






Children and Young People Population




Predicted percentage increase in under 5s by ward 2001 to 2010 (Census count in brackets*)







Main language spoken by children in Haringey primary and secondary schools, January 2004




Income deprivation amongst Haringey children




Proportion of all households with dependent children headed by a lone parent, 2001



Tenure of households with dependent children, 2001





Number of households with dependent children in accommodation that is overcrowded, adequate or under occupied, 2001





Life expectancy for males and females in Haringey, London and England (1991/93 to 2001/03)






Cause of death in people aged under 25 in Haringey, 2002-2003





Age distribution, under 25 years






Type of disability

Infectious disease notifications in children aged under 18 years, 2002-2003





A Healthy Life

- CYP and their families should be supported and empowered to make healthier choices



Admission rates for all accidents per 100,000 children by ward, 2001-2004






Number of child road traffic accident casualties per month, 2004





Types of crimes committed by 10-17 year olds, April 2001 to March 2004





