MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

SECTION 256 OF THE NHS ACT 2006

BETWEEN:-

- (1) North Central London Integrated Care Board (the "ICB")
- (2) The Mayor and Burgesses of the London Borough of Haringey ("the Local Authority");

Title of Scheme: NCL ICB contribution to Haringey Council's Osborne Grove Nursing Home, CANNING CRESCENT SCHEME, LOCALITIES HUB SCHEME, FAMILY HUBS SCHEME, ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY SCHEME AND EARLY HELP & PREVENTION SCHEME (THE SCEME), scheme in 2022/23

1. The Scheme

1.1. The Section 256 will secure more health gain than an equivalent expenditure of money on the national health service by: Allowing the ICB to contribute towards The Scheme utilising existing contract and commissioning arrangements in place at the Local Authority.

2. Description of Scheme (Scope)

2.1. Funding contribution towards development works at The Scheme as defined above.

3. Financial Details

- 3.1. The agreed total financial value is £3.152m
- 3.2. The parties enter into this Agreement for:

3.3. commencing on:

January 2023 with an end date of 31 March 2023.

3.4. The Local Authority agrees to expend the funds only to procure and/or provide the Services/Works described in this agreement.

3.5. The funds shall not be increased in the event of any overspend by the Local

Authority in its delivery of the Scheme unless otherwise agreed by the ICB.

3.6. The Local Authority will notify the ICB of any expected over or underspends arising

within fourteen (14) Working Days of becoming known.

3.7. There shall be no variation to this Agreement without the prior written consent of all

Parties.

3.8. If there is a need to vary The Scheme, a proposal will be submitted to the ICB with

any variation agreed by both parties.

3.9. Both parties can give notice to terminate without fault by providing notice in writing

with a minimum of 30 days' notice. Any unspent monies will be returned to the ICB

by the end of the notice period unless alternative arrangements for handling of any

surplus funds are agreed in writing between the parties during the notice period.

4. **MONITORING AND REVIEW**

4.1. The Local Authority will keep proper records in relation to The Scheme in

accordance with the arrangements referred to in this Agreement.

4.2. The Local Authority will allow the ICB and/or its representatives to inspect all such

records and will supply copies on request. The Local Authority will acknowledge

such a request from the ICB within five (5) days of receiving the request and will

allow the ICB to inspect all such records and/or shall provide copies within ten (10)

days of receiving the request from the ICB.

4.3. The Local Authority shall prepare reports evidencing how its use of the funding is

achieving the objectives of this agreement.

4.4. Reporting and KPIs associated with this funding will be agreed between the parties

separately but in the interests of ensuring swift distribution of funds have been

omitted from this Section 256 agreement.
