Dear Sirs,

We are making representation in regard to the Provisional application for a premises licence for 72-76 High Road South Tottenham London N15.

In determining what conditions are appropriate, it will be necessary to consider the individual circumstances of the premises, including:-

- The nature and style of the venue,
- The activities being conducted there,
- The location, and,
- Anticipated clientele.

We would particularly like to remind applicants of their existing legal obligations regarding:-

- Irresponsible Drinks Promotions,
 - Selling alcohol to a person who is drunk, and
 - Underage sales
- Fire Risk Assessments.

Licensees and premises supervisors are also reminded of the offence of selling alcohol to a person who is drunk, and to ensure that all staff are aware of the consequences.

At present Seven Brothers Supermarket is located just at 76 High Road N5 and holds a 24 hour alcohol licence.

This area of the High Road N15 has become a known location for street drinking in the area which has led to anti social behaviour. Men can be seen at the corner of the shop throughout the day consuming alcohol which does not make any effort to stop this behaviour from taking place. The hours that the premises is seeking is now excessive for the area and will only serve to prolong and add to the existing street drinking problems and loitering that is currently taking place in the vicinity. As this is a new licence that is being applied for the consideration must be viewed in light of the current situation in this location as they relate to the four licensing objectives.

In order to address these concerns we feel it appropriate to uphold the licensing objectives

- that the operating hours for alcohol sales be 8am - midnight each day
- For the premises to not stock or supply beer/ lager or ciders above 6.5% ABV.
- No single cans of beers/ lager or cider

- We also require that the total floor space taken up for the display of alcohol is limited to under 20% of the overall floor space.

We consider these to be appropriate actions in promoting the licensing objectives due to the wider community issues with street drinking in the area, alcohol harm and violence where alcohol is a contributing factor is high in the High Road N15 area.
