Appendix 2 – Consultation response analysis

Background

The Government abolished Council Tax Benefit in 2013 and every Council was tasked with designing its own local scheme to provide financial support to those residents on low incomes. The scheme is called the Council Tax Reduction Scheme. The scheme has not changed since it was previously amended in 2022.

The Council is proposing to change its scheme as it applies to working age residents in the borough.

The council are required to have the new scheme in place by 11 March 2024 to start on 1 April 2024.

The council ran a consultation on the subject from 06 December 2023 to 31 January 2024. Members of the public were asked to go to haringeyctrs@commonplace.is to view proposals and give feedback. An option was available to request hard copies to be sent to residents who required them.

If the proposals are not agreed, then the current CTRS scheme remains in place.

50 responses were received, all of which came online. The feedback received is displayed below.
