A number of residents have contacted me to express their concerns about the above application to supply alcohol for 24 hours. Their concerns are set out below:

1. The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

There is concern that extending the licence for 24 hours will encourage more crime by the very nature that it will be known as the place to purchase alcohol in the middle of the night. There is already a culture of street drinking attached to this shop and it is very likely that this will continue throughout the night and will attract crime and disorder.

2. Prevention of Public Nuisance

Residents already express concern about the number of persistent street drinkers who hang around outside the premises for considerable periods to drink the alcohol, along with people urinating in the street and dropping cans, bottles and litter. It is likely people will come to the shop at all hours to buy alcohol and will then hang about outside especially during the summer months. There is also the noise from vehicles including loud music, shouting and the revving of engines, who visit this outlet. Residents concern is that this disruption will continue throughout the night causing distress and inconvenience to families.

3. Public Safety

The presence of street drinkers can feel very uncomfortable at any time but it is threatening and intimidating when this happens late at night or in a 24 hour setting. This sets the scene for an area to feel unsafe. This shop is at the end of a residential street and residents complain that they already experience considerable disruption let alone if there is 24 hour sale of alcohol.

4. Protection of Children from Harm

Many residents are concerned that their children pass this shop on their way to and from school and should not have to experience street drinkers who can, at times, be drunk and shouting loudly or arguing. Neither should they have to see people urinating in the street or dropping cans and bottles outside their homes, in their gardens or in the street.

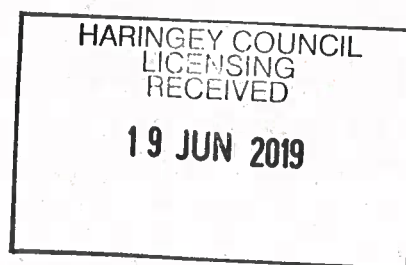

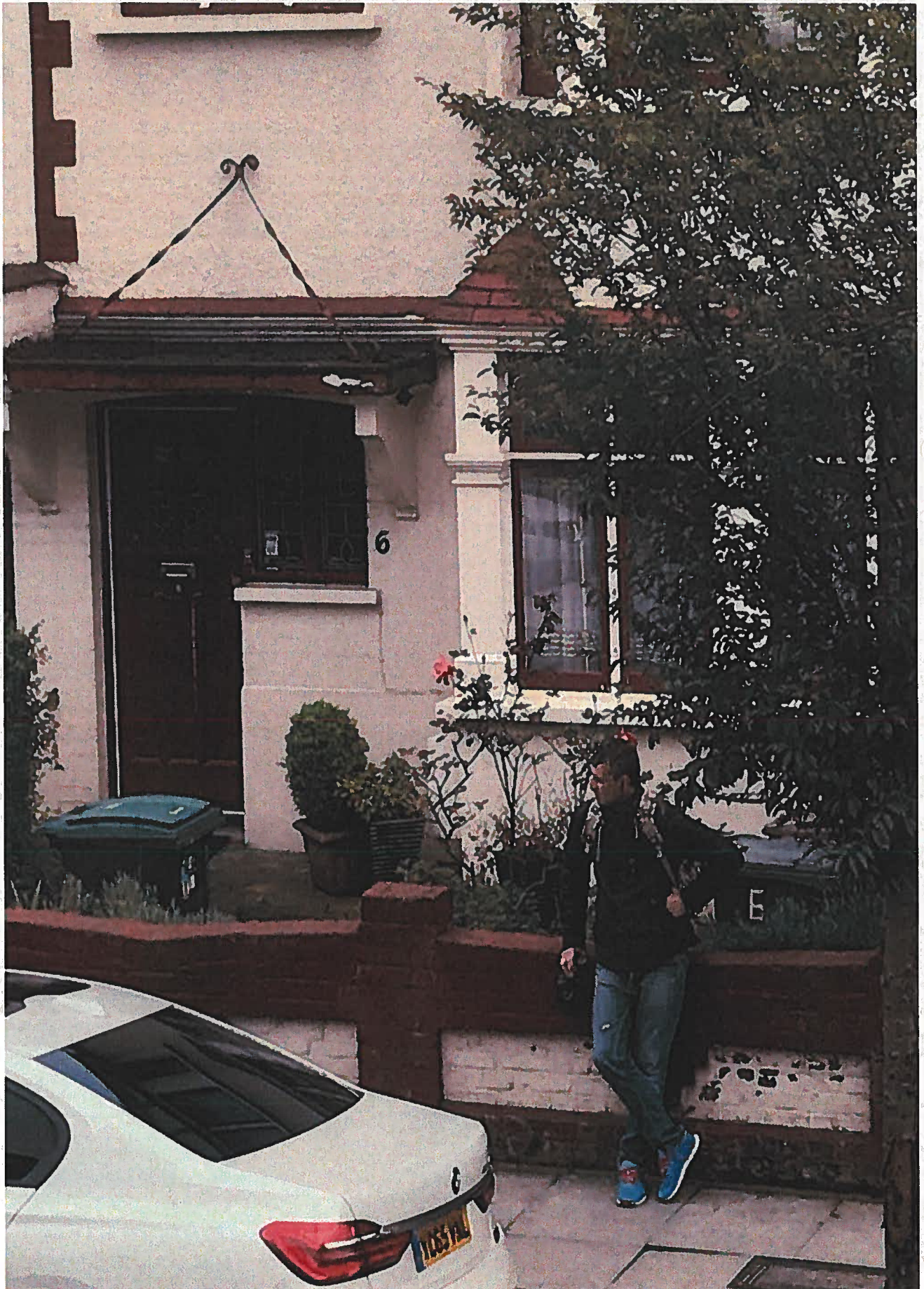
I am writing with regards to a serious concern that has arisen in the past two weeks with regards to a license that is pending to be issued to an OFF Licence on our road. We, the residents that reside surrounding this OFF Licence have had to suffer immeasurably since it had been granted a license to sell alcohol for consumption OFF premises and are making a representation to have this pending application repealed immediately. Whilst it may be in the interest of the council to grant such licenses, it is not in the interest of our community that you will ultimately be subjecting our children to danger and destroying our neighbourhood. I have already consulted with relevant authorities in advising how to pursue the matter further should the council not take our objection seriously.

The surrounding neighbourhood has continuously seen people of Eastern European descent come on our roads causing Anti-social behaviour, noises and public indecency. Whilst there has been requests for the council in the past to police this area, no action has been taken place and ineffective measures has left our neighbourhood unsafe. We are aware of a community officer who patrols the surrounding area and all the neighbours who have signed this petition can attest that not once have they witnessed him confront these people. Moreover, as if being afraid of his own shadow. It is ultimately evident that the council has a complete disregard for the safety of our children and are happy to expose them to public indecency i.e. watching people urinating freely and publicly on our road. Ever since this store had begun selling alcohol it has caused multiple disturbances to our road with people littering (many neighbours' bins were not being collected due to having food waste in the wrong bins causing unsanitary condition). There are a significant number of children on our road who are afraid to walk on the pavement as these people have been intimidating them instead leaving them walking in the middle of the road and exposing them to even more danger. The minimarket is intending to build 3 extra units to increase the size of the OFF license which ultimately will turn our road into a "hang out" for these people. There has also been reports by neighbours that they are conducting illegal business, selling cigarettes under the counter. Our road is continuously loud throughout the night and the children become restless. It is unbecoming that our road has become a central location for the purchase of alcohol. We have attached numerous photos as evidence confirming the above.

We will not sit idly and watch the council turn our neighbourhood into a place of drunkenness and crime. The neighbourhood is growing and has a friendly atmosphere. Granting the OFF licence will severely and significantly damage this atmosphere and negatively affect the lives of residents and families as well as contribute to the overall levels of crime in Haringey.
