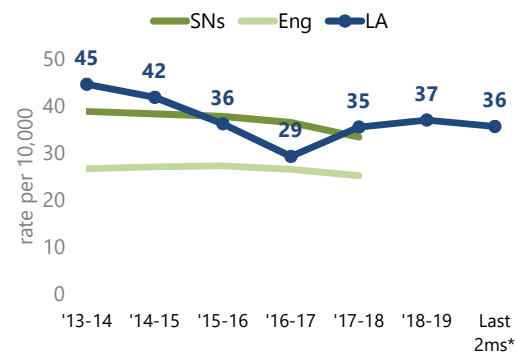

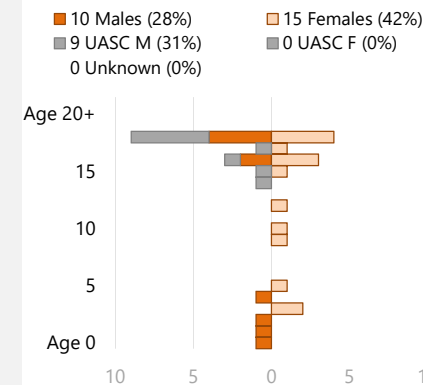

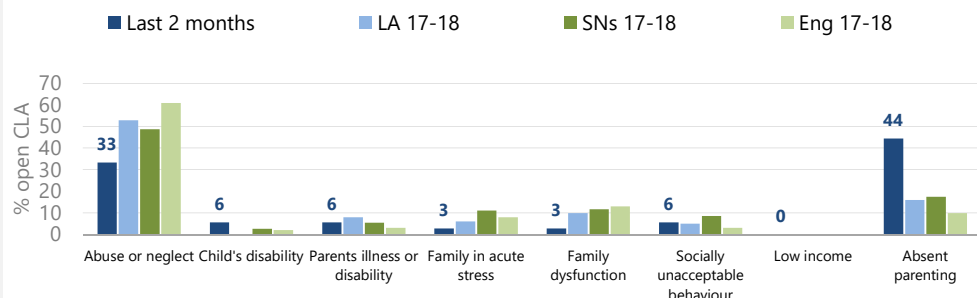

Rate of CLA per 10,000 children (snapshot)



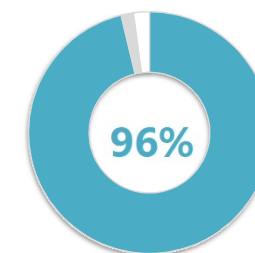

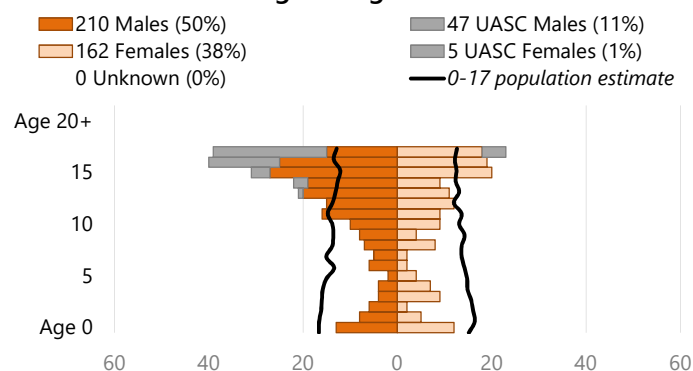

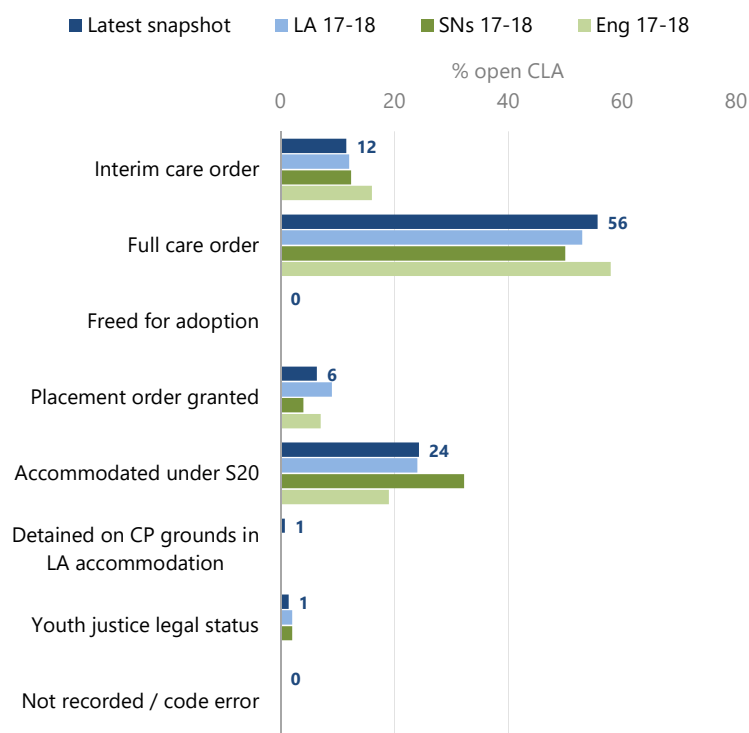

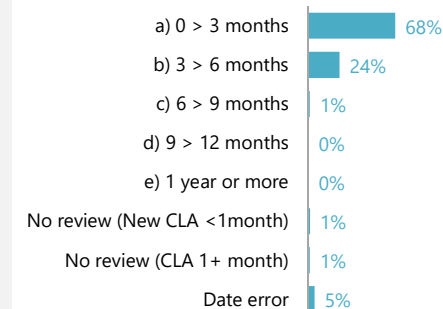

Comparing legal status of open CLA (snapshot)

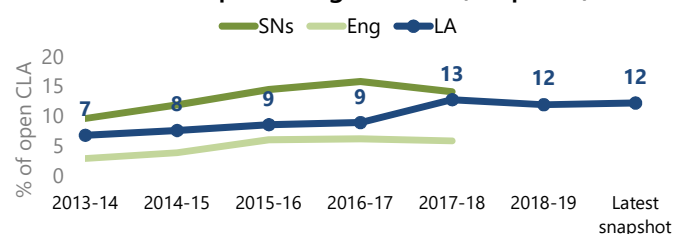


Time since latest review

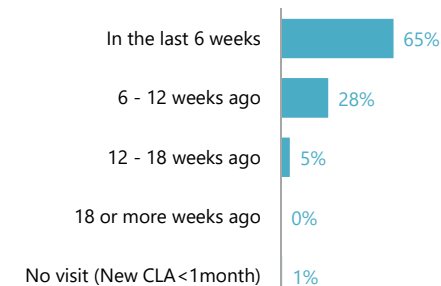

UASC as a percentage of CLA (snapshot)



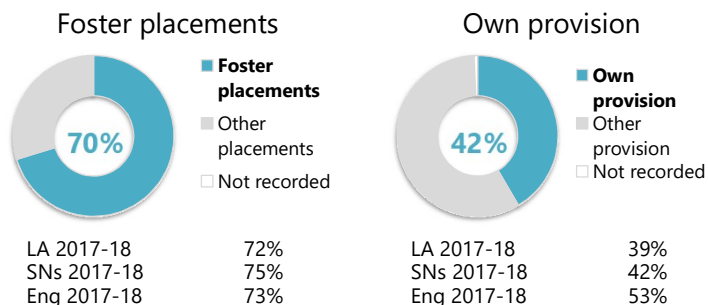
Time since the child was last seen

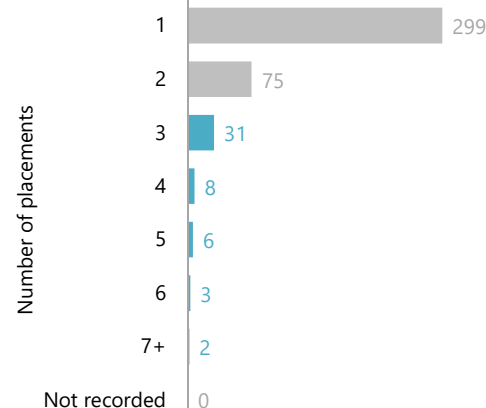

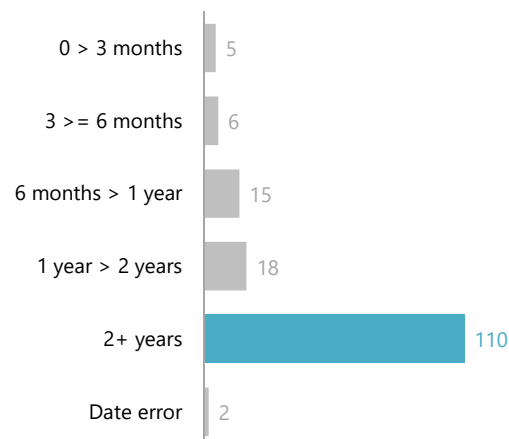

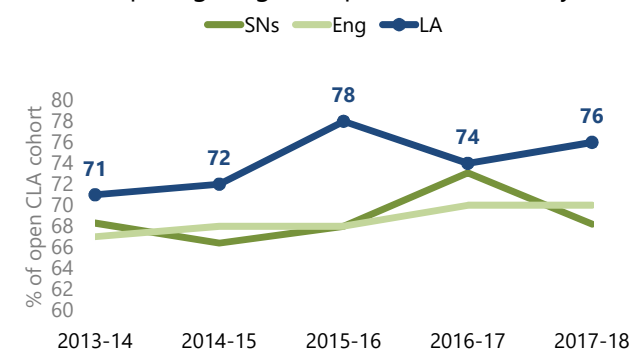

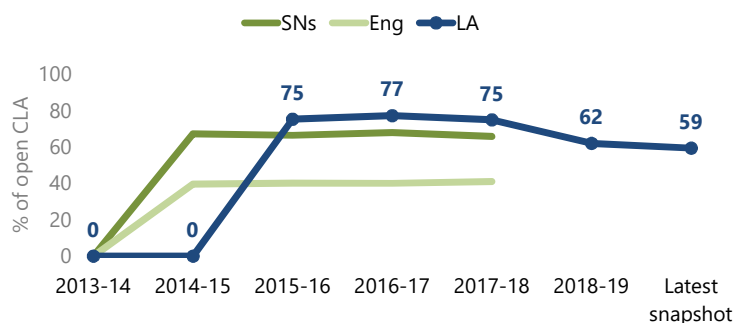
Duration of latest placement for each current CLA aged under 16 who have been looked after for 2½ years or more

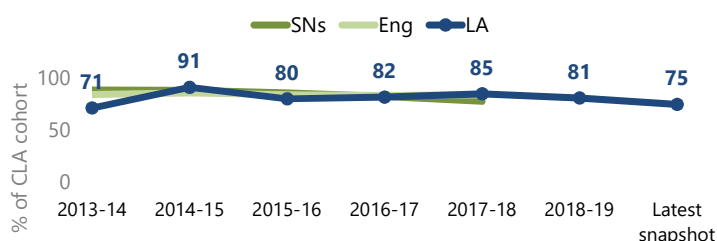

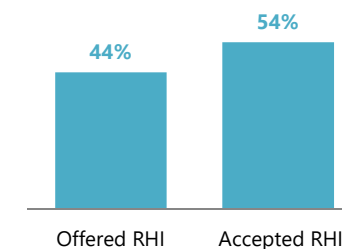

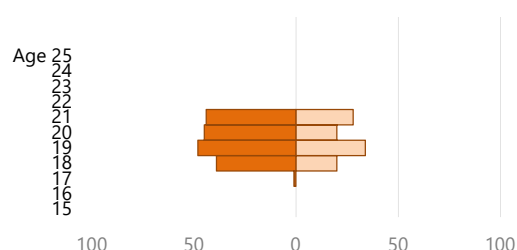

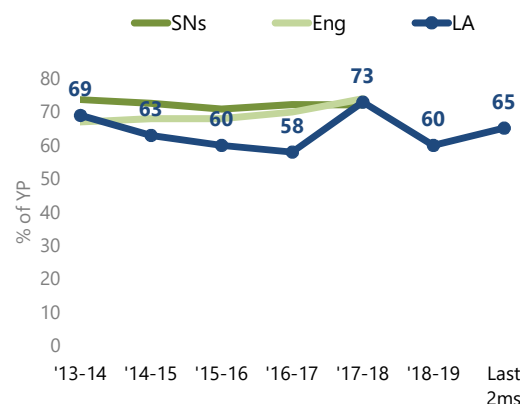

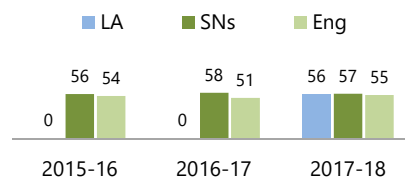

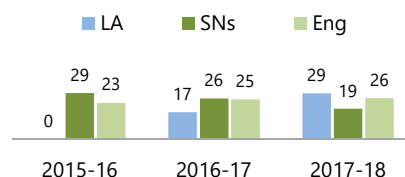

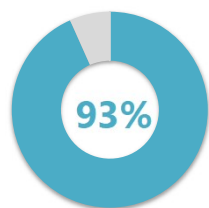

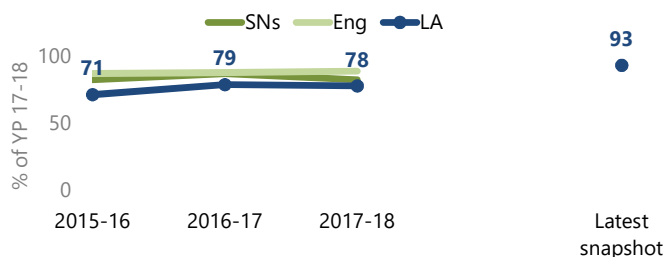

Accommodation suitability of 17-18 year olds

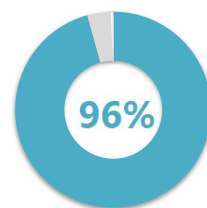

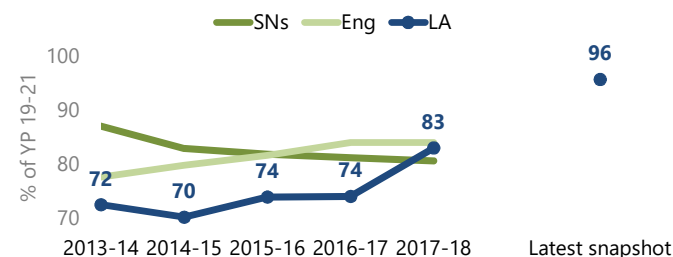


Accommodation suitability of 19-21 year olds

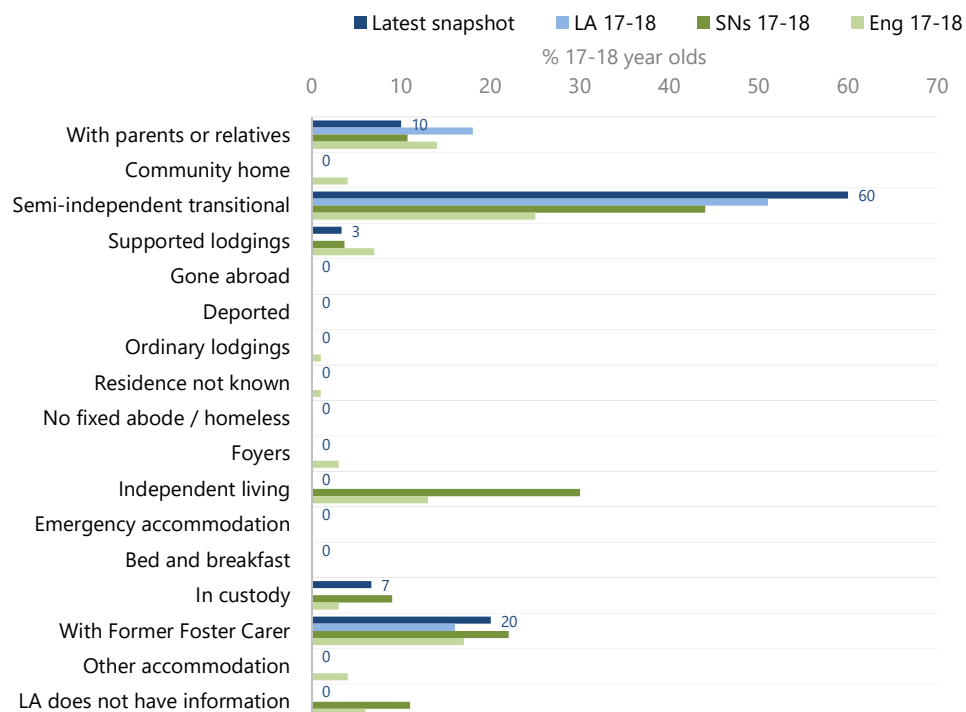

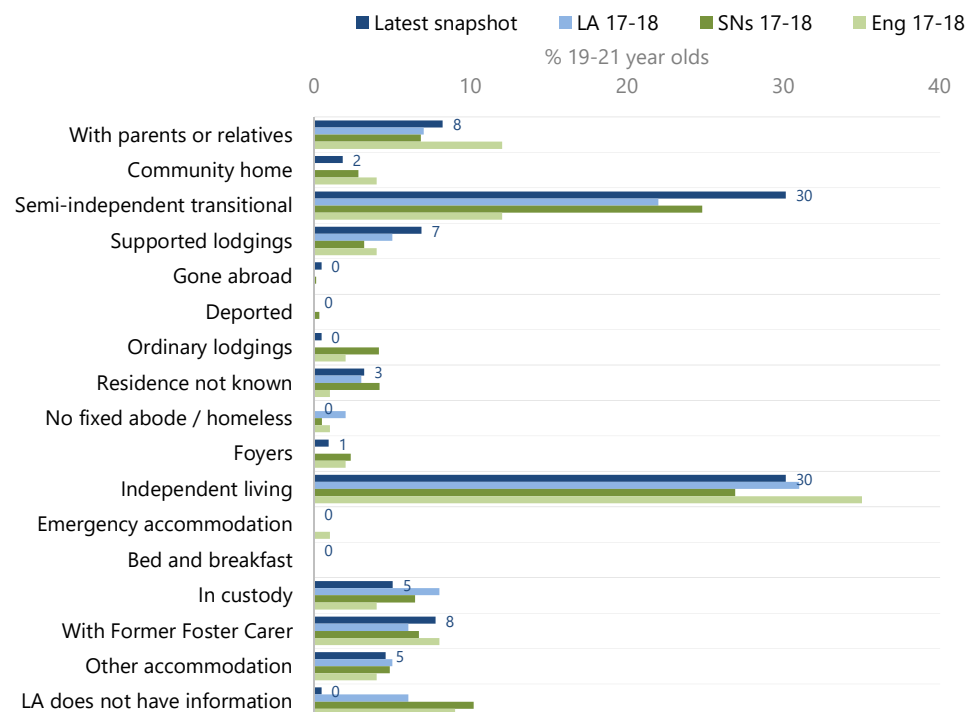

Accommodation types of 17-18 year olds



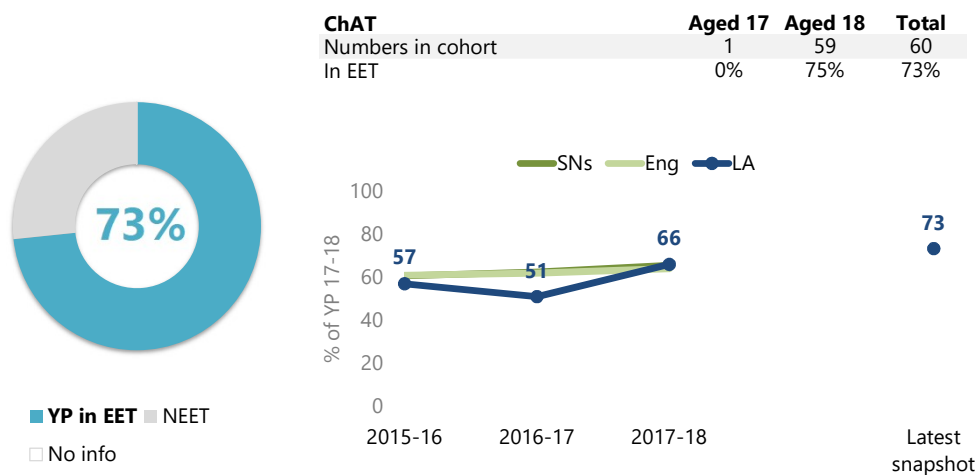
Accommodation types of 19-21 year olds



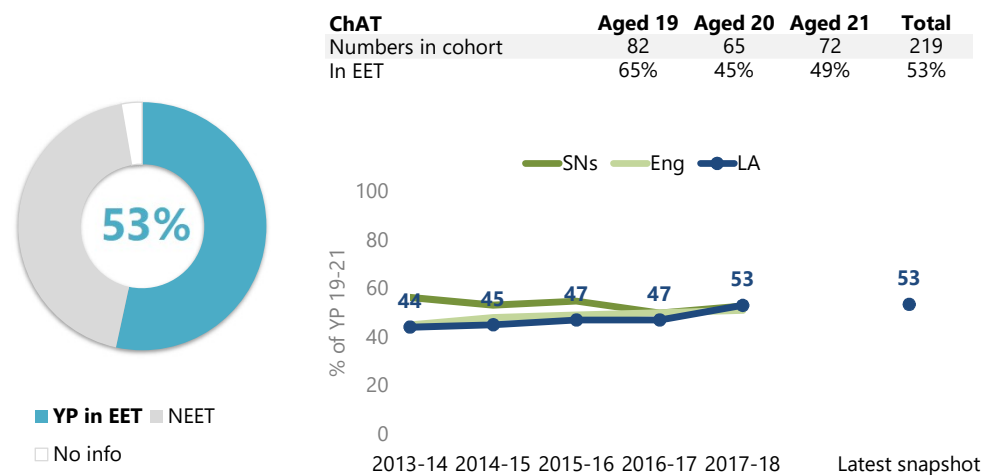

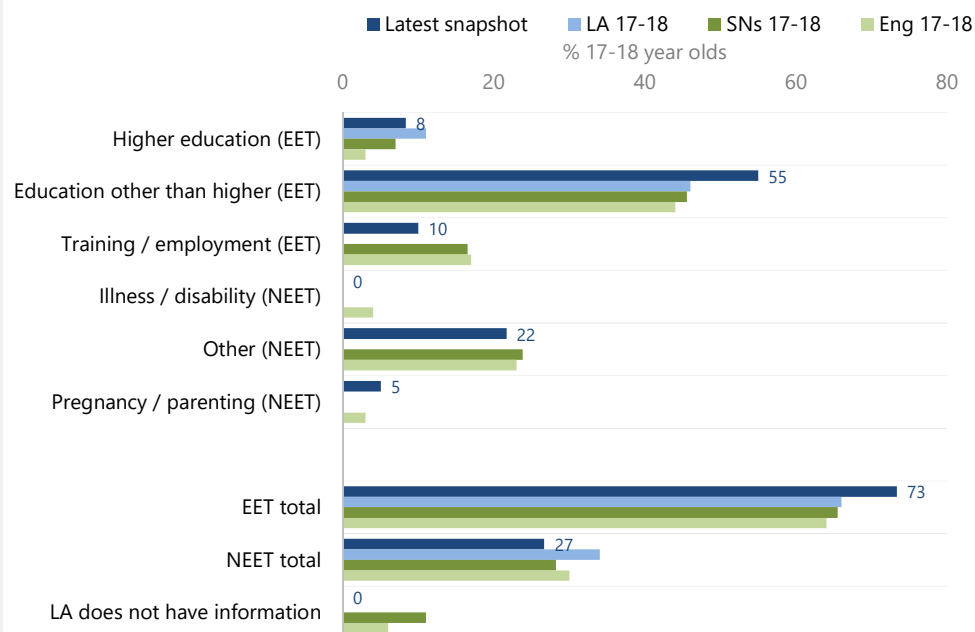
Education, Employment, or Training (EET) of 17-18 year olds



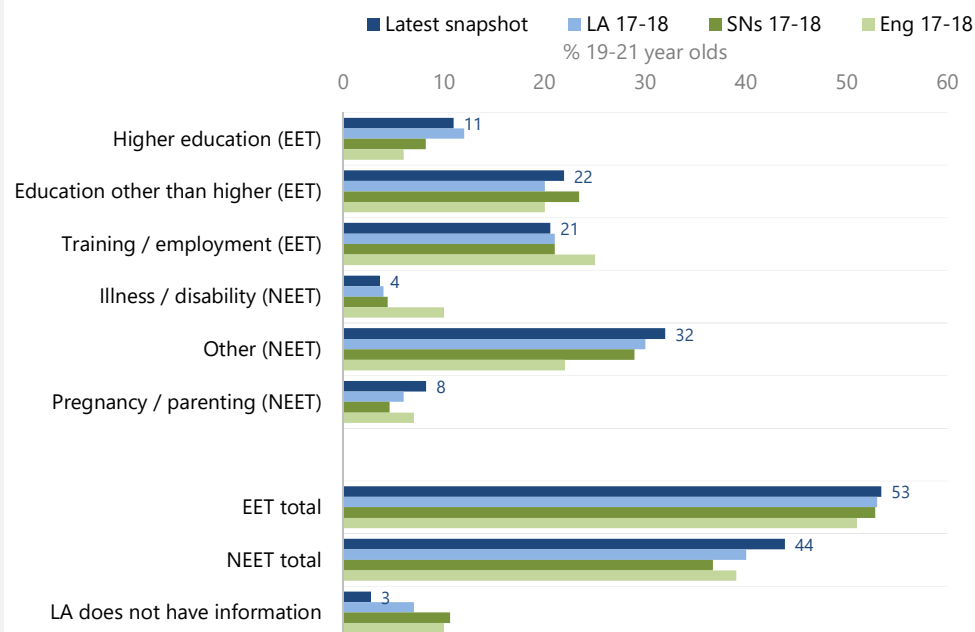

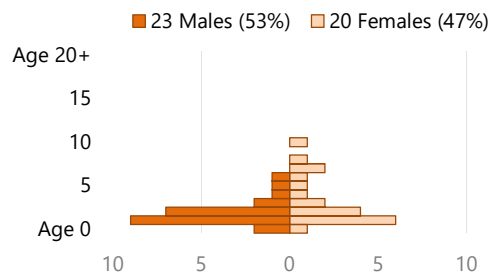

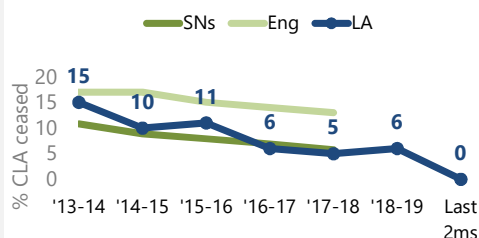

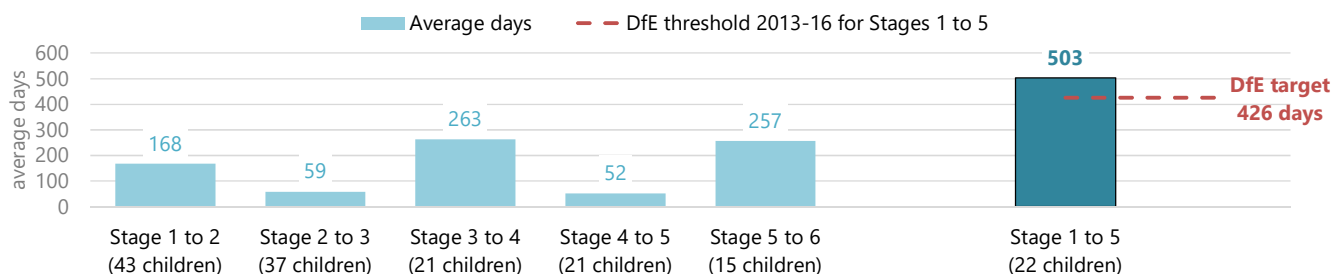

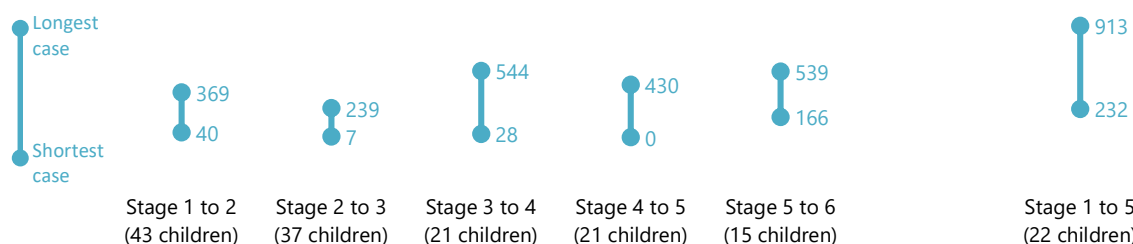

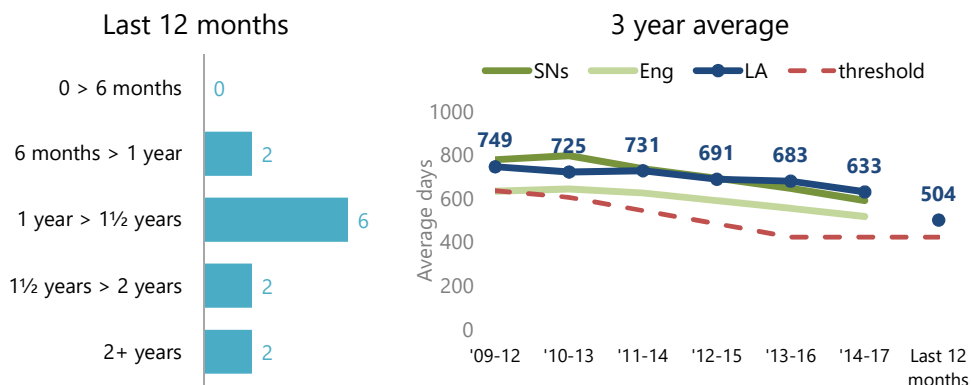

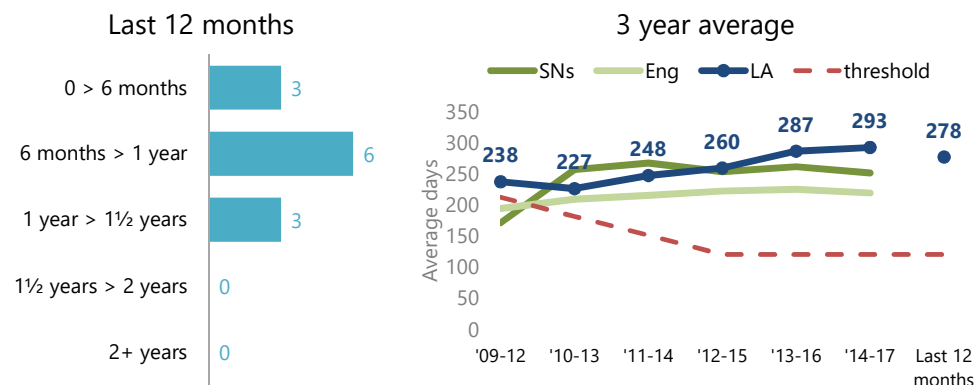

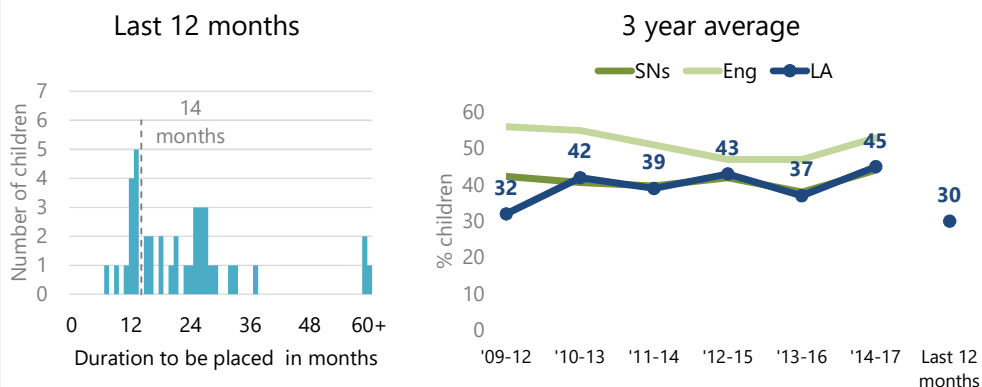

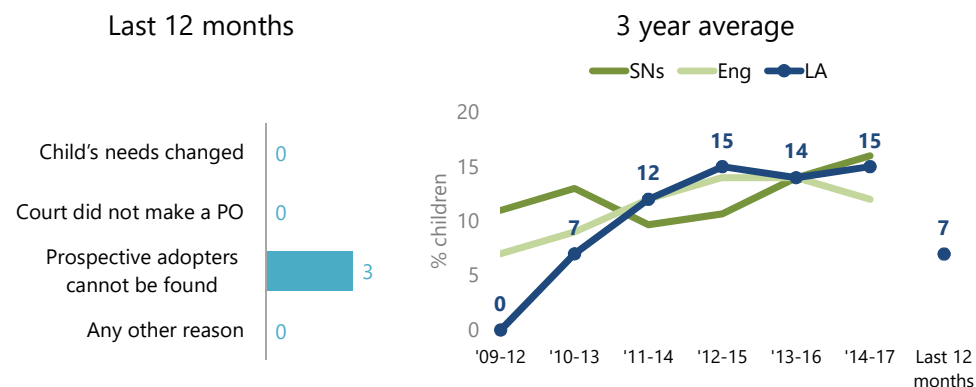

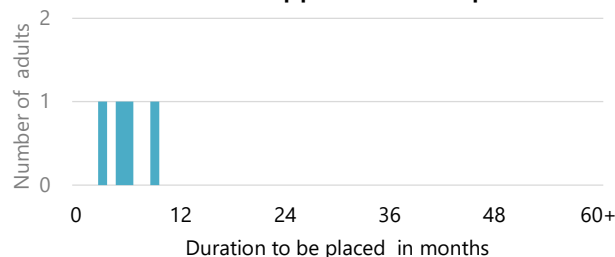

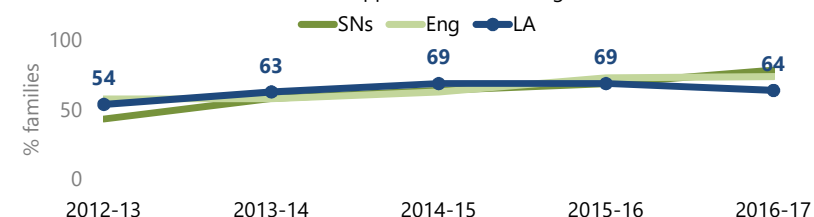

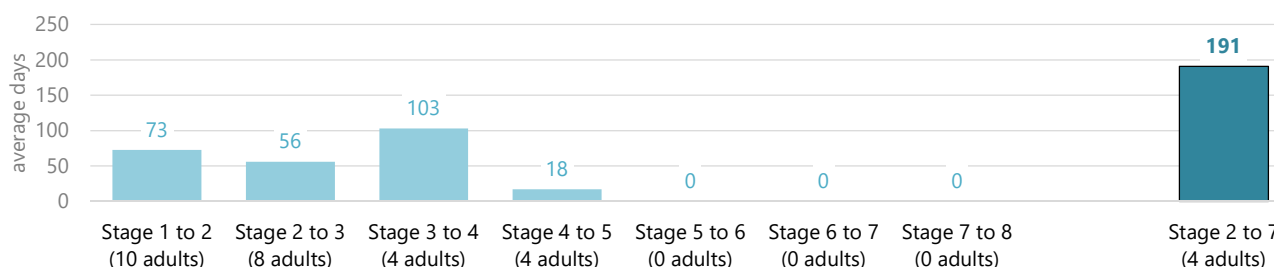
