<p>Public Safety</p> <p>I am objecting to the application because a group of residents have approached me to object on their behalf. Any licensing application comments are shared with the applicant. This is not a method to get people to place objections because many may not want to face the backlash and/or intimidation from an establishment.</p>
<p>The Prevention of Public Nuisance</p> <p>Residents have told me they do not want to publicly object and put their name on a licensing objection when those who frequent the establishment are unfriendly, older men and intimidating to many local residents who use the shopping facilities on Myddleton Road. I understand from the residents who have shared this with me that the patrons of the Traditional Café and Tea House have complained to the Bowes Park Community Association and the We Love Myddleton Road group about local residents who have expressed concerns about the patrons at the premises.</p>
<p>The Protection of Children from Harm</p> <p>There is a nursery next door to the premises and the parents and staff who work here have to negotiate groups of men drinking and smoking outside the doors in groups right next to the nursery.</p>
