Annex 1 -Mandatory Conditions

Section 19 - Supply of alcohol

- (2) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (3) The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Section 20 - Exhibition of films:

- (2) Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3) (b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.
- (3) Where-
 - (a) the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
 - (b) the relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question,
 - admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.
- (4) In this section-
 - "children" means persons aged under 18; and
- "film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984.

Section 21 - Door supervision

At specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity and each of these individuals must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

THE PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

- Premises to remain open for 30 minutes beyond the sale of alcohol. There will be access to toilet facilities during this time.
- Designated Premises Supervisor to be a member of the local Pubwatch.
- A log will be maintained of any incidents and will be made available to the Police on request.

PUBLIC SAFETY

THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

- Recorded music will be reduced to background level 30 minutes prior to the end of permitted hours for the supply of alcohol.
- All windows and doors to be kept closed after 2230 save for entry and egress.
- A notice will be placed prominently at the exits asking customers to leave quietly.
- The applicant to agree with the Licensing Authority the addition of air conditioning and sound limiting devices or alternative means of achieving the same objectives.

THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN

Persons under the age of 18 will not be permitted on the premises on the premises after 2000 other than for a bona-fide pre-booked event.

Alcohol may only be sold to individuals over the age of 18 with valid proof of identification with one of the following:

- A valid passport
- A photo driving license issued in a European Union Country
- A proof of age standard card system
- A citizen card, supported by the Home Office



I would like to confirm that I have considered the above proposal with regard to the prevention of public nuisance on behalf of the Enforcement Response (Noise) Team & would like to:

Make representations to the Variation on the following grounds:

The proposed operating hours are inappropriate due to the close proximity of residential dwellings. The noise caused by patrons exiting the premises and locating suitable transport home is likely to be detrimental to the residential amenity. Therefore, if the proposed operations are to be granted all reasonable steps and regular monitoring by the Landlord and his staff shall take place to ensure that customers conduct themselves appropriately when entering and leaving the premises. This is to ensure that no disturbance is caused to nearby residents or annoyance to people passing the premises.

The operating schedule does not address the prevention of public nuisance from:

- airborne entertainment noise
- Structure borne noise or vibrations from entertainment
- Noise generated by patrons in external areas of the premises e.g. beer garden
- Noise from patrons exiting the premises
- Noise from plant and machinery

Supporting Information

We have had complaints about noise coming from the public house, mainly when there are
live bands. I visited the premises before, about 2 years ago. On that occasion the noise
was not excessive but it was audible within the complainant's home. There is potential for
public nuisance unless regulated entertainment is properly regulated.

Informative

I would recommend the following conditions to the operating schedule:

Operating hours

The premises should operate during its proposed hours as per application

That regulated entertainment ceases at 23.30 Sunday to Thursday and ceases at 00.30 on Friday and Saturday to allow quieter dispersal of guests before closing time.

Prevention of nuisance from noise/vibration Airborne

All doors and windows will remain closed during the regulated entertainment licensed activities. Where a door is used for patrons to enter or leave the premises the door will be fitted with a self-closing device and staff told to ensure that it is not propped open. If necessary, A member of staff shall be positioned at the door to ensure it is opened for as brief a period as possible.

The identified windows/doors will be fitted with a device that instructs staff when the door has been opened.

Entry to the premises will be restricted to a particular entrance whilst the premises is being used for regulated entertainment licensed activity

The regulated entertainment licensable activity shall conclude 30 minutes before the premises is due to close to prevent excessive noise breakout as the premises empties.

Entrance/exit from the premises whilst regulated entertainment licensable activities are ongoing shall be via a lobbied door to minimise noise breakout.

Where necessary adequate and suitable mechanical ventilation should be provided to public areas.

Structure borne

All speakers are mounted on anti-vibration mountings to prevent vibration transmission of sound energy to adjoining properties.

Sound limits

The licensee shall ensure that no music played in the licensed premises is audible at or within the site boundary of any residential property.

All regulated entertainment amplified activity will utilise the in-house amplification system, the maximum output of which is controlled by the duty manager.

The level of amplified regulated entertainment shall be controlled by means of limiting device set at a level agreed with the licensing authority unless adequate steps have been taken to ensure that amplified equipment and its associated noise will be contained within the premises without the potential to cause public nuisance. Licensing Authority would need proof of this is such measures already exist.

Outside Areas

No music will be played in, or for the benefit of patrons in the beer garden or other external areas of the premises. This includes the use of Loud Television or similar equipment in outside areas of the premises.

No form of loudspeaker or sound amplification equipment is to be sited on or near the exterior premises or in or near any foyer, doorway, window or opening to the premises.

Signs shall be displayed in the beer garden/on the frontage requesting patrons to recognise the residential nature of the area and conduct their behaviour accordingly – The management reserve the right to ask patrons to move inside the premises or leave if it is felt that they could be disturbing neighbours.

The number of persons permitted to utilise the beer garden/frontage will be restricted to a suitable number.

Only patrons seated at tables will be permitted in the beer garden.

The beer garden/frontage will be closed and patrons requested to come inside the main structure of the premises at 22:30 hours

Dealing with complaints

A complaints book will be held on the premises to record details of any complaints received from neighbours. The information is to include where disclosed, the complainants name, location, date time and subsequent remedial action undertaken. This record must be made available at all times for inspection by council officers.

Regular liaison meetings will be held to enable neighbours to raise concerns about any aspect of the licensed activities.

Patrons entering/exiting premises.

There will be no queuing outside the premises.

However, if people queue to enter the premises a licensed door supervisor shall supervise and ensure the potential patrons behave in an acceptable manner.

When the premises turn out a licensed door supervisor shall supervise patrons and ensure they leave in a prompt and courteous manner, respecting the neighbours.

Signs should be displayed requesting patrons to respect the neighbours and behave in a courteous manner.

A licensed door supervisor will be positioned on the exit door to ensure, as far as reasonably practical, that patrons do not leave drinks.

A licensed door supervisor will patrol the cartilage of the premises to prevent patrons urinating in public areas in the vicinity of the premises.

Prevention of nuisance from litter

Adequate receptacles for use by patrons, especially smokers (cigarette butts) will be provided in the local vicinity. The positioning of the receptacles will be agreed with the licensing officer.

The Voluntary Code of Practice for the Fast Food Industry (DEFRA-2003) is followed to reduce fast food litter and waste in the local environment.

Prevention of Nuisance from Odour

All ventilation and extraction systems shall be correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from odour.


Prevention of nuisance from light

The use of explosives, pyrotechnics and fireworks will be restricted to once a week and located away from nearby residential premises]

Illuminated external signage shall be switched off when the premise is closed.

Security lights will be positioned to minimise light intrusion to nearby residential premises.

This is just to raise my objection to the proposed application as outlined in your letter received Dec 8th 2008 and to make a representation against this.

I live directly opposite the Poachers pub (which is currently on the market for sale), and I am raising my objection against on prevention of public nuisance as well as the prevention of crime and disorder.

During the the summer months when the pub has held live and DJ music events before, the noise coming from the establishments PA system is much too loud and a noise nuisance. As the doors are often also left open, or are constantly being opened as their customers use these to gather outside to drink; which only further worsens the situation.

The crowds also get loud and rowdy themselves as they consume more alcohol, often shouting, fighting and on one occasion I have even had one of their drunken customers throw something at my window for no reason. Acts of crime.

Noise pollution already is problem here; with the constant sound of traffic and police and ambulance sirens frequently whining, so the last thing all residents' need here is further added unnecessary noise and distress.

In response to the notification that The Poachers at 423 Lordship Lane, Wood Green, London N22 5DH has applied for a variation to their premises license in order to increase their hours of regulated entertainments, supply of alcohol and opening hours, we would like to voice our strong objection to this, on grounds of noise pollution, associated anti-social behaviour and public nuisance.

My husband and I live at Flat 27, 1 The Roundway, N17 7EQ, located directly across the road from The Poachers. We have had occasion to phone Haringey Environmental Services during the past 6-12 months due to the persistent noise pollution from the late live band entertainment at The Poachers. When we have called, we have been informed that there have been other such complaints.

The noise levels from the pub and the late hours they already keep are a source of disturbance. Further to this, the level of violent crime and anti-social behaviour that is directly associated with The Poachers pub is concerning at it's current level, as there are often very loud and violent fights that come out into the street and cause a-clear public nuisance. My husband has taken photos of these incidents as they arise on a frequent basis. We are often kept awake at night by this as well as the entertainment noise levels. I would imagine the local police office could comment on this as well.

In our opinion, any extension of The Poachers premises license would represent a significant intrusion to our own lives and well-being, and further to this it would be detrimental to the local largely residential area and the quality of life in our neighbourhood. We strongly urge you to consider these implications and our objection, and to therefore reject the application that has been put forward to you by the The Poachers.
